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
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INTRODUCTION.

THE Priory of All-Hallows or All Saints, which stood upon the ground now occupied by Trinity College, Dublin, was founded by Dermod Mac Morough, King of Leinster. This unhappy prince, who, among his many other crimes, is charged with having burned many churches^a, was the founder of religious houses in different parts of his territories. At Ferns^b in Wexford, in atonement for having burned the town, he founded for monks

monks of the Order of St. Augustine the Abbey of St. Mary; at Baltinglass in Wicklow, he built the Cistercian Abbey de Valle Salutis^c; and the Nunnery of St. Mary de Hoggess of Dublin, with its dependant cells at Kileeheen^d, in Kilkenny, and Athady, in Carlow, owed its origin either to his policy or to his transient penitence.

By a charter granted about the year 1166, when he had succeeded in taking hostages from O'Carroll, King of Uriel^e (or Louth, Armagh, and Monaghan), this prince conferred on his spiritual father and confessor, Edan, Bishop of Louth, for the use of the canons of the church of the daughter of Zola, the land called Ballidubgaill^f, with its men, that is, with Melisu (Malise) Macfeileean, his sons and grandsons, free and released from any procurations^g or expedition (to be rendered) to himself

himself or his successors in the government of Leinster and Dublin for ever; and he charged the men of Dublin and Leinster to maintain the bishop and his canons in the possession of the said land, in all liberty, without any exaction of tithes, as fully and honourably as any college of canons or monks in Ireland was possessed of any royal endowment.

In the absence of authentic and of historical evidence, if we are unwilling to indulge in vague conjectures or fanciful etymologies, we must confess our ignorance of the church of the daughter of Zola, from which Dermot brought the canons of All-Hallows. From whatever church they were derived, this priory, if not from the first, adopted very soon after its foundation the rule of St. Augustine, as reformed and rendered stricter in the Convent of Aroasia^b.

These decrees furnish an instance of the weakness of law against custom. In the fourth decree it is enjoined with a particularity omitted in Stanyhurst's translation, "Quod de villis Ecclesiarum cibus ille detestabilis qui quater in anno a viciniis comitibus exigitur, de cetero nullatenus exigatur." Yet in an Irish Deed, made in 1503, between the Friars of Kilcormick, in the Queen's County, and Theobald, the son of Donagh, it is expressed that the friars owe the food of four persons, each quarter of a year, according to the custom of the country.—*Miscell. Irish Arch. Soc.* vol. i. p. 104.

As long as this monastic rule was fully observed the canons of All-Hallows must have mingled little in the affairs of life, and have been little noticed in public history, and accordingly we have been able to discover only few and indistinct traces of this house in the records and chronicles of the time. Still, the situation of the priory, at the very gate of Dublin, at the head of the level ground then called the Steyn, stretching along the south bank of the Liffey to the sea, must have made the canons spectators at least of many great events. From this plainⁱ Hasculf and John le Deué, with their iron-clad Danes, some in long breastplates and some in iron plates sewn together, and with round red shields edged with iron, prepared to assault Dublin,

“ Une citè mult loé
Que Hathelyth iert einz nomé,”

which Strongbow had given to the safe-keeping of Miles Cogan; and it was here

“ Desur le Hogges de Sustein,”

that Gilmeholmoc^j, having agreed with Cogan to be “strong upon the stronger side,” awaited the issue of the contest, ready to join the conqueror; and it was near this priory, at the old Thengmote of the Danish colonists, at St. Andrew’s Church, the site of the present Castle Market, on the south side of Dame-street,—alas for the transitoriness of human grandeur—that Henry II.^k spent from Martinmas to Shrovetide, A.D. 1171-2, in a royal palace, “de virgis levigatis ad modum patriæ illius constructum,” where, at Christmas, to please

the King, the Irish princes, for the first time, tasted heron's flesh, and where they were astonished at the elegant abundance of an English feast, and the order and obsequiousness of the attendants.

The priory was not without benefit from this neighbourhood of royalty; it was at this time, that, in the presence of Archbishop Lawrence, of the original patron Bishop Edan, of Strongbow, Hugh de Lacy, Robert Poer, and others, that Henry II. confirmed the grants of Baldoyle and of several other lands, made by Dermot, of which the original charters are not recorded. This preservation of their property seems to have been a special favour to this house. It might have been expected that, to conciliate the Irish ecclesiastics, King Henry and his immediate successors would have preserved at least the landed property¹ of the Irish Church, united by the Council of Cashel,

Although the buildings were destroyed and the religious dispersed, the property of the Irish Church was preserved during all the troubles consequent on the Danish

invasion. St. Bernard (*Vita Malachie*, cap. v.) says that from the destruction of the Abbey of Benchor (Bangor) by the Danes, to the time of Malachy, its property fell into the hands of persons who were appointed by election, and who were called abbots, “servantes nomine, etsi non re, quod olim extiterat.” This passage must have been overlooked by Dr. Lanigan, when he allowed (vol. iv. p. 25) that Gille, Bishop of Limerick in 1110, and Apostolic Legate, had been Abbot of Benchor. The names of some of the abbots thus described by St. Bernard, are given in Archdall, from good authorities, without any distinctive marks.

It would appear from the following passage in the Tripartite Life of St. Patrick, that at the time it was written, which has not been thought to be later than the tenth century, the custom of

Cashel, in ritual^m as well as doctrine and discipline, with the Church of England, but although that council freed all church lands from lay exactions, from which Dermot's charter had exempted the lands of Baldoyle, yet the mystical dream of Giraldusⁿ when he saw King John marking out on the green sward, the plan of a church with a large aisle for the laymen, and a chancel “enormiter arctum,” for the Irish clergy, his direct assertion of the English robbery of the lands of the Irish Church, by which the clergy were reduced to beggary, and of the mutilation of their old dignities and privileges, and complaints, like that of Albin^o, Bishop of Ferns, against the Earl Marshall, and of Archbishop Comyn^p against Hamo de Valoniis, shew that the love of church lands commonly prevailed over policy and piety. Nay, to the lands of Baldoyle, granted by Dermot and confirmed by Henry II. to the priory, it would appear, from our Registry^q, that for several generations the Lords of Howth maintained a claim,

claim, founded probably upon the grant of Howth by King John, and that the canons were obliged to purchase these lands twice over, from Sir Almarie and his wife with spiritual benefits, and from Sir Nicholas with forty marks.

In 1182 Bishop Edan^r renounced, in favour of John Comyn, the first English Archbishop of Dublin, all claim to the Church of All Saints, reserving possession, however, under the Archbishop and the Church of the Holy Trinity, for his own life; and the patronage of this priory was confirmed to Archbishop Henry de Loundres in 1216, in the Bulls of Innocent III. and Honorius III., reciting the several possessions of the see of Dublin.

The three successive Bulls of Urban II. in 1186, of Gregory IX. in 1234, and of Innocent V. in 1276, contain, not only the confirmation of a gradual increase of lands and churches, but an increasing succession of Papal privileges and immunities. Urban exempts from tithes^s their tillage lands, cultivated with their own hands, or at their own cost, and their cattle. He allows them to receive into their Order clerics and laics, provided they were free^t and *absolved*, and to retain them without contradiction; the professed brotherhood were prohibited from migrating to any other house, without license from the prior, saving for the sake of entering some stricter Order^u.

During a general interdict, the canons might celebrate Mass, in a low voice, with closed doors, without ringing bells, having excluded the excommunicated and interdicted. Without manifest cause no one was to presume to pronounce against them sentence of interdict or excommunication. All customs and ancient liberties and immunities were permanently sanctioned. The enclosures of their houses and granges were protected by apostolical authority from theft and arson, and had the privilege of freedom from arrest. The election of the prior was secured to the brotherhood. And, finally, the cemetery was declared free, so that none should oppose the interment therein of any person, except he were excommunicated; the due rights of the churches to which the bodies belonged being observed.

Such were the principal privileges secured to the priory by the Bull of Urban II., given at Verona by the hands of Albert, Priest Cardinal and Chancellor S. R. E. on the 6th Nones of July, in the fourth year of the Indiction, in the first year of the Pope, and in the year of the Incarnation MCLXXXVI.

In 1234 Gregory IX. added clauses enjoynning the members of the priory to receive the Chrism, the Holy Oil, and the consecrations of their altars and churches, and Holy Orders, from their diocesan^v

Of the jealousy with which exempt monks guarded against the exercise of any episcopal function by their

bishop, provided he were in the grace and communion of the Holy Roman See, and at the same time, the erection of new chapels and oratories within their parish, without their consent, and that of their diocesan, was prohibited.

To these privileges in 1276 Innocent V. added a protection against new and undue exactions by archbishops, bishops, archdeacons, or deans, and all other persons, ecclesiastical and secular, and this Pope specially noted, that the Church of All Saints had no abbot, but was under the government of a prior. These are nearly the usual clauses and privileges contained in Bulls of this period, and they are here mentioned, not for any peculiarity in their contents, but as specimens of the exemptions and immunities sought for by religious houses in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The other Bulls here printed are short, and expressed in general terms.

The superiority over the Priory of St. Saviour of Glendalough, one of the earliest of the acquisitions of All-Hallows, was one of the most interesting; however great was the old sanctity of Glendalough, it was now desert and desolate, a den of thieves and robbers^w; and the Archbishop of Tuam^x bore testimony that, in the forty years previous to 1214, more homicides were committed in that valley than in any other place in Ireland. In the Synod of Mellifont in 1152, which was attended by Gilda na Naomh, then Bishop of Glendalough, Cardinal Paparo had divided this see, and had assigned part of it to the metropolitan see of Dublin, which, till that time, was confined within the walls of the city, intending, as the Archbishop of Tuam believed,

believed, that it should be united with Dublin on the next vacancy. In 1192 Earl John^y, by a charter dated at Nottingham on the Feast of St. John the Evangelist, granted to John Comyn the privilege of nominating the Bishop of Glendalough, who was to be chaplain and vicar to the archbishop. He had previously, when in Dublin^z, granted the see itself to Archbishop John, “pro raritate populi et paupertate Ecclesie Dublin;” but perhaps the insolence of the Irish, to use Archbishop Felix O’Ruadan’s words, may have deferred the execution of this plan, although it was confirmed by Matthew^a, Archbishop of Cashel, the Pope’s Legate; it is, however, probable that William Piro, the last recognized^b Bishop of Glendalough, was appointed under this charter, in 1192, by Archbishop Comyn.

Pope Innocent III., to whom John had sent the Archbishops of Bourdeaux, York, and Dublin, as ambassadors for the purpose, confirmed the union of the sees in 1216, on condition that, with part of the revenues of the see of Glendalough, a religious house or hospital^c should be erected; and accordingly Archbishop Henry de Loundres founded near the Priory of All-Hallows, on the sea-shore, which was called the Steyn, an hospital where pilgrims on their way to St. James of Compostella, who might be detained by stress of weather, should find bed and board; and he endowed there ten chaplains, who were to wear black cloaks with a white cross on the breast.

While the old Irish City of Glendalough in the mountains, secured only by its situation, and hallowed by ancient custom, was gradually giving way^d before its modern and Danish rival, the seat of trade

trade and foreign intercourse, and while its bishops of the succession of St. Patrick were supplanted by the Dublin archbishops of the succession of St. Augustine, the fate of its abbeys was not dissimilar. At the time of the foundation of the Priory of All-Hallows, Coemgin or Kevin was Abbot of Glendalough, and his name appears amongst the witnesses of Dermod's charter. Having become vacant, probably by Coemgin's death, Strongbow conferred the abbey and parsonage, "Abbatia^e et Parsonatus" of Glendalough, with all its great possessions and immunities, as they were specified to him *in verbo veritatis* by King Dermod, on his dear clerk Thomas^f, in a charter witnessed by the Countess Eva and confirmed by Henry II.^g

This grant was not long observed. Earl John, by a charter dated at Tewkesbury^h, granted to the Archbishop of Dublin half a cantred belonging

belonging to the Abbey of Glendalough, which lay nearest to the Archbishop's castle of Balymore. And Matthewⁱ, Archbishop of Cashel and Papal Legate, confirmed to the Archbishop of Dublin Earl John's grant of the whole Abbey of Glendalough, together with his grant of the bishopric.

It must have been shortly after the union of the sees of Dublin and Glendalough, that Archbishop Loundres, by his charter^j, subjected the Island^k of St. Saviour of Glendalough, with all its possessions, to the Priory of All-Hallows, enjoining on the Prior and Convent of St. Saviour, whom he by implication charges with disorderly and irregular conduct, that they should be obedient to the wholesome admonitions of the priors of All-Hallows; and the Island Sancti Salvatoris of Glendalough was confirmed to our priory by the Bulls of Gregory IX. and Innocent V.

Before 1186 the priory had no lands granted to it, except those given by King Dermod, but between that year and 1234 it had received grants of the Church of St. George^l in the suburbs with

Among other monuments, there is a place in that lane called now Collet's-innes, which in old time was the Escaxar or Exchequer. Which should implie that the princes court would not have beene kept there unlesse the place had beene taken to be cocksure. But in fine it fell out contrarie.” “There hath

ten acres belonging to it, of a messuage near the Church of St Stephen, of the Island Sancti Salvatoris de Glendelacha and of forty acres of land in the territory of Dovenachbroc^m, towards the north, for which acres the canons were to pay yearly one poundⁿ of pepper for pottage.

