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PREFACE.

In editing these Registers I have added such items of information as I could gather relating to the families of those whose names occur therein, and also regarding the different Acts of Parliament by which entries in Registers have been affected, so as to give the book more historical interest. One of the chief motives that induced me to undertake the task of putting the Registers into print was a desire that the inhabitants of the parish should be able, if they wished, to feel more personal interest in it and the families that have resided here. In these days people very easily forget that the same work has been going on, the same houses occupied, the same relative duties fulfilled by former generations, who were of just as much importance and as necessary to fulfil them as those who are fulfilling them now.

By the kindness of the Bence Family I give a very full statement of their pedigree. They have been an influential family in this neighbourhood for more than three hundred years, dating their recorded history from the time when they were the most important of the inhabitants of Aldborough, and have held the chief portion of the property in this parish since 1691, when they bought the estate of the Coke Family, who were the previous owners. In that portion of their pedigree relating to the Rev. Thomas Bence, Rector of Kelsale-cum-Carlton, who died 1757, the descendants of Catherine, who married Gabriel Trusson, and whose daughter Catherine married Anthony Collet, are represented now by the Rev. Anthony Collett, Rector of Hastingleigh in Kent.

I am able also, by the kindness of F. A. Crisp, Esq., to give a photo-lithographic copy of an old engraving of Thorington Church, copied from a volume of drawings of Suffolk Churches made by Isaac Johnson of Woodbridge between 1793 and 1816.

I thought it of interest also to give the names of the Rectors of the parish, and, as I have stated elsewhere, Dr. Bensly, the Diocesan Registrar, has enabled me, at much inconvenience and trouble to himself, to give a complete list of all the Rectors from December 1381, the date of the first recorded institution, to the present day, by which I learn that

PREFACE.

I am the fifty-third recorded Rector in direct succession from the institation of Jo'es Fowas de Donewyso. The Priory of Blythburgh held the patronage of the church and rectory before this date, as in their charter, dated in the last year of Richard I., the gift of the advowson and of land in the parish to the Priory by Willium, son of Walter de Sadenfield is referred to. I have, however, in my possession an old Chartalary of the Priory in which this gift is mentioned as having been made by Galfride de Beletone, and afterward confirmed by William de Sadenfield. Fourteen pages of this Chartalary relate to Thorington, and a copy of the first page, which contains the record of this gift of Galfride de Beletone, I have had taken by photo-lithographic process by Mr. Griggs of Peckham, and have added it to this book. The Historical Manuscripts Commission of the Rolls House have examined this Chartulary, and will give a notice of it in the Report they present to Parliament next year. The Rectors from the date of this gift to the institution of Jo'es Fowus are not recorded in the books of the Diocesan Registry, and, as the tower and walls of the body of the church are of Early Norman date, it seems tolerably certain that the fabric has been in existence at least since 1130, so that two hundred years of the early ecclesiastical history of the parish leave no traces of the Rectors that officiated here.

The Registers of this parish are not the only Suffolk Registers that are published. Those of Tannington and Ellough have already been printed, and those of Brundish and Carlton (by Kelsale) are in the printers' hands, and I think that increased interest in the past history of our parishes would be encouraged by a wider publication of these records.

I have added an Appendix of names entered since 1882, for I have taken longer time in publishing the book than I anticipated, and the type, after a sufficient number of copies had been printed, was broken up. I have brought the entries down to the latest possible date.

RECTORS OF THORINGTON.

ON the inside of the cover and on the first page of the First Register Book there is a list of Rectors from the year 1593 to the present time, with the exception of Samuel Ledys, 1610-12; but as by the kindness of W. T. Bensly, Esq., LL.D., Deputy-Registrar of the Diocese, I am able to give a correct list of all the Rectors from the first recorded Institution in 1332, I prefer giving this completed list to merely copying those in the Thorington Register Book. To Dr. Bensly's courtesy the completeness and correctness of this list of Rectors is entirely due. Free access to the Institution Books and unlimited time for examination was liberally allowed me, and the list when completed received his supervision and corrections.

This list is taken from Tanner's MS. in the Norwich Diocesan Registry, down to the institution of Robert Smith, A.D. 1484, and compared with the entries made in the Institution Books in the same Registry, from which quotations, when made, are inserted in brackets. After the institution of Robert Smith, where the list in Tanner's MS. terminates, all the extracts are made from the Institution Books, which commence A.D. 1299.

The 'Tanner's MS.' or 'Norwich Domesday Book' which is here referred to, is a large folio volume of nearly a thousand pages, written in Latin, in modern Gothic character. It is a survey of all the parishes of the Diocese of Norwich with the temporalities and spiritualities of the Priors and Monks and other religious houses in the several parishes. It gives an account of all the livings in the Diocese, procurations, synodals, and other payments, at some unstated date; but internal evidence proves that it commenced about the beginning of and continued nearly to the end of the fifteenth century.—Vide First Report of the Historical MSS. Commission, 1870, page 87.

[The bequest of Rob. Hoo, dated 1503, implies that its continuation entered on the sixteenth century.—T. S. H.]

One omission of Institution, when Francis Kynaston became Rector, will be noticed A.D. 1620, but this omission is rectified by the Register Book of this Parish, where "Francis Kynnaston, Rector Ecclesiæ de Thorington," is "writ large." The omission is supposed to have arisen from the confusion consequent on Bishop Jegon's death in 1617 and his successor's, Bishop Overall, in 1619, for the Institution Books are for four or five years at that time not accurately kept.

To Colonel Chester, LL.D., Editor of the 'Westminster Abbey Registers,' I am indebted for the University status of most of the later Rectors.

Instead of placing notes at the bottom of the page I insert them in Italics immediately following the passages referred to.

Browne of Marlesford, who was his nephew :—A large party was expected to dine with the Master of Caius College one day, and as was usual, the preparations for the purpose were made early in the day. Symonds contrived to get unobserved into the Hall, and collecting all the forks laid for the guests, stuck them in and about the carving over the Master's chair representing the arms of the College. This was not observed till the dinner was served, and when the guests found that no forks were provided for them, the Master took the butler severely to task for his neglect, and threatened to discharge him from his situation; and he could not be pacified till some one observed how they had been employed, when the joke produced a general laugh, and luckily the author escaped for that time undiscovered, and of course avoided punishment, though the butler afterwards found out who it was who was so nearly the cause of his dismission.

