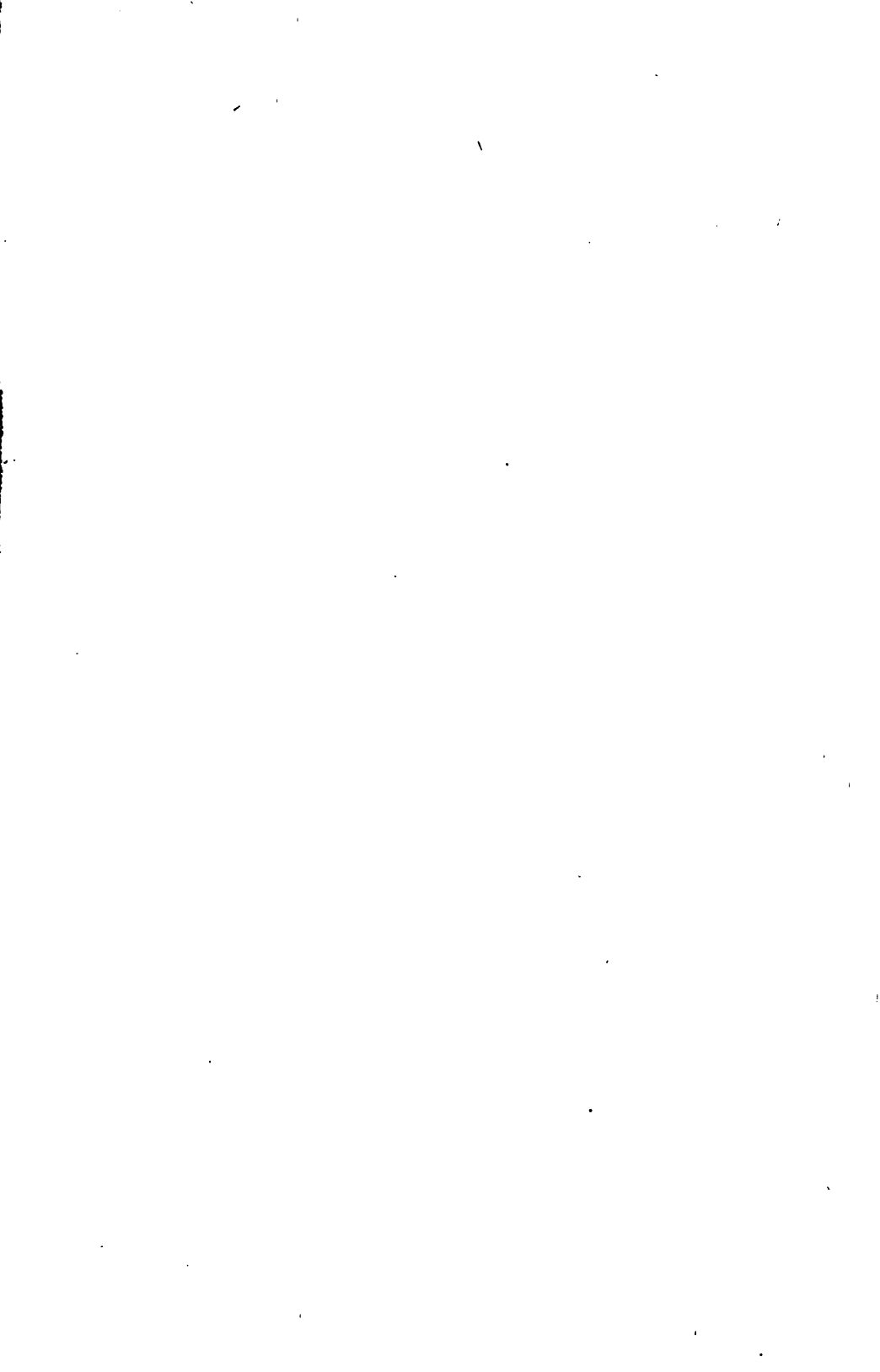

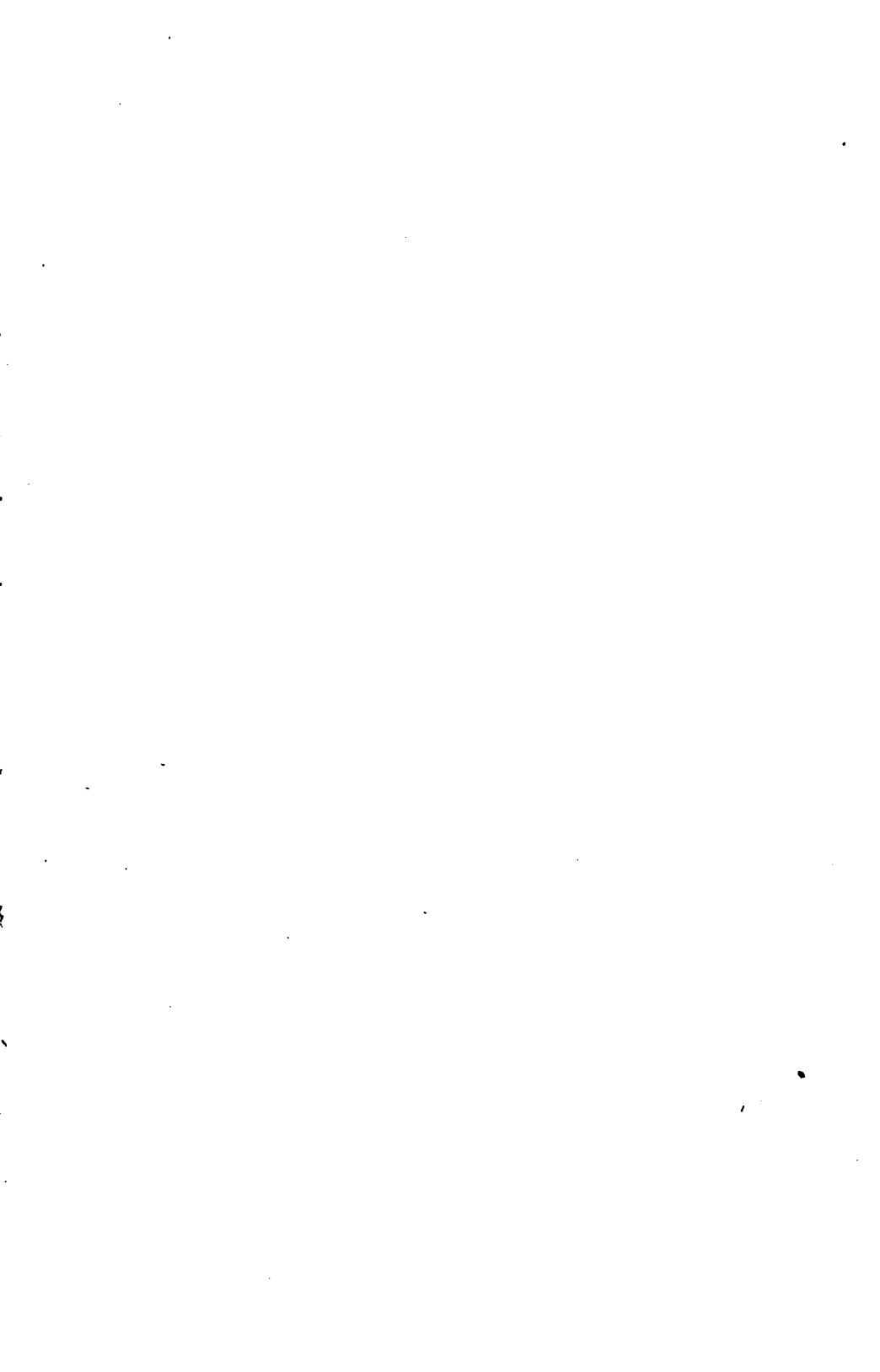

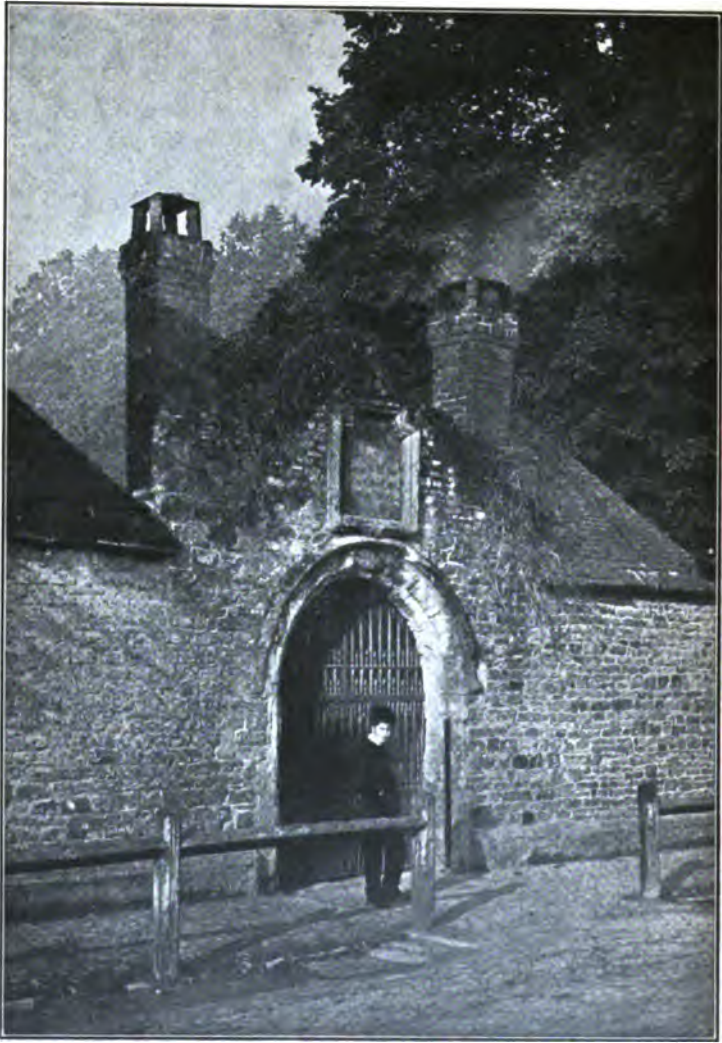

EDITOR'S PREFACE.

THE Old Blundellian Club, at their annual meeting in June, 1903, resolved to publish the School Register with other ancillary matter in commemoration of the Tercentary of the School in the following year, and they confided the publication to the hands of the present Editor. From the material that increased upon him as soon as this resolution became known, he has been compelled to divide the publication into two parts, the first of which is here presented, and comprises the Register itself from its commencement in 1770 to the removal of the School to its new site at Horsdon in 1882, together with a few notes and an index. In a second part will be printed a number of useful Appendices with the Historical Introduction and remaining illustrations referred to in the prospectus issued by the Club. If the work is found useful, it may be that other hands will continue the series, so that in time firm ground may arise from the bog of tradition whereon the future historian of the School may tread *certo pede*. Such at least is the object with which the O.B. Club puts forth this little book. A previous effort to the same end was made in 1892 by Mr. H. M. Rankilor, an Assistant Master at the School, who published a fragment of the Register from 1770 to 1812, but only a few copies were printed, and it has long been out of print.

The value of such work depends entirely upon its accuracy, and the present Editor has endeavoured to secure this as far as in him lies.

It is not to be supposed that among the 3460 entries, involving always two and sometimes three names, with an address, two dates, and other matter, often in obscure handwriting, he has avoided all mistakes, but all he has detected

are the following errata. Each entry was first copied in MSS., from which the first proof was printed, and this proof was then examined (not merely read) with the Register itself. The Index has been made, copied, and verified in the same way. The Editor, however, does disclaim the patent errors of the record, which are those of the registering Headmasters themselves. These errors, with the desire of presenting an accurate transcript, he has not corrected.

Such, for instance, is the boy who anticipated Mr. Wells' time machine by entering school on the 27th January, 1823, and leaving it on the 16th December previous,* and some, it will be seen, never left at all. The spelling, too, has been preserved in all cases, "Crusey" is more interesting than the "Cruwys Shay" of to-day.

But on the whole the Register has been diligently and faithfully kept, and the Editor hopes as faithfully rendered.