About the year 1240 the priory was enriched by grants of the parish of Taghadoe^o, in the diocese of Dublin, conferred upon it by Maurice Fitzgerald, Lord of Offaly, saving to the Church of Laraghbry and to the Chapel of Maynooth, their tithes, lands, and offerings; of the Church of Rathmackne^p in the diocese of Ferns, the gift of William Marshall, Earl of Pembroke; and from the gift of Maurice Fitzmaurice Fitzgerald, of the parish of Rath in Imokelly, all of which were confirmed to them by the respective bishops “in proprios^q usus;” and of the Church of Arnegeth, in the diocese of Meath,

beene also in that lane a chappell dedicated to Saint George, likelie to have beene founded by some worthie knight of the garter. The maior, with his brethren, was accustomed, with greate triumphs & pageants yeerlie, on Saint George his feast, to repaire to that chappel and there to offer. This chappell hath beene of late razed, and the stones therof, by consent of the assemblie, turned to a common oven: converting the ancient monument of a doutie adventurous and holie knight to the colerake sweeping of a pufloafe baker.”

Meath, of which we find no further mention. It was also about this time that Theobald Fitzwalter^r, second butler of Ireland, granted to the priory two acres and a half of his land of Steyn near to their house, with all the tithes and offerings of the whole Steyn; and that John, son of John, son of Dermic^s, confirmed his father's grant of a boat for catching salmon and other fish on the Liffey, for which he was to receive a rose on every St. John Baptist's day, in the Church of All-Hallows; and it was probably about the same time that Claricia^t, daughter of Gilbert, son of Griffin, granted half a carucate of arable land in Balyofryn next to the land of Sir John Harold of Kylgabane (Kilgobbin), with pasture on the mountains for as many cattle as the canons chose, with liberty to pasture, dig, cut, and with all other privileges, which the grantor possessed or could give.

Such were the grants of parishes and of lands which the priory thought worthy of Papal confirmation in the year 1276. In these and the other grants of the same period, there is proof—in the mention of homage, wardships, suits of court, and marriage—that the Norman settlers brought with them into Ireland all the complexities of the feudal system; a system eminently fitted, by the strictness and frequency of its legal relations, by the minute divisions of its ever present authority, by the nearness of its administrators, and by the variety and succession of its dependencies, to discipline a rude people by the introduction of notions of right and of law, and by familiarizing them with legal forms and ceremonies. Nor, when we are considering a great ecclesiastical lordship, should we forget that the severities

assigned to the priory *in proprios usus* by Bishop Adam in 1333 (p. 15), there was reserved to the bishop the “ordinatio” of the vicarage, and from the inquisition, printed, p. 81, it appears that the vicar

was entitled to a moiety of all the profits of the parish.

severities of the Feudal system must have been much softened when it was administered by the easy and formal churchman, connected by blood more frequently with the middle ranks than with the nobles of the land.

Perhaps the most startling grant in this collection is the concession and donation by Richard de Pheypo^u, of certain serfs, with all the issue and progeny of their sept. From the name Mackelegan, and from their being said to be of Balydugyl, it is likely that these men were the descendants of the Melisu Macfeilecan, of Balydugil, who, with his descendants, was granted to the priory in King Dermot's charter. They are here given separate from the land, and as pure serfs or "villeins" in gross," not as neoyffs^w, betaghs, or *ascripti glebae*. The difference between these forms of villeinage was considerable; the betagh or native was an occupier of the land, bound to the performance of certain offices connected with land; he was bound to the land and granted with it; he was obliged to bear taliage^x, high and low, at the will of the lord; his right to dispose by will of his chattell property was denied in the King's Courts; and even were he to raise himself to the rank of a citizen of Dublin, any landed property which he acquired was liable to be seized upon by the lord. In this form villeinage existed in Ireland to the sixteenth century^y, when Archbishop Alan, in 1531, counts up his natives

natives as he would count up his stock^z; but as *servi*; these Mackeligans were in a worse state than betaghs or natives; so far as is indicated by this charter they were absolute slaves, and, as they were given without land, might be removed or sold from it.

In the early charters the grant of a turbary at Finglas^a, where turf might be dug for the supply of all the houses of the priory, and the condition in the grant of forty shillings of annual rent in Manthonin, in the tenement of Arclo^b, that it should be exchanged for equal charge on land nearer to Dublin, are worthy of observation.

These grants were in pure alms “pro salute animarum,” or the rent was only nominal and illusory, a rose, or a pair of spurs, or a pound of pepper; but a change now took place. The fervour of religious zeal, which the monks and canons had diverted to themselves, from older and now almost forgotten institutions, was directed towards the Mendicant Orders in the thirteenth century, and the followers of St. Benedict and St. Augustine gave way to those of St. Francis and St. Dominick.

The subsequent grants then were of a different kind, and were more in the nature of sales or of perpetual leases. Of these one of the earliest and most interesting is that of Waleran^c de Wellesleigh, who grants fifty acres in his tenement of Crewath, with the lordship and feudal service of the ten acres held by John Wodeloc^d, together with the common pasture of the whole mountain, in wood and turbary,

bary, broom, and heath, at the rent of forty shillings a year, and to secure himself against the depreciated currency of the black or copper money.^e Wellesleigh expressly mentioned that the payment should be in silver^f.

In the charters and deeds relating to the property of the priory within the city or suburbs of Dublin, there are many things to attract the notice of the local antiquary, and who is not a local antiquary in his own neighbourhood? The very names of the streets are not without interest and significance; Rochelle-street tells of foreign trade, Bertram-street of the city residence of the noble family of Verdon, Skinner-row, the north side of which we have seen pulled down, of the hides and furs which our ancestors used to barter for the wines of Poictou^g; while the incidental mention of the Thengmote carries back the view to the dark times of the Danish colony. We have a mill^h and a millrace in the present College-green, and a milldam and a quarry in Dame-street.

The times were now coming when the lands in the immediate neighbourhood of Dublin, although not the most extensive, would be the most valuable possessions of the priory. With short-sighted policyⁱ, Edward the First had wasted the flower of the Anglo-Irish nobles in the wars of Gascony and Scotland, while, with unusual weakness, to secure their favour, he had resisted his own wish to consolidate his power in Ireland, and to attach the natives to his government by extending over all the protection and the authority of English law, and by abrogating altogether those Irish customs, which were still recognized in his courts. It is not strange then, that the natives, who had in vain sought the shelter of the throne from the oppression of their petty tyrants, should have taken advantage of the misfortunes of Edward II. and should have been encouraged to resistance by the success of the Scots. Nor is it strange that, having no one great man to guide them, and no principle of union to raise their discordant septs to the feeling of national independence, they should have satisfied at once their vengeance and their cupidity by predatory attacks on the property of the English, by burning their homesteads, by driving away their cattle, and finally by entering into possession of the lands, which they had made worthless to the occupiers. In this general lawlessness, the priory must have found great difficulty in establishing its rights in its remoter estates; as early as 1305, we find the prior complaining of a rescue of distresses which had been made in the fee of Tipperary^j, and in 1318^k he was par-

doned a fine, on the grounds of poverty, a plea again used for the like purpose in 1396; and in 1423¹, according to the statement of the Canons, confirmed by Archbishop Talbot, the priory was reduced to such a state of misery^m, by the ruin of its buildings, by the unjust and hostile occupation of its lands, by the unfruitfulness of the seasons, by the mortality of men and cattle, and by the number of strangers, and other oppressions, that their remaining goods were scarcely sufficient to support the prior and the convent, so that Divine worship, the observance of the rule, and other works of piety, could no longer be maintained without the relaxation of two marks of the six payable to the archbishop for proxies.

In 1374 the prior was summoned to Parliamentⁿ. It was in 1380, when the priory was smarting from loss of property and sinking into

In one for forty years, provided the tenant's life should last so long, a power was granted to the tenant to take away any trees he might plant on any land reclaimed by him from a mill-pond. In another, right of re-entry is secured on the rent being one month in arrear. In another, right of seizure for rent was given on another tenement, if sufficient distress was not found on the premises. In most of them the tenant is bound to repair the buildings, and to deliver them up “stiff and staunch” at the end of his term. In one the rent was reduced one-half for forty years, in consideration of the expenses of the tenant in repairs and buildings. We have also the purchase, or perhaps the repurchase, by the priory of the remaining portion of a lease of forty acres at Donnybroke, of which some years had expired.—Nos. XXIII. IV. VIII. XXXI. II. into poverty^o from the incursions of the natives, that it received the writ^p of Richard II. ordering the observance of the enactment in the Statute of Kilkenny, that no Irishman, or any enemy of the king, should be admitted into any religious house within the land of Ireland. Recourse had often been had before, by both sides, to this unhappy proof of national discord. So early as 1250 Pope Innocent IV.^q sent a Bull to the Irish bishops, ordering them to revoke a Statute which they had made, "ex quodam livore," that no Englishman should be received into their religious houses as a canon: and while the Irish Abbot of Mellifont^r refused to admit any monk unless he made oath that he was not of English descent, and the Irish Abbot of Magio^s [Mayo] alienated the lands of his abbey with a view to prevent English monks from dwelling there, the English monks of Granard^t and of Inisceourcy, of the same Order (they were all Cistercians), buckled on their armour and attacked and killed the Irish, and then returned to celebrate Mass.

The writ of Richard II. was directed to twenty-one religious houses; although not repealed by authority, it was not long observed; like many other laws it was silently reversed when the passion in which it originated had given place to the common feelings of humanity. The names of some of the subsequent abbots in these houses are purely^u Irish.

At

At one time, in this period of its depression, the priory enjoyed a gleam of hope ; during King Richard's "noble voyage," when the northern lords^v, laying aside their girdles, skeins, and caps, had fallen on their knees at his feet, and done homage, and sworn fealty to the King at Drogheda ; and when the Leinster lords^w had received the kiss of peace from the Earl Marshall; at that time the priory paid forty shillings into the Hanaper for a charter^x dated at Kilkenny, 5th April, 1395. In this charter not only was the charter of Henry II. recited and confirmed, but also the title of the canons was confirmed in all their possessions, notwithstanding the alleged loss and burning of their muniments, and in addition, liberty was granted to them notwithstanding the Statute of Mortmain, to acquire lands and advowsons to the annual value of twenty pounds.

In the scarcity of facts indicative of the personal characters and conduct of the members of this house, we transcribe the following notices of charges brought against two of our priors, quoted in the *Monasticon Hibernicum*, from Archbishop King's manuscripts.

" 1319. Richard of Exeter, Chief Justice of the Common Bench, made a complaint against the prior, that he, the said Richard, had given into his custody a crane^y, safely to keep for him till he should call for it, but that the prior, through malice prepense, suffered it to escape, to the loss and damage of

sixty shillings to the said Richard; he, therefore, brought his action to recover the said damage. The prior appeared, and confessed that the bird had escaped out of his custody; on this acknowledgment, at the request of the Chief Justice, the Judge pardoned the prior."

"In 1396 William Reve was prior; for Richard Norreys, one of the canons of this priory, being accused of divers felonies, and thereupon confined in the marshalsea, the said prior came into court and did openly and publicly make use of injurious and unbecoming expressions to Stephen Bray, the Chief Justice, though admonished to the contrary; he was thereupon committed to the custody of the marshal; but the court taking into their consideration, that the said prior was not of sound mind, and compassionating his weakness, and the exility both of him and the priory, he was pardoned on paying a fine of thirteen shillings and fourpence."

We may also mention here that in 1310, Philip de Braibrooks, canon of the church of the Holy Trinity, was confined here, for heresy, by sentence of Richard, Archbishop elect of Dublin, for one year.

In the reigns of Henry IV., V., and VI., the only deeds we have found relative to our priory, are some leases of tenements in Dublin, and the King's pardon granted in 1416, by Thomas, Archbishop of Dublin, deputy of Sir John Talbot of Halomshire, Lieutenant of Ireland, to the prior and convent, of all intrusions, abatements, &c., in Dublin, Donaghbroke, Baldoyle, Donaghkarny, Ballycollane, and Kenturke, and elsewhere in Ireland, and the confirmation of their title therein. There is also, bearing the date of June 2, 1460, the return of Lawrence, Archdeacon of Ferns, to a mandate from John Purcell, bishop of that see, ordering an inquiry respecting the avoidance and presentation to the parish of Rathmackne. From this it appears that the archdeacon held a court of inquiry composed of nineteen persons, most of whom were rectors and vicars in the neighbourhood, in the church of St. Nicholas of Clomen, "in pleno loci capitulo," who, on their oaths, made a return, in which the following articles are not without interest, as throwing light on the state

state of the church: they found that the Prior and Convent of All Hallows were the true patrons, and had presented on the last vacancy, that the vicarage was not litigious or pensionary, but portionary; that is, the patrons had the first portion of all fruits, profits, sheaves, tithes, offerings, lands, altarages, and other things belonging to theforesaid Church of St. Martin of Rathmackne; and the vicar had the other half of the same. That the clerk presented by the prior was not of honest condition of life and conversation, or fit, in science and manners, that he was guilty of perjury, inasmuch as he took his oath before the archdeacon, when about to be ordained, that he would keep a grammar school for the next three years, which oath he did not keep; and that, having been suspended by his ordinary, he notwithstanding performed Divine Service, and that, therefore, the patron having presented an unfit clerk, the vicarage had devolved, *pro hac vice*, to the collation of the Ordinary.