On another occasion he had a still narrower escape from a severe castigation. The Dean of the College, whose duty it was to read prayers in Chapel, had a very peculiar mode of reading, and that a very disagreeable one. One afternoon Symonds, who sat nearly under him, and who was a good mimic, made the responses in a tone and manner so exactly resembling the Dean as to produce more than a smile among all the auditors. This was an offence too flagrant to be overlooked; he was accordingly convened before the Master, who severely reprimanded him for the impropriety and indecency of his conduct, and declared his intention of inflicting a very severe punishment upon him. Symonds, with all due respect, requested to be heard in his defence, and having received permission, stated that he had been sent to college by a subscription of his friends, with the intention that he should qualify himself for Orders, that he had come to the College with the determination of paying every attention to what he should hear and see, and to guide himself accordingly, that though the mode in which the Dean read the service in Chapel was certainly different from what he had been accustomed to hear, yet that he thought that he was bound to consider it the proper mode, and had endeavoured to the best of his power to imitate it, and that if he had judged wrong, he had not erred intentionally, and was very sorry for it; that this was the sole motive for his conduct, and he should be very sorry if he had offended the Dean, or had been guilty of any impropriety towards the College. This was all said with so much apparent earnestness and simplicity as to remove the Master's anger, who dismissed him with a caution that he did not in future subject himself to a similar reprehension,

The son of Barnabas Symonds, who was brought up to the study of physic, and practised for many years as a surgeon and apothecary at Saxmundham, had all the humour of his father, and all his love for practical jokes. Many are the stories told of him in his neighbourhood, and many the pranks still remembered about him. He has declined practice, but still (1826) resides in the same town."

MEMORANDUM OF COKE,

AND

GIFT OF THE CHURCH BELL.

On the second page of the First Book of Registers is the following Memorandum :--

"MEMORANDU' y^t y^e Right worshipfull Edward Coke Esquier Attourny Generall to the Queenes most excellent maiestie and Bridgett his wife did Giue unto the Towneshippe of Thorington in June 1598 one Bell* alone vppon this condicion that neyther the Churchwardens nor any of the inhabitants of the said Towne should at any time after y^e aforesaid Guift sell awaye the said Bell but continve and maintayne the same for the callinge together of the inhabitants of the said Towne to divine Service and other Seemely vses In witnes whereof I Robert Golde minister of the saide Towne of Thorington have sett to my hand to this wrightinge the xx^{th} of September 1607.

In the 'Life of Sir Edward Coke,'† by Cuthbert William Johnson, are the following notices :---

Edward Coke was the only son of Robert Coke of Mileham, co. Norfolk, Bencher of Lincoln's Inn, and Winifred, daughter and coheiress of William Knightley of Morgrave Knightley, in the same county. He was born Feb. 1, and baptized Feb. 8, 1551, at Mileham ; matriculated Trin. Coll. Camb. Oct. 25, 1567 ; entered at Clifford's Inn, London, 1571, and at the Inner Temple, 1572 ; married, Aug. 13, 1582, at Cookeley, Bridget, daughter and coheiress of John Paston, Esq., of Huntingfield Hall, co. Suffolk, by whom he had seven sons and three daughters.

- 1587. Recorder of Norwich.
- 1590. Bencher of the Inner Temple, and Steward of the Manor of Framlingham.

- Before he had been many months a widower he married, 2ndly, Lady Elizabeth, 4th daughter of Thomas Cecil, first Earl of Exeter, the beautiful, young, and wealthy widow of Sir William Hatton. "The marriage ceremony was performed in a private house, without either banns or licence. In consequence of this irregularity, Coke and his lady, with the Rev. Henry Bathwell, Rector of Okeover, Thomas Lord Burleigh, afterwards Earl of Exeter, the bride's father, and several others present at the marriage, were prosecuted in the Archbishop's Court. By a timely and respectful submission, however, by their proxies, they escaped the greater excommunication."
- 1603. Knighted by James I.
- 1606. King's Sergeant, and Lord Chief Justice of the Common Pleas.
- 1613. Chief Justice of the Court of King's Bench, usually called Chief Justice of England, and Privy Councillor.
- 1614. High Steward of the University of Cambridge.
- 1616. "Removed" from the Court of King's Bench. Described by Sir George Croke as "a prudent, grave, and learned man in the common laws of the realm, and of a pious and virtuous life."

- 1623. M.P. for Coventry, after having been committed to the Tower as one of the "illtempered spirits" that opposed the Court.

"The third of May, riding in the morning in Stoke, between eight and nine o'clock, to take the ayre, my horse under me had a strange stumble backwards, and fell upon me (being above eighty years old), where my head lighted near to sharp stubbes, and the heavy horse upon me. And yet, by the providence of Almighty God, though I was in the greatest danger, yet I had not the least hurt—nay, no hurt at all."
- 1633. [Misprint for 1634.] Died Sep. 3. His last words being, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done." While on his death-bed, Sir Francis Windebank came to his house at Stoke in virtue of an order from the Privy Council in search of certain seditious papers—at least this was the pretence. He carried away Coke's will, and several other papers and manuscripts. Seven years afterwards the papers were principally returned, but not the will.
- 1634. Buried Oct. 4, in Tittleshall Church, co. Norfolk. For his monument £400 was paid to Nicholas Stone.

"So devout a son he was of the Church of England, in the observance of the rites and ceremonies thereof, that I am confident that in near forty years before his death, if sickness or public employment, or something extraordinary did not divert him, scarce one day passed wherein he was not twice a devout assistant in the offering up of the public service of the Church; nor was he less severe to himself in his person, than just to his public employments, being never so much as suspected of any notorious or scandalous vice. ('Justice Vindicated.' Roger Coke. 1660.)

REGISTERS OF THORINGTON.

