

# PREFACE.

HE Registers of a comparatively obscure parish, like Calverley, cannot be expected to yield a great amount of genealogical material that will be interesting outside the district. Its value must necessarily be local, rather than general. Nevertheless, some good grain will be found among what may appear to some eyes to be mere husks and chaff. Some may ask "why the chaff has not been left out?". This might have been attempted, had any person been competent always to distinguish between the two; certainly I am not. Different people are interested in different names and families, and perhaps no two antiquaries, in making extracts from a register, would note down The lawyers well know the value of a the same entries. document of this nature when printed entire; and so do many antiquaries. In fact, the public attention has been very much directed of late to this subject. It will hardly be questioned that persons of good family, will be pleased to see the baptisms of their forefathers in print, even though their rank in life was not so high as that at present held by their descendants. Again, nearly all families which are now of good position, at one time occupied a lower station; and the families which are now "rising from the ranks," and growing into wealth and consideration, have a natural wish to enquire and learn something about their ancestors, although their names may not have served to enrich emblazoned pedigrees and county histories. Even the poorer classes like to be able to count up their forefathers, and understand how they are related to those whom they call cousins, and from whom they may hope to inherit property, under certain circumstances, such as intestacy. It is almost solely to Parish Registers that they must look for this information.

I venture to think that it would be an act of great injustice, as well as of inconvenience, if all the Parish Registers were carried off to London, as a few well-meaning genealogists have proposed. Centralization is a greedy, grasping, monster, that, in order to pamper the tastes, and promote

the ease and comfort of the few, would sacrifice the rights and privileges of the many. This view has been taken by a writer in the "Antiquary" in the March number of the present year; and I cannot do better than make use of the reasons, so fairly and so ably stated, in addition to those which had already occurred in my own mind.

First, the registers are parish property, and to remove them would be an act of confiscation which nothing could justify, except some overwhelming benefit to the nation at

large.

Secondly. For once that any antiquary, or genealogist, or person at a distance, requires to inspect a register, people resident in the particular parish require this fifty times. Local genealogists, it may be added, will require to consult the register a hundred times. They will say "Nihil humani à me alienum puto." London genealogists will wish to see one single entry, or the entries relating to one particular family only, while the local ones will be interested in all.

Thirdly. For most legal purposes, registers are most conveniently placed where they are. A lawyer's clerk has constantly to compare the certified copy with the original book. Is he to go to London every time? If its legal custodian has to produce the register in the Court of Assize, it would cost the litigants very much less to have it taken to the county town, than to pay a clerk from Somerset

House to bring it all the way from London.

Fourthly. It would be very cruel to the poor, to deprive them of their present facilities for obtaining certificates. The Clergy, it is well known, make presents of a large number of certified copies, every year, to needy parishioners; and allow properly-introduced antiquaries to consult their registers, without making any charge. Often, the monument in the Parish Church is the key to the register book, and furnishes the year that is missing; nay, sometimes the monumental inscription alone identifies the person buried.\* It is certain that our churches cannot be stripped of all their epitaphs, for the sake of a few Londoners, who wish

to "live at home at ease." Besides, if all the old registers, before 1813, were removed; there must be a modern book kept, as by law directed, which in the case of small parishes it would take many years to fill. Therefore the genealogist desiring to make a general search, might find that half the books were in London, and that the person he was in quest of had died a few months later than 1812; and he must still go down to the country for his search. Who, again, is to certify copies of registers? If the Registrar General's certificate is to supersede that of the clergy, the latter must be compensated for the loss of income, which in some cases is by far the largest part of the proceeds of the living. And how absurd to have one person certifying to the entries of 1812, and another to those of 1813.

Lastly. Would the registers themselves be safer than at present? The writer in the Antiquary does not hesitate to assert that more records have disappeared and been lost from depositories in London than from those in the country. And he gives the very sensible and reasonable advice, that instead of taking away the registers themselves, Government should direct official copies to be taken, and deposited at Somerset House. To that there could be no objection, and it might further be enacted that such copies should be taken as legal evidence, in case the original registers should have been lost, or accidentally burnt, (as those at Doncaster were)

or become illegible.

It would have been a useless incumbrance to this book, had I printed the entries in full. Therefore the words "baptized, married, buried," &c., have been omitted, but a page is given verbatim et literatim, at the beginning of each division, to shew the form in which the registers were anciently kept. In every instance the original spelling of the names has been retained; but some of the initial letters, which occur in small letters, have been printed in capitals.

I should have been glad, could I have filled up the chasms from the Transcripts in the Archbishop's Registry, but as they are reported as "incomplete, and in disorder," I abandoned the attempt. Wherever they do exist, it is most desirable that proper copies of them should be obtained, and lodged in the iron safe of the parish, and there is perhaps no way in which churchwardens could expend public money more wisely.

My original intention was, not to annotate at all, letting

the register tell its own tale; but I have added a few notes while the sheets were passing through the press. It would

have been easy to make them more numerous.

The price of this book has been purposely kept down, in hopes that it may thereby obtain a larger circulation, and a wider sphere of usefulness. The prices of some Parish Registers that have been published lately, are so high, that few purses can afford to buy all that are now advertised to appear. Valuable as any one single register is, if printed entire,—"worth its weight in gold," as one of our most distinguished living genealogists wrote-comparison with other registers is of paramount importance. It will be generally found that the first child was baptized in the parish in which the parents of the young mother resided. And as for the marriages, previous to Lord Hardwicke's Act, (26 Geo. II. cap. 33.) which came into operation on the first of January, 1754, they seem to have been celebrated anywhere. except in the churches of the parishes in which the persons to be married dwelt. Many of the License Bonds preserved in the Archbishop's Registry give the persons intending to marry, the choice of two or three churches.

I have to be speak the indulgence of my readers for the History &c. of the Church. It only professes to be a hastily filled in sketch, drawn by a youthful and inexperienced

hand.

My best thanks are due to the Rev. James W. Hatton, M.A., Vicar of Calverley, for his kindness in giving me unreserved permission to use the registers; to the Rev. C. B. Norcliffe, M.A., of York, who is ever ready to help other antiquaries, for numerous extracts from his large and valuable Manuscript Collections; to Mr. J. Horsfall-Turner, of College House, Idel, for extracts from wills proved at York, &c., and to Charles W. Thistleton, Esq., of York, for permission to see and make extracts from Torre's MSS.

It will be seen that I am indebted to Burn's History of Parish Registers for much of the general information con-

tained in the "Introduction."

The Index has cost me a good deal of labour, but will, I know, be considered by many persons as a most useful, and by others as an indispensable feature of the book.