In 1468 a visitation of the priory was held by R. Warenn, official of Archbishop Tregury. Prior William Stewnot and Richard Cristor (Christopher) sub-prior, and four canons, attended, and as far as we can judge from the imperfect abstract in Archbishop Tregury's Registry, no cause of complaint appeared against any member of the body.

The success of Edward IV. must have excited hopes of royal favour in the prior and canons of All Hallows: claiming, as the heir of the De Burghs, Ulster and Connaught, and possessed in the right of the Mortimers of the liberty of Meath, this Prince must have felt a personal interest in the country; his father had resided in it for some time and had not only won the hearts of the great lords of Meath, whose fidelity to the supposed blood of their hereditary feudal lord was shewn at the battle of Stoke, but had gained also the support of the great family of the Geraldines, the ancient benefactors of the priory. The only privileges, however, granted in this reign are contained in the unprinted Acts of Parliament of 1472 and 1474. By the

the first of these Acts the title of William (Stewnot), Prior of All Saints, was confirmed to all wrecks on the manor of Baldowell, enjoyed by his predecessors time immemorial. While the second, passed in a Parliament held at Conal^z, in the 18th of Edward IV., enacts:

“At the supplication of William Prior and Convent of All Saints, near Dublin, lords of the town of Baldoile, that as the inhabitants of the town of Baldoile, in county of Dublin, are daily troubled & damaged in their goods by the king’s admirals of Ireland and their deputies, according to the law of Ulron^a, who daily levy inordinate amercements on them, against all law and conscience, to the great damage of said prior and convent, and the utter undoing of said tenants & inhabitants ; it is enacted that said prior & his successors shall, for the time to come, be admirals of said town and all other their lands in Ireland, and shall enjoy the said office of admirals to them & their assigns & deputies, without any molestation or impediment from the king, his heirs or successors, officers or ministers, & that no other admiral of the king or his deputy shall vex or trouble any of the said tenants & inhabitants, by virtue of their office, in time to come, & whoever of them acts to the contrary shall forfeit £10, half to the king and half to the party grieved.”

These were great and valuable privileges, shewing the power of this house and the personal influence of the Prior, William Stewnot, who in this year was joined in commission with the Archbishop of Dublin, and Earl of Kildare and others, to attend the King on particular affairs relative to the public interest.

But the act of the greatest value to the priory was one of the year

year 1474, passed in a Parliament held in Dublin, reciting, that Richard, Abbot of St. Thomas, near Dublin, and William, Prior of All Saints, near Dublin, and their convents, had much lands within the habitation of the Irish enemies, and enacting that they might send and carry, as well victuals as other necessaries, to the said Irish, and might let to farm and sell the profits of their possessions to them, as often as they pleased, and might treat and be conversant with them, as well in war as in peace, and that they might be godfathers to such, without any offence or breach of law^a. In fact the lands situated beyond the English marches were either to be given up altogether, or were to be maintained by friendly dealings with those, who were styled in parliamentary language, Irish enemies ; that such dealings were frequent, even in time of war, chiefly through the intervention of these great religious corporations, is proved by many existing records, and, were there no existing evidence, might be inferred from the nature of the case ; but as such dealings were contrary to law, they subjected the English party to heavy penalties, and this Act of Sanction obtained from Parliament protected the House from the necessity of suing out a license from the Lieutenant, and from the legal extortion of informers and officials.

In the want of common inns^b, it was in religious houses, and at their expense, that the King's Deputy and his officers, and also Irishmen and others resorting to him, were most commonly lodged. All Hallows was not backward in complying with this laudable custom ; and such is the meagreness of our information respecting our Priory, after the termination of the Registry in the middle of the fifteenth century, that we are tempted to mention, that on the 23rd of July, 1488,

1488, Sir Richard Edgcomb^c, who had been sent to Ireland as the King's Commissioner, after the general declaration of the Anglo-Irish in favour of Lambert Simnel, had an interview with the Earl of Kildare, at a place of Canons called All Hallows, without Dublin, and there had long communication with him and his Council, and that day, at after dinner, the said Sir Richard rode to Drogheda, twenty-four miles thence; and the same parties had another conference at All Hallows, on the 29th of the same month.

In 1490, in a Parliament held at Drogheda, and thence adjourned to Dublin, before Gerald Earl of Kildare, deputy to Jaspar Duke of Bedford, Lieutenant of Ireland, Prior William (probably through the influence of the Deputy, the hereditary friend of All Hallows), obtained a privilege, indicating the unhappy circumstances of the country. Stating^d that his convent was grievously charged with diverse subsidies, taxes, talliages, and grants, made as well by authority of Parliament as by that of the Great Council, and also with other impositions laid upon them for great and little hostings ("grand jornaiez et petuz"), he obtained an Act, exempting him and his house for ever and their possessions in every county, barony, and deanery in Ireland, from all subsidies, taxes, talliages, and from all impositions granted to the King, or to any governor of the land, on the payment of 13*s.* 4*d.* to be levied from the lands of Baldoyle, by the collector of the deanery of Swords. By this Act^e were also confirmed all grants made to All Hallows by Edward IV., any Act or ordinance made or to be made notwithstanding.

The attention of Henry VII. was at last directed to the state of Ireland, by the countenance shewn by the Yorkist party to the two Pretenders, Simnel and Warbeck. For the encouragement of his loyal subjects he granted eight marks^f yearly to the guild in the chapel of St. George the Martyr, in Dublin, an old Lancastrian foundation. In 1506, the masters^g and wardens of the guild covenanted to pay Prior Nicholas, and the convent of All Saints, the sum of four marks yearly, "for the sustentacion and wages of a honest chapleyn to say masse and other divine service in the said chapell, in Sundaies and Feasts and thrice by weeke, that is to say, Wednesday, Fryday, and Saturday, wekely and yearley," as long as the royal grant of eight marks should continue.

In the next year (1507) we find the last grant made to this house, of which we have any notice. Margaret White^h, in her pure widowhood, surrendered to the King, for the use of the Prior and convent of All Saints, her lands and tenements in Calganiston, in the barony of Newcastle, County Dublin. This was the onlyⁱ lordship which the "Kyng had in all Ireland in possession of thineritaunce of the Crowne," and it was specified that the lands of Calganiston were to be held according to the uniform and laudable custom of that manor.

In 1534, the Prior was bound to send two able gunners^j or archers to the hosting. On the 1st day of March, 1537, Walter Hankoke, the last Prior of this ancient foundation, granted a lease^k of a farm at Ballycollane^l, to William Baly, and Isabel his wife, for thirty-

thirty-one years, at the rent of four marks. The tenant being also bound to furnish a wache hen and a goose at Christmas, *all her-thyoles* (a word we cannot explain), a custom day to draw turf to the Abbey, and to free the ditches of his portion of the town.

It was also covenanted, that if the half-year's rent were two months in arrear, the Prior was to have a right of distress, and if no lawful distress was therein, then the lessor was to repossess the lands. The tenants were bound to keep the messuage and appurtenances stiff and staunch at their own proper costs and expence ; and were not to alien or sell any part of the premisses without the consent of the Prior, under pain of forfeiture of the lease ; and if the tenants died during the term, without lawful issue, the lands were to revert to the Prior and Convent, and any corn which might be growing on the lands at the termination of the lease, was to be the property of the tenant.

These are interesting covenants in the earliest lease in English of lands in Ireland, with which we are acquainted, and they give no sign of any apprehension of the impending ruin of the Priory; yet, within less than two years of the date of this lease, the chapter-house
in

to these lands was disputed by the Crown in the time of Richard II. They were seized into the King's hands in consequence of an inquisition taken before Sir Thomas Clifford, Escheator of Ireland, which found that a certain Sytrick Mak-morgh (perhaps the founder of Inis Patrick—Mon. Hib. p. 218), gave the grange of Ballycollane to All Hallows, to find two chaplains, “*Divina celebrantes*,” for the souls of the said Sytrick and his successors : that at the taking of the Inquisi-

tion, on the Monday before the Feast of St. Patrick the Bishop, in the 13th of Richard II. (1390), this condition was not observed, and that the heir of Sytrick was an Irishman, and an enemy to the King. It was subsequently found by a jury, that the lands had been granted by Dermic M'Morgh, before the conquest, to William, then Prior, and had been held by all his successors ; the Prior thereon had a writ “*de manu amovenda*,” on the 4th of December, 1302.—Memorand. Roll, 17 Rich. II.

in which it was executed witnessed a very different scene. There, on the 16th November, 1538, in the presence of sundry persons, in a deed giving proof of the compulsion under which it was executed by the vehemence of the declarations of their free will, Walter Hancoke, Prior, Robert Dolyng, John Grogan, James Blake, and John Barret, the last Prior and the last Canons of All Hallows, assembled for the last time, and there signed, sealed, and delivered, to the Royal Commissioners, William Brabazon, Gerald Ailmer, John Allen, and Robert Fitzsimon, all hungry for monastic spoil, the surrender of their ancient priory. The form of surrender then executed omitted no property which could belong to the house. It specified the scite, ambit, and precinct, the whole church, belfry, and cemetery, all manors, messuages, lands, tenements, rents, reversions, and services, mills, meadows and pastures, woods and underwoods, houses, buildings, granges, granaries, stables and dovecots, fisheries, warrens, annuities, waters, ponds, rectories, vicarages, knights' fees, advowsons of churches, chapels, and chantries, pensions, porcions, tithes, oblations, courts leet, and of frank pledge, and their profits and perquisites, and all other rights, possessions, and hereditaments, as well spiritual as temporal, in the counties of Dublin, Meath, Kildare, Louth, Tipperary, Kilkenny, and elsewhere in Ireland, belonging in any way to the Prior and Canons of All Hallows. Nor were these all. There were added their charters, evidences, writings and manuscripts, their goods, chattels, utensils, ornaments, jewels, and debts, all these were granted to the King, to be disposed of at his good pleasure, without appeal or complaint, and the unhappy men were forced to declare, that they thus deprived themselves of house and home of their own free will, and that they put an end to a venerable institution, to which they were bound by the most solemn obligations, certain just and reasonable causes thereto moving their minds and their consciences.

The

The loyalty of the citizens of Dublin during the siege of Thomas Fitzgerald equalled in courage, if not equalling in the importance of its results, the defence of their predecessors against the attack of Robert and Edward Bruce, was rewarded with the spoils of All Hallows. On the 4th of February, 1539, the King granted to the Mayor, Bailiffs, citizens, and commons of Dublin, the Priory, with all its lands and advowsons, as they had been surrendered by Prior Haneoke, for the annual payment of £4. 4*s.* 0*3d.*, as the twentieth part of the value.

This noble grant was not long held by the Corporation in their own hands. On 7th of August, 1539, they leased^m the whole of it for six years, to Nicholas Stanyhurst, of Dublin, gentleman, and to Walter Forester, of the same, clerk, at the rent of five score pounds sterling.

The work of demolition was now going on. In this lease, although Stanyhurst was bound to keep up and repair the Byrtas and gatehouse next the Hogge's-green, the stone walls, porter's loge, and leaves of the same gate, and to uphold the roof thereof, it was covenanted, that the tenants should make no claim to the stone work, stone walls, towers, slates, and timber, "that is at this present day there unsold within the precinct of the said House of All Saints," and that it should be lawful to the Corporation to dispose of them, and to convey them away.

Mr. D'Alton mentions an inquisition of 1548, by which All Hallows was found to have been seized of the nunnery or cell of Lusk, which, having been appropriated to the Priory, was afterwards transferred to Grace Dieu.—Hist. of Co. of Dublin, 420-423.

what property the House had in Waterford, nor does any Inquisition, with which we are acquainted, specify any lands in their possession at the time of the surrender in Meath, Louth, Tipperary, or Kilkenny.

The fate of the site of this Priory has been happier than that of most other religious houses. In 1592, on the 21st day of July, it was made over by Thomas Smythe, Mayor of Dublin, George Kennedy and John Milles, Sheriffs, the commons and citizens of the city, to Adam Loftus, Archbishop of Dublin, Chancellor of Ireland, Provost of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, near Dublin, founded by Queen Elizabeth, and to the Fellows and Scholars of the said College, for their use and that of their successors for ever. The old buildings, if any still remained, were speedily demolished, except the steeple; and a college, the forerunner of that noble building, to which so many now look with filial affection, was erected in their place. It was seven hundred years ago dedicated to God, and it is still intended for his service.—May it be so always!

The list of Priors of All-Hallows is very imperfect. We have ascertained only the following :

AFTER the dissolution of the Priory of All Hallows, it may be presumed that, with the other muniments of the house, and with the lands to which they related, the Registry here printed was transferred to the Corporation^q of Dublin; and accordingly we find that, when Sir James Ware's extracts from it were made, it was "in the treasury of the citie". How or when the Registry fell into private hands does not appear, but we know that at one time it belonged to Dudley Loftus, LL.D.^s, who was appointed *temporarius* sub-rector of the University of Dublin in 1641^t. Loftus was connected, through

the family of Molyneux, with Dr. John Madden^u, in whose collection of manuscripts our Registry was probably contained, when that collection was purchased by the learned and munificent Bishop Stearne^v; (to the Irish antiquary it is pleasant to connect^w these names.) Bishop Stearne bequeathed his manuscripts to the Library of Trinity College, and there, on the site of the old Priory, the Registry^x of All Hallows is safely deposited.