Before the suppression of Monasteries by Hen. VIII., Registers of marriages and burials of persons connected with them were kept by each house, also of those who were baptized or buried within their precincts. In 1538 an order was issued that each parish should keep a Register of christenings, marriages, and burials, but this order was not generally obeyed, and in 1597 another order was issued by the Convocation of Canterbury, and confirmed by the Queen, that such Registers should be kept, and that copies of such Registers as had been hitherto made, should be made in the new books, and each page attested by the signatures of the Incumbent and Churchwardens. In this parish of Thorington the Register seems to have been commenced in 1561, and copies from y^e ould booke, which does not now exist, made in 1593, down to the marriage of James Crispe and Abra' Brooke, June 17, and each page is attested by the signatures of Robert' Golde, Rector, and Will'm Spalding and Thoms Johnsonn, Churchwardens.

It will be observed that in the earlier portions of the Registers surnames are sometimes spelt in different ways, and that the dates are occasionally intermixed. The Rectors of Thorington seem to have adopted the plan in general use among the Clergy of keeping a book for entries to be made by the clerk, and copying these entries when they had to present their Registers at the Visitations.

It should be remembered that before 1752 the year commenced on March 25, and not on Jan. 1.

"Monuments.—In the chancel, and attached to the north wall, is a large and costly monument erected to the memory of Arthur Coke, third son of Sir Edward Coke, Lord Chief Justice, by Bridget his first wife, daughter of John Paston, Esq. In the upper compartment is a kneeling figure of the first-mentioned gentleman in a military habit, carved out of white marble, which retains its polish and freshness in a very remarkable degree. The figure possesses considerable ease, and is much superior in execution to the recumbent effigy of the female which reclines in a stiff attitude, holding an infant in her arms, on an altar-tomb at the feet of her husband. The monument is profusely charged with the armorial cognizances of Coke and Waldegrave, with varions quarterings. On the first shield appears Coke, with four coats, viz.—

- 1. COKE .- Party per pale gules and az. 3 eagles displayed argent.
- 2, Arg, a chev. between 3 chaplets az. flowered or.
- 3. Sab. a chev. between 3 covered cups or.
- 4. Arg. 6 fleurs-de-lis az. 3, 2, 1, and a chief indented, or ; impaling Waldegrave, of four coats.

1. WALDEGRAVE .- Party per pale arg. and gules ; a crescent sab. for difference.

- 2. Barry of ten, arg. and az.
- 3. Erm. a fess sab. between 3 rosettes or.
- 4. Arg. a fess between 3 mullets azure."

The inscription is as follows :-

"Here lyeth byried Arthor Coke, Esq., third sonne of Sir Edward Coke, Knight, late Lord Chiefe Jystice of England, and of the Privye Counsell of Kinge James. Here lyeth also buried in the same tombe, Elizabeth, daughter and sole Heire Apparent of Sir George Waldegrave, Knight, w'ch Elizabeth, christianly and peaceably departed this life the 14th day of November, Anno D'ni 1627. And the said Arthor likewise christianly and peaceably departed this life at Bury S^t Edmunds, in this county of Suffolk, on the 6th day of December, 1629.

"They had issue betweene them, living at their deceases, foure daughters, viz.

"Elizabeth, Mary, Winifred, and Theophila, whom Almighty God prosper and protect." The three eldest were baptized at Thorington 1613, 1615, 1621, and a daughter Bridget was buried April 2, 1622.

• Extract from Johnson's 'Life of Sir Edward Coke,' pp. 397, 398 :--

Henry (fifth son of Sir Ed. Cohe), who was baptized at Huntingfield, August 30, 1592 (The Huntingfield Register gives 1591), was seated at Thurrington in Norfolk (mistake for Suffolk). He was elected member of Parliament in 1623 for Wycomb, twice in 1625 for the same borough, and in 1640 for Dunwich. He married Margaret, daughter and heiress of Edward Lovelace, by whom he had a son Richard, who espoused Mary, daughter of Sir John Rous, Bart., their son Robert (only son—Suckling's 'Suffolk') succeeded, on the death of John Coke (4th son of Sir E. Coke), to the Holkham estates and the greatest part of Sir Edward Coke's property.

His children, baptized at Thorington, were: 1. Briget, Oct. 3, 1626. 2. Jane, Ap. 28, 1628; buried March 3, 1642-3. 3. Robert, Aug. 24, 1629; buried Dec. 21, 1630. 4. Thomas, Oct. 27, 1630; buried April 19, 1631. 5. Theophilah, April 14, 1632. 6. Robert, Nov. 27, 1634; buried Dec. 28, 1661.

Henry Coke was buried Nov. 19, 1661, and his son Cyriack Coke Aug. 2, 1679. See Registers at those dates.

Mary, daughter of Sir John Rous, by Elizabeth daughter of Sir Christopher Yelverton [sister of Sir John Rous of Henham Hall, created Bart. 1660], married Richard Coke, Esq., of Thorington, grandson of the celebrated Sir Edward Coke, the only son of which marriage inherited the Holkham estates, upon failure of the male descendants of John Coke, Esq., who died at Honington, in Suffolk, in 1661 [Blomefield, art. of Abode, and of their Parents, Guardians, or Overseers; all which the said Register shall publish three several Lord's Days then next following, at the close of the Morning Exercise, in the Church or Chapel; or, if the Parties to be married desired it, in the Market-Place next adjoining thereto, on three Market-Days, in three several Weeks next following, between the hours of Eleven and Two; which being done, the Register shall, upon request of the Parties concerned, make a certificate of the due performance thereof, without which such Marriage shall not proceed : And if any exception be made thereto, the Register shall insert the same, with the Name of the Person making such exception, and their Place of Abode, in the Certificate of Publication.

"All Persons intending to be married, shall come before some Justice of Peace of the same County, City, or Town Corporate, where Publication hath been made, and bring a Certificate thereof, with proof of the consent of their Parents or Guardians, if either of the Parties be under the age of twenty-one years : And the Justice shall examine, upon oath, concerning the truth of the certificate, and due performance of all the Premisses, and of any exception arising ; and, if there be no reasonable cause to the contrary, the Marriage shall proceed in this manner :

"The Man, taking the Woman by the hand, shall distinctly pronounce these words, I A.B. do here in the presence of God, the Searcher of all Hearts, take thee C.D. for my wedded Wife; and do also in the presence of God, and before these Witnesses, promise to be unto thee a loving and faithful Husband.

