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#### NOTE.

The following Record does not profess to be complete. It is designed merely to preserve the knowledge of the settlement and early history of the family in this country, and to enable its representatives now living to trace their connection with the original stock. The compiler undertook the work of gathering these statistics more than twenty years ago. He visited the cemeteries and searched the records of most of the towns where the first Robert Coe and his children resided, and has consulted such works in the libraries of the Historical Societies of Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New York, as were supposed to contain facts bearing upon the subject. He could not incur the expense of publishing the results of his inquiries in detail; but he deems it a sacred duty to preserve this brief outline, that the honored and pious men who brought to these shores the name he inherits, may not be altogether unknown or forgotten by their posterity.

# FAMILY RECORD.

The Coe family came to this country from Suffolkshire, England, where they had resided for many generations. The earliest notice of them, which can now be found, is in Fox's Book of Martyrs, which states that "Roger Coo," of Milford, Suffolkshire, was burned by Queen Mary, September, 1555, at Yexford, in that shire. A full account of his trial and defense is given by Fox, vol. 3, page 349, folio edition. Little is known respecting the family till the removal of Robert Coe to this country. In the authentic family record, he belongs to the

#### FIRST GENERATION.

Robert Cooe\* was born in Suffolkshire, England, in 1596. With his wife, Anna, born 1591, and their three sons, he sailed from Ipswich, Suffolkshire, in company with 79 others, in the ship Francis, John Cutting, master, April 10th, 1634. They reached Boston in the following June, only six years from the date of the first settlement in the Massachusetts Colony. Robert Coe settled with his family in Watertown, near Boston, and was made a freeman there, September 3d, 1634.

<sup>\*</sup>In Fox's Book of Martyrs, the orthography is Coo. In the records of the Custom House, preserved in the State Papers Office, Westminster Hall, London, the name is written Cooe. In many of the early records of New England, it is Co. The oldest original signature, which I have found is in the Town Records of Jamaica, L. I., and was written February 14, 1663. The name is Robart Coe, but a signature written March 2, 1663, is Robart Co.

In 1635, "all the towns in the Bay began to be much straitened by their own nearness to one another." Accordingly, leave being granted by the Council, several families from Watertown, Newtown, and Dorchester formed settlements on the Connecticut river at Windsor, Hartford, and Wethersfield. The Watertown people, among whom was Robert Coe, settled at (Pyquang) Wethersfield, which they purchased from the Indians. "The letter of dismission granted by the Church at Watertown, in the Massachusetts, dated 29th of May last," to Robert Coe and five others, was ratified and confirmed by the first court holden at Hartford, April 26th, 1636.

A difficulty soon arose in the church, and after fruitless efforts by the church at Watertown, and by Mr. Davenport of New Haven, to effect a reconciliation, it was proposed by Mr. Davenport that one party should remove. Accordingly, on the 30th of October, 1640, Mr. Andrew Ward, and Mr. Robert Coe, in behalf of themselves and about twenty other planters, purchased Rippowams, (Stamford,) of New Haven Colony, for £33, and commenced a settlement there. At the general court in New Haven, April 5, 1643, a court having the same powers as that at New Haven, was established at Stamford, and Robert Coe was appointed one of the assistant judges.

In the autumn of 1643, a deputation was sent from Stamford to Long Island, to examine the country; and in the spring following, (1644,) Robert Coe, Richard Denton, (pastor of the church at Stamford,) and several others formed the first English settlement at Hempstead, L. I.

In 1652, he removed to a place called Mespat, and aided in establishing a settlement which was named Middelburg, (now Newtown, L. I.) He was a magistrate, during his whole residence there, and took a leading part in all the affairs of the town. In 1653, he was appointed a deputy to proceed to Boston, and invoke the protection of the New England Colonies against the Dutch and Indians, who had conspired against the English settlements on Long Island. In November of the same year, he was sent, with delegates from the other English towns, to confer with the burgomasters of New Amsterdam, in reference to some plan for the common safety.