I shall be only too glad to receive corrections and additions.

# CalBerley Church.

N old parish church is always an interesting, and locally, an important building, even though it has not been associated with great events in history. On it are sure to have been employed the most strenuous energies that could be expended, in order to make it, in structure and design, the best building in the place. look at its weather-worn walls and mouldering pinnacles, our thoughts naturally revert to the period when it was first erected, and the times through which it has continued to stand. Perhaps it had its first existence when the Saxons had cleared a space in the forest, and tilled a few "hides" of the rich virgin soil. One of their first thoughts would be to erect some place which they might set apart for the worship of God. Theirs would be no grand stone edifice, with arches and towers. They were not great at architecture. A few rough logs of wood would be their building materials, and perhaps the size of the church would be the only feature distinguishing it from the huts in which the villagers lived. Then, after the Normans had come and dispossessed the Saxons, a stone building, with its circular arches and windows, would supplant the old wooden church. If, in after centuries, the accommodation became insufficient, a larger and more elaborate building would be raised, much of the material of the old being used in the construction of the new.\* Then when the national taste became debased, the plain stone walls and the oakwork would be covered with successive coats of plaster and paint, "those lovely delights

of churchwardens in the good old times;" the carved work would perchance be broken down "with axes and hammers," and burnt, and ugly additions made to the edifice, which marred its beauty, and destroyed its distinctive features.

What scenes these old walls at Calverley have witnessed! Here they have stood through the times of the Norman feudal lords, when men were treated as so many cattle. Within them have worshipped men who fought at Poictiers, Agincourt, Shrewsbury, and Marston Moor. They outlasted the monasteries, and sheltered the soldiers of the Commonwealth. The bells have called pious worshippers to the Romish mass, and rung out the welcome news of victories under Nelson and Wellington. In the "fat churchyard" are buried the forefathers of numbers who still live within the sound of the village bells; while children have been baptized here who were destined to "make their mark in the world."

The traveller passing up the Aire valley, when midway between London and Edinburgh, has a momentary glance at the hoary old building. Standing on a gentle declivity overlooking the valley, it forms a conspicuous object in the landscape; and, being embowered among trees, is exceedingly picturesque. The best view of it is that looking from the south entrance to the village.\* In the foreground are some old cottages and farm buildings; to the left the vicarage, overshadowed by tall beeches; to the right and directly behind, are the "Lodge" and "Old Spring" woods. These are backed up by the leafy slopes of Esholt, and the heather of Ilkley and Rombald's Moor. Over these again, can be seen a bit of the north side of Wharfedale.

A nearer view shews that the building is in the usual form of large churches, consisting of tower, nave, chancel, aisles, and porch. It contains specimens of all the leading styles of architecture, from Norman to Perpendicular. Before the restoration, it had also a considerable quantity of "Churchwardens' Gothic" incorporated with it. The architecture, though generally pure, is almost devoid of ornament, unless the necessary mouldings of the arches, and the tracery of the windows, can be so called. It is simplicity itself, and plainness personified, compared with many churches.

How long there has been a church at Calverley, is uncertain, but no doubt parts of the present edifice have seen seven centuries; and it is more than probable that the Saxons had a place of worship here. The village is certainly of Saxon origin, judging from its name, which means "the field of the calf-herd." There is no mention of a church here in Domesday Book—1086; but this is far from being conclusive proof that none such existed, as many places are known to have possessed churches at that period which are not mentioned in that record.\*

Again, the patron-saint—St. Wilfred—was a Saxon, and, I believe, there is no instance of a church of Norman foundation being dedicated to a Saxon saint. The contempt of the Normans for aught pertaining to the vanquished race seems to have prevented such an occurrence. For further proof see pp. 17 and 18. The Saxon church, being in all probability of wood, was most likely destroyed in the

So well acquainted with the Domesday Survey as Sir Henry Spelman must have been, it is somewhat singular that he should have advanced, on the authority of Sprott's Chronicle, that at the time of its formation there were found to be no less than forty-five thousand and eleven parish churches within the kingdom, whereas in truth the whole number actually noticed in the Survey amounts to a few more than one thousand seven hundred; and it is remarkable, that while two hundred and seventy-two Churches were returned from Lincolnshire, two hundred and forty-three from Norfolk, and three hundred and sixty-four from Suffolk, one only can be found in the return for Cambridgeshire, and none in Lancashire (between the Ribble and the Mersey), Cornwall, or even Middlesex. The whole number of Churches recorded in the Survey falls considerably under what there are grounds for concluding they must have amounted to about or soon after the time of the Conquest." Sir Henry Ellis' "Introduction to Domesday," I. §7, p. 286. The author then gives instances of Churches, of the existence of which at or before that time unexceptional evidence is adduced, and remarks that "if, as is commonly reported, thirty-six Churches were destroyed by the Conqueror, in order to enlarge the new forest in Hampshire, this is an argument that they could not be so few as the number entered in Domesday is surmised to imply."-Denne, Archaol. vol. viii. p. 223. The enquiries of the King's Commissioners were probably not meant to extend to Churches unendowed with land, so that great numbers would from this cause be omitted.

wholesale devastation of the north of England by William

the Conqueror.

However, it is certain that about the beginning of the reign of Henry the Second (1154) one of the family of Calverley, alias Scot, built or rebuilt and endowed a church here. It is uncertain which member of the family performed this pious deed, but most probably it was John Calverley, son of the John who came into England as steward to the Empress Maud.\* The only parts of this building which now remain are the nave walls. About the middle of the south nave wall still exists one of the original circular-headed Norman windows, now walled up. It was discovered there on removing the plaster during the late restoration of the church.† The foundations, &c., of some of the pillars when taken out were found to be stones corresponding to those forming this window. These Norman windows are remarkable on account of their great size inside compared with the outside. At Adel and many other places may be seen windows of the same class. They were thus formed in order to obtain the maximum of light with the minimum of cold air, being, of course, unglazed. This Norman church would very likely be similar, in size and general appearance, though not so elaborate in detail, to the far-famed one at Adel. which was founded in 1140, and has just been restored.

The Rev. Alfred Brown in a lecturet on "Calverley and

its Story," says-

"Our church had certainly a north aisle, which existed 25 years ago, with arches of a much lower elevation than the present, of which fragments are still visible. There has been a chancel, but somewhat narrower than the present chancel, the foundations of which, consisting evidently of stones belonging to a still more ancient structure, have been discovered. Besides, where the ancient chancel wall has joined the nave there were signs in the moss found upon the lime and stones to testify of a former ruined church.