The manuscript is on vellum, and consists of sixty-three leaves, each $9\frac{1}{4}$ inches in length, by $4\frac{1}{4}$ in breadth, with margins about an inch broad; a full page contains about twenty-eight lines. The titles of the Bulls and other documents are in Rubric. Although now nearly illegible, from the fading of the ink, it is written in a neat and uniform hand of the fifteenth century, and was compiled between the year 1425—the latest date mentioned in any of the charters^y—and the year 1460, the date of the return made by the Archdeacon of Ferns to the mandate of the bishop of that diocese, respecting a presentation to the vicarage of Rathmackne^z, which is written in a more recent hand, on the back of folio 3. That the volume is now nearly as perfect as it was three centuries ago appears from the following memorandum on the back of folio 41: “Iste liber continet sexaginta quinque

quinque folia tam scripta quam non scripta, anno Domini 1553, quorum quinquaginta novem sunt scripta^a. Four of the leaves “non scripta” remain^b, so that, with the exception of two leaves at the end, which are now wanting, the manuscript is as perfect as it was in 1553^c.

Before that time, however, the first sixteen leaves of the original manuscript were lost, for there are still visible on many of the leaves the peculiar numerals of an older system of paging, by which the present folio 1 was numbered folio 17. Notwithstanding this mutilation of the volume, we may hope that the original Registry is still nearly complete. It is not likely that in the early pages, which have been lost, any of the more ancient documents of the Priory were contained; those pages, probably, were partly occupied by a table of contents, such as is frequently prefixed to monastic chartularies; and partly they may have been left blank for future insertions, like the folia *non scripta* of the memorandum of 1553; and from Archbishop Talbot’s relaxation of two marks, payable for proxies, being written on our folio 1, it is probable that these early folios were occupied by records, to which priority was given, not from their higher antiquity, but from their peculiar interest in the days of the compiler. It is evident that the documents in the Registry have been arranged according to a system, and this order has, therefore, been preserved in the following pages: first, there are Papal Bulls^d, then Royal Confirmations^e, then Charters and Leases relating to property within the city of Dublin^f, followed by grants of lands in other parts of Ireland.

land^g. This is a simple and natural arrangement; it is not easy to suppose that in an ecclesiastical Registry any documents took precedence of the Papal Bulls; and as Archbishop Talbot's^h relaxation immediately precedes the confirmation of Pope Gregoryⁱ, it is plain that our present manuscript contains all the Bulls of the original compilation. It is, indeed, possible that charters and other evidences of the connexion of the Priory with the Archbishops of Dublin, who were not only the ordinaries, but the patrons of the house, may have had the first place in our Registry, and that, instead of a subsequent insertion, Archbishop Talbot's Relaxation may have been the last of a series of such documents. On this matter it is impossible to speak decisively, but we are of opinion that the original compilation commenced with our No. I., and continued in the order of the following pages, until it closed with No. LXXXVIII., and that the numbers which follow in this collection were added amongst the original compilation, according to the caprice of the transcribers.

Although the misplacing of one^j of the Papal bulls, and the mis-dating of others^k, and the strong suspicion of at least one graver error^l, prevent implicit reliance on the learning and care of the compiler of the Register, yet of the general accuracy of the record there is the most satisfactory evidence. Not only is there a copy of the deed of Richard Chamberleyn to be found in the Charter Book of the Corporation of Dublin^m in the same words with our No. XXIX., but we have in some instances been enabled to test the accuracy

racy of the transcripts in the Register, by collating them with the original charters. In the muniment room of the Corporation of Dublin, to which access was granted by the liberality of the Corporation, there are still preserved ten documents, the poor remains of the whole body of the evidences relative to the Priory of All Hallows, which were probably once deposited there. Six of these, of which there is no copy in the Register, have been printed as the first six numbers of our Appendix. The other four, namely, the Charter of Adam, Bishop of Ferns, embodied in the Inspexio of Edward III.ⁿ; the Inspexio, Confirmacio et Graciosa Concessio of Richard II., granted at Kilkenny^o; the Confirmation, by Almauricus de Hofla^p, of the Lands of Balidugil and Balykeligan, then held by the canons under the grant of the old Irish kings; and the Charter of Johannes Latimer^q, relinquishing all claim to that land, "que vocatur Inchenehaven et jacet inter Duncharni et aquam que vocatur Schikethoth," and granting to the Church of All Hallows his own corpse; these four records have been printed in the following pages, not from the Register, but from the originals, in the possession of the Corporation; and the slight difference between these originals and the copies in the Register, as collated, in the note^r, is sufficient evidence

dence of the general correctness and trustworthiness of the compiler of the Register.

The Appendix consists of original documents connected with the priory, printed without arrangement, in the order in which we had access to their depositories.

The first seven numbers are taken from the Munitment Room of the Corporation of Dublin, to which we were admitted by an Act of Assembly, and where every facility of search was afforded by the kindness and attention of Mr. William Ford, Town Clerk.

To Sir William Betham we are indebted for the extracts from the Plea Rolls, which, with his permission, Dr. Aquilla Smith transcribed from the originals in his keeping.

No. XIII., the Visitation of this Priory in 1468, is taken from Archbishop Tregury's Register, preserved in Trinity College.

The remaining numbers are printed from the original volume of Archbishop Alan's Registry, in the possession of the Archbishop of Dublin, which His Grace put into the hands of Dr. Todd for the purposes of this work^s.

We mention the assistance which we have thus received, not simply in discharge of a debt of gratitude so incurred, but as a proof of the interest felt in the works undertaken by the Irish Archaeological

logical Society, and of the general desire to assist every effort to make known the few remaining authentic records which are illustrative of the ancient, social, and political state of this country.

For various aid given in the progress of this work we are also bound to thank Mr. D'Alton, whose accumulated stores of materials for Irish History are so clearly arranged that they can easily be consulted; and for information on topographical subjects, part of which unfortunately came too late to be available, the Editor is indebted to Mr. O'Donovan.

But although much assistance was derived from these and other scholars, the Editor is chiefly indebted to Dr. Aquilla Smith, who collated every sheet as it went through the Press with the original, and exercised a most efficient superintendence over the whole work.

The original document, the fac-simile of which fronts the title page, is in the Town Clerk's office; it is printed at page 15; but the word "propensantes," line 20, should be "pio pensantes."

THIS indenture, made betwixt Thomas Newman and Nicholas Hertberd, masters of the geld in the chapell of St. George the marter in the suburbis of the cittie of Dublin Morys Colton and Patricke Hertberd wardens of the said gelde of the one parte, and Nicholas Prior and convent of the house of All Saints by sydes Dublin on the other parte, Witnesseth that the said masters, wardens, and their successors, by the onely assent and consent of the fraternitie of the said gelde, have given and granted to the said Prior and Convent and their successors four markes of silver of lawfull money, to be paid to the said Prior and convent and their successors by the hands of the said masters and wardens that now beene or for time shalbe, at the feasts of Easter and Saint Michaell the Archangell by even porcions yearly, for the sustentacion and wages of a honest chapleyn to say masse and other divine service in the said chapell in Sundaiies and feasts and thrice by weeke, that is to say, Wednesday, Fryday, and Saturday, wckely and yearly. To have and to hold the said four marke to the said Prior and convent and their successors in forme aforesaid, as long as the said masters and wardens and their successors hath and enjoyeth and shall have and enjoy eight marke granted by the king to the said masters and wardens and their successors to find and sustaine a priest at the pleasure

pleasure of the said king in forme aforesaid. Provided that as ofte as the said Prior and convent and their successors make any default in the service according to the premisses, that then the said Prior and convent and their successors to loose iiijd. of silver for every default of every day, and that it be lawfull to the masters and wardens for the time being to keepe and retaine the said money for the said defaults. Moreover, if the said Pierce his heires and assignes, do not content othere pay othere make to be paid to the said Prior conwant othere theire successors the aforesaid xli. of lawfull money, other a good fate marte and a good swyne, by three monthes after the said feast, that then it be lawfull to the said Pierce his heires and assignes, to dowble the said xli. of lawfull money, and by reason of nonpayment of the said xx. pound by the said three monthes, that then it be lawfull to the said Prior conwant, other their successors, to reenter in the aforesaid towne, and the aforesaid Pierce his heires and assignes to voide and withdraw their hands from the said towne and no more to interrupte neither deale therewith without assent of the said Prior and convent, and to thus our lawnde and warde wee the aforesaid arbitrators severally to thus presents putt our seales. To have and to hold all and singuler the premisses with their appurtenances to the said Nicholas and Walter and their assignes from the feast of Saint Michaell the archangell next ensuing the date above written unto the end and for [the] terme of six yeares then next and imediately ensuing to be fully compleated. The said Nicholas and Walter or their assignes paying therefore yearly dureing the said terme to the aforesaid maior bailives and commons and to their successors five score pounds of good and lawful money of Ireland to be paid termely in forme following that is to say fiftie pounds by the post semblie day after the feast of Cristmas next ensueing the date above written and other fiftie pounds by the post semblie day after [the] feast of Saint John Baptist then next following for all manner of services suites and demands. And if the rent be behind in parte or in the hole after any of the said post semblaies that then it be lawfull for the said maior baillives cittizens and commons and to their successors to enter into all and everie the premisses and them to have and peacablelie to enjoy this lease notwithstanding. 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





NOTE S.

Title.

ECCLESIE.—This foundation is occasionally called, in the preceding documents, *Domus, Conventus and Prioratus*; but its more common title is Ecclesia.

Page 1, line 1.

Gregorius.—Gregory the Ninth, Pope from March 1227 to August 1241. The terms of this Bull are the same as those used by this Pope in a Bull of the year 1234, to the abbey of Dumfermline. See *Registrum de Dumferndyn*, p. 175.

Page 2, line 6.

Sancti Georgii.—As neither the church of St. George, the messuage near the church of St. Stephen, the Insula Sancti Salvatoris de Glindelacha, nor the forty acres “in territorio de Donenachbroc,” are mentioned in Urban’s Bull (p. 4), it is probable that they were granted between the year 1186, the date of that Bull and 1234, when they were confirmed by Gregory the Ninth. The parish churches of St. Paul and St. George were united to the priory of this house.—*Alan’s Registry*, p. 350, Trinity College copy.

Page 2, line 8.

De Balidogaill, now Bald Doyle, County of Dublin.

Page 2, line 9.

De Balicongelan, now Ballyconnell, County of Dublin.

Page 2, line 9.

De Keldronan, perhaps Drynanstown in the County of Kildare, or Kiladreenan in the County of Wicklow. In 1318, Gilbert, Prior of All Hallows, sued Thomas de Cromhale and Alicia his wife, for a messuage and three carucates of land in Kildronan,

in the County of Kildare, of which Maurice Fitz Gerald had unjustly disseised David late prior; the prior did not succeed in his suit, but was "in misericordia pro falso clamore;" his fine, however, was excused *quia pauper*. R. Pl. B. T. No. 88. Ed. II. (n. 97). Although in 1318 the present County of Wicklow formed part of the County of Dublin; the bounds of counties were not then so well defined as to make it impossible that Kiladreenan should have been counted in Kildare.

Page 2, line 9.

De Cnoclislenn.—Lissan hill ? near Dublin.

Page 2, line 10.

De Canturc, now Clonturk, near Dublin.

Page 2, line 10.

De Duncernac, now Donnycarney, near Dublin. Here was one of the churches founded by St. Patrick in Campo Breg. Tirechan, quoted in Petrie's Round Towers, p. 141.

Page 2, line 10.

De Riboannan.—The present name of this place has not been ascertained. At the time the Registry was written there must have been some established mode of writing the names of the great holdings of the priory; and we can only account for the great diversity of form under which they appear in it, by ascribing it to the accuracy of the transcriber, and his unwillingness to alter the erroneous or obsolete spelling of the original documents.

Page 2, line 11.

In Island Sancti Salvatoris de Glindelacha.—Alan's Registry, as quoted in King's Collectanea de Rebus Hibernicis, p. 285, says: "H. Archiepiscopus Dublin confirmavit ecclesie Omnim Sanctorum Dublin ecclesiam Sancti Salvatoris de Glendelach, alii volunt (quod) per Fulconem de Sandford concessa erat." As it is not mentioned in Urban's Bull, it must have been granted between 1186 and 1234; and was probably granted by Henry de Loundres, Archbishop from 1213 to 1228, in whose episcopate the see of Glendalach was united with that of Dublin. By an inquisition at Newcastle, 30th August, 1604, it was found that the monastery or priory of All Saints, near Dublin, was seised, *inter alia*, of diverse messuages, with 1000 acres of arable lands, 700 acres pasture, 100 acres wood, and 200 acres moor, with their purtenances, "in cella Silve Salvatoris et Gланorkan in Glandalaghe," and in the towns of Ballyardgowle, Ballyiske, and Ballinluge.—*Inq. Dublin*, Jac. I. 5.

Page 2, line 12.

Donenachbroc, correctly Dovenachbroc, now Donnybrook.—See p. 67.

Page 2, line 13.

Vineis.—In the corresponding Bull for Dunnfermline vineæ are not mentioned.

Page 2, line 19.