The Editor's thanks are due and are here gratefully acknowledged to many kind assistants, particularly to the Governors of the School and their Clerk (Mr. E. F. C. Clarke), to the present Headmaster and the Librarian of the School (Mr. H. F. Tatum), to the Marchioness of Sligo, Mr. A. C. R. Maitland, the Rev. J. H. Ward, Capt. F. R. Dicken, R.N., Mr. C. B. Sanders, the Rev. L. T. Rendell, the Rev. J. B. Hughes, and Mr. L. T. Webber Incedon.

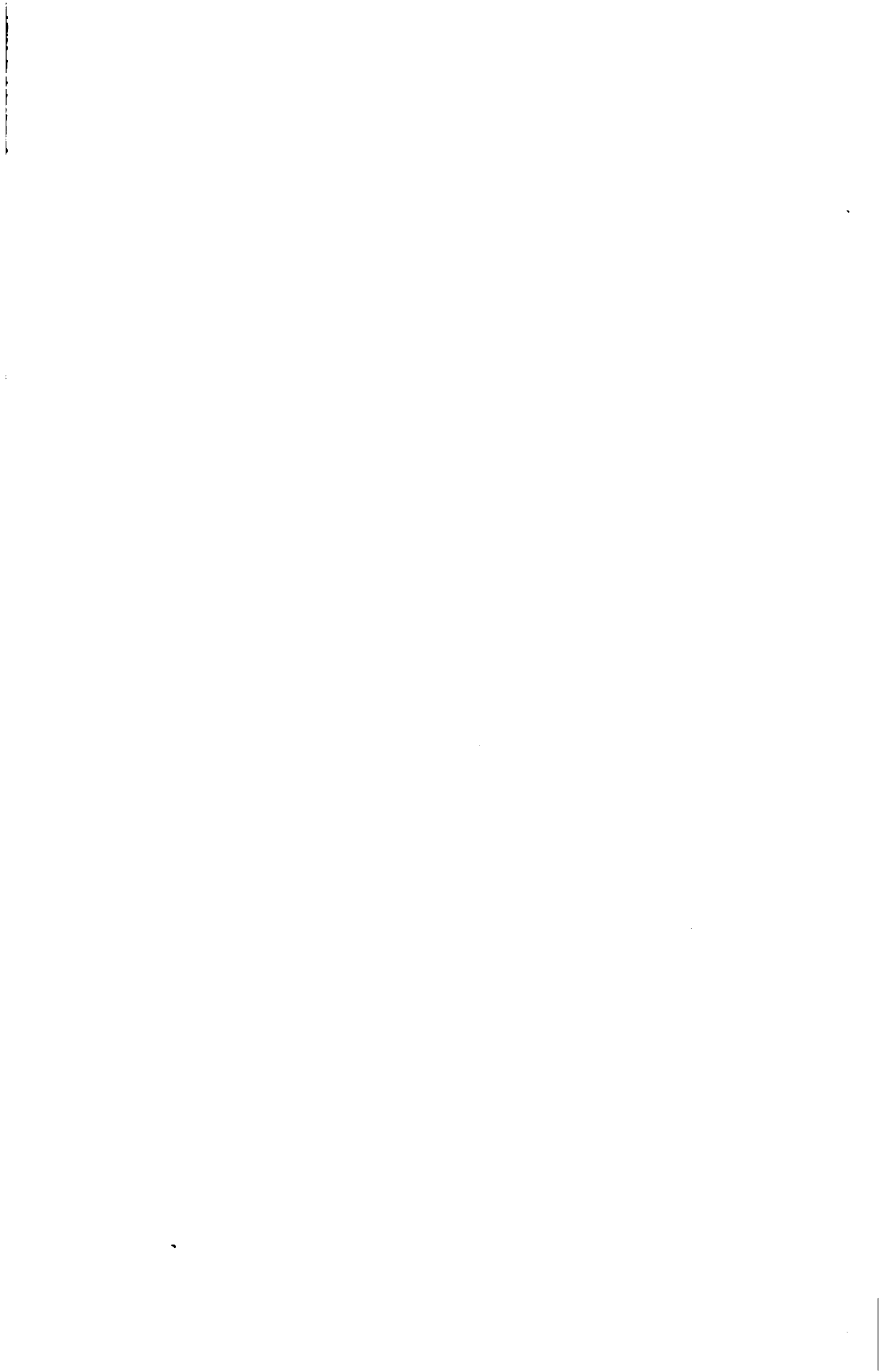

LIST OF ILLUSTRATIONS.

✓1. THE OLD GATEWAY *Frontispiece.*

This gateway probably dated from 1662, when the gate underwent considerable alteration and repair, iron gates being substituted for the "fair strong Gate with a little Dore" of the Founder's will, which had become much decayed. The Latin inscription (given underneath the picture) was cut on a brass plate and probably placed over the archway at the same time, as it is referred to by Prince (*Worthies of Devon*) in 1701 as "yet plainly to be read." The porters' lodges were added in 1695. The Latin inscription was recut on the present copper plate in 1794. This copper plate was removed to the New School in 1882, and the Gateway itself was pulled down and rebuilt to a greater height early in 1883, when the wooden posts and rails were also removed and the roadway raised to its present level above the plinth of the wall shown in the picture. The photograph, of which the picture is a reproduction, was taken by the late Mr. F. J. Bond, of Tiverton, in July, 1880.

There are many translations of the inscription. The best known is the oldest version ascribed to the Rev. Thos. Wood, Usher of the School, 1760-1788:

*"Minerva, on her travels, sought to find
Some hospitable seat to please her mind:
She saw this school—struck with the stately dome,
She cried with transport 'This shall be my home.'"*

THE
Register of Blundell's School,

1770-1882.

THE Register itself is a leather-covered folio, plastered with nearly obliterated notices of the litigation between the Town and School in 1844. It has this inscription on its first page:—
"A Register of the Scholars educated in Blundell's School. This Volume, designed to be a Repository of certain facts very worthy of remembrance, is humbly presented for such use by Benjamin Inledon, formerly a Scholar, and now a Trustee.—**BENJN. INCLEDON**, 1 May, 1770." The inscription is in Mr. Inledon's writing.

Pasted on the fly leaf is the one of the two impressions of the Hogarth O.B. ticket described in the Appendices; following opposite are the following entries:—"Seven elm trees were planted in the meadow bordering on the river Lowman in Novr., 1830, following the direction of the bank, and about six feet therefrom.—**A DICKEN**."