Are not all these tokens of two Norman erections, the one more ancient than even the oldest part of the nave walls, and that chancel, the foundations of which I have said have been brought to light? There are other signs testifying of erections at different periods; e. g., the tower inclines from S.W. to N.E., the nave more to the E., the walls curving at the W. to meet or fit the tower, and the chancel inclines again to the S.E. Each portion of the church seems to attest its erection independently of the others, inasmuch as the walls are nowhere tied into each other."

He goes on to say,—"The crooked tower arch is only on a piece with the irregularity of the rest of the structure, and would only look worse if it were altered,—a step which the architect has firmly set his face against. It is one of the marked and singular features of our church. How the deformity has arisen it is impossible to say. It may have been intended to correct the irregularity of the ground plan; perhaps drawings were sent by monks, and the country masons were unequal to their work. There the arch stands to tell its story of a primitive and ruder style and age."

This arch belongs to a later style of architecture.—the "Decorated Gothic." The church was partly rebuilt at the beginning of the 14th century. "To do this," again quoting Calverley and its Story, "both sides of the nave have been pierced for the insertion of the present arches, the south aisle entirely built, . . . the large west window inserted, and the whole of the chancel re-built upon somewhat broader, though perhaps shorter, foundations, than the old one; for the sedilia, now restored, seem to have been part of the older chancel, and removed to their late position, which they did not exactly fit into, and were probably coeval with the old Norman church." The sedilia are three in number. Elizabeth Patefyn, d. of John de Calverley, and Thomas Patefyn, of Headingley, left (in 1340) her "best animal" to Calverley Church, as a mortuary, being a common custom, and to 3 chaplains 60s, per annum each for celebrating service for a vear at Calverlev.\*

The corbels† supporting the arch spanning the north aisle, and separating it from the Calverley chapel, or quere, now

The church was again altered in the latter part of the 15th century by William Calverley.† At this date the clerestory and the upper part of the tower seem to have been added.

On the south side of the chancel is to be seen one of those curious "Low-side," or "Leper's" windows, which have caused so much speculation among archœologists. Its sill is much lower than the others, and a transom runs across the window at the height of the sill of the next chancel window. The opening, now blocked with masonry, shows traces of a grating, which was in existence before the restoration of the church in 1870.

Low-side windows do not seem to have been glazed; they were fenced by a grating as mentioned above, and closed by an oaken shutter inside. Various theories have been advanced to account for them, none of which seem perfectly satisfactory. One theory was that they were intended to enable persons to watch the Pasch-light, or the light placed in the Easter sepulchre from Good Friday to Easter, without entering the church, and hence they have received the name Lychnoscopes. Another theory was that a certain sect of hermits, not caring to mix with the congregation in general, were in the habit of making their offerings through these windows. Another explanation is that they were meant for lepers, or persons out of the pale of the church, to communicate at, in place of joining the congre-

gation; from this they are sometimes called "leper windows."\* Again it is suggested that they were meant for the distribution of alms. Another theory is, that they were used as confessionals, but there is at least one instance where one occurs in domestic architecture. All these theories, however, fall to the ground when it is remembered that there are cases where these windows are in existence at a considerable distance from the ground.

In the Journal of the Archaeological Institute, for March 1848, Mr. Cole suggests that the low-side window might be the place where the sacristan stood to ring a bell at the mo-

ment of the "manifestation of the host."

The most probable theory is perhaps that advanced by Mr F. P. Lowe, in a paper read at the joint meeting of the architectural societies of Lincolnshire and the archdeaconry of Northampton, in 1850, On Low-side Windows (to which paper I am greatly indebted for my information). He concludes that "these windows were intended to serve the purpose of casements, and that they were made use of for any purpose to which casements might be applied. The windows of a church, especially in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries, were generally set so high in the walls as to be out of the reach of persons standing on the floor; added to which, at that time, the use of stained glass became common. It is clear that no casement could be constructed in a painted glass window, for the form of the casement would interfere materially with the design in the window; added to which, the risk of breakage would have been too serious to allow such an arrangement to be thought of. It was therefore necessary, for the purpose of ventilation certainly, and

it may be for some other reasons, to have other openings to the outer air unconnected with the windows, and hence low-side windows were introduced: they were placed low, in order to be within reach of the officers in the church, so that they might regulate the admission of air, and also that they might not interfere with the symmetrical appearance of the painted windows. They were closed with a shutter in order that when not in use they might not interfere with the general effect, whilst they were grated instead of glazed, for the free admission of air." In after times, when there was no incense burned, and the chancels were used for sittings, they would be found inconvenient, and would be walled up.

### OLD STAINED GLASS.

On the last day of May, 1620, when the antiquary Roger Dodsworth visited the church, there were the following coats of arms, &c., in the windows:—

## "EST WINDOW.

Calverlay. A man kneeling in armour, on his breast gules, a scutcheon between 6 owles argent.

(Gospatrick) Gules, a bezant.

Plumpton. Azure, on 5 fuzelles, en fesse or, 5 escallops, gules.

#### NORTH WINDOW.

(Hawkesworth.) Sable, 3 falcons close argent. (Gospatrick) Gules, a bezant. Argent, an egle displayed, azure.

#### SOUTH WINDOW.

THORNHILL. Gules, 2 barrs gemewise and a chief argent. (Ward) Azure, a cross flory argent.

Argent, a lyon rampant gules, on his breast an [annulet?]

WARD. Azure, a cross flory.

CALUERLEY. Sable, on a scutcheon between 6 owles, a mollett of 6 points pierced gules.

(Normanville.) Argent on a fesse between 2 double cotises gules, 3 fleurs-de-lis of the first.

### SOUTH QUIRE WINDOW.

A woman kneeling, on her garment, per pale CALVERLEY, and gules, 2 barrs gemelles and a chief argent. (Thornhill.)

#### NORTH WINDOW.

(Bigod.) Or, on a cross engrailed gules, 5 escallops ermine. (Tyas?) Argent, a cross gules.

(Tonge.) Sable, a bend argent, between 2 cotises and 6 martletts or, a border argent.

(Langton?) Gules, a chevron ermine between 3 lyons rampant or.

#### SOUTH WINDOW.

(Old Percy.) Azure, 5 fuzelles in fesse or. SWILLINGTON. Argent, a saltire gules."

Dr. Whitaker says, in Loidis and Elmete, (1816) p. 229, that fifty years before, there were the following relies of painted glass in Calverlev Church.