Liberos et absolutos.—The distinction between the freeman and the villein was maintained by the Church; and none but freeborn or enfranchised men were admissible into religious foundations. It would seem, however, that a more benignant and liberal practice made its way, and that the nobles, who thereby lost the services of their villeins, were induced to enact laws against the admission of serfs or natives into holy orders. The 16th Article of the Constitutions of Clarendon (1164), asserts that, “*Fili rusticorum non debent ordinari absque assensu domini de cuius terra nati esse dinoscuntur.*” And in the 14th clause of the Statute of Kilkenny, for the publication of which the antiquary and the historian are deeply indebted to Mr. Hardiman, it is enacted: “*Que nul prelatz de St. Esglise recoievent nulle neoyff* (i. e. native or villain, see Blackstone, book ii. c. 6) *as ascuns orders sanz assent et tesmoignage de son seignior faiet a luy sur son seale.*” In the life of Robert Betun, Bishop of Hereford, from 1131 to 1148 it is said: “*Ordinationes clericorum exquisitissime faciebat . . . Gyrvagagos, acephalos, notabiles, alienos, servos penitus refutabat. Clericulos nisi pro vectiores et libertatis testimonium habentes, quibusque in ecclesia locus et virtus pro virtus fuisse, coronare devitabat.*”—*Anglia Sacra*, vol. ii. p. 310.

Page 2, line 22.

Arcioris religionis obtentu.—A dispute between the Dominicans and the Franciscans, as to which was *ordo arctior et superior*, to which members of the other might transmigrate, is recorded by Matt. Paris, no friend to either order, at the year 1243. Watt's Ed. p. 540.

Page 2, line 25.

Interdictum.—The following record, taken from Alan's Reg. p. 410, Trinity College copy, refers to an Interdict laid on the City of Dublin by Archbishop Fulk de Saundford, in the year 1267:

“Octobonus misericordie divina Sancti Adriani Cardinalis Apostolice sedis Legatus venerabilibus in Christo patribus Lismorensi et Waterfordensi episcopis salutem in salutis auctore. Page 2, line 32.

Fines parochie vestre.—In John Alleyn's decree, this house is styled "conventum dominus ecclesieque parochialis atque conventionalis Omnium Sanctorum"—p. 82.

Page 3, line 30.

Anno millesimo ccxxiiij.—As Gregory the Ninth sat from 1227 to 1241, it is plain that the transcriber must have omitted an x; the Indiction and the year of his reign are correct, and, with other circumstances, prove that this Bull must be assigned to him.

Page 4, line 3.

Urbanus.—Urban the Third, Pope from November 1185 to October 1187. This is the earliest of the Bulls granted to our priory; but in printing it has been thought right to observe the order of the Registry, in which the Bull of Gregory the Ninth is placed first.

Page 4, line 12.

Arrocensium.—“Sunt alii regulares canonicci qui de Arroasia nuncupantur eo quod prima hujus institutionis abbatia qua caput est omnium aliorum sic vocatur, in diocesi Atrebatenzi sita. Hi siquidem fundamentum regule beati Augustini retinentes, ut carnem suam cum vitiis et concupiscentiis arctius crucifigerent, carnes a refectorio suo subtraxerunt. Camisiis insuper non utuntur, sed cum tunicis laneis nocte in dormitorio suo quiescent. Quasdam etiam alias institutiones necessarias et honestas supra prædictum fundamentum prudentes adficiant, contra imminentia pericula sibi præcaventes, addiderunt. Et quoniam nihil magis virtutem religionis conservat, ubi plures sunt congregaciones et conventus, quam respectus ad unum superiorem, qui diversa sub se membra regit et continet, quasi summum et supremum caput, semel in anno sub primo et principali abbe generale concilium celebraturi convenient.”—*Jacob. a. Aroensium is printed “Froensium” in Pope Celestine’s Bull to the nunnery of Clonard, given in Dugdale’s *Monast.* ii. p. 1043.

Page 4, line 20.

Cantury.—From the Confirmation of Henry II. (p. 20) it appears that the lands here mentioned, although not included by name in Dermot M’Morogh’s foundation charter, were granted previous to the coming of King Henry, and that the English had made no additional grants to this house previous to the date of this Bull, in 1186.

Page 4, line 22.

Decimis.—From the earliest times the Irish Church laid claim to tithes. In the canons of a very ancient Irish Synod, published by Martene, in the fourth volume of his *Thesaurus Aeedotorum*, col. ii, which he ascribes to the times of St. Patrick, but in which reference is made to the authority of Colummanus Doctor [Columbanus?], it

it is enjoined, “ut omni anno decimas de vitalibus et mortalibus Deo demus, cum omni anno ipsius munera habeamus;” but that of the fruits of the earth, the tithe is to be given only in that year in which they grow; when a person had less than ten of any article, there seemed, in the time of this Synod, to have been some doubt as to the proper mode of tithing; some asserting that in such case no tithes need be paid; others enjoining, that if a man had only one cow, he should divide the price into ten parts, and give the tenth to God. In the treatise *De Statu Ecclesiae*, written by Gilbert, Bishop of Limerick and Legate, about the year 1100, are these words, shewing the payment of tithes, and the persons to whom they were paid in Ireland at that time: “Octo sunt ergo quibus sustentatur sacerdos, parochia, mansus, atrium, cœmiterium, templum, altare, calix cum patena, corpus cum sanguine, Parochiam appello populum primitias oblationes et *decimas* persolventem, Mansum dico terram aratri quam ad minus debet habere sacerdos; Atrium, cum domibus suis clausuram.”—*Usserii Vet. Epp. Hib. Sylloge*, p. 85. It is probable, however, from the frequent repetition of orders for their payment by Cardinal Paparo in 1157 (see the Annals of Cluain Aidnach, in Keating, vol. ii. p. 276), at the Council of Cashel in 1172, in which, however, the canon applies not to the payment of tithes, but to their appropriation to the parish church (see *Hibernia Expug.* lib. i. c. 30), and by Archbishop Comyn in 1186 (see Harris’s Ware’s Bishops, p. 317), as well as from the assertion of Giraldus Cambrensis—who, however, mixes this charge with others which, as Irishmen, we should not willingly allow (*Top. Hib. Distinc.* iii. c. 19)—that there was some difficulty in enforcing these canons of the Church, and in establishing this custom. In the fifteenth century it was a usual practice for dying men in their last wills to leave a sum of money to the parson of the parish, *pro decimis oblitis*; of this several instances are to be found in Archbishop Tregury’s Registry of Wills, which is preserved in the Library of Trinity Coll. Dub.; and in the same volume are given several sentences of excommunication pronounced against contumacious withholders of tithe in the diocese of Dublin; and if contumacious for forty days, the excommunicated person was committed to prison. Except in the payment of the quarter episcopals to the bishops in Connaught (see Harris’s Ware’s Bishops, p. 619), I have not found the slightest mention of any threefold or fourfold apportionment of the tithes in Ireland, either by law or custom. The term of forty days previous to the arrest of the excommunicated person (*Rot. Cl. ii. H. 3*, in *Turr. Lond.*, and *Proceedings against Alice Kyteler*, p. 20) was reduced to a month by the first chapter of the Statute of Kilkenny.

The following Bull relative to tithes has not been printed. It was addressed by Innocent the Third, in 1214, to Archbishop Henry de Loundres:

“Innocentius Episcopus servus servorum Dei venerabili fratri Archiepiscopo Dublin salutem et Apostolicam benedicionem. Significasti nobis quod plerique per Hiberniam

Page 5, line 18.

Sepulturam.—The eleventh canon of Archbishop Comyn’s Synod, prohibits, under the pain of an anathema, any person to bury in a churchyard, unless he can shew by an authentic writing, or by undeniable evidence, that it was consecrated by a bishop, not only as a sanctuary and place of refuge, but also for a place of sepulture; and that no laymen shall presume to bury their dead in such consecrated place without the presence of a priest.—*Harris’s Ware’s Bishops*, p. 316.

In 1427, John, the sixth Earl of Kildare, was buried in this monastery; and in 1478, his son and successor Thomas, the seventh Earl, was buried with him (Archdall’s *Lodge*, vol. i. p. 82). It is possible that the Fitz-Gerald monument, now in the outside wall of St. Werburge’s church, Dublin, may have been the monument of one of these earls; and that at the desecration of the priory chapel, it may have been removed to that church, by the piety of his representatives.

The following decree regarding the burials in the chapel of Palmerstown, which were claimed by the prior and canons of Lanthonie Prima, as belonging to the church of Garristown, and by the canons of St. Patrick, as belonging to the Prebend of Clonmethan, is taken from Alan’s *Reg.*, p. 621, Trinity College copy:

“ Universis Christi Fidelibus ad quos presens scriptum pervenerit H. Dei Gratia Dublin Archiepiscopus eternam in Domino salutem: ad universitatis vestre notitiam volumus pervenire quod cum controversia mota esset coram nobis super sepultura parochianorum capelle de Villa Palmeri inter Priorem et Canonicos Lanthonie prime ex una parte contendentes ipsam sepulturam ad ecclesiam suam de Villa Oggariibluct spectare: et Canonicos Sancti Patricii Dublin ex altera parte contendentes ipsam sepulturam spectare ad prebendam de Glinmether tandem pro bono pacis perpetue de consensu capitulorum nostrorum Sancte Trinitatis et Sancti Patricii Dublin dictam sepulturam cum capella de Villa Palmeri concessimus diece ecclesie de Villa Oggarii

Oggarii et assignavimus ad eandem ecclesiam perpetuo spectandam cum totali jure parochiali. Salvo nobis et successoribus nostris jure parochiali et pontificali salva etiam vicaria quatuor marcarum vicario in predicta capella de Villa Palmeri a predicto Priore et Canonicis Lanthonie prime nobis et successoribus nostris presentando et per nos et successores nostros in eadem capella canonice instituendo perpetuo assignanda. Qui quidem vicarius et successores sui de quinque solidis annuis ad festum Sancti Michaelis solvendis prefate Prebende de Glimmethone pro bono pacis supra memorata sepultura perpetuo satisficiet et onera episcopalia ad dictam capellam spectantia sustinebit. Ut hec nostra concessio futuris temporibus robur optineat indissolubile presenti scripto in modum cirographi confecto sigillum nostrum una cum sigillis capitulorum nostrorum Sancte Trinitatis et Sancti Patricii Dublin apponi fecimus appositorum est sigillum domini Roberti Sub-Prioris tunc temporis procuratoris generalis in Hibernia Canonicorum de Lanthonia Prima."

In the Synod of Cashel it was ordained that the dead man should have the third of his moveables; and this rule was observed in the time of Archbishop Tregury. The following extract from Laing's Chronicle of the Kings of Norway, shews the antiquity of this custom, and the mode in which this part was disposed of amongst some of the northern pagans: "Thorer explained, that it was so established in this land (near the mouth of the Dwina river), that when a rich man died, all his moveable goods were divided between the dead man and his heirs. He got the half part, or the third part, or sometimes less, and that part was carried out into the forest and buried—sometimes under a mound, sometimes in the earth, and sometimes even a house was built over it."—Vol. ii. p. 200.

Page 6, line 15.

Abbatem proprium non habentem.—Abbeys governed by priors were at this time of rare occurrence. There seem to be some faint indications that priories of a foundation anterior to the middle of the thirteenth century, were originally immediately under resident episcopal authority. Malachy, Bishop of Down from 1176 to 1201, granted the church of St. Patrick of Down in these words: "Sciant futuri tanquam presentes quod ego Malachias Dunensis Episcopus concessi ad honorem Dei et sancte religionis ecclesiam S. Patricii de Dune cum omnibus pertinentiis suis ad opus prioris et nigrorum monachorum, quorum ipse episcopus ero custos et abbas, sicut fit in ecclesia Wyntoniensi vel Conventrensi."—*Mon. Angl.* vol. ii. p. 1020. For the abbatial authority of the Bishop of Winchester over the monks of St. Swithun Wynton, see Girald. Camb. *De Rebus a se gestis*, printed in *Anglia Sacra*, vol. ii. p. 480. The Archbishop of Dublin, amongst his other titles, styled himself "Ecclesiarum cathedralium Sanctissime

Sanetissime Trinitatis regularis Abbas et Sancti Patricii Episcopus."—*Lib. Niger*, quoted in D'Alton's *Archbishops of Dublin*, p. 84.

Page 6, line 28.

Medietate decime (decimarum?) molendini.—The tithes of the mill were the tithes of the profits of the mill, consisting of a fixed proportion of the corn ground in it.

Page 6, line 31.

Stakto, now Taghadoe, or Taptoo, in the barony of North Salt, County of Kildare.

Page 7, line 1.

Rahtmaneht, now Rathmacknee, in the barony of Forth, county of Wexford.

Page 7, line 2.

Rath,—Perhaps Rathbarry, in the diocese of Ross?

Page 7, line 2.

Arnegeeth.—Perhaps Grangegeeth, in the diocese of Meath. Mindensi, by a not uncommon mistake, is written for Midensi. These parishes of Rath and Arnegeeth were not in the possession of the priory at the^o time of the Dissolution.

Page 7, line 8.

Balihoneron.—Perhaps Ballyornan, in the parish of Powerscourt, County of Wicklow. Vil'de Ballynornan, in Glaneapp, is mentioned amongst the lands held by the O'Tooles and others from Sir R. Wingfield, as of his manor of Powerscourt, in an Inquis. Wicklow, 8 Jac. I.

Page 7, line 8.

Insulam Sancti Salvatoris.—Probably now called the Priory of St. Saviour. See Mon. Hib. p. 775, and Ledwich Antiq. p. 176.

Page 7, line 31.

Capellam seu oratorium.—The twelfth canon of Archbishop Comyn's Synod, held about 1186, prohibits the celebration of divine service in chapels built by laymen to the detriment of the mother churches.—*Harr. Ware's Bishops*, p. 317.