"And then the Woman, taking the Man by the hand, shall also distinctly pronounce these words, I C.D. do here in the presence of God, the Searcher of all Hearts, take thee A.B. for my wedded Husband; and do also in the presence of God, and before these Witnesses, promise to be unto these a loving, faithful, and obedient Wife.

"The Man and Woman having made sufficient proof of the consent of their Parents or Guardians, and expressed their consent to Marriage, in the manner and words aforesaid, before such Justice of Peace, in the presence of two or more credible witnesses, he shall declare them to be from thenceforth Husband and Wife; and after such consent so expressed, and such declaration made, the same shall be good and effectual in law; and no other Form of Marriage shall be accounted valid according to the Laws of England. But the Justice of Peace, in case of dumb persons, may dispense with pronouncing the words aforesaid; and with joining hands, in case of persons that have no hands.

"A Book of Vellum or Parchment shall be provided for the registering of all such Marriages, and of all Births of Children, and Burials of all sorts of People, within every Parish ; for the safe keeping of which the Inhabitants and Householders, chargeable to the poor, shall make choice of some able and honest person, to be approved by one Justice of the Peace of the County, and so signified under his hand in the said Register Book, to have the keeping thereof, who shall therein enter all such Publications, Marriages, Births of Children, and Burials of all sorts of Persons, and the Names of every of them, and the Days of the Month and Year thereof, and the Parents, Guardians, or Overseers' Names ; and for such Publications and Certificate, the Register shall be paid 1s., also 1s. for the entry of every Marriage ; for every Birth of a Child 4d., and for every Death 4d. But for Publications, Marriages, Births, or Burials of poor People, who live upon alms, nothing shall be taken. And the Justice of Peace, if desired, shall give a Certificate on Parchment, under his Hand and Seal, of such Marriage, and of the Day of the Solemnization thereof, and of two or more of the Witnesses then present, for which his Clerk to receive 1s. And if such Certificate shall be produced to the Clerk of the Peace for that County, and request made to him to make an Entry thereof, he shall enter the same in a Book of Parchment to be provided for that purpose, and kept amongst the Records of the said Sessions, for which he may receive 4d.

"If any Person shall, by Violence or Fraud, steal or take away any one under the age of 21 years, or cause so to be done, with intent of Marriage, he shall forfeit his whole Estate, Real and Personal; one-half to the Commonwealth, and the other to the Party so taken away; and farther suffer close imprisonment, and to be kept to hard labour in some House of Correction during life; and every Person convicted of aiding or abetting any such Violence or Fraud, shall be imprisoned and kept to hard labour for the space of seven years; and any pretended Marriage obtained by such Violence and Fraud, shall be null and void.

"Where any Guardian shall betray his trust touching any Child, by seducing, selling, or otherwise wilfully putting such Child into the hands or power of any Person to marry such Child, without his or her free consent, such Guardian shall forfeit double the Value of such Child's portion, one moiety thereof to the Commonwealth, and the other to the Child so married.

"The Age for a Man to consent unto Marriage shall be 16 years, and the age of a Woman 14 years.

[†] The name Attwood does not occur again in these Registers, except at the burial of these children in December of this year. Coupled with the Christian names Hermon and Olive it possesses interest. In a short account of the "Manor of Sanderstead," co. Surrey, by Granville Leveson Gower, Esq., published by Wyman and Sons, 1878, is the following notice, pp. 3, 4 :--

"John Ownstead died on the 9th August, 1600, aged sixty-six, and was buried in Sanderstead Church...... Leaving no issue, he by his will devised this manor, after the death of his second wife Margaret, to his cousin Harman Atwood.

"The family of Attwood, of whom a pedigree is given by Manning ['Hist. of Surrey,' vol. ii., p. 570], had long been seated at Sanderstead, and were, I imagine, a yeoman family of the place. In a fine of land relating to Sanderstead, 19 Ed. III., I find the name of Peter Atte Wood, and in Coulsdon, the adjoining parish, the same name occurs in 6 Ed. II., when Peter at Wode, John and Roger de Bosco [or of the Wood,] are returned as owning lands in that parish :

"Harman Atwood died in 1653, aged eighty-three, as appears by the inscription on his monument in the Church. After him we find his fourth son, Harman Atwood, in possession, and he by his will devised Sanderstead to his brother John and his sister Olive for their lives, with remainder to Harman Atwood, son of his elder brother John."

[The Christian names Harman and Olive seem to imply a connection between the Thorington and Sanderstead families.]

[†] Until A.D. 1751 the year was reckoned as commencing on March 25 and ending on March 24, but as this usage differed from the computation employed in Scotland and neighbouring nations, and was the cause of great inconvenience in the dates of deeds and other legal writings, an Act of Parliament was then passed that the first day of January should in future be the first day of the new year, so that 1752 should commence on that day instead of on March 25. And at the same time it was enacted that (as the reckoning of time was erroneous, and there was a difference of eleven days between the reckoning of the equinoxes and their recurrence), that number of eleven days should be struck out of the calendar, so that the day "following the second day of September shall be called, reckoned, and accounted to be the fourteenth day of September." At the same time it was also further enacted, "that for the continuing and preserving the calendar or method of reckoning, and computing the days of the year in the same regular course, as near as may be, in all times coming," "the several years of our Lord, 1800, 1900, 2100, 2200, 2300, or any other hundredth years of our Lord, which shall happen in time to come, except only every fourth hundredth year of our Lord, whereof the year of our Lord 2000 shall be

* An Act came into operation on Oct. 1, 1783, imposing a tax of 3d. on the registration of every birth or christening, marriage, and burial. Pauper baptisms and burials were exempted. The "Parson, Vicar, or Curate" was allowed two shillings in the Pound "for his trouble," but was subject to a fine of £100 if he neglected registration. He could, however, compound for the tax by the payment of a yearly sum. This Act was considered very oppressive and vexatious and was repealed in 1794. In William the Third's reign an Act of the same kind had been in force for five years. It came into operation on May 1st, 1695. It was passed to grant his Majesty certain rates and duties on marriages, births, and burials, and upon bachelors and widowers, for the term of five years, for the carrying on of the war against France with vigour. This tax varied according to rank. On marriage from 2s. 6d. to £50; on births from 2s. to £30; on burials from 4s. to £50, and over. The tax on bachelors and widowers was a yearly one, from 1s. to £12 10s. There is no reference to the working of this Act of William's in these Registers.