In the east window a crucifixion and these arms:-

1. Calverley, an inescutcheon argent in an orle of owls sable.

2. The same, impaling Tempest, twice under a group of figures, and this inscription :-

## "Orate pro bono Statu UAm'i Calue'lep."

3. (Markenfield.) Argent, on a bend sable three annulets or (bezants).

4. Argent, an egle displayed sable.

Sable, a chevron between three lions 5. (Langton.) rampant argent.

6. Sable, a bend argent.

7. England with a label of three points sable. Semé of fleurs de lys. Duchy of Lancaster. (? Richard, Duke of Cornwall, King of the Romans.)

8. Old France quartering England.

Also the figure of a Calverley kneeling, his arms on his

tabard, behind him three sons.

It seems, then, that the whole of the painted glass remaining had been removed to the east window, and that there was a considerable proportion missing since 1620. This may be accounted for partly by the inevitable decay from weather, and partly by the bad workmanship and bad taste of the country glaziers, who, if a piece dropped out, would not stick at putting in its place a piece of plain white glass. There is now a further deficiency, the only remaining old glass being:—A crucifixion and four figures, one holding a book, several parts of canopies, &c., and the following heraldic glass:—

1. CALVERLEY. Sable, an inescutcheon and an orle of

owls, argent.

2. THORNHILL. Gules, two bars gemelles and a chief argent. (This shield has had a piece of glass which is foreign to it fitted into its base.)

3. EDWARD III. France ancient, with the lions of Eng-

land.

4. Tong. Sable, a bend argent, between two bendlets and six martlets or.

5. MARKENFIELD. Argent, on a bend sable, three bezants.

6. Gules, three lions passant or, with a label of three points of France.

7. Argent, an eagle displayed azure.

Besides these shields there are several fragments of heraldic glass.—Argent, several martlets (more correctly storm finches) sable, portions of a Tempest coat. Sable, owls argent—Calverley. Parts of a shield—France ancient. Sable, a falcon argent—Hawksworth. Part of a shield parted per pale, sable, and argent—martlets sable—Calverley and Tempest. Four Calverleys kneeling, one with his arms on his tabard. Sable a lion rampant argent. Several fragments—Sable, a griffin or. There are also the following fragments of an inscription scattered over the window.

The window was supposed to be restored in 1870, when several additions were made. It is a pity the work was not placed in better hands.

William Calverley's\* tombstone still remains within the communion rails, but it has been covered by encaustic tiles. The inscription was fast wearing away, but to cover it over was surely a singular means of preserving it. In 1620 the inscription was copied in full by Roger Dodsworth. It is given partially by Whitaker in Loidis and Elmete, p. 229.

"Grate pro anima Millielmi Calberley qui obiit 12 die Septembris Anno Domini, MCCCCC septimus. Cujus anime propitietur Deus."

The following is Dodsworth's description, as given in Jennings' MSS., Brit. Mus., Harl. MS. 797.

"A tombe on the northe side the quyer, thereon engraved the portraiture of a man's hand, on his breast per pale gu. a bezant, an inescutcheon enter 6 owles. His wife with Sayvile's crest.

About it thus:

Caluerlay, 1507. Pray for the soule of William Calverley, Knt., and for the good estate of Alice, his wife, wch. William dyed the xv. day of Sept. in the yeare of our Lord MVC.seven. On whose soule God have mercy."

At the same date there was—

On a stone in the south quire—
"'Pray for the soule of Thomas de Thornour and Margaret sometymes his wife & of their parents whose soules rest for ever in peace."

Dodsworth gives the following list of "Townes in Calverley Parish:—(1) Calverley, (2) Idell, (3) Nether Pudsey, (4) Over Pudsey, (5) Oldcotes, (6) Wros, (7) Windhill, (8) ffersley, (9) Woodlands, (10) Stanningley, (11) Woodhall,


(12) Stonsdell,\* (13) Over Bolton & (14) Nether Bolton, (15) Priesthorpe, (16) Rodley, & (17) Bramley."—Jennings' MSS. The fifth, sixth, ninth, eleventh, twelfth, and fifteenth are at present only small hamlets, and, I doubt not, were no larger in 1620. Only a portion of Rodley is in Calverley parish and township.



### ANCIENT MEMORIAL CROSS SLABS.

One of the most interesting discoveries made during the restoration of the church in 1870, was that of ten ancient incised cross slabs. They are at present deposited outside, the church, close to the north aisle wall, except Nos. 5, 6, and 7, which are built into that wall, of course exposing the design. One of them (No. 9) had been re-cut in 1845, and built into the front of the porch, at the time certain alterations were made in the church. The rest had been used as base-moulds, window heads and sills, &c., in the chancel, which is of the "Decorated" style, so that it is several centuries since they were thus used, or rather mis-used, shewing that the practice of converting these sacred memorials into building materials is not confined to modern times. "A few years ago, on taking down the tower of the church of Helpstone, Northants, it was found that a very considerable proportion of the stone used in its construction was composed of monumental slabs, on which were incised many beautiful crosses of the 13th century. More than a hundred of these stones must therefore have been removed from the chancel floor and cemetery, to help in building the tower, which was of the succeeding style, viz. 'The Decorated.'"—D. A. Walter's "Ancient Memorial Cross Slabs from the Churches of York," pp. 3 and 4.


The term, "Incised Cross Slabs" is applied to those flat stones having a cross and other emblems engraved or incised upon them, which are to be found in our ancient Cathedrals, Churches, and Cemeteries. In shape, they taper in width from head to foot, and are of all lengths, from two to six or

























even seven feet, and vary in thickness from three to nine inches. In many cases, the cross is the sole emblem employed. The design is expressed by lines of different degrees of thickness, which were originally filled up with

pitch or cement.

No. 1 is a beautiful specimen of the 13th century style. It is of the variety called *quasi-incised*, the head of the cross having the parts forming the design sunk from the general surface, and the stem and "Calvary" incised. "Calvary" is the term applied to a base formed of the representation of steps, symbolical of Mount Calvary. The sword by the side of the cross indicates that the stone originally covered the grave of a soldier or a knight. It was usual to carve on these slabs some emblem of the calling of the deceased.

No. 2 is probably an early 14th century specimen. The base terminates in a *fleur-de-lys*, on the dexter side of the cross is a sword, and on the sinister a shield, shewing that a knight who bore arms has rested beneath it. The design is

"quasi-incised."

No. 3 is also "quasi-incised." It is either of the Saxon,

or a very early Norman period.