"In Chancery. Atty.-Genl. v. Devon, Earl of. Shewn to the Revd. Alldersey Dicken on his examon. for the Defts., Hy. Sanders and Anthony Boulton (Clks).—**C. P. VILLIERS, Exr.**"

The Register contains 284 pages ruled in seven columns, each with the following printed headings:—No.; Names of Scholars; Son of; Years of Age; Admitted into School; Went from School; Colleges elected to on the Foundation. The period to April, 1882, occupies 231 pages.

The entries in every case are in the handwriting of the Headmaster of the period, except the entry "F. Exon," opposite the name of Frederick Temple, which is the handwriting of the late Archbishop of Canterbury.

From the 21 August, 1847, to January, 1882, the last column is also regularly filled with the description—Foreigner or Native—of each boy.

There are numerous mistakes in the notation. Thirty-six numbers, viz: 149, 534 to 553 inclusive, 2028, 2506, 2403, 2527, 2593, 2645, 2787, 2851, 2858, 2891, 2992, 3141, 3268, 3412 and 3511 are entered twice.

One hundred and twenty-two numbers, viz: 988, 1588, 2646 to 2655 inclusive, 2717, 2909, 2952, 2965, 3019 to 3118 inclusive, 3181, 3202, 3242, 3479 and 3545 are omitted. J. Veysey is entered twice under 1414 and 1422; 2645 and 2644, 2771 and 2770 are transposed. The numeration for the above period ends with 3546, but with the corrections above there is a nett total of 3460 entries for the 112 years, or an average number of entries of 30 25/28 per annum.

The numbers at the School vary considerably. The numbers noted in the Register are April 1772, 101; March 1773, 100; August 1773, 100; April 1774, 99; February 1775, 103; July 1775, 91; July 1776, 90; March 1794, 108; October 1794, 118; April 1796, 109; December 1796, 106; February 1797, 116; November 1797, 122; April 1799, 123; October 1800, 133; September 1801, 123; August 1802, 132; April 1803, 144; August 1803, 150; November 1804, 150; December 1805, 142; April 1806, 149; March 1807, 150; April 1808, 149; June 1809, 150; June 1810, 148; June 1811, 150; June 1812, 150; June 1813, 157; June 1815, 203 (the highest number recorded in the Register to 1882); June 1817, 190; June 1818, 192; June 1819, 170; June 1820, 176; June 1821, 173; June 1822, 161; June 1823, 149; June 1824, 137; June 1834, 127; September 1834, 133; May 1835, 117; February 1848, 31; September 1873, 92; February 1874, 105; October 1874, 120; February 1875, 130; May 1875, 134; September 1875, 140; September 1881, 78; April 1882, 88.

Allowing for the departure of all boys at the School when the Register commenced it is thenceforward easy to work out the numbers of boys at the School in any particular year, half year or term.

In the *Blundellian* of June, 1894, the following years are worked out by H.M.R., in all cases June of the year:—1777, 90; 1778, 79; 1779, 76; 1780, 69; 1781, 59; 1782, 55; 1783, 64; 1784, 58; 1785, 73; 1786, 77; 1787, 87; 1788, 82; 1789, 90; 1790, 99; 1791, 89; 1792, 99; 1793, 109.

Dunsford gives the following numbers:—August 1790, 105, and in 1804, 96. The latter number, however, is very difficult to reconcile with the Headmaster's figures above of 150 in the previous year and 150 in the November following.

Harding gives the following numbers:—1819, 163; June 1837, 112, of whom 56 were boarders at the School; June 1845, 80, of whom 44 were boarders at the School, and quotes statistics, that of the first 2345 entries in the Register (to August, 1840) 343 only were either born or brought up in Tiverton, and of these 343, 78 only continued at the School until the age of 16, and of the remainder 510 only. Of the 78, 26 only had offered themselves for the School Scholarships and Exhibitions, and 19 had been elected. Of the 510, 170 had so offered themselves and 60 had been elected. On the other hand, a writer in the *Blundellian*, February, 1896, under the name "Scrutator," quoting from Foster's *Alumni Oxoniensis*, says of the first 1165 entries in the School Register, 245 matriculated at Oxford alone.

In marked contrast to these figures it may be noted that from the removal of the School in May 1882, to the present time (December 1903)

there have been 1419 entries for 21 $\frac{2}{3}$ years. The first 1419 entries in the Register occupy more than 44 years. The average annual entry from May 1882 to the present time has been 65 $\frac{32}{65}$. The present number of the boys in the School is 205. The highest number ever attained was 274 in April 1890, and the largest entry made in any one single term was 39 in September last.

The following is an accurate transcript from the Register with the following abbreviations and exceptions:—The numeral following the boy's name is the boy's age on entry, the first date is that of his admission into the School; the second date that of his leaving School; the words following are just such as appear opposite his name in the last column. The capital F at the end of the entry signifies Foreigner, and the capital N signifies Native, as entered in the Register.

It will be noted that Mr. Keats enters "eloped" against the names of nine boys in his day. Dr. Richards the same in one case. Dr. Dicken the same in two cases. Mr. Sanders enters "ran away" once and Mr. Hughes the same once—14 in all.

Dr. Richards enters "expelled" against the names of five boys, Dr. Dicken of one, Mr. Sanders of one and "dismissed" in the case of one other. Mr. Hughes "dismissed" in two cases, and Mr. Francis "removed" in four cases. In all these 14 cases of expulsion the entry has been omitted in this transcript.

BENJAMIN INCLEDON 1730-1796.

A BRIEF account of the Donor of the Register may fitly come here. Benjamin Incledon was born 1730, the second son of Robert Incledon, of Pilton House, Barnstaple. His mother was Penelope Sanford, of Ninehead, Somerset. He was educated at Blundell's, and was elected a Feoffee of the School in 1765. He married at Tiverton in 1757 Margaret, the second daughter of John Newton, of that place.

By the death of his elder brother he succeeded to the Incledon estates in North Devon, which are described as an ample patrimony. He has left an enduring reputation as a genealogist and antiquary, especially in all that concerned Devonshire families. Amongst other works he compiled the *Stemmata Fortescuana*, now at Castle Hill in this county.