* Many members of the family of Wales are buried in Walberswick Churchyard, and the following entry from the Halesworth Registers indicates a relationship between the Walberswick and Halesworth branches: --1751. June 28. Carver Wales, of Walderswick, merchant, burd. (The name Carver is probably derived from Thomas Carver, Doctor of Physick, who was buried at Halesworth 6th October 1708.) The name is now quite extinct at Walberswick. A branch of the family settled at Downham Market, and descendants are still living in that neighbourhood.

† The following notice of the Anguish family is copied from Suckling's 'Suffolk,' vol. ii., pp. 44, 45 :--

⁴⁴ Thomas Garneys, Esq., in 1672, conveyed the whole village and manor of Somerleyton to Admiral Sir Thomas Allin, Knt. and Bart., who died in 1686. He left two children-Sir Thomas Allin, Bart., who succeeded him, but died without issue ; and Alice Allin, who, marrying Edmund Anguish, Esq., of Moulton, in Norfolk, carried Somerleyton and the adjoining estates into that family, their eldest son, Richard Anguish, taking the name and arms of Allin under the provisions of his uncle's will. Sir Richard Allin, alias Anguish, was advanced to the rank of a Baronet, and married, in 1699, Frances, daughter of Henry Ashurst. [Le Neve calls her Diana Ashurst.] He died about the year 1725, leaving two sons-Sir Thomas Allin, Bart., who succeeded him, but died unmarried ; and Ashurst Allin, who, on his brother's death, inherited his baronetcy and estates. Sir Ashurst married Thomasin Norris, and dying in 1770, devised his property to his only son, Sir Thomas Allin, who died in 1794, a bachelor: in whose person this line of the family and the baronetcy became extinct. The manor of Somerleyton, however, and the residue of the estates, passed to his heir-at-law, Thomas Anguish, Esq., who was descended from Edmund Anguish, the second son of Edmund Anguish, Esq., of Moulton aforesaid, who married Alice, daughter of the first Sir Thomas Allin. Mr. Anguish died unmarried in 1810 (he was a lunatic in 1806, vol. i., p. 243), and was succeeded in all his manors by the Rev. George Anguish, Clerk, M.A., Prebendary of Norwich Cathedral (and Rector of Gisleham, vol. i., p. 249). This gentleman was born February 7th, 1764, and dying a bachelor July 5th, 1843, the family of Anguish became extinct. The manor and advowson of Somerleyton then fell by heirship to his nephew, Lord Sydney Godolphin Osborne, son of the Duke of Leeds, by Catharine, his second wife, sister to the Rev. George Anguish, the previous possessor. In August, 1844, these, with several other lordships and estates, were conveyed, [by purchase] as already shewn, to Samuel Morton Peto, Esq., [afterwards Sir S. M. Peto, Bart.,] of the City of London, who is the present possessor (1847). The family of Anguish, late lords of Somerleyton, are said to have migrated from the shire of Angus, in Scotland, whence they assumed their surname. Their crest, however, does not confirm this, being an anguis, or snake, coiled in the grass. The shield is a good old bearing : gules, a cinquefoil, pierced, argent. Blomefield says, 'They settled at Moulton, in Norfolk, where they remained three centuries, and where, in 1699, Edward Anguish held the manor of the Earl of Northampton, as parcel of the manor of Forcet.'

The following properties were also held [Suckling's 'Suffolk,' vol. i.] by the Allins and Anguishes, and devolved on Lord S. G. Osborne, who sold them to Mr. Peto, August 1844. The lordship of the hundred of Mutford ; the lordship of the manor of Barnaby ; Carlton Colville (the advowson was sold for £3000 to W. Andrews, Esq.); the estates in Mutford, which Sir Thomas Allin had bought of the Trustees of Lady Mary Heveningham, wife of William Heveningham, who at the Restoration was attainted of high treason and his estates were confiscated for acting as one of the judges at the trial of Charles I. ; the fee of the hundred of Lothingland; the manors of Ashby with the advowson of the church, and the manors of Corton and Newton, with the appurtenances and 4 messuages, 3 gardens, 50 acres of land, 20 of meadow, 40 of pasture, 10 of wood, 200 of furze and heath, 10 of marsh, 10 of alder, 40 shillings rent, and free-foldage in Ashby, Corton, Newton, Oulton, Lowestoft, and Hopton ; the manor and estates of Gapton Hall, wit

Belton; the manors of Blundeston Hall and Gunville's [the Gunville's estate was sold by the executors of Frances, daughter of the Rev. Ashurst Allin, to Nicholas Henry Bacon, Esq.] (the advowson of Blundeston with Flixton Lord S. G. Osborne sold to Thos. Morse, Esq.); the manors of Somerleyton, Flixton, Corton, Ashby, Gapton, and Newton; the manor of Lawney in Flixton; the manors of East and West and North and South Leet in Gorleston, and of Gorleston. Sir S. M. Peto was head of the firm Peto, Betts, and Co., Contractors, who laid down the railway from Balaclava to Sebastopol during the Crimean war free of charge to the English Government beyond the cost price; for this service he received a baronetcy. On the bankruptcy of the firm, 1860, the Somerleyton property was sold to Sir Francis Crossley, Bart., M.P. for the West Riding, Yorkshire. His son, Sir Savile Crossley, is the present possessor.

* In 1753 an Act of Parliament which was to come into operation March 25, 1754, was passed to prevent clandestine marriages. Hitherto many persons had solemnized matrimony in prisons and other places without publication of banns or license, and it was now enacted that banns of marriage must be published on three separate Sundays preceding the marriage in the church or chapel of the parish wherein the persons to be married dwelt, or if they lived in different parishes then in the church or chapel of each parish in which they dwelt ; and the marriage was

Power was reserved to the Bishops to grant licenses, and to the Archbishop of Canterbury to grant special licenses. Any person convicted of solemnizing matrimony without banns or license or in any other place than the proper church or chapel, was to "be transported to some of His Majesty's plantations in America for the space of fourteen years," and the marriage to be "null and void," but the prosecution must be commenced "within three years after the offence committed." Marriage was to be solemnized in the presence of at least two witnesses besides the minister. The penalty for making a false entry in the register book "of any matter or thing relating to any marriage," or forging or altering an entry or the copy of an entry, or forging or altering a license, or destroying any register book or any part of one, with intent to void a marriage, was "death as a felon without benefit of clergy" (*The Statutes at Large*, Pickering, vol. xxi., p. 124).