No. 4 is Norman. This is probably the memorial stone of Henry Scot, styled "de Puchegehidsay," son of William (or Walter) Scot, or de Calverley, who was living circ. 1200. Henry was a Knight Templar, and the order of Knights Templars bore as their badge a double cross, which occurs on this slab.

No. 5 is unlike any other slab I have ever seen described, and I do not know to what period to assign it. Perhaps it is the base of a cross, but I very much doubt its being a memorial slab at all.

No. 6. Saxon, or 11th century. This is probably a frag-

ment of a larger stone.

No. 7, of the 11th century, is probably a fragment. The 11th and 12th century crosses are distinguished by being of the heraldic form called "Cross Pattée." The four pellets are remarkable.

No. 8 is "quasi-incised." The chalice placed on the stem of the cross is the emblem of a priest. Date, Early 14th

century.

No. 9, of the 13th century, is a cross not unlike that of St. Cuthbert, in a circular head.

No. 10 was found buried, apparently just as it had been originally placed, near to where it now lies. It is rudely executed, and may be of the 11th century. The stem of the cross bears shoots and leaves, and the circular head is divided per saltire.

If Nos. 3, 6, and 7 are really Saxon designs, we may be almost certain that there was a church here before the Con-

quest.

## HISTORY OF THE LIVING.

As has before been said, it was about 1154 that the Church at Calverley was first endowed, probably by John de Calverley. The living did not, however, remain long in the hands of the family, for, in or about 1217, (Foster in his Yorkshire Pedigrees, says 1176) it was given by William le Scot, or de Calverley, to the Chapel or College of St. Mary and the Holy Angels, or as it was commonly called, St. Sepulchre's chapel, at its foundation, and appropriated thereto. This chapel stood on the north side of York Cathedral, and opened thereinto.\* The charter of its institution will be of interest, as it shows fully how the great tithes of Calverley were alienated. The original is of course in Latin.

"CHARTER of the Foundation of the Chapel of the Blessed Mary and the Holy Angels, near the Archbishop's Palace,

in the city of York.

ROGER, by the grace of God, Archbishop of York, having built against the great church a chapel, he dedicated it to the name of the Blessed and Immaculate Virgin Mary and the Holy Angels, for the celebration of divine services, to the honour of God, glory of his successors, and a remission of his own sins. He ordained the same to be a perpetual habitation for thirteen clerks of different orders, viz:—four priests, four deacons, four sub-deacons, and one sacrist, all those to be subservient to the will of the archbishop, especially the sacrist, who shall be constituted procurator of the

rents and revenues belonging to it, paying each of the priests ten marks per annum, for his own salary, besides the revenues of the rents that remain over, and besides what will complete the sum of all the portions of the priests, deacons, and subdeacons. Also he willed that the said sacrist of his own cost expend ten shillings on *Maunday*, as well in veiles, wine, ale, vessels, and water for washing the feet of the canons, and other poor clerks, to the use of these poor clerks, and also to contribute sixteen shillings to the diet of the said poor clerks, that in all things the fraternity and unity

of the church may be preserved.

And for their necessary sustenation, he, of his own bounty, gave them the churches of Everton, Sutton with Scorby Chapel, Heyton, Berdesey, and Ottlay, one mediety; and procured of the liberality of other faithful persons the church of Calverley, the gift of William le Scot, the church of Hoton, the gift of William Paganel; the church of Harwood, the gift of Avacie de Ruminilly; the church of Thorpe, the gift of Adam de Bruys and Ivette de Arches, his wife. To this chapel also did belong the churches of Collingham, Clareburg, and Retford. Roger provided also that the churches which were not of donation should be free from synodals, and all other things due to the Archbishop, his successors, and their officials, and ordered that they should as quietly and freely hold these churches, which are of his donation, as others have before them. Lastly, he ordained, for the more diligent serving of the chapel, that none of the said clerks should dwell out of the city, which, if they presumed to do, they should be displaced by the archbishop, and another of the same order be by him appointed."

—Dugdale's Monasticon.

In A.D. 1258, Archbishop Sewall ordained a vicarage at Calverley. By the ordination charter (which is too long to print here) the vicar was to receive fifteen marks per annum out of the alterage of the church, or else to take the whole alterage, and pay fifteen marks per annum to the sacrist of the chapel of St. Mary and the Holy Angels, who was to distribute six marks per annum among the poor of the parish. The Vicar was to pay procurations, and repair the chancel.

From this time to the Reformation, the chapel of S. Mary and all Angels presented to the living of Calverley, but their right was twice disputed by the descendants of William Calverley. Roger le Scot de Calverley, son of William, in the time of King John, was the first to do so.

"Pleas, the year not known, of the time of King John.

The assize of last presentation to the Church of Calverley. the advowson whereof Roger le Scot claymes against the Archbishop of York, and H. the treasurer of York. And the Archbishop's attorney comes and says that he claims nothing in that church but the custody, as of that which is void, and which custody the foresaid Treasurer disseiseth him of. And the foresaid H. savs that an assize ought not to be taken thereof, because the church is not void; yea, he is parson of that church as of that whom Roger the Archbishop of York attorned to the chapel of St. Mary, which he built upon the gate near the mother church of S. Peter; of which church he is sacrist of the gift of the same Roger the Archbishop, in which is contained that he to the maintenance of the priest and clerks serving in the foresaid chapel of S. Mary hath provided largely as well as of his own gift as of the gift of others. Amongst the rest he remembers of the gift of William Scot the church of Calverley. contained in the same charter that the foresaid priests and clerks ought to receive their subsistence by the hand of the sacrist of the foresaid chapel, whereof the same H. is sacrist. He produceth likewise another charter of the same Archbishop Roger, in which is contained that he gave and granted to Hamo the singing man of York, the sacristan of the foresaid chapel of S. Mary, that he should dispose and order the service in the same, and should minister to the chaplains and deacons, and to the underdeacons as he had appointed to them for victuals and clothing in his charter, that is, to wit, in the charter which he first produced. And the Jurors say that William Scot, grandfather to the foresaid Roger Scot, gave that church to Roger, Archbishop of York, and Judgment-the foresaid H. hold it, and Roger in mercy roll 1s.\*—Harl. M.S. 797. Brit. Mus.

A grant was confirmed in 1236, which was made by the sacrist of St. Sepulchre's—G. de Tiwe—to Robert de Calverle, clerk, "of an annual rent of thirteen marks, and of the right of pasture in a certain place in Calverle."

In 1290, the revenues of the church were claimed by John Scot, against Corbridge. Archbishop Romanus ordered James de Langtoft to seize them; so that the monks again

won the day.