At Blundell's he is remembered by many gifts and institutions, such as the picture of Samuel Wesley in the Library, the Register, the MSS. volume he compiled on the donations of Peter Blundell given by him to the Feoffees and now in the possession of the Governors; by the same book published at his own expense in 1792, the frontispiece therein now used on all the School Prizes and Books; the pictures of Blundell and Popham in the Big School. Although these

pictures were received after his death, their receipt at all was doubtless due to his exertions. He was the first historian of the School, and the Feoffees thought so well of his work that they republished his book at their own expense in the Bi-Centenary year. In 1792 they passed a resolution thanking him "for the very assiduous and unwearied attachment he has always shown to the interest of this foundation." He has been thought worthy to occupy a place in the *Dict. of Nat. Biography*. He was Recorder of Barnstaple from 1758 to 1796, in which latter year he died.

His wife survived him and died in 1803. His eldest son, Robert Newton Incedon, was a Feoffee of the School for many years, and through him the Blundell portrait was received and probably that of Popham also.

PHILIP ATHERTON 1757-1775.

THE Rev. PHILIP ATHERTON, M.A., born 1719, was Usher from 1746-1757, when, on the resignation of the Rev. William Daddo, he was elected Head Master June 1st, 1757.

Like his predecessor Daddo, Atherton was a Fellow of Balliol College. Dunsford describes him as eminent for classic learning and as greatly raising the reputation of the School.

He resigned in 1775, and dying two years later, lies buried with his wife under the Chancel in St. Peter's Church, Tiverton.

At the time of his decease he was Vicar of Ninehead, Somerset, and he also served St. Peter's, Tiverton, as a Curate of one of the Portions for about the last thirteen years of his life.

The following inscription is placed to his memory in St. Peter's:—

"Near this Stone lie the remains of the Rev. Philip Atherton, A.M., Vicar of Ninehead, in Somerset, and one of the Ministers of this Church, who died the 19th of March, 1777, in the 59th year of his age. He was Master of Blundell's School in Tiverton 18 years, which important and laborious office he discharged with the highest reputation. His learning, His Courteous behaviour, His sweetness of temper, a sound clear understanding with a truly christian Benevolence of Heart Gained him through life the respect of all and rendered his death universally lamented.

This monument was erected to his memory by his disconsolate widow with an earnest request that when it should please God to take her from this world She might be buried with him, and that this common marble might convey to Posterity the united names of a man and wife who were loving in their lives and desired after Death not to be divided."

Below it are the words:—"Hetty, the wife of the Revd. Philip Atherton, died the 10th of Jany., 1784, aged 75 years. According to her request she lies here interred. This inscription to their honored Benefactress was added by her Grateful Nephew and Niece, Richard and Elizabeth Tucker."

He makes the first 129 entries in the five years he kept the Register, averaging 26 a year, and leaves 103 boys at the School.

RICHARD KEATS 1775-1797.

THE Rev. RICHARD KEATS, M.A., of Mag. Coll., Oxon, was born 1731, elected Headmaster of Blundell's 17th May, 1775.

He had been Curate of Charlton, Hants, and preacher at St. Mary's, Oxford, and undertook private tuition.

He founded the Speaking and Composition Medal in 1777 and introduced many fresh customs (such as "lines") some of which he borrowed from Winchester.

Harding says he was regarded as an excellent scholar and conducted the School with ability and judgment.

He was the father of Admiral Sir Richard Goodwin Keats, G.C.B., sometime Governor of Newfoundland and afterwards of Greenwich Hospital. The Admiral was a great friend of King William IV., who personally attended his funeral.

Mr. Keats resigned in 1797, and became Rector of Kings Nympton, Devon, and in addition, in 1804, Rector of Bideford.

He died in 1812, and is buried in Kings Nympton Church with his wife, Elizabeth, under a handsome monument erected by the Admiral.

An engraving of Mr. Keats was published by subscription chiefly undertaken by his pupils, and as the appended invitation to subscribe speaks of the print of Peter Blundell as "recently published," it must have been just after that event in 1813. Mr. Keats had died the previous year.

The following seems to have been widely circulated at the time :—

"Proposals for publishing by Subscription a print of the late Rev. Richard Keats, who for upwards of twenty years faithfully discharged the arduous and important duties of Headmaster of Blundell's Free Grammar School in Tiverton.

"The print will be engraved in the first style by Bond, under the direction of Henry Singleton, Esq., from an accurate portrait in possession of the family, It is intended to form a companion print to that of Peter Blundell recently published.

"Subscriptions at one guinea per copy will be received by Rev. W. P. Richards and Rev. J. Ley, Masters of Blundell's School, also by the following gentlemen, late pupils of the deceased :—Rev. J. Russell, Crediton; T. Brown, Esq., Canonsleigh, near Tiverton; Rev. J. Dene, Horwood, near Bideford; Rev. R. Bryan, West Down, near Barnstaple; T. Pearse, Esq., Salisbury Square, London; Rev. G. Raymond, Symondsburly, Dorset; Rev. W. B. Barter, Timsbury, near Bath; Rev. T. Sweet Escott, Hartrow; W. Leigh, Esq., Bardon; Rev. T. Poole, Enmore; T. W. Crosse, Esq., Bridgwater; Rev. T. Matthew, Kilve, near Stowey; R. Leigh and H. J. Leigh, Esqrs., Taunton;" and also by the booksellers therein named.

Fifty-six subscribers' names follow, including that of his son, Vice-Admiral Sir R. G. Keats, for six copies.

The engraving is an exact counterpart in style of the Peter Blundell engraving, and bears upon it "Miss A. Foulstone, Pinxt W. Bond, sculpt.," and is of a painting made in 1787, when he was Headmaster, as it describes him as such, "aetatis 56." Below are the words "Et tanquam in clarissima luce versetur, ita nullum obscurum potest nec dictum ejus esse nec actum Cic. De off. Lib. 2. Cap. 13."*

Mr. Keats makes 501 entries in 21½ years, averaging 23 13/42 per annum, and leaves 106 boys at the School.

WILLIAM PAGE RICHARDS 1797-1823.