Considering the widespread illegal publication of banns in use among the clergy the following note may be of interest :-

The rubric before "The Form of Solemnization of Matrimony" in "the Sealed Books" which by the Act of Uniformity has the force of Statute Law, is as follows : "First, the banns of all that are to be married together must be published in the church three several Sundays or holydays in the time of divine service, immediately before the sentences for the offertory." The rubrics only provide for the publication of banns after the Nicene Creed. This was inconvenient where there was not divine service in the morning of every Sunday. To remedy this, the Marriage Act, 26 Geo. II., c. 33 (1753), orders the banns to be published "upon three Sundays preceding the solemnization of matrimony, during the time of Morning Service, or of Evening Service if there be no Morning Service, in such church or chapel upon any of those Sundays, immediately after the second lesson." The words, "after the second lesson," are to be taken with the alternative clause only ; the time of publication when there is a Morning Service being already fixed by the rubric. There was no reason for changing the time of publication in the Morning Service, the only thing needed being a permission to publish banns of marriage during the Evening Service.

Note.—This is the legal opinion of Mr. A. J. Stephens (Notes on the Book of Common Prayer, vol. ii., p. 1153): "The printers of the Prayer Book have committed a flagrant breach, or rather a succession of flagrant breaches of the law; for they have not only chosen to put their own construction on the statute, which undoubtedly is a false one, but they have, in order to carry out their false construction, actually omitted altogether that portion of the rubric after the Nicene Creed which directs the publication of the banns, and also substituted a new rubric of their own at the commencement of the marriage service, although the statute says nothing which in the remotest degree authorizes any alteration of the rubric, but rather guards against any unnecessary deviation from it" (Scudamore's Notitia Eucharistica, pp. 253-4). The rubric after the Nicene Creed in the Scaled Books is as follows, "And then also (if occasion be) shall notice be given of the Communion; and the banns of matrimony published," etc. The rubric before the Marriage Service is given above.

SECOND VOLUME OF MARRIAGES, 1754 TO 1812 INCLUSIVE.

On the inside of the cover is this memorandum :--

Nov. 1, 1806. The Rev. Bence Bence was inducted into this living by the Rev. Tho. Sheriffe, R. of Uggeshall, and he read himself in on the following day.

In this book witnesses for the first time attest their presence at the ceremony. In 1757 Charles Mabourn, Rector, performs the marriage service and also signs the Register as one of the two witnesses ; and in 1758, 1770, 1772, and 1773, Barnabas Symonds, Rector, does the same.

It will be noticed that all the entries in the first volume of Marriages after 1758 are repeated in this book, and that in this book entries of Marriages are made during the years 1754, 5, 6, 7, 8, whilst in the first book it is noted that in these same years there were "none."

The following extract from Lecky's "History of England in the Eighteenth Century," Vol. I., pp. 490-1, refers to the Marriage Act of 1753.

"The long list of social reforms passed under the Pelham Ministry may be fitly closed by "The long list of social reforms passed under the Pelham Ministry may be filly closed by the Marriage Act of Lord Hardwicke, which put a stop to those Fleet marriages, which had become one of the strongest scandals of English life. Before this Act the Canon Law was in force in England, and according to its provisions the mere consent of the parties, followed by cohabitation, constituted, for many purposes, a valid marriage, and a valid marriage for all purposes could be celebrated by a Priest in Orders at any time or place, without registration, and without the consent of parents or guardians. Stamped licences were, indeed, required by law, but not for the validity of the contract, and their omission was only punished as a fraud on the revenue. In such a state of the law atrocious abuses had grown up. A multitude of clergymen, usually prisoners for debt, and almost always men of notoriously infamous lives, made it their business to celebrate clandestine marriages in or near the Fleet. [*The Fleet was a prison a which debtars were confined*.] They performed the ceremony without licence or quesclergymen, usually prisoners for debt, and almost always men of notoriously infamous lives, made it their business to celebrate clandestine marriages in or near the Fleet. [*The Fleet was a prison in which debtors were confined.*] They performed the ceremony without licence or ques-tion, sometimes without even knowing the names of the persons they united, in public-houses, brothels, or garrets. They acknowledged no ecclesiastical superior. Almost every tavern or brandy-shop in the neighbourhood had a Fleet parson in its pay. Notices were placed in the windows, and agents went out in every direction to solicit the passers-by. A more pretentious, and, perhaps, more popular establishment, was the chapel in Curzon Street, where the Rev. Alexander Keith officiated. He was said to have made a 'very bishopric of revenue' by clan-destine marriages; and the expression can hardly be exaggerated if it be true, as was asserted in Parliament, that he had married on an average 6000 couples every year. He himself stated that he had married many thousands, the great majority of whom had not known each other more than a week, and many only a day or half a day. Young and inexperienced heirs fresh from college, or even from school, were thus continually entrapped. Among the more noted instances of clandestine marriages we find that of the Duke of Hamilton with Miss Gunning, that of the Duke of Kingston with Miss Chudleigh, that of Henry Fox with the daughter of the Duke of Richmond. It is not surprising that contracts so lightly entered into should have been as lightly violated. Desertion, conjugal infidelity, bigamy, ficti-tions marriages celebrated by sham priests, were the natural and frequent consequences of the system. In many cases in the Fleet Registers names were suppressed or falsified, and marriages fraudulently ante-dated, and many households, after years of peace, were convulsed by some alleged pre-contract or clandestine tie. It was proved on one occasion before Parliament that there had been there had been 2954 Fleet marriages in four months, and it appeared from the memorandum books of Fleet parsons that one of them made £57 in marriage fees in a single month, that