Page 7, line 32.

Indebitas exactiones.—For some of these undue exactions of Bishops and ecclesiastical officers, their “extorsiones, tallagia, auxilia, et hospitiorum visitationes,” see De Statu Menevensis Ecclesiae in Ang. Sac. ii. pp. 532, 533.

Page 7, line 34.

Sepulturam.—See Archbishop Comyn's Canons, No. 11. Harr. Ware's Bps. p. 316.

Page 8, line 15.

Hominem temere capere.—Did these words confer immunity from legal arrest within the bounds of their places and granges—locorum seu grangiarum? It is said to have been one of the oldest laws of the British Church, “ut civitates et tempa Deorum, viæ ad illa ducentes, ac aratra colonorum immunitate confugii congauderent, ut quicunque fugitivus sive reus ad ea confugeret cum venia coram inimico suo abiret.”—*Hist. Mag. Winton. in Anglia Sacra*, vol. i. p. 182.

Page 9, line 1.

Datum Latranen.—Taking the year 1276, and the Indiction, which tally, the fourteenth kalend of June was the first and not the third year of Innocent the Fifth.

Page 9, line 7.

Innocencius.—Probably Innocent the Third, Pope from 1198 to 1216. The list of possessions here confirmed is very short, and the Island of St. Saviour's, which is mentioned in Pope Gregory's Bull of 1234, is not included amongst them.

Page 9, line 22.

Innocencius.—Probably Innocent the Fourth, who resided frequently at Lyons. He was Pope from 1243 to 1254.

Page 10, line 12.

Martinus.—Martin the Fourth, Pope from 1281 to 1285.

Page 12, line 7.

VIII.—This confirmation is in the Charter Rolls in the Tower of London, 22 Ed. III. n. 2. It is there said to have been by writ under the privy seal, and for a fine of 20s. paid into the Hanaper.

Page 13, line 21.

Dele [et T. de].

Page 15, line 3.

Wilhelmi Marescalli.—This charter must have been granted before 1276, in which year the church of Rathmacknee was confirmed to this Priory by Innocent the Fifth. See p. 7.

Page 15, line 7.

Wilhelmi Siircid.—Perhaps intended for Wilhelmi Senioris; William the Elder, Earl of Pembroke.

Page 15, line 16.

Ade episcopi Fernensis.—Adam de Northampton, Bishop from 1312 to 1346.

Page 15, line 23.

Hugonis episcopi.—Hugh de Lampart, Bishop of Ferns from 1258 to 1282.

Page 16, line 15.

J. Fernensis (lege Fernensi) episcopo.—John St. John, Bishop of Ferns from 1223 to 1243.

Page 16, line 27.

Laderachbrim.—By the following decree, Archbishop Luke erected the church of Laraghbrien (Maynooth) into a prebend of the Cathedral of St. Patrick. The patronage of this prebend is still possessed by the Duke of Leinster, the representative of Maurice Fitz-Gerald :

Dieti vero canonici per dictum Mauricium et ejus heredes presentandi vicarium in ordine diaconatus in dicta ecclesia Sancti Patricii convenient servitum cum aliis dicte ecclesie vicarii similem in omnibus emolumenterum sumpturum porcionem. Statuimus insuper et ordinavimus quod quotiescumque dictam ecclesiam de Lathedbrune per nos factam Prebendariam ut supradictum est vacare contigerit dictus nostris ad dictam ecclesiam de Lathedbrune nomine Prebende iidoneum presentabunt. Ad hec scient universi quod predicto nobili viro Mauricio vel ejus heredibus per ea que supra scripta sunt quantum ad jus patronatus attinet in nullo prejudicium generabitur quin libere possint et debeant ad dictam ecclesiam de Lathedbrune cum ipsam vacare contigerit ut superius continetur absque contradictione aliqua presentare. Et ut supradicta ordinacio nostra et statutum perpetue firmitatis robur optineat huic scripto in modum cirographi confecto sigillum

Page 16, line 32.

Philippe de Intebergia.—See *Rot. Can. Litt. Antiquiss.* 41, 42.

Page 17, line 1.

Lucas.—Luke, Archbishop from 1228 to 1255. This confirmation must have been granted before 1251, in which year Hugh, Archdeacon of Dublin, was consecrated Bishop of Ossory.

Page 17, line 18.

Johannis episcopi.—John de Cumba, Bishop of Cloyne from 1335.

Page 17, line 24.

Omachilly.—Imokilly, a barony in the County of Cork.

Page 17, line 27.

Nicholai Clonensis.—Nicholas de Effingham, Bishop of Cloyne from 1284 to 1320.—*Harr. Ware's Bishops*, p. 576.

Page 17, line 34.

Salva nobis.—Various means were adopted to secure the regular performance of divine service in the parishes appropriated to religious houses. Thus in Maurice Fitzgerald's grant of the parish of Taghadoe, p. 16, the tithes, lands, and obventions, and other things belonging to them, are carefully reserved to the church of Laderachbrim (Laraghbrien), and to the chapel of Maynooth; and in this instance of the parish of Rath, by reserving to himself the collation of the vicarage, the bishop not only secured the appointment of a resident priest, but also prevented the collusive arrangement which too often was made by religious houses with vicars of their own nomination.

Page 19, line 17.

Et eciam.—By this general clause of confirmation of all lost and destroyed charters, the Priory was secured in all the possessions it then held, acquired at whatever time, or by whatever means. It would have given greater value to this charter in modern eyes, if all these possessions and their reputed donors had been named.

Page 20, line 3.

Statuto de terris.—For the Statutes of Mortmain, see Blackstone's *Commentaries*, book ii. chap. 18.

Page 21, line 4.

Robertus dictus de Decer.—William de Brystole, who witnesses this charter as mayor, held that office in the sixteenth of Ed. I. 1288. See No. lxiii. p. 60. John le Decer was mayor in 1308 (and again in 1321, MSS. St. John's parish, Dublin), and died in 1332. Mon. Hib. 162, 211. In 1288, Archbishop John de Samforde, with the assent of the chapters of Trinity and of St. Patrick's, demised to David Callan, citizen of Dublin, half a carucate of land and five acres of pasture, in his tenement of Colloyn, for the term of twenty-four years, at the rent of 17*d.* an acre, with liberty to erect a pigeon-house.—*Alan's Reg.* Coll. copy, p. 498.

Page 22, line 12.

David de Kallan tunc majore.—David de Callan was more than once mayor; at the time of this grant Robert Talbot and Hugh le Serjant were provosts, and David de Callan witnessed No. 40, Litt. Antiq. Rot. Can. as mayor, with Hugh de Keresey and Rob. le Decer, bailiffs.

Page 22, line 27.

Roberto de Lynet.—The right form of this name, which was of great distinction for at least two generations, is now uncertain. In Mon. Hib. p. 156, in two paragraphs in immediate succession, we have Gilbert de Yvet and Gilbert de Livet. In this Registry it appears as De Lynet and Del Ynet. In the commencement of the reign of Edward II. the De Lynets were a powerful family in the south of Ireland. Rot. Can. Pat. 3 and 4 Edward II. 59, 72. Gilbert del Ynet is said, in Mon. Hib. p. 188, to have been mayor of Dublin about the year 1212.

Page 23, line 3.

Theobaldus Walteri.—As this grant is witnessed by J., Bishop of Ferns from 1223 to 1243, it must be assigned, as is done by Archdall, Peerage, vol. iv. p. 5, to the second Theobald Walter. Is it not from the circumstance, that the first Theobald was brother to Hubert Walter, Archbishop of Canterbury, that the tradition originated of the connexion between the family of Ormonde and Archbishop Thomas à Becket? Archdall, vol. iv. p. 3. This grant is recited and confirmed in No. ix.

Page 23, line 8.

De Stein.—In 1403, Robert Lugteburgh held a certain pasture called Le Steyne, near Dublin, from James Earl of Ormonde. Rot. Pat. 4, H. 4, 95. In 1633, Theodore Docowra, Baron of Cullmore, was seised of the land called the Staine, containing forty acres, and near Le Hoggen Greene of one messuage, three acres of pasture and four of meadow, parcel of the possessions of the late monastery of St. Augustine. Inquis. 20 Car. I. Com. Civit. Dublin. During the attack of the Irish and of “Johan
le

le Devé" on Dublin, Gilmeholmoe drew up his forces ready to help whichever of the parties should prove victorious:

“ Desur le Hogges de sustein,
Dehors la cité, en un plein.”

Cong. of Ireland, 2321.

Page 24, line 6.

Mauricio Mach Muruch.—This charter exhibits a mixture, unhappily too rare, of Irish and English names. The Fitz-Williams and the De Beaufoss are seldom found with the Mac Dermots, Mac Moroughs, and Mac Donoghs.

Page 24, line 29.

Thoma de Wyncestr.—In a Pipe Roll, 44, 5 Hen. III., engraved in Record Report i. Pl. ii. p. 56, several of the names attached to this and the following grants, appear as witnesses: Walter Unred, Symon Unred, Reymond Pictavens, Thom. de Wynton (Winchester), Elyas Burel, and Rich. Olof. In this year, 1259-60 (and also in 1267, Chain Book), Vincent Taverner was mayor, and Walter Unred and Hugh Cissor (Tailor) were provosts.

Page 25, line 21.

Ricardo Olof.—According to No. xxxiv. p. 37, Richard Olof was mayor, and Thomas de Winchester and Roger Asseborne were provosts, in 1317, the tenth of Edward II.; but as Roger Ashbourne was mayor, and Peter Abraam provost, in 1260-1 (Corpor. Charter Book), we shall, if we assign it to this date, 1317, have amongst the nine witnesses to this charter, four persons connected with the corporation for fifty-seven years, which seems beyond likelihood. By considering the words “filii Regis Edwardi” in No. xxxiv. as an error of the transcriber for the words “filii Regis Henrici,” and thus making Olof’s mayoralty in the year 1282, we shall avoid this difficulty, and save the credit of Robert Ware’s list of mayors, in which Robert de Nottingham rightly appears as mayor in that famous year, in which he defended Dublin from the Scots. Geram also, the grantor, witnesses No. xxiii., which was probably granted about the year 1230.

Page 26, line 3.

In Thingmothe.—This word seems to mean the Thingnote, or place of legal assembly in the Danish times of Dublin. See Gloss. Du Cange in *voce* Thingare. St. Andrew’s church and churchyard were the site of the present Castle Market, and so late as the year 1758, some memory of its original dignity was preserved, in its being

being the place of the mimie glories of the Mayor of Bull Ring.—*Harr. Dub.* pp. 60, 319.

Page 26, line 15.

Petro Abraam.—Peter Abraham was mayor, and Simon Unred and Thomas Wrench (probably Wyenche, for Winchester) were bailiffs, in the year 1258.—*Mon. Hib.* p. 161. A year which would agree with the observations made on page 25—*Ricardo Olof.*

Page 26, line 20.

Baldewynus Gerran.—Was evidently the same person as Baldewynus Geram in No. xviii., which was probably executed at the same time with this charter, as the witnesses to both are the same.

Page 27, line 22.

Hugone archidiacono Glyndalacensi.—Hugh de Mapilton, Bishop of Ossory, 1251–6. Luke was archbishop at the date of this charter, 1243. Hugh de Chaddestone was archdeacon of Glendaloch in 1267.—*Mason's St. Patrick's*, p. 47.

Page 28, line 7.

Flynttyscroft.—Flynncroftz, a messuage in St. Werburgh's parish.—*Marginal note to Registry*, fol. 33. d. In 1763, Sir William Davis paid the Corporation £2 a year for Flint's Croft.—*Rental of Dublin Corporation, in Harris's Dublin*.

Page 28, line 25.

Wydne Cornub.—The following charter of this Guido Cornubiensis, or Guy Cornwall, provost in 1230, is taken from Alan's Registry, p. 640, Trinity College copy:

“ Sciant presentes et futuri quod ego Wido Cornubiensis dedi concessi et hac presenti carta mea confirmavi Deo et ecclesie Sancti Patricii Dublin unam aream terre que jacet in longitudine ab area que fuit quondam Warini de London, usque ad aream domini . . . Canonici et in latitudine ab area Radulphi le Porter usque ad aream edificiorum canonorum Sancti Patricii cum omnibus pertinentiis suis. Tenendam et habendam de me et heredibus meis libere et quiete solute et integre. Reddendo inde annuatim mihi et heredibus meis sex denarios scilicet ad festum Sancti Michaelis pro omni servicio et demanda. Hanc autem donacionem et concessionem ego Wido et heredes mei dicte ecclesie Sancti Patricii Dublin contra omnes homines in perpetuum Warrantizabimus, &c.”

The following charter of Radulph de Mora, also another of the witnesses to this grant to All Hallows, is also taken from Alan's Registry (p. 10, Trinity College copy), and

and is worthy of notice, from the mention of Beltonia, clearly the Baaltingne, as the term of payment, corresponding to Martinmas:

“ Universis Christi fidelibus ad quos presens scriptum pervenerit Radulphus de Mora civis Dublin salutem. Noverit universitas vestra me divine pietatis intuitu pro salute anime mee et uxorun mearum antecessorum et successorum meorum dedisse concessisse et hac presenti charta confirmasse in puram et perpetuam elemosynam Deo et Domui Sancte Marie de Gratia Dei unam marcam redditus de terra quam teneo de Richardo Trussell que quondam fuit Obti Trussell solvendam medietatem ad Belloniam (Beltoniam?) et aliam medietatem ad festum Sancti Martini de me et hereditibus meis in perpetuum percipiendam. Ut autem haec mea donatio concessio et confirmatio imposterum perseverent presentem chartam sigilli mei impressione roboravi. His testibus Galfrido de Marisco. Nicholao Parvo. Hervisio de Dunhevet. Michaele de Angulo. Gilberto de Lynet. Ingelbric. Ada vicario de Balmadon.”