THE REV. W. P. RICHARDS was born in 1772, the fourth son and seventh and youngest child of Charles Richards, of Silverton, Devon, and Hannah Page, his wife. He was of a family who had owned lands in that parish since the 16th century and resided there for at least five generations. A great uncle, John Richards, was a successful merchant in London, and left £30,000 at his decease besides lands, and endowed the Boys' School at Silverton. Another John, his father's first cousin, who died August 9th, 1736,

at Edmonton, Middlesex (*vide Gent. Magazine*), was a wealthy Spanish Merchant. In latter days the Richards family were largely scholastic. One brother was Headmaster of Hyde Abbey School, another of Newport Grammar School, a nephew was Headmaster of Leeds Grammar School, and a great nephew a Master again at Hyde Abbey. Although the Master of Blundell's is generally styled LL.D., he really was educated at Winchester, of which he was a Foundation Scholar, and matriculated at New College, Oxford, 1792, of which he became Fellow and proceeded B.C.L. 1805, D.C.L. 1822. He was elected Headmaster of Blundell's 5th January, 1797, having just attained 24 years of age. He married December 29th, 1813, Amelia, daughter of Sir John Strachan, Bart. Mrs. Richards died February 9th, 1852, having had three daughters, the eldest of whom, Amelia Frances, born at Blundell's in 1815, still lives at Winterbourne House, Teignmouth.

He was presented to the College Living of Stoke Abbas, Beaminster Dorset, in 1811, and only resigned it a few years before his death.

On leaving Blundell's he retired to Teignmouth, where in 1824 he became the first perpetual Curate of East Teignmouth Church, which he resigned in 1856. In the manner of those days he discharged the duties of Stoke Abbas by deputy, as otherwise the living was hardly compatible with either his very active governance of Blundell's or with his curacy at Teignmouth.

He died at Winterbourne House April 2nd, 1861, and was buried in East Teignmouth Churchyard. In Teignmouth to-day he is recollected by his carriage which was usually drawn by two horses with a postillion instead of the modern coachman on a box.

He raised Blundell's to the highest point recorded in the Register at the Old School, and has left a reputation for sound scholarship and severe discipline.

On his resignation in 1823 some of his pupils presented him with a silver cup with the following inscription:—

"Viro egregio et doctissimo Gulielmo P. Richards, LL.D., qui viginti sex annos Scholæ Tivertonensis præfuit discipuli ejus tantorum in se beneficiorum haud immemores hoc minusculum summa cum reverentia tribuerunt." *

This testimonial is now in the possession of the Doctor's grandson, Mr. W. J. Maitland.

Dr. Richards makes 1,213 entries in his 26½ years, averaging 45 41/53 per annum and leaves 149 boys at the School.

ALLDERSEY DICKEN 1823-1834.

THE Rev. A. DICKEN, D.D., was born 28th February, 1794, the eldest of a family of thirteen children. The Dickens were a family of Shropshire landowners for 200 years before Mr. Perry Dicken, Dr. Dicken's grandfather, settled at Tiverton about the middle of the 17th century, and here Perry Dicken married Mary Penleaze in 1767. Dr. Dicken's father, the Rev. Perry Dicken (also of Blundell's and after of Balliol), was for 40 years Vicar of Witheridge, near Tiverton, and married Mary, the daughter of Henry Venn, of Payhembury, in 1792.

Dr. Dicken's family, when it removed to Devon, became strongly Blundellian. I find his father, two uncles, a cousin, three brothers and two nephews, besides himself—ten Dickens—entered in the Register.

Dr. Dicken was at Blundell's 1803-1806 and again 1808-1811 (vide Nos. 892 and 1075 in Register). He won the Composition Medal in 1810 and the Sidney Sussex Exhibition in 1811, graduated twelfth wrangler in 1815, became Fellow and Tutor of St. Peter's College, Cambridge, B.D. 1826, D.D. 1831. He won the Seatonian Prize in 1818 with the poem "Deborah," and was a member of the Council of the Cambridge Philosophical Society. In 1822 he published three sermons preached before the University, and in 1847 marginal notes and references on the authorized version of Holy Scripture.

In 1831 Dr. Dicken was presented to the Rectory of Norton, near Woolpit in Suffolk, by St. Peter's College, and he retired to Norton on resigning Blundell's. There 45 years later he was still discharging his clerical duties without a curate.

On February 15th, 1838, he married Caroline Mary Huddleston, the sister of one of his neighbours at Norton, who died 17th October, 1869. He was elected Head Master of Blundell's on 30th June, 1823. On his resignation in 1834 he received a massive silver tray from his pupils with this inscription:—"Alldersey Dicken, S.T.P., hoc ubi plurima debentur vix munusculum quodque indicit quam declaret summa ejus in se merita afferendum Consenserunt discipuli A.D. MDCCCXXXIV."* The testimonial was presented by one of his old pupils, Edward Arthur Dayman, afterwards Vice-Chairman of the Governing Body and Fellow and Tutor of Exeter Coll., Oxon.

He died 2nd January, 1879, and was buried at St. Peter's, Bournemouth, Hants. His mother, some sisters, and others of the Dicken family lie buried at Tiverton.

Dr. Dicken had seven children, four of whom survived him, including two sons, Frederick Rowland and Charles Gauntlett, both

Captains in the Royal Navy, still living. His eldest son, George Alldersey, died shortly after leaving Cambridge, where he graduated at St. Peter's College.

Dr. Dicken first instituted mathematical teaching at Blundell's, and on his resignation a local newspaper thus referred to him (July 6th, 1833) : "It is acknowledged on all hands that an instructor more amiable or kind-hearted, united with such extensive and varied learning and indefatigable research, has never presided over this noble establishment."

Dr. Dicken makes 337 entries in the Register in 11 years, averaging 30 7/11 per annum, and leaves 133 boys at the school.

HENRY SANDERS, 1834—1847.

THE REV. HENRY SANDERS was the eldest son of Robert Rogers Sanders, wine merchant and banker, of Exeter, and Laura (*neé* Coulson) his wife. Mr. R. R. Sander's father Joseph, was a woollen draper in the same city, and one of the founders of the Exeter Bank in 1769. Both Joseph Sanders and his father Henry (also a citizen of Exeter) were Quakers, and lie buried in the Friends' Burial Ground at Exeter. The Rev. Henry Sanders was born in Palace Gate, Sept. 21, 1805, and was educated at Westminster School. He took part in the play there of 1823, "Adelphi," both in the Epilogue and as "Micio." From thence he proceeded to Christ Church, Oxon, where he had previously won a studentship at the age of 16, and he stroked the College boat on several occasions. In 1827 he took a second class Lit. Hum., and in 1831 was ordained. He was elected to the Head Mastership of Blundell's 30th June, 1834. In 1837 he married Caroline Margaret Isabella, daughter of the Rev. Jacob Ley, Rector of Ashprington, Devon, but had no children.

