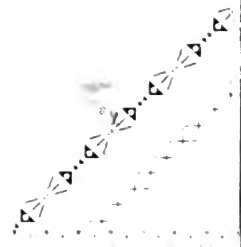

PREFACE.

Several years ago the compiler of this pamphlet began what may have seemed a profitless, thankless and disappointing task. Profitless, because from a pecuniary standpoint we can depend little on the prestige of our ancestors: thankless, for who could tell whether even those most nearly related would take the slightest interest—and disappointing lest the words of Saxe should prove true, that,

“Your family thread you can't ascend,
Without good reason to apprehend
You may find it waxed at the farther end,
By some plebeian vocation:
Or worse than that, your boasted Line
May end in a loop of stronger twine
That plagned some worthy relation.”

No special attempt has been made to trace the lineage of the family across the water, though no doubt this, too, would be a source of much interest and family pride.

B.— For convenience in references a number has been assigned to each member of the family. C. stands for child or children; b. for born; m. married; and d. died. The present post office address, so far as we are able to learn, is under the name. To trace from individuals to their families, find their number in the left hand margin, then turn on till the same number is found again in the middle of the page. To trace backward, reverse the process. (2) or (3) signifies second or third marriages.

Regardless of all the care and painstaking correspondence, I am well aware that there will be found some errors and omissions, some of which have been impossible to obtain. In this respect I wish to ask a special favor, which I trust no member of the family will be unwilling to grant, that is, if there is a positive proof of any error or omission, that it be reported to me as soon as possible, also changes of residence, marriages, births or deaths, that at some future time a more complete edition may be issued.

HISTORICAL.

The first step in our direct lineage we find in the person of John Warren, who came from England to America early in seventeen hundred, and settled in Massachusetts.

Joseph, the o'dest of his two sons, was born in Roxbury, Massachusetts, in 1741. He was a graduate in medicine at Harvard college in 1759, and in 1772 took his first step in public life.

Almost upon the spot where stands the Bunker Hill monument, fell Major General Joseph Warren, on that memorable 17th day of June, 1775. Of him was said, "We want him in the Senate, we want him in his profession, we want him in the field. We mourn for the citizen, the senator, the physician and the warrior." He was one of the first members of that patriotic association known as the "Sons of Liberty," and was extremely efficient in fostering a spirit of rational liberty among his people. He delivered the first annual oration on the subject of the "Boston Massacre," and was a hero firm in the faith that "resistance to tyrants is obedience to God." His body was buried where it fell, but after the British had left Boston in the spring of 1776, it was taken up, carried to the city and interred with masonic and military honors beneath St. Paul's church. A statue of Gen. Warren was inaugurated on Bunker Hill, June 17, 1857, the 82d, anniversary of the battle.

*John Warren, brother of the preceeding, and the second step of our recorded genealogy, was born in Roxbury, Mass., July 27, 1753. He was a graduate of Harvard college in 1771, after which he took a two years course in the study of medicine, under the direction of his brother, whose patriotic views he fully shared and aided with his pen. He commenced practice in Salem in 1773. He was with the Salem regiment in the battle of Lexington, and remained a fortnight at Cambridge in charge of the wounded. In June he offered himself at camp as a volunteer and was appointed senior surgeon of the hospital. He accompanied the army in all its worst perils and hardships during two years; after which he was appointed to the charge of the hospitals in Boston. He joined the expedition of Gen. Green to Rhode Island in 1778, and another against insurgent Shays in 1785. His enthusiastic interest in his subject, and his faculty of vivid description, led to the establishment of a medical school under his auspices attached to Harvard college; and he was appointed professor of anatomy. His principal publications were as follows: the first fourth of July oration, delivered in 1783; a "Dissertation on the Mercurial Practice in Febril Diseases;" an address before the humane society; an eulogy on the Hon. Thomas Russell; and an address to the lodges of freemasons, of which order he was Grand Master. He continued to take an active part in all public events to the time of his death.

Our subject matter has been gathered entirely by correspondence, and the author here wishes to acknowledge his appreciation of the many favors, and the kindly interest shown by all who have given him assistance and encouragement in the work.