About A.D. 1291, Pope Nicholas IV. made a grant to King Edward I. of a tenth of the possessions of the Church of England to defray the expenses of an expedition to the Holy Land, and a valuation of the Church's property had to be made in consequence. The MS is still in existence, and has been printed by the Record Commissioners under the title of "Taxatio Ecclesiastica Angliæ et Walliæ, auct. P. Nicholai IV., circa 1291." In 1318, in consequence of the ravages committed by the invading Scots, subsequent to Bannockburn, a new valuation had to be made, which shews us to what extent these ravages went. This district suffered severely. From 1316 to 1332 (in which year the Scots wintered at Morley), their incursions were almost unintermittent.

In the first valuation, the annual value of the vicarage of Calverley is put down at £8, but in the second, the place was so wasted, that the value is returned as "nothing." In the return made by William, archbishop of York, Calverley is said to be worth "hardly a goat's grass." "Yorkshire Churches," p. 30, on the authority of the Rev. R. P. Collyer, New York. "Q.Q. 111a. 12 E.2. Of churches wasted by the Scots, newly taxed, the Vicarage of Calverley hath not sufficient for the maintenance of a chaplayne. Melton's Register, fol. 129." Jennings' MSS. Harl. 797, Brit. Mus.\*

The taxation of Pope Nicholas is a most important document, because all the taxes, as well to the King as to the Pope, were regulated by it, until the survey made by Henry

VIII. in the 26th year of his reign.

In 1532, an Act of Parliament was passed entitled "An Acte concernynge restraynt of payment of Annates to the

see of Rome." The excessive usurpations of that church had reached such an extent that it was generally felt that something must be done to stay them, both on account of their unsoundness of title and political inexpediency. In their unsoundness of title and political inexpediency. In 1534 a second act was passed making it unlawful to make any payment to the church of Rome, under any pretence whatever, and separating it from England. Now the King could not demand the "Peter's Pence," indulgences, fees, &c., under the old names, but he caused the Church to render to him the First Fruits and Tenths of all benefices and dignities.

It was to carry into effect these provisions that the "Valor Ecclesiasticus" was made. It is a survey of all the ecclesiastical property on the eve of the Reformation, made by Commissioners. It is considered "the most pre-eminent of our ecclesiastical records," and has been published by the Record Commissioners under the title "Valor Ecclesiasticus," temp. Hen. VIII., auctoritate Regia institutis." By it we find that Calverley rendered to the chapel of the Blessed Virgin Mary at York, "iiijd. yearly." Also that Thomas Morton, Clerk, was incumbent, and the rectory was appropriated to St. Mary's chapel, near the metropolitan church of York.

"The multiple used to find the increase of the value of property mentioned in this survey is from 10 to 20, generally the latter;" so that the value of the vicarage, in present money value, was probably over £150.

Of course, at the Reformation, the patronage passed into the king's hands, and we find that King Edward the Sixth

presented to the living in 1551.

In 1558, (5 and 6 Philip and Mary) the advowson was granted by the Queen to Nich. Heath, archbishop of York, and his successors, but Queen Elizabeth afterwards presented to it. nevertheless.\* After this there were two collations by the archbishop, viz. 1612 and 1627. Since then the Crown presented, until the gift was vested, by exchange, in the Bishop of Ripon for the time being.

In the 4th of James 1st's reign (1607), August 4th, the Rectory of Calverley was granted by the King to William Vernon, of Soothill, and Christopher Naylor, of Wakefield,

as appears by Pat. Roll, 4 Jas. I. part. 23.

"The King, in consideration of the faithful service of his kinsman, Louis, Duke of Lennox, as well as for divers other good causes and considerations, gives and grants, for himself, his heirs, and successors, to William Vernon, of Soothill, co. York, gentleman, and Christofer Naylor, of Wakefield, in the same county, gentleman, and to their heirs and assigns, all those two rectories of Wakefield and Dewsbury, in the county of York

and all those Rectories of Calverley, Bradsey, or Bardsey, and Collingham, with all their appurtenances. And all the tithes, great and small, with all messuages, lands, tenements, meadows, pastures, common rights, pensions, portions, annuities, rents, reversions, services, etc.....in the towns. parishes, and hamlets of Otley, Calverley, Bradsey, or Bardsey, and Collingham, in the said county of York, lately belonging to the Chapel of the Blessed Mary and Holy Angels, commonly called Sepulchre's Chapel, near the metropolitan church in the city of York, etc......of the annual value of seventy-six pounds, sixteen shillings, and sixpence, etc ...... To William Vernon and Christofer Naylor, their heirs and assigns, all and singular, the manors, messuages, mills, houses, edifices, structures, barns, stables, dovehouses, gardens, orchards, lofts, cottages, lands, tenements, hereditaments, meadows, pastures, ponds, fishponds, common lands, glebes, ways, wastes, vacant grounds, furze and heath,

moors, marshes, woods, underwoods, etc., essarts, turbaries, with all tithes of sheaves, corn, grain, hay, wool, line, lamb, &c.; all oblations, obventions, pensions, portions, fruits and profits, waters, watercourses, aqueducts, emoluments, and hereditaments, of whatever nature or kind whatsoever, etc. \* \* \* \* \*

To be held in Fee farm, as of the manor of East Greenwich, in free and common soccage, and not in chief or by military service, paying out of the same rectories the yearly sum of £76 6s. 6d. to the King's Receiver." This is alluded to in Hutton Wood's Decrees in the Court of Exchequer in Tithe

Causes. London. 1798. vol. iii. p. 243.

The Rectory afterwards came into the possession of the family of Savile, but how, I have not been able to ascertain. Henry Savile, of Lupset, who died in 1569, had married Joan Vernon, sole daughter and heiress of William Vernon, of Barrowby, co. Lincoln, and was father, by her, of Sir George Savile, Baronet, who died in 1522.\* His son, Sir George Savile, is described as of Soothill, which, as well as the rectory of Calverley, may have been left him by the will of William Vernon, of Soothill. But is very possible that Vernon and Naylor were only trustees for Sir George Savile, who was the real purchaser.

In the case of "Bewick versus Nicholls," 23 Nov., 1769, (Wood, iii. 243) the Vicar recovered small tithes within the Manor of Tyersall. An indenture dated 23 February, 21 Charles the Second, 1669—70, was put in, whereby R. Walter and others conveyed to John Thornton the Tythes of Tyersall in fee. Receipts from 30 Oct., 1689, to 22 May, 1711, were also produced in evidence, signed by H. Saville.