As a Master, Mr. Sanders was distinguished as a strict disciplinarian and possessed in a singular degree the faculty of detecting and stimulating the abilities of those placed under his charge. On the 29th June, 1847, the boarders left Blundell's in pursuance of the Vice-Chancellor's decree of the 29th October, 1846, and in leaving they presented him with a silver inkstand inscribed thus: "Presented to the Rev. Henry Sanders, M.A., in token of their esteem and gratitude for the benefits derived from his tuition and their regret at leaving him so suddenly by the last of the boarders at Blundell's School, 1847." *Trewwin's* states that "the scene of the presentation was most touching, the pupils and their preceptor were equally overcome and after several fruitless attempts to give expression to his feelings he was obliged to retire." At the break-up

supper, at the end of that half, Mr. Sanders thus addressed them—I quote from the same newspaper: “‘My boys, it is now nearly 14 years since I took upon me the duties of Head Master, and ever since that time as I have endeavoured never to pass over a fault, so I trust you will acquit me of the charge of punishing offenders too severely. I hope you will distinguish yourselves so that in a few years it may be said, those are the fruits of the old system which has been productive of so much good.’ Thus ended a day of painful and melancholy interest.” Mr. Sanders was presented that year to the Rectory of Sowton, Devon, by the then Bishop of Exeter, Dr. Philpotts, and this he held to his death.

At Christmas, 1847, Mr. Sanders resigned the Head Mastership and was presented with a silver kettle, bearing an inscription said to be written by his old pupil, Frederick Temple, afterwards Archbishop of Canterbury: “*Facti e discipulis Amici Henrico Sanders, M.A., sedem non animum mutant Scholæ Blundellinæ nuper alumni, 1847.*”^{*} The inkstand is now in the possession of the Rev. F. A. Sanders, Rector of Woodleigh, Devon, and the kettle in that of Mr. C. B. Sanders, of Pinhoe, Devon, the nephews and executors of the Head Master.

In 1875 Dr. Temple, then Bishop of Exeter, made him Archdeacon of Exeter and Canon of the Cathedral, and in 1885 Chancellor of the Cathedral. Mrs. Sanders died 21st April, 1882, and the Archdeacon on the 24th June, 1888, just previous to an Old Boys' Day, at which he was to have been specially entertained as the guest of the day. Both the Archdeacon and his wife are buried at Sowton. Mr. Sanders was the last of the long line of Head Masters under the old regime at Blundell's. He makes 352 entries in 13½ years, averaging 26 2/27 per annum, and leaves 31 boys at the School. At the date of the Vice-Chancellor's Decree (29th Oct., 1846), the School had 82 boys, but from that date to Dec., 1847, 14 months, when Mr. Sanders resigned, the School lost 61 boys and only had 10 entries.

JOHN BICKLEY HUGHES 1847-1873.

THE Rev. J. B. HUGHES was born at Battle House, Bromham, Wilts, June 13th, 1817. He was the son of Major Hughes, who from Eton had proceeded M.A. and Fellow of King's Coll., Camb. Major Hughes afterwards joined the 1st Dragoons, saw service in the war with the Nizam, and was Adjutant of the Wilts Militia during the threatened invasion by Napoleon. The Rev. J. B. Hughes was educated at King Edward VI. School, Bruton, Somerset, and proceeded to Magdalen Coll., Oxon., as Demy and Exhibitioner. He took his M.A. degree and Orders in 1841, and became Assistant Master at Marlborough College. He was appointed Usher of Blundell's on the 27th August, 1844, and upon the resignation of the Rev. H. Sanders was elected Headmaster November 12th, 1847. He was married in St. Peter's Church, Tiverton, on the 4th January, 1848, by Dr. Wilkinson, the first Headmaster of Marlborough College, to Elizabeth, daughter of the Rev. Henry Middleton, Vicar of Barton Stacey, Hants. The Rev. Sholto Middleton, Blundell's Scholar at Balliol, 1853, and Usher of the School from 1859-1864, was Mr. Hughes' brother-in-law and only left Blundell's to be appointed Headmaster of Mr. Hughes' old School, at Bruton. Mr. Hughes had nine children, all born at Blundell's, all of whom still survive. Of these four were sons educated at the School, the youngest of whom, Walter Octavius of Mag. Coll., Oxon, won his "blue" for athletics. Mr. Hughes was much interested in architecture and published several works on the subject, among them "The Churches of Tiverton," "Antiquities of an Ecclesiastical Character in Tiverton," "History of Huntsham Church," &c. He was the Hon. Sec. to the Committee for the Restoration of St. Peter's Church, Tiverton, in 1853-6. Mr. Hughes resigned the Headmastership in 1873, upon a pension of £200 per ann. from the School, and was presented by the Dean and Chapter of Exeter Cathedral to the Vicarage of Staverton, Devon, where he still resides. He was Dean Rural of Totnes, 1881-1900, and published a history of that office. He makes 672 entries in the School Register in

26 years, averaging 25 $\frac{11}{13}$ per annum and leaves 92 boys at the School.

Mr. Hughes' Headmastership therefore covers nearly the whole of the transition period from the Vice-Chancellor's Decree forbidding Boarders to all Masters, through the 1852 Scheme of the Court of Chancery (which allowed 10 boarders to each Assistant Master, excluding the Headmaster and Usher) and the 1865 Scheme of the Charity Commission (which removed the limit of boarders to the Assistant Masters) to the final Scheme of 1876 by the same Commission (which allows boarders to all Masters and under which the School is now regulated); and although this has been the most critical period in the long history of the School, Mr. Hughes' average annual entry did not fall below that of Mr. Atherton or Mr. Keats, while it is only a fraction less than that of Dr. Sanders. AUGUSTUS LAWRENCE FRANCIS 1874.