Page 28, line 23.

R. Priore de Sancta Trinitate.—At the beginning of the thirteenth century there were two or three priors of the Holy Trinity whose names began with the letter R. (See Mon. Hib.) Magister Thomas was probably Thomas de Craville, Chancellor of St. Patrick's in 1231, and W. Archdeacon, was William de Northfield, Archdeacon of Dublin in the time of Archbishop Luke, 1228 to 1256. In Mon. Hib., p. 157, Ralph de la More is said to have been dead in 1238; and the Charter Book of the Corporation says, that Guido Cornubiensis was Provost in 1229–30, so that we may fairly assign this charter to some time about 1230.

Page 29, line 5.

Johannes Hareng.—Seems to have been the tenant or assignee of Philip de Wygornia mentioned in xxii. This lease cannot have been much later than the grant in the previous number, as three of the witnesses are the same in both.

Page 30, line 24.

Thoma de Wynton.—This grant is of the same date as No. xvii. the mayor and provosts being the same. Roger the clerk wrote de Winton and Scissore for the names which Nicholas of Leominster(?), the writer of xvii., was content to represent under their vernacular forms of Wyncester and Taillur.

Page 31, line 3.

Audoenus Brun.—It is difficult, from its internal evidence, to ascertain the date of this document, but as it must have been prior to xxvii., which refers to it, and which was

was made before the year 1240, it must be one of the earliest in the Registry. For various grants made by Archbishop Comyn to Audoen his clerk, son of William Brune, see Alan's Registry, College copy, p. 628.

Page 31, line 25.

Rogerio Priore.—Roger was prior of the Holy Trinity in 1212 and 1230; in 1238 Philip was prior.—Mon. Hib. 154. Thomas was chancellor of St. Patrick's in 1231, and William Fitz-Guy was dean from 1219 to 1240. So that this grant must have been made between 1219 and 1238. In Mon. Hib., p. 206, William de Flamstede is said to have been mayor sometime before 1308. John le Decer was mayor in 1308, but if a William Flamstede was mayor about that time, he may have been the son of this witness.

Page 32, line 8.

Sancti Petri de la Hulle.—Stanyhurst says that the church of St. Peter de Monte, or upon the Hill, was appendant to St. Patrick's church.—Description of Ireland in Holinshed, p. 25. The vicarage of St. Peter's was formed in 1680, by an act of Council, which united into one the parishes of St. Kevin, St. Peter de Monte, and a portion of St. Stephen's.—Mason, St. Patrick's, p. 45.

Page 32, line 29.

Willelmo Bocdif.—It is to be feared that in the names of the mayors and provosts, witnesses to this lease, we have an instance of the carelessness of the writer of the Registry. In Ware's list, which was taken from the list in the Tholsel, the mayor and bailiffs for this year, 1334, are William Gaydon, William de Winerton, and Roger Grancourt; while for the same year the Charter Book of the Corporation, fol. 64, gives the names Beydyn, Winertown, and Graunecourt. It is easy to reconcile the Charter Book with Ware. Nor is it, perhaps, impossible to reconcile all these seemingly incongruous names, Gaydon, Bocdif, and Beydyn, by supposing that the real name was Beodif, which being written Begdyv, was copied by the scribe in the Charter Book Beydyn, and by the still more careless framer of Ware's list was changed into Gaydon. According to this conjecture the real name is more nearly preserved in our Registry than in any other record. John Crokes, John Callan, and Giles Waldeswel (correctly Baldeswell) frequently appear in Ware's list about this time.

Page 33, line 2.

Ricardi Chamberleyn.—Richard Chamberlan was bailiff in 1374, and again in 1375, and is occasionally mentioned as a citizen of Dublin in the Chancery Rolls, from 49 Ed. III. to 7 Hen. IV. He probably held this land from the city, and for greater

security caused this relaxation to be entered in the Charter Book, where it is to be found at folio 58.

Page 33, line 22.

Michaelis de la Pol.—Stanyhurst, *ubi supra*, calls this church St. Michael's of Poules, *alias* Paules. From the two following leases it would appear that this parish was situated near St. Patrick's cathedral. In 1682 the parishes of St. Bride and St. Michael of Pole, and a part of St. Stephen's, were united by act of Council, and this church was used as the diocesan school-house. In 1706 the Chapter issued an order to Dr. John Jones that he should not pull down the monument or tower of St. Michael of Paul's, near his school-house in Sheepe-street.—Mason, 72. Archdall, Mon. Hib. p. 150, says that Le Pulle-street, in the parish of St. Brigid, is now called Ship-street; but this is inconsistent with the earlier authority of Stanyhurst, who, p. 26, in his enumeration of the streets of Dublin, mentions both the Poule, or Paulmil-street, and the Sheepe-street, *alias* Ship-street; he also states that the Poule gate bridge was repaired by Nicholas Stanyhurst about the year one thousand five hundred forty and four. During the assault of the Norwegians on the English occupiers of Dublin, Harris, in his History of Dublin, p. 224, says, Richard de Cogan, by direction of his brother, sallied out of the south gate (then called Pole gate, at the end of St. Werburgh-street) with a body of 300 horse, and attacked the enemy in flank. In the original the gate from which this victorious attack was made is called the west gate, and the 300 horse are reduced to 30.—Conquest of Ireland, 2341. In Hib. Expug. Dist. I. c. xxi., Giraldus says that Richard Cogan sallied out *per porticum australem*. Curious etymologies are suggested by the name of the Norwegian leader: Regan calls him Johan le Devé, and Giraldus styles him Johannes Thewoode, *quod latine sonat insanus vel vehemens*. Have we here the origin of the Scottish word *Deave*, and the old English *Wood*?

Page 34, line 10.

Priore.—Rogero?—*Vide* No. xxvii.

Page 34, line 15.

Carmelit[an]is.—The Carmelites, or White Friars, in White Friar street. This house was founded about the year 1278.—Mon. Hib. 213.

Page 37, line 17.

Ricardo Olof majore.—As the names of R. Olof, Thomas Wynchester, and Roger Ashbourne, frequently occur as witnesses to many undated grants, it is of some importance to ascertain the year in which Olof was mayor, and Wynchester and Ashbourne provosts.

provosts. In this No. the year of their magistracy is said to have been the tenth of Edward, son of Edward, or Edward II., that is, the year 1316; and that this was the true date of Olof's mayoralty, would seem, in some degree, to be rendered probable by the circumstance that Richard de Sancto Olavo is said in Ware's list to have been bailiff in 1308, 10, and 12; and in our No. xxxiii., which is dated in 1347, the shop now recovered being styled the shop recovered from Richard Ponteys, would seem to bring the transaction of the present No. within the preceding fifty years. But there are great difficulties in the way of fixing the mayoralty of Olof and the provostship of Winchester and Ashbourne so late as 1317.

From No. lxxvii., p. 68, it appears that Prior Nigellus was alive in 1288, and that he was dead in 1298; he could not therefore have been plaintiff before Richard Olof in 1317. Nor is this the only difficulty in the way of this late date of the present No. In a Pipe Roll of 44-5 Hen. III., preserved in Birmingham Tower, and of which a facsimile is given in Record Report I., p. 56, amongst the witnesses are Walter Unred, Elyas Burel, Ric. Olof, Thom. de Wynton, Reymund Pictavens, and Simon Unred; but in Nos. xviii. xx. xxv. we have these six persons surviving to Olof's mayoralty, or to that of Wynton, which, as he was Olof's provost, was probably subsequent to Olof's. As the 45th of Hen. III. was from Oct. 1260 to Oct. 1261, if Olof's mayoralty was in 1317, we shall have six persons witnessing deeds at the interval of fifty-seven years. In Mon. Hib., p. 206, Thomas de Winchester is said to have been mayor of Dublin when Richard St. Martin was dean of St. Patrick's, which limits the time from about 1250 to about 1269. Perhaps it may be conjectured that the real date of Olof's mayoralty was 1282, the tenth of Edward I., and that the words *filiis Eduardi* were a mistake of the scribe of the Registry for *filiis Henrici*. When more documents of this period have been printed, these uncertain dates will probably be fixed; at present we can only deal with them in conjectures.—See note to p. 25, l. 21.

Page 38, line 17.

In vico pelliparii.—“Skinner's-row, reaching from the pillorie to the tolehall, or to the high crosse.”—Stanyhurst, *ubi supra*. Harris says that it is mentioned, with an alias Boath-street, in a record of the 20 Hen. VI.—Dublin, p. 88. In the Rentals of the estate of the city of Dublin, as it was in the year 1763, published in Harris's Dublin, p. 483, Sir W. Dixon is charged £1 for a house in Skinner-row amongst the All-Hallows' rents.

Page 38, line 18.

Thome Fukom.—In 1236 Walter Fitz Ivon granted to the prior and convent of the Holy Trinity a certain lot of ground in the parish of St. Nicholas. It is endorsed on

the original deed that in the year 1335, Thomas Faukoun, currier, held in his possession the said ground then built upon.—Mon. Hib. p. 157.

Page 39, line 10.

Longabulum.—This was the landgable, or land rent within the walls, reserved in John's charter of Dublin.

Page 39, line 17.

Le Rochelstrete.—Harris says that Rochel-lane was called in the ancient records of Ch. Ch. *Vicus Rupellæ* and *Vicus de la Rochel*, and that it had its name from the Rochelle merchants inhabiting there. As it is so called in this grant, which can scarcely be of a date later than 1230, its name cannot be derived from Richard de Rupella, Lord Justice in 1261. In the times of Stanyhurst and of Harris it was called Back-lane.—Stanyhurst's Descript. of Ireland, p. 26. Harris's Dublin, p. 90. The trade with Rochelle probably consisted in the exchange of Irish peltry for the wines of Poictiers (Top. Hib. Dist. I. c. v.) and perhaps for salt, which was sometimes enormously dear.—Clyn's Annals, p. 12.

Page 40, line 2.

Willelmo decano.—Of the witnesses to this grant William Fitz Guy and T. de Castello occur as dean and chancellor in 1219. Roger was prior of Holy Trinity in 1212, (Mon. Hib. p. 154) Radulph de Mora was dead in 1238 (Mon. Hib. p. 157) and Wydo Cornubiensis was provost in 1229.—Charter Book, fol. 41.

Page 44, line 19.

Willelmo Douce majore.—In the Proceedings against Dame Alice Kyteler, printed for the Camden Society, at p. 16, for Willelmo Doucemanne, civitatis Dubliniæ, read W. Douce, majore Civitatis Dubliniæ. This, and some of the other pleas in this Registry were intended to evade the Statute of Mortmain.

Page 45, line 14.

Invico Berterani.—Bertrami?—Bertram's-street, or Bertrami's-court, not mentioned either by Stanyhurst or Harris, is said by Lynch (Feudal Dignities, p. 68) to have derived its name from the residence of Bertram de Verdon, Seneschal of Ireland, in the time of Henry II.


Page 47, line 3.

Petro Habraham.—The year of Peter Abraam's mayoralty has not been ascertained; as Vincencius Tabernarius, who was then provost, was mayor in 1267, it probably

bably was shortly before that year. The occurrence of R. Olof's name in this connexion harmonizes with our conjecture of the date of his mayoralty in the note to No. xxxiv.

Page 47, line 9.

Meylerus de Cursun.—The following descent of the family of De Cursun, corruptly called De Courcy, is taken from the Clarendon MSS., vol. xxxvi., fol. 107, British Museum :



Strongbow's grantee, Vivianus, is called De Cursun in Harris's Ware, p. 190. If the death of the second Meyler is rightly placed in the 27 Hen. III., this grant must have been made before 1244, which would agree with the date, 1238, given in Mon. Hib., p. 157, as the year of Pollard's mayoralty. It is to be observed that the mayor witnesses before the dean of St. Patrick's.

Page 50, line 14.

Carta Dermicci.—The authority of Dermod M'Morrough, king of Leinster, within the city of Dublin, seems to have been uncertain and fluctuating. In this charter he distinguishes the men of Dublin—a body of commercial foreigners, struggling for independence—from the men of Leinster, his native and hereditary subjects.

Page 50, line 17.