Early in 1656, he, with several others, commenced a settlement in Jamaica. The first town meeting was held February 18th, when a house lot was given to Robert, and another to his son, Benjamin Coe. The land occupied by the settlers was purchased of the Indians, the certificate of purchase being signed by Robert Coe and seventeen others, March 21st, 1656. He was appointed a magistrate of the town in 1659, and represented it in the General Convention at Hartford, in May 1664, by which body he was appointed Commissioner for Jamaica. He continued to be one of the most active and prominent men in public affairs, till about 1672, at which time he was 76 years old. The time of his death is not known.

#### SECOND GENERATION.

Robert<sup>1</sup> and Anna had three children, viz.: John<sup>2</sup>, Robert<sup>2</sup>, and Benjamin<sup>2</sup>.

John<sup>2</sup> was born in England, in 1626. He accompanied his father to Watertown, Wethersfield, Stamford, Hempstead, and Newtown. In the last named place he enjoyed much distinction—held the offices of magistrate, deputy, and overseer; and was prominent in all the affairs of the town. He had five sons, Robert, John, Jonathan, Samuel, David, the fourth of whom, Samuel<sup>3</sup>, married Margaret Van Zandt, and removed to New Hempstead, (now Ramapo, Rockland Co.,) N. Y., in 1734, where he died in 1742, aged 70 years. He was among the first settlers, and most influential men of that region. He had ten children, viz.: Samuel, John<sup>4</sup>, Benjamin, William, Isaac, Matthew, Daniel, Margaret, Sarah, Abigail. The second of these, John<sup>4</sup>, was born, December 7, 1719, married Hannah Halsted,\* resided at New Hempstead, N. Y., and died May 11, 1782, aged 62 years.\* He had two children, viz.:

Jonas<sup>5</sup> and Holsted<sup>5</sup>. Jonas<sup>5</sup> (D.D.) born March 20th, 1754, married Eliza H. Burnet, September 27, 1794, was pastor of the 1st Presbyterian Church of Troy, N. Y., died July 21, 1822, aged 68. He had four children, viz.: Burnett M. born June 25, 1795, died August 20, 1795, Edward M. born September 29, 1796, died February 11th, 1828, John R. born Jan. 17, 1800, died Sept. 30, 1823, Eliza Maria, born December 18, 1803, married James Brown, resides in New York. Halsten<sup>5</sup>, born 1760, resided at Newark, New Jersey, died Aug. 19, 1832. He had ten children, viz.: George W., Sarah, (married Rev. James Patterson of Philadelphia,) Mary, (married Rev. Dr. Hay,) Timothy, Hannah, Halsted, (Commodore, Buenos Ayres, S. A.,) Matthew, Abby H., Elizabeth, Charlotte.

Robert<sup>2</sup> was born in England in 1627, and accompanied his father to Watertown, Wethersfield, and Stamford. He removed thence to Stratford, Ct., married Hannah ————, and died in 1659, aged 32.\* He had one son *John*<sup>2</sup>, who is the ancestor

of those whose names appear in the following pages.

Benjamin² was born in England in 1629, he accompanied his father in all his removals, married Abigail Carman, and spent the latter part of his life in Jamaica. His grandson, Benjamin, born 1702, removed to Newark, N. J., and died 1787. He had two sons, one of whom was killed in the Revolutionary War. The other, Benjamin, was born 1736, and died 1818, leaving two sons, Aaron, and Sayers. The former lived in Westfield, N. J., and the latter born April 26, 1772, in Newark. Their descendants are numerous in New Jersey.

<sup>\*</sup> Ebenezer<sup>4</sup> resided on the same spot, in Stratford, occupied by his father and grandfather. His son, Ebenezer<sup>5</sup>, born 1735; his grandson, John Ebenezer<sup>5</sup>, born 1769; his great-grandson, John<sup>7</sup>, born 1804; and his great-great-grandson, John Henry<sup>8</sup>, born 1832—making in all seven generations—have occupied this homestead. The last two are still living.

<sup>†</sup> Abel<sub>5</sub> had five children, viz.: Elijah, Charles, Jerusha, Abel, and Mary. The second of these, Charles, had three children, viz.: Noah, born May 25, 1786: Polly, born Sept. 13, 1788; and Parsons, born Feb. 4, 1792. 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