MR. A. L. FRANCIS, Scholar and Fellow of Jesus Coll., Camb., was elected Head Master on the 20th December, 1873, and was the first layman to occupy that position. He was born Jan. 16, 1848, and educated at Christ's Hospital. He took a First Class in the Classical Tripos, 1870; M.A., 1871; and became Sixth Form Master at Dulwich. He comes of a long line of distinguished scholars. He is the son of Mr. H. R. Francis, Fellow of St. John's Coll., Camb., and Judge of the Supreme Court, N.S. Wales, and grandson of Philip Francis, of Ranelagh, the friend of Geo. IV. Philip Francis was in his turn the son of Sir Philip Francis, the immortal author of the Junius letters, the rival and opponent of Warren Hastings in the Viceroyalty of India, and the cause of his subsequent impeachment.

Sir Philip's father was the tutor of Gibbon and the translator of Horace and Demosthenes, while his grandfather was Dr. John Francis, Dean of Lismore. Mr. A. L. Francis married in 1874 Emily Constance, daughter of the late Major-General Robert Unwin, who had served with distinction in every Indian campaign from General Nott's Afghan march down to the Relief of Lucknow. Mr. Francis has continued the literary traditions of his family in various ways and a translation of Sophocles' "Ajax" by him was rendered at the School Speech Day in 1901.

His eldest son (an O.B.), is an Assistant Commissioner in the N.E. Rhodesia, and fought with the Wilts Yeomanry in the Boer war.

Mr. Francis is still the Head Master of the School, and it is therefore difficult to speak of his work there. It may suffice to say that under him the School has attained its highest pitch of prosperity since its foundation, both in the numbers and successes of its scholars. From the date of his appointment in December, 1874, to May, 1882 (when the School was removed to new buildings at Horsdon, and this portion of the Register ends), Mr. Francis makes 256 entries in 8½ years, averaging 30 18/25 per annum.

From Mr. Francis' first entry (Feb. 3, 1874), to the opening of his own house for boarders, under the 1876 scheme, which allowed all Masters,

including the Headmaster, to receive boarders (Nov. 1, 1880), seven years, the number of entries were 223, averaging $31 \frac{6}{7}$ per annum, and from that date to the removal of the School in May, 1882, $1\frac{1}{4}$ years, the number of entries were 32, averaging $24\frac{1}{4}$ per annum.

In May, 1882 there were 88 boys who went to the new buildings, and in addition there was an entry of 12 new boys at the beginning of the first term, these making exactly 100 with which to commence the new era.

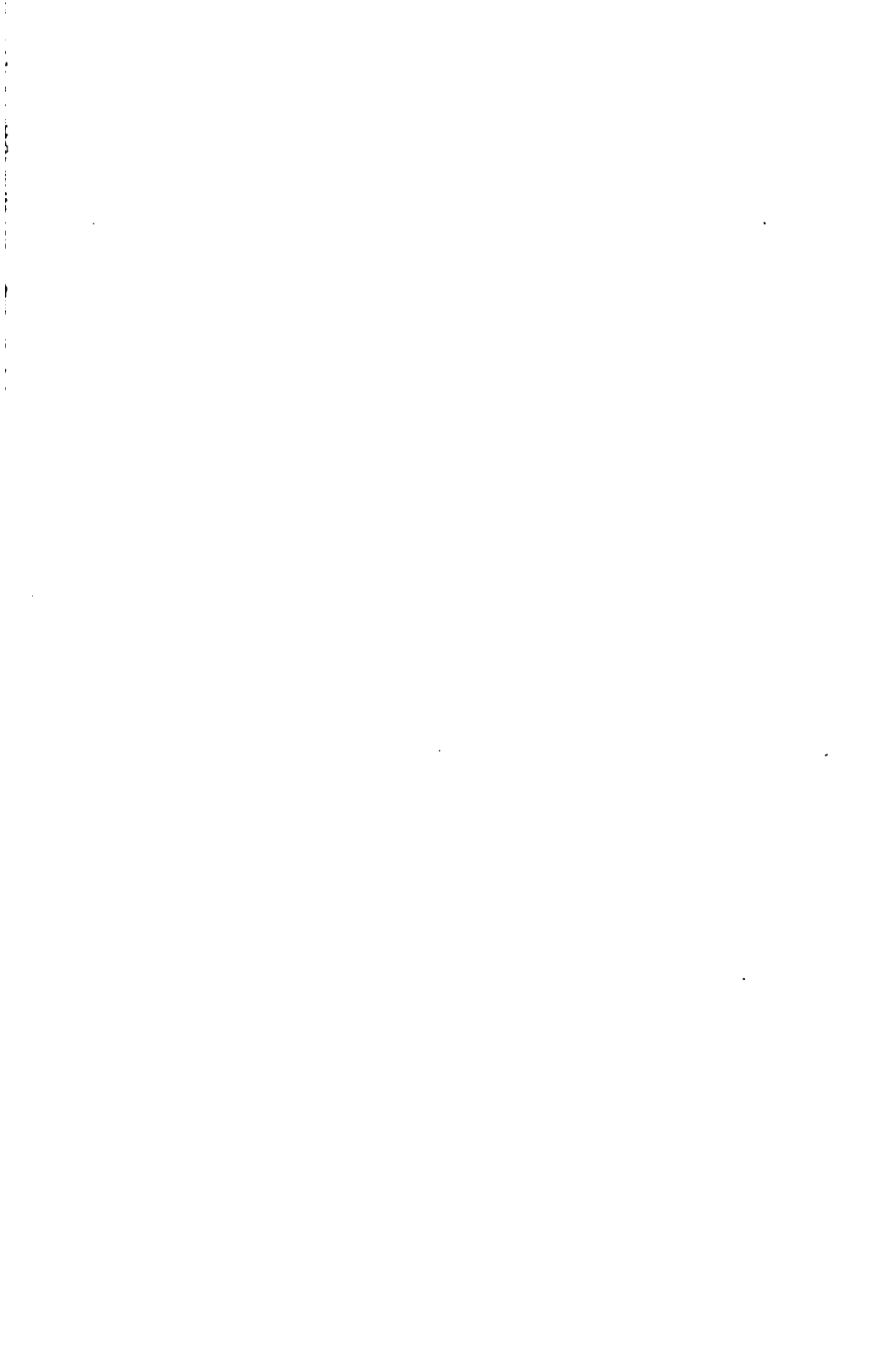