1711, were also produced in evidence, signed by H. Saville. The Saviles "sold the tithes to the inhabitants (? landowners), only reserving some small amount to be paid yearly out of every town. Nothing belongs to the Church but the small tithes. Yearly value of the Vicarage is something under £30. Signed, William Rawson, vic."—Notitia Parochialis, No. 654. A.D. 1705. (Lawton's Collectio Rerum, 1842, p. 117.)

On the 9th of December, 1692, Walter (afterwards Sir Walter, Bart.) Calverley, had the "Articles of Agreement"

drawn up "between Mr. Savill and his sisters for purchase of Calverley tithes, to pay him £19 in hand, and £615 before sealing the deed.,'\*

When the Calverley estates were sold, in 1754, the great tithes passed into the hands of the Thornhills, who still possess, but do not collect them. The great tithes on other properties in the parish are also in the hands of the landowners.

In the Parliamentary Survey, made during the time of the Commonwealth, (vol. xviii. p. 311) Calverley Vicarage is valued at £24, and the Rectory is said to be worth "£80 per annum."

The living was augmented in 1759, with £200, to meet a

benefaction from Sir Walter Blackett, Bart.

HILLARY'S BEQUEST. Joseph Hillary, of N. Hallwood, in Leeds main riding, by his will dated 19th May, 1658, gives "unto his good friends, Walter Calverley, of Calverley, Esq., Richard Waugh, Clerk, present vicar, and Samuel Moss, of Priesthorpe, yeoman, and their heirs for ever, all those four dwelling houses, with the appurtenances, in Park Lane, in Leeds mainriding, within the manor of Leeds, and now or late in the occupation of Jno. Rushforth Luke Nicholson, George Ly....., and Francis Oliver, or their assigns. To have and to hold the same unto the said Walter Calverley, &c., their heirs, &c. Upon consideration and trust that they the said Walter Calverley, &c., and their heirs, &c., shall yearly pay forth of the real profits and issues of the said messuages, the yearly sum of £4, at the feast of Pentecost, and St. Martin's in winter, by equal portions for and towards maintenance of schoolmaster at Calverley for ever. And also 40s. to the minister at the feasts aforesaid. And also etc. 20s. to the parish clerk at the feasts aforesaid. The surplusage for the buying of books, and other preferment of poor scholars of the said school at their discretion."

# Introduction.

"THE first is, that no infant shall receive the blessed sacrament of baptisme, bott onlesse an trybett to be pay'd to the king." Such was the sentence which headed the list of grievances prepared by the promoters of that noted rising in the North of England, "The Pilgrimage of Grace." Thomas Cromwell, Secretary of State, had been appointed also Vicar-general, by Henry VIII. This was a new office, to which the King transferred his control over the Church. Cromwell soon caused an Act of Parliament to be passed to suppress the lesser monasteries, on account of the immoralities alleged to be committed there. As a consequence of this, an order had to be made to make provision for registration, this duty having before devolved on the priests. It was to this that the rebels objected in their list of grievances. It is needless to say that the value of accurate registration has since been much better appreciated.

Such was the effect of the Order, that whereas there are only 40 registers in existence which have entries prior to 1538, the year when the act came into force, there are 772 which commence in that year, and 1822 during the next twenty years.

The Calverley Registers commence in 1574, a comparatively early date. Halifax commence in 1538, Tong in 1550,

Elland and Birstall in 1558, Batley in 1559, Leeds in 1572 Bradford 1596, Haworth 1645, Almondbury and Castleton 1653, Meltham 1669, Thornton 1678, Lightcliffe 1704, Wibsey 1744, Cleckheaton 1761.

Very probably there has once been an earlier volume than the present. Many registers have been lost through the carelessness of their custodians.\* It is only of late years that their importance has been duly estimated, and means suggested for their preservation in time to come.

The Harleian Society, taking into consideration the genealogical interest attached to them, has undertaken their publication, and already the Registers of St. Peter's, Cornhill from 1538 to 1666, and the Registers of St. Dionis, Backchurch, London, have been published, and thus permanently

\* "In a Northamptonshire parish an old parchment register was discovered in a cottage, sewed together as a covering for the tester of a bedstead; and in an Essex parish, the clerk, not having ink and paper to make an extract for an applicant, observed, "Oh, you may as well have the leaf as it is," and, says Mr. Burns, in his "History of Parish Registers," taking out a pocket knife, he gave the applicant the entire two pages. It is also on record that an enterprising grocer being clerk of the parish, found the register invaluable for wrapping up his grocery commodities; and of a curate's wife who used it for making her husband's kettle holders. Amongst some of the further disasters that have befallen these ill-used records, we may allude to their being occasionally sold as waste paper; their destruction by fire at the clergyman's residence; and their complete loss through being stolen. The early registers of a parish in Kent have been lost, 'having been kept at a public-house to be shown, as they contained some curious entries as to tythes; whereas in another we are informed that the clerk employed the leaves of the parish records, amongst other purposes, for 'singeing a goose.' It is impossible too, to say how many may have fallen a prey to damp and other ravages of time, as well as from religious and political troubles."

preserved "for all generations to come." But it is impossible for one society to publish all the Registers in the kingdom, and this leaves much for individual effort to perform. "Unfortunately, however, many of the Parish Registers which have hitherto been printed by private individuals have not been published in their entirety, but only such extracts as were, in the opinion of the editor, worthy of note. As records of genealogical and historical value such imperfect publications are comparatively valueless."

The present volume is printed as complete as possible thus avoiding the objection named.

It was commenced in the reign of Queen Elizabeth, and during the vicariate of William Webster. It is a folio book, measuring about 13 inches by  $7\frac{1}{2}$ ; it is of parchment, and has the appearance of having been written on loose sheets afterwards stitched together and covered with a thick parchment binding.

There is a chasm in the Marriage entries from May 1607 to September 1629, and in the Burial entries from May 1607 to November 1624; also Baptisms 1643 to 1649, and Burials 1644 to 1649. In a few instances pieces have been torn out of the book, and in many places the ink is faded, so that the book is not quite complete. In some places it is disfigured by stains of tincture of galls, which has evidently been used to temporarily resuscitate the faded writing. This may have effected its purpose at the time, but the result now is that of leaving great yellow stains all over the book.

The entries in the earlier years appear to have been copied from a former register, as the writing is so very uniform, and there are instances where the christian or surname is omitted, which of course, would not have occurred if the entries had been made in this book at once. Generally speaking, the writing is good, especially the commencements of the marriage and burial registers, which are beautiful specimens of caligraphy. Towards the end of the book, however, the entries have been made hurriedly and carelessly by an indifferent scribe.