pools of Field parsons that one of them made 207 in marinage fees in a single month, that another had marrined 173 couples in a single day." P. 498.—" With large classes of the community the easy process of Fleet marriages were very popular. On the day before the new law came into force no less than 300 were celebrated, and a bold attempt was made by a clergyman named Wilkinson to perpetuate the system at the Savoy. He claimed, by virtue of some old privileges attaching to that quarter, to be extra-parochial, and to have the right of issuing licences himself, and he is said to have actually cel-brated as many as 1400 clandestine marriages after the Marriage Act had passed. By the instrumentality of Garrick, one of whose company had been married in this manner in 1756, a Savoy licence passed into the hands of the Government, and the trial and transportation of Wilkinson* and his curate put an end to clandestine marriages in England. Those who desired them, however, found a refuge in Scotland [Gretna Green marriages in England. Those who desired the Isle of Man [clandestine marriages nere made illegal in the Isle of Man in 1757] and Guernsey; and in 1260 there were always vessels ready at Southampton to carry fugitive lovers to the latter island." [The charge for the passage was five guineas.] In 1823 another Marriage Act was passed, of which the chief points of difference from that of 1753 are...

of 1753, are-

That seven days' notice of banns shall be given to the clergyman before the first publication. That no clergyman shall be punishable by ecclesiastical consures for solemnizing marriages without consent of parents unless he has had notice of such dissent.

That banns must be republished if the marriage is not solemnized within three months.

That no marriage shall be solemnized at any other time than between the hours of eight and twelve in the forenoon.

That when marriage is solemnized between parties under age by false oath or fraud, the guilty party shall forfeit all property accruing from the marriage. The penalty of transportation for fourteen years for improperly solemnizing marriage was preserved, but the prosecution must take place within three years after the offence was committed.

* Wilkinson was transported for some years, and "John Grierson, the clergyman of the Savoy Chapel," was transported for fourteen years for this illegality in 1755. Perhaps he was Dr. Wilkinson's curate,

She was a godly sober and vertuous woman and lived (by y^e blessing of God) untill she was one hundred and eight yeares of age. This Jane for y^e affectionate love she bare as well to hir husband Richard Lovelace as to the said Henry and Marg^{ret} and their children gave all hir estate of Valve to those children as by hir last will appeareth. She Christianly and peacibly passed out of this mortal life y^e 12 day of June 1630 in y^e faviour of God and good men.

REREDOS IN MEMORY OF H. A. S. BENCE, ESQ.

The reredos is executed in Baltic and Belgian oak ; it consists of three central panels, with wings and "returns" on the sides of the chancel. The central panels consist of three cusped arches, divided by buttresses, which terminate in crocketed finials. In these arches are three subjects carved in oak, which represent the following scenes. In the centre is the group of the "Crucifixion." Our Saviour is shewn on the cross, the figures of the Blessed Virgin and of St. John stand by the sides; above their heads we see the sun and moon,-emblems of the eclipse that took place at the solemn moment of our Saviour's death. In the background is seen the city of Jerusalem. On the dexter side of the reredos is represented the scene of the "miraculous draught of fishes," and on the left side "St. Peter walking on the sea," in which the Saviour is seen standing on the sea, and raising St. Peter, who is sinking into the waves. All these groups are carved in high relief, and are beautifully executed. The style of the carving is that of the fifteenth century, of the best type. The central compartment of the reredos is surmounted by a "brattishing" or cresting of pierced foliage, whilst under this member is a moulding, in the hollow of which vine leaves are sunk. Between each of the three figure "panels" are four smaller ones, in which are quaintly carved the lily, passion-flower, rose, and pomegranate. The wings, as well as the sides or "returns" of the reredos, consist

of framed panels of fifteenth century type. The arms of the Bence family, as well as the following inscription, "To the glory of God and in loving memory of Henry Alexander Starkie Bence, born May 15, 1816, died May 30, 1881," are carved on the upper part of the right or N. side. The antique altar table, which is of Jacobean type, is so placed as to stand in a recess, in the centre of the reredos. This table is also raised on an oak step or platform, of which the front is decorated with carved rosettes or "bosses." This altar table is covered by a richly embroidered frontal and super-frontal, on which are executed in rich colours and gold the cross keys of St. Peter and pomegranates, the grounds being in damask and velvet of antique designs. The ancient "aumbery" and piscina which have been incorporated into the design of this reredos have also been restored and decorated, and its shelf in oak has once more been replaced. The character of all the work is of the type prevalent in Suffolk in the fifteenth century.*

• At the feet of the said Jane Lovelace lye buried y^e bodies of Robert and Thomas Coke sons of y^e abovesaid Henry and Margaret. Robert dyed 20 Dec. 1630. Thomas dyed 18 Apr. 1631, both infants.

3. On a flat stone within the Communion rails is a brass plate, above which was a shield of arms, or group of children, on brass also, now gone. With the following inscription:

Lovelace's monument, which was formerly fixed against the east wall of the chancel on the south side, has been taken down, and the tablet only, of black marble, preserved, which is laid in the floor just below ; the inscription, never intended for the rough use it will now occasionally be put to, cannot last a very long time. Inscription below and arms gone.

The stone for Rob. Gould lies north and south against the east wall of the chancel, towards the north side.

The monument for Alexander Bence has been removed from the east end, north side of the window, to the north wall, about the centre of the chancel, and is not otherwise altered.

Below this inscription is a male figure in bailiff's gown and ruff collar, and a female figure in hat and ruff collar, followed by the ensuing lines:

IF TO BE IVST, RELIGIOVS, WISE, AND FREE BE MANS : OR HIS, WHAT BETTER COVLD THERE BEE TO STRAVNGERS KINDE, AND TO HIS HOME SO DEARE WELL KNOWNE FOR TRAFFICK, WTH THOSE NATIONS NEARE IF TO ATTAINE A COMPETENT POSSESSION BY FAITHFVLL PAINES FREED FROM OPPRESSION OR OF HIS WORD SO CIRCVMSPECT AND SOVNDE AS THAT THE SAME BEYOND THE LAWES HIM BOVNDE AND BY THAT STRAIGHT RVLE W^{CH} EXPERIENCE BRINGS TOOKE THE TRVE HEIGHT OF MOMENTARY THINGS BOLDLY HER BENCE MAY ALDBOROVGH PREFERRE WHOME AS SHE BREDD HERE KINDELY DOTH INTERR.