The author has been amply repaid for time and labor by the many friendly correspondences established, the many acquaintances made and relatives discovered, and hopes that this work may be the means of bringing the family into a nearer relationship, and becoming better acquainted as relatives and kin,

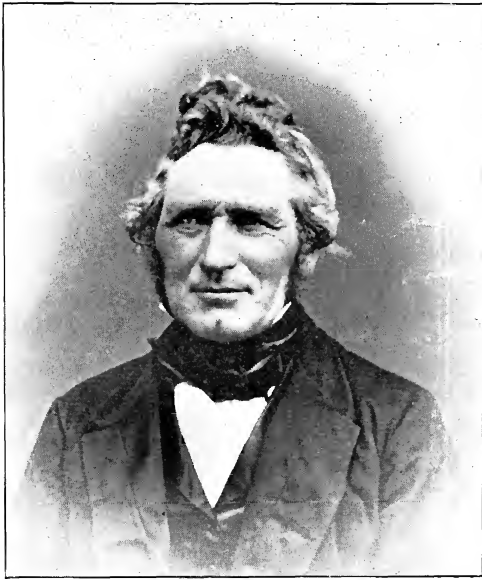

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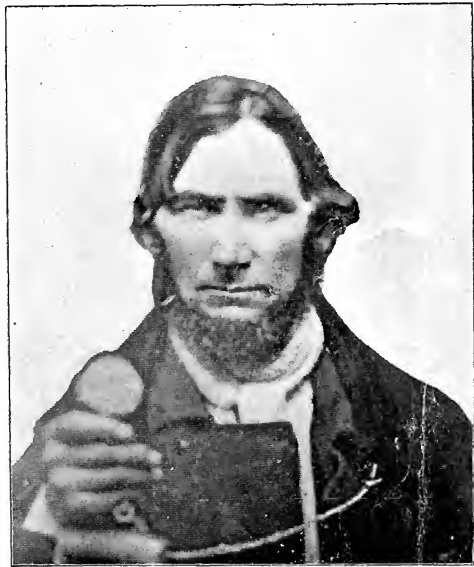

No. 24, Aaron Warren, the senior of the six children of Joseph and Sarah, was born on a farm near Hamilton, N. Y. He obtained a common school education. His thoughts ran largely to history and to mechanical work. June 8, 1836 he left Eaton, N. Y. for Michigan where he arrived the 18th of the same month. He settled on a farm in York township, Washtenaw county, where he erected several houses and other buildings, and did more or less clearing as the country was then new and well timbered. Early in April 1860 he took a severe cold and after but a few days illness, with congestion, on the 12th of said month he bid farewell to life below.

No. 25, Albert Warren left the East, bound for Ohio, May 15, 1834. From there to Michigan where he settled in Cass county and accumulated some property. He expressed a strong desire for a western home, and in May 1855 left for Utah, since which time no trace of him has ever been found, and his death is believed to have taken place there.

→ No. 26, Julius Franklin Warren, who was born near Hamilton, N. Y., helped to get out the timbers for the Hamilton Theological Seminary. There was said of him by some of the officials of the college with whom he was personally acquainted: "Mr. Warren was a man with very marked traits of character, of untiring energy, and a persistent worker in whatever business engaged." In 1855 he moved with his family to Michigan where he spent several years in the vicinity of Galesburg, then moved to Lansing, and finally to Petoskey where sickness overtook him and he died, June 27, 1885.

No. 27, Irene Warren, Bonney, from childhood a resident of Madison county, N. Y., where she still resides. Her life has been a most happy one, relying wholly upon the hope of a hereafter. In her declining years we find her well and strong.

No. 28, Cynthia Warren, Sanford, left Eaton, her girlhood home, for the west May 22, 1834, arriving in Ohio a fortnight after. There they remained until March 20, 1836, when with her husband they came to Michigan and settled in York township where they now enjoy the happiness and blessings of a good old age.

No. 29, Achsah Warren, Sanford, the youngest of the six, was the fourth one of the number to cross the river, December 27, 1891, at South Otselic. Her life was spent happily within the borders of her native state, N. Y., where the surviving ones of her children may be found.