"During the confusion which existed in the reign of Charles I., Parish Registers were greatly neglected, and were for the first time regulated by Act of Parliament. In the year 1644 an ordinance was made that 'a fair register book of velim' should be provided in every parish, and that the names of all children baptized, and the time of their birth, and also the names of all persons married and buried, should be set down therein by the minister. During the Commonwealth the system of leaving parochial registration to the clergy seems to have failed. Parliament again interfered, and registrars were appointed. At the Restoration the charge of keeping the registers again devolved on the clergy, and has continued part of their duty ever since. Nothing appears to have been done with regard to the Parish Registers in the reign of James II., but in that of William III., in consequence of a duty being imposed on the various entries, the negligent and careless clergy were, for the first time, exposed to the terror of the common informer. Many of the registers, therefore, from this time seem to have been better kept; but as a great number of the clergy were still not fully aware of the penalties they were subject to through non-compliance with the law, in the fourth year of Queen Anne's reign an act of indemnity was found necessary."

In the year 1753 was passed the famous Marriage Act,

called Lord Hardwicke's Act, still in force. By this Act any person convicted of tampering with or destroying any Register of marriage was to be deemed guilty of felony without benefit of clergy. In the year 1783 the Stamp Act was passed, which levied a tax upon every entry in the Parish Register, but it met with such opposition that it was repealed in the year 1794. By it the rich and poor were taxed alike, and the clergyman had been placed in the invidious light of a tax-gatherer. As the poor were often unable or unwilling to pay the tax imposed upon them, the clergyman often paid it out of his own pocket rather than incur the ill-will of his parishioners. In the year 1812, an Act, commonly known as Rose's Act, was passed for "the better regulating and preserving parish and other registers," and lastly, in the year 1836, an important change was made, when it was required that henceforth all future registers should be kept in books specially provided for that purpose, and "according to one uniform scheme set out in the schedules annexed to the Act." Since the passing, therefore of the Registration Act, in 1836, the value of the Parish Register as a public record has greatly diminished. The registration of births and deaths has superseded, as far as legal purposes are concerned, that of baptisms and burials; and every quarter a copy of the marriages is forwarded to the Registrar (Royal, one, too, of the well known pair of green books, when filled, being likewise sent to the Registrar General.

The Registers shew that many families existing in the parish have done so for centuries, as they occur from the first. The following are examples taken at random, Booth, Harper, VHall, Thornton, Dawson, Fletcher, Yewdall, Hodgson, Wade, Atkinson, Swaine, Grimshaw, Lepton, Bateson, Walton, Waterhouse, Milner, Thackeray, Lee.

Numbers of others could be given, as a glance at the Index will shew. Of course, there are names which have, locally, quite died out, and these sound rather strange to our ears. E.g. Grave, Syser, Bushell, Peck, Lillie, Flather, Graistwicke, Dunkin, Toppin, Wildbore, Trente, Dishforth, Ine, Cauldfield, Coulcole, Windebanck, &c., &c.

Some of the Christian names which occur are curious specimens—Freegift, Faintnot, Ursalie or Ursula, Sybil, Diones, Prudens, Elkanah, Sheffield, Edoun or Edonn, Fortune, Eden, Ellnathan, Josias, Elmodad, Patience, Dorcas, Tobe. The orthography is in some instances quite amusing.

Of names in favour with the people there may be mentioned Hugh, Isaac, Lawrence, Ralph, Tristram, and Warren; Dorothy, Dora, Faith, Grace, Mercy, Patience, Isabel, Jennett, Margaret, Rosamund, Susan, and Ursula.

There is no instance of a double christian name in the registers so early, indeed, the practice of giving them did not become common till after 1800.

Altogether, there are about 40 volumes of registers at Calverley, 8 of these comprising the period up to 1800. The number is, of course, every year increasing.

The tale has often been told, and the brief space allowed by a foot note, will not allow of more being said than that, maddened by drink and gaming, Walter Calverley, having conceived an unjust jealousy of his wife, and fancying that his children would be made beggars through his dissipated habits, murdered his sons William and Walter, attempted to kill his wife, and rode off to commit the same crime on his other son Henry, who was at nurse: but he was prevented, being captured, and tried, first by a magistrate, and then at York Castle, where he was pressed to death. A tradition says that after a pretended burial, his remains were conveyed to Calverley, and buried there. However, the following is the entry of his burial at S. Mary's, Castlegate, York, from the register there. "Walter Calverley, executed for murthering his own children, the 23rd of April 1605, was buried the said 10th of August."

Wilson, of Calverley, and his assignes, the one half of his Seat or stall as it is seated against the piller or wall of the Steple on the north sid in the parishe church of Caluerley; and the other half of the said seat beinge the south parte or end he doth assigne unto John Smith, sone of the Andrewe Smithe, and his assigns for ever. And further the said Andrewe Smithe, doeth assigne unto Izaacke Smithe, his sone, his seat or rome in the stall or seat now placid against the third piller, upon the north sidd towards the chancell.

And further, John Hunter, withe consent of the church-wardens of the towne and parishe of Calverley, Anno Dmi. 1616, Cristoffer Hodgsone, of Caluerley, being one of them, doeth by this Register belonginge to the church, assigne, passe, and sett over, all my righte, entrest, and title of and in one Seate or stall as it is now placed on the southe side of the middle alley, the third seate west from the chancell unto Thomas Harper, sone of John Harper, of Calverley, and his assignes for ever. And for confirmacon of truth of this Register, I, the said John Harper, have setted my name with

my owne hand, the sext daye of ffebruary, in the yeare above said.

Wilson, of Calverley, and when it is bulded and sett downe, the said Richard Midgley, is by this Regester to have and possesse vnto him and his assignes for ever.

Whereas the Churchwardens, in the yeare 1604, sould vnto James Webster, then dwelling in Calverley, the second seat or stall behind the northe dore, in the parishe Church of Calverley, and after by the consent of the Churchwardens, 1610, the said James Webster sould to George Boithe, dwelling in Idle, the moittie or halfe parte of the said seatt, and after the death of the said James, the moittie reserved did descend unto his wife which said right is now turned unto John Cawvard her (husband?) Anno Dom. 1628, dwellinge in Calverley.

One thousand sixe hundreth twenty sixe, by the consent of the Churchwardens, John Rawson, and John Nettleton, being two of them, William Bucke, and Lawrence Bucke, bothe dwelling within the towenshippe of Idle, are to have one seatt as it is now placed vpon the south side of the middle alley, before Mr. Thorneton's seat, towards the


