Ensign, December, 1673. Captain in King Philip's War, 1676. Killed by the Indians in the conflict known as Pierce's Fight.

Eighth in descent from John¹ Sayles, of Providence, and Mary Williams, of Providence (daughter of Roger), his wife. He was born 1633, died 1681. Governor's Assistant, 1653. Commissioner for Providence, 1653, 1655, 1657, 1659. Deputy for Providence, 1669, 1670, 1671, 1674, 1676, 1677, 1678.

Seventh in descent from John² Sayles, of Providence, and Elizabeth Olney, of Providence (daughter of Thomas²), his wife. He was born August 17, 1654; died August 2, 1727. Deputy for Providence, 1694, 1706.

Eighth in descent from Jonathan Sprague, of Hingham, Massachusetts, Providence and Smithfield, Rhode Island, and Mehitable Holbrook, of Hingham, Massachusetts, his wife. He was born May 28, 1648, Hingham; died September, 1741, æ. 93. Boundary Commissioner, 1695. Deputy for Providence, 1695, 1696, 1698, 1699, 1700, 1702 to 1710, 1712, 1714. Speaker of the House of Deputies, 1703.

Eighth in descent from Edward Smith, Sen., of Providence, and Anphillis Angell, of Providence, his wife. He died November 8, 1693. Deputy for Providence, 1665, 1668, 1675, 1676, 1680, 1682, 1683. Governor's Assistant, 1691.

Seventh in descent from Edward² Smith, Jr., of Providence, and Mercy Mowry, of Providence, his wife. He died November 9, 1726. Deputy for Providence, 1716, 1717.

Fifth in descent from Joshua Winsor, of Glocester, and Abigail Smith, of Smithfield, his wife. He was born September 17, 1709, died December 23, 1796. One of the thirteen signers of the first written compact of Providence Plantations that has come to us, 1637.

Accompanied Roger Williams to Providence, 1636. One of the thirteen signers of the first written compact of Providence Plantations, August, 1637. Commissioner for Providence, 1652, 1653.

Sixth in descent from Captain Thomas Angell, of Providence and Scituate, and Sarah Brown, of Providence, his wife. He was born March 25, 1672; died September 14, 1744. Captain of Fifth Providence Company, 1722 to 1730. Deputy for Scituate, Rhode Island, 1733, 1734.

Eighth in descent from Chad Brown, of Providence, and Elizabeth ———, his wife. He died before 1650. One of the thirteen signers of the first written compact of Providence Plantations, August, 1637.

Ninth in descent from WILLIAM CARPENTER, of Weymouth and Rehoboth, and ABIGAIL ——, his wife. He was born 1605, England; died February 7, 1658, or 1659, Rehoboth. Deputy for Weymouth to the Massachusetts General Court, 1641, 1643. Deputy for Rehoboth to the Plymouth Colony Court, 1656.

Eighth in descent from Thomas Clemence, of Providence, and Elizabeth ———, his wife. He died 1688. Deputy for Providence, 1666, 1672.

Eighth in descent from John Field, of Providence, and ———, his wife. He died 1686. One of the thirteen signers of the first written compact of Providence Plantations, August, 1637. Deputy for Providence, 1676.

Fourth in descent from Captain Daniel Lyon, of Woodstock, Connecticut, and Prudence May, his wife. He was born February 22, 1734; died June 20, 1820, æ. 86. Captain of a company of grenadiers in Connecticut, October, 1774. Captain at Lexington, April, 1775. Captain of 7th Company in 8th Continental Regiment, 1775. Captain of Regiment of Militia, 1776.

Sixth in descent from William Lyon, of Roxbury and Woodstock (then in Massachusetts), and Deborah Colburn, of Dedham, Massachusetts, his wife. He was born September 15, 1675, Roxbury; died September 17, 1741, Woodstock. Representative for Woodstock to the Massachusetts General Court, 1735 to 1741.

Fifth in descent from Captain Joseph Marcy, of Woodstock, Connecticut, and Mary Throope, his wife. He was born September 18, 1697, Woodstock; died October 18, 1795, æ. 88. Captain at Woodstock, Connecticut, 1750.

Seventh in descent from Daniel Smith, of Rehoboth, Massachusetts, and Esther Chickering, his wife. He died April 28, 1692. Deputy for Rehoboth to the Plymouth Colony Court, 1672, 1674 to 1678. Governor's Assistant, 1679 to 1686, 1691. Councillor under Andros, 1686 to 1689.

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Seventh in descent from John² Smith, of Providence, and Sarah Whipple (daughter of John), his wife. He died 1682. Ensign, 1653, 1654. Named in the Royal Charter of King Charles II, 1663. Deputy for Providence, 1666, 1672.

Sixth in descent from Major William³ Smith, of Providence, and Smithfield, and Mary Sayles, of Providence, his wife. He was born 1682; died December 11, 1753. Deputy for Providence, 1714, 1716, 1720, 1721, 1723, 1724, 1726, 1727, 1728, 1729. Governor's Assistant, 1729, 1730, 1731. Deputy for Smithfield, 1735, 1744. Captain, February, 1714. Major by October, 1714. Served as Major at Siege of Louisburg, 1745.