By the side of the above.

HERE LYETH BVEIED THE BODY OF ALEXANDER THE SONNE OF IOHN BENCE, WHO HAD TO WIFE MARY Y^E DAVGHTER OF THOMAS SQVIER, THEY LIVED TOGEATHER 38 YEARES & 4 MONETHES. AND HAD ISSVE 9 SONNES & 2 DAVGHTERS, WHEREOF ARE LIVINGE IOHN, ROBERT, ALEX^E & SQVIER. ROSSE & MARY, HE WAS BAILIFFE OF THIS CORPORATIO' SIX TIMES. HE DECEASED THE 27TH OF IANVARY. 1612. ETATIS SVE 65.

Above this inscription is a male figure in bailiff's gown and ruff collar. The wife's figure is missing, as also a shield above the figures bearing a ship—the arms of Aldborough.

Below the inscription, nine sons on left ; two daughters on right, on one brass plate.

MONUMENTAL INSCRIPTIONS OF THE

Formerly in Chancel.

Male figure in bailiff's gown and ruff collar between two wives in ruffe collars and hats.

HERE LYETH BVRIED THE BODY OF IOHN THE SON OF ALEXANDER BENCE WHO HAD TWO WIVES MARY AND ELIZABETH BY HIS FIRST WIFE MARY WHO LYETH INTER-RED BY HIM HE HAD ISSVE 4 SON'ES & TWO DAVGHTERS, VIZ. IOHN ALEXANDER EDMVND MARY AND ELIZABET THESE FIVE WEARE LIVING AT HIS DEATH, HE WAS BAYLIF OF THIS COR-PORATION FOVER TIMES, AND DYED THE SECOND OF IVLY ANNO DOMINI 1635 ÆTATIS SVÆ 54.

Below, a small brass with four sons, and another with two daughters.

Copies of these brasses and inscriptions were taken some years ago, probably between thirty and forty, but the date is uncertain. Of these the first was described as being on a flat stone in the middle of the church; it is now at the east end of the south chancel aisle, and is perfect. The second, now by the side of the former, was then in the chancel. The shield of arms and figure of the wife were then existing. The third inscription was described at that time as being in the chancel, but now no trace of figure or inscription can be found. Rubbings of these brasses as they were then are in the possession of Captain Starkie Bence of Kentwell Hall, Suffolk.

Churchyard.

M¹⁸ Mary Bence Widow of Squier Bence died 24 October 1678.

Here lyeth the Body of Squier Bence the son of Alexander Bence. He had two wives, Elizabeth and Mary. By his first had two children, who died young was Bailiff three times and Burgess in Parliament twice. Died 27 November 1648 aged 51 years 6 months and twelve days.

These inscriptions are not now to be found.

BECCLES.

Chancel.

Sacred to the Memory of Harriot the much lamented wife of the Revnd B. Bence Rector of this Parish and Daughter of William Elmy Esq. and of Catharine Pullen his wife. She died June the 9th 1815. Aged 56 years.

Also in Memory of the above named Bence Bence a faithful teacher of God's word both by his Life and Doctrine. He departed this life the 2nd of Sept^r 1824, aged 77 years.*

A Monumental Inscription to William Elmy, Esq., who died June 9, 1801, aged 86 years; and to Catharine his widow, daughter of Peter Pullyn, Esq., who died March 22, 1808, aged 80 years. And to other members of the Elmy family.

Also, on the north wall, within the altar rails, a memorial of Katharine widow of Nicholas Starkie, Esq., of Frenchwood in Lancashire, and youngest daughter of Robert Edgar, Esq., of Ipswich. She died April 10, 1814, in the 47th year of her age, leaving two daughters.

* At the restoration of Beccles Church the flat stone covering the grave of Bence Bence and his wife was removed from the chancel to the nave.

BENHALL.

Hic jacet Edmundus Bence Armiger Obijt quinto die Maij Anno Ætatis suæ 83 Anno Dom. 1702. A parte sinistra viri sui Positum est quod mortale Mariæ Bence vitam dum Egit providam multæ Consulens Proli vicinis Chara Pauperibus Munifica Animam reddidit Maij 10 Ætatis 69, anno 1717.

Here lieth the Body of Mary Bence daughter of Edmund and Mary Bence late of this Parish who departed this life the 16th Jan^{ry} 1765 aged 93. And Abigail daughter of the said Edmund and Mary Bence who departed this life the 10th March 1750 aged 68.

HENSTEAD.

Panel of four.

Robert the 3rd son of Edmund Bence of Benhall died Dec. 19th 1745 aged 72 years.

Robert Sparrow of Worlingham died Sept. 15th 1765 aged 60 years.

Anne wife of Robert Sparrow and daughter of Robert Bence died Nov. 8th 1776 aged 68 years.

Laurence the only son of Robert and Mary Bence daughter of Laurence Eachard A.M. died March 31st 1747 aged 41 years.

Chancel.

In grateful and affectionate regard this monument is erected to Mary Bence second Daughter of Robert Bence formerly of this Parish whose remains together rest in the Vault at the west end of this Church. Thro' a long life she performed every Duty within her sphere and died deeply lamented Dec. 21, 1792, aged 83 years.

Churchyard.

In hopes of a joyful Resurrection here rest the Bodies of Robert Bence and Lawrence Bence his son both of this Parish, Gentlemen. Robert died and buried 19th Dec. 1745, aged 72 years. Lawrence on the 31st March 1746, aged 41.

Here lyeth ye Body of Katherine the wife of John Bence of Heveningham,

Also of Anna Maria Relict of the above who departed this life March 17th, 1872, aged 85 years.

Churchyard.

To the memory of Gabriel Trusson Esq. who died 17 June 1766, aged 54, and of Catharine his wife Eldest Daughter of the Rev. Thomas Bence Rector of this Parish, who died 8 June 1785, aged 77.

SIBTON.

Churchyard. In hope of a joyful Resurrection Here lyeth the Body of M^{rs} Mary Bence wife of M^r Robert Bence of Henstead in this County who depart^d this life on the 21 (?) Day of August 1717. Aged 33 (?) years.