Edano.—Lugwdensi, or Lugudensi, as printed by Dugdale, Mon. Anglic., from Sir J. Ware's transcript, has been always taken to mean Bishop of Louth or Clogher, a see at this time filled by Edan O'Kelley, who had been appointed to it in the room of Christian, Malachy's brother, by Malachy himself, because he saw in a vision the episcopal gold ring upon Edan's finger. (Cambrensis Eversus, p. 168.) It is not plain, however, that Dermod, king of Leinster, had any connexion with Louth, and it is also difficult to assign a reason for his placing the Bishop of Clogher in Dublin. It would be easy to read Lug., the contraction for this bishop's title, in Alan's Registry —See Appendix, No. xiv.—for *Lag.*, the contraction for *Laginiensium Episcopus*, a title

title perhaps not known to the Dublin ecclesiastics of the fifteenth century, and which they certainly would be unwilling to recognize out of the line of the Dublin prelacy, but which was borne by Ferdomnach, Bishop of Kildare, about the year 1096 (*Usserii Sylloge*, p. 93), and by other bishops of that see, and which, during the supremacy of Dermot, may possibly have been assumed by his Bishop of Ferns. The Bishop of Ferns at this time was Joseph O'Hethe, or O'Edha.—Ware's Bishops. If his Christian name had been Aed, there would be no difficulty in assigning to him the honour of this foundation. We must observe that Lug., or *Lugwdensis Episcopus*, was not the uniform style of Edan O'Kelley, Bishop of Clogher, since his name is given as a witness to the charter of the monastery of Newry, as Bishop of Ergalia, or Uriel.—Ware's Bishops. For Edenigo, in the list of witnesses, read Coemgino.

Page 50, line 18.

Ecclesie filie Zole.—Dunsoghly, in the County of Dublin, has been suggested.

Page 50, line 20.

Liberos et absolutos, read *liberam et absolutam*.

Page 50, line 20.

A procuracione et expedicione mea.—*Procuracio* may be considered as the Latin for *coshering*, the exaction of lodging and provision for himself and his retinue, laid by the chief lord on his tenants and others under his protection. *Expedicio* probably comprehended not only the obligation of military service, but the *bonaught*, or exactions, imposed for the maintenance of the chieftain's horsemen or kearns.—Adelung's Du Cange in *vocabulis*, and Harris's Ware, chap. xii.

Page 50, line 26.

Decimarum exactione.—Civil tithes.

Page 50, line 27.

Canonicorum vel monachorum.—The old foundations in Ireland were exclusively for canons, and until the foundation of Mellifont by Malachy in 1142, Ireland was, in the words of St. Bernard, “terra jam insueta immo et inexperta monastice religionis.”—*Usserii Sylloge*, p. 105. These canons were Cœnobites, bound by some of the various rules mentioned in Irish Ecclesiastical History, and were merged by Innocent II., 1139, in the Canons Regular of St. Augustine. For the strong resemblance of the Canons of St. Augustine with the Culdees, see *Liber Cartarum Prioratus Sancti Andreæ*, Preface, xv., 370, 374; one of the many volumes of authentic documents by which

which the Bannatyne Club has cleared up disputed points in history, and substituted knowledge for question and conjecture.

Page 51, line 7.

Almauricus de Hofda.—Almaric, third Baron of Howth, which lordship was confirmed to him by John Earl of Moreton. The lands of Bald Doyle and Ballycollan were probably dependant on the lordship of Howth. This charter was granted in the time of Prior Richard, who witnessed a grant of Archbishop Henry to the Vicars of St. Patrick between 1223 and 1228. Hugo de Esthamur, one of the witnesses to this charter, appears to be the Hugo de Estham of pp. 38–9, 62–8. For the benefits conferred by the grant of Fraternity here conditioned for, see Preface to Christ Church Obits, p. xxvii.

A Copy of the Letters granted to Robert Arbuthnot and Marion Scrimgor, his wyffe (on) ther recepcion in the Fraternitie of the Ordour of Observantia in 1487, has been printed in the Miscellany of the Spalding Club, vol. ii. p. 103.

A very curious grant from this Almaric de Hofda, in which he swears, under the penalty of 40*s.*, that he will not lay violent hands, except in self-defence, upon any of his prelates, is here subjoined, it is taken from Alan's Registry, College copy, p. 634.

“ Universis Christi Fidelibus ad quos presens Scriptum pervenerit Almoritius de Howth Salutem in Domino. Noverit universitas vestra me dedisse concessisse et hac presenti carta confirmasse pro anima mea et aminabus antecessorum nostrorum Vicario Ecclesie de Howth viginti quinque acras terre de Dominico meo. Tenendas et habendas in puram et perpetuam elemosynam viz.: illas que jacent propinquiores Rivulo defluenti in mare inter Ecclesiam et vetus Castellum versus orientem et extendunt se a filo aque in longitudine usque ad divisas factas inter terram illam et terram meam versus occidentem. Et a vico veniente de Manaloge usque ad predictum Rivulum atque versus australiem partem usque in mare in latitudine cum omnibus suis pertinentiis tempore quo Walterus de Snell fuit Vicarius de Howth et in recompensacione hujus terre assignavit dictus W. de Snell mihi quindecim acras terre propinquiores porte mee versus Villam Come Walleys. Hec autem mutacio terre facta fuit de consensu et voluntate Reverendi Patris nostri Domini Luce Dublin Archiepiscopi et magistri Gentili Personae de Howth tunc temporis itaque W. de Snell Vicarii pro bono Ecclesie et a Domino Dublin confirmata. Ego autem et heredes mei dictas viginti quinque acras terre dicto W. de Snell et successoribus suis contra omnes homines warrantabimus. Concessi etiam quod omnes homines sui et tenentes quieti sint et liberi ob omni servitute, exaccione et demanda ad me et heredes meos pertinente. Et quod habeant per terram meam et mare liberum ingressum et excessum

sum et quod habeant turbas ad ignem et pasturam ad animalia sua et alia necessaria sic ut alii homines de patria habent. Et quod emant et vendant et merchandizias suas faciant per totam terram meam quiete et pacifice et sine omni impedimento. Ad hec volo quod homines de terra mea operarii conductitii sint in Servicio cum indignerit quando in servitio proprio non fuerint retenti. Preterea concessi dicto Willielmo de Snell in augmentum dicte Vicarie sue intuitu pietatis unam batellam piscatricem liberam et quietam in perpetuum ab omni consuetudine, exaccionе et demanda ad me et heredes meos spectantibus ubique applicuerit in terra mea et omnes pescatores de terra mea qui eandem battellam ad piscandum intraverint in mare sive fuerint obligati sive non dum steterint in servicio suo cum ad terram redierint immunes sint ab omni exaccionе et demanda ad me et heredes meos pertinente nec ab eisdem per extorcionem injuste aliquid exigam vel aliqui meorum nomine meo. Page 52, line 4.

Nicholaus de Houete.—Nicholas, said to have been the sixth Lord of Howth. He seems to have possessed the want of respect for the clergy which was manifested by the third lord, and to have oppressed them, not by force, like his ancestor, but by law. If the former charters were valid—and there does not appear any reason for questioning them—these forty marks were clearly extorted from the prior and convent,

vent, anxious to keep the peace with their powerful and litigious neighbour. It may be observed that Balydowle is here said to be a Manerium.

Page 52, line 22.

Lucam le Waleys.—For a notice of this family, and their connexion with this neighbourhood, see D'Alton's Dublin, p. 265.

Page 53, line 3.

Ricardus de Pheypo.—Adam de Feipo was one of Hugh de Lacy's barons, and had a grant of Scrine, Clontorht (Clontarf), and Santreft, which brought him into contact with the grants to All-Hallows. In 1332 Simon de Feypo was seised of the manors of Skryne in Meath, of Santry in Dublin, and of Rathcoul and Moyeshell in the Liberty of Trim.—Pipe Roll. Of the introduction of the name of Simon into this family the following account is given in the *Miracula Simonis de Montfort*, printed by the Camden Society: “Ricardus Seypo (Feypo) miles Hiberniæ, habuit mulierem pregnantem et febricitantem et propter mæsticiam et dolorem perdidit loquela. Physici desperaverunt et dixerunt, ‘Aut peribit puer aut mater.’ Post paululum versa est ad vomitum, et peperit masculum elegantem sed abortivum. Dictus Ricardus plieuit denarium ad martirem nostrum, super matrem et puerum, et revixit puer, et sanata est mater, et dederant nomen Simon de Montfort. Testes hujus rei dictus Ricardus cum tota familia sua.”—p. 73. How Feypo, lord of Santry, had acquired authority over these men of Baldoyle, does not appear. It would be hasty to conclude, from this charter, that it was possible in Ireland, as we know that it was in Scotland, for a person to be tenant to one party and *native* to another, a complicated relationship, which must have been full of difficulties.—Reg. St. Andree, p. 278.

The following documents from Alan's Registry contain, with other valuable matter, important notices of the state of betaghs and *natives* in Ireland, at different periods :

From an Inquisition given in Alan's Registry (Trinity College copy, p. 243) it appears that a certain Simon Neyl, or Oncyll, who is styled Citizen of Dublin, had acquired two caruates of land in the manor of Lispobell, and that in the 30th of Edw. III., 1356, Archbishop Mynot claimed the said Symon, who was an Irishman, as his Native, and thereupon entered into possession of the said lands.

Page 53, line 17.

Domino Stephano tunc abbe.—Stephen was Abbot of St. Mary's from 1236 to 1240. Mon. Hib. 137; and Philip was Prior of H. Trinity in 1238. Ibid. 157.

Page 53, line 29.

Aquam que vocatur Schikeloth.—Not known.

Page 53, line 30.

Cum corpore meo.—The Papal Bulls, as we have seen, gave the Priory the right of sepulture.

Page 55, line 3.

Petrus Dei gracia Ossoriensis.—Peter Mannesin, or Malveisin, canon of Ossory, confirmed Bishop of Ossory 8 December, 1218, died in 1229.—*Harris' Ware's Bishops*.

Page 55, line 18.

Remundus Lamboe.—In 1247, Raymond Labanks granted to the Priory of the Holy Trinity the tithes of his lands in Fingal, called Clonn Seniganacht. Mon. Hib. 158. The obit of Mabilia de Banke was observed in the Priory of the Holy Trinity on the 13 Kal. of April. Johanna, the grantor of No. LIX., and co-heiress with Mabilia, married Geoffry Tryvers. Alan's Reg. p. 159, Trinity College copy. As he confirms Mabilia's grant in LX., it appears that Tryvers was eventually the successor of Raymond. Ward, in the barony of Castleknock, was formerly called the Town of Reimond le Bank.—D'Alton's Dublin, p. 584. For a grant to Nicholas Labench, see Rot. Canc. Litt. Antiquissime, 5.

Page 57, line 2.

Hanethanrey.—In the following charter of Geoffry de Tryvers, this place is called Aglythonreye, in the tenement of Castleknock: perhaps it was some land on the water of *Abhainn Righ*, or the King's River, now the Rye Water, near Lucan.

Page 58, line 18.

Rogero de Mesintoun.—This charter was granted before 1285, as Roger de Mesinton was dead in that year.—See No. LVIII.

Page 63, line 15.

Cloghran.—Cloghran, near Hiddert, County Dublin.

Page

Page 64, line 23.

Corduf.—Curduff, in Castleknock, near Dublin.

Page 65, line 11.

Johannis Wodelok.—John Wodlock was sheriff of the County Dublin in 1302. D'Alton's Dublin, p. 609. This charter must have been granted before 1298, in which year Prior Nigel was dead.—*See No. LXXVII.*

Page 65, line 16.

Maritagium.—This right of giving permission to marry was sometimes sold, as appears from the following bond, taken from Alan's Registry, p. 404, Trinity College copy :

Noveritis me teneri Venerabili Patri Domino meo Domino Fulconi, Dei Gratia Dublin Archiepiscopo in viginti libras argenti sibi annuatim solvendas usque ad legitimam etatem Agathe filie et heredis Meyler O'Thochil, duobus anni terminis, viz.: decem libras in Pascha, et decem libras in Festo Sancti Michaelis, pro Warda Terra et Maritagio diete Agathe sicut Carta dicti Domini mei super hoc confecta Testatur quamquidam pecuniam eidem Domino fideliter et integre me terminis statutis promitto solitum subiciendo me cohorecioni ejusdem Domini quod me ad dictam solutionem faciendam per omnia bona mea in dicto tenemento inventa possit distingere. In cuius rei Testimonium etc. Datum apud Solone. Die Sancti Valentini Ponificatus dicti Domini F. Anno viii. Hiis Testibus, &c.”

Page 66, line 3.

Willelmus Bussard—The obit of Alicia Bossard was celebrated on 9 Kal. Aug., in the Priory of the Holy Trinity.—*Book of Obits*, p. 33.

Page 66, line 20.

Consensu proborum.—This grant was probably made prior to the year 1247, in which, by a Royal Charter, the men of Drogheda, on the Meath side of the Boyne, obtained the privilege of electing annually their Seneschal and Provosts. (D'Alton's Drogheda, vol. i. p. 151). At this time the Probi of this grant were probably analogous to the Commons, and the Discreti viri to the Aldermen, of other corporations. It would seem, also, that there was no seal belonging to the body. Henry Macgorman may have been the possessor of Gormanstown, which the Prestons afterwards acquired from Sir Almarie de St. Amand. It is evident, from this charter, that the jurisdiction of the Probi of Drogheda extended into the adjacent district. The part

part of Drogheda, on the North side of the Boyne, was called De Ponte ex parte Uriel, or, De Ponte Ferrardi, from its situation in the territory of Ferrard. In this North part of Drogheda was situated the Franciscan Friary of Drogheda, where were compiled the Annals de Ponte Ferrardi, called hitherto Annales de Monte Fernandi, or the Annals of Multifernam.—See note following.

Page 66, line 20.

De Ponte.—It would now be difficult to discover the reasons why the Annals inscribed “Annales de Monte Fernandi,” were called the Annals of Multifernam.

There is no reason for believing that the Franciscan Friary of Multifernam was ever called de Monte Fernandi, a name, which its situation in a low valley would render singularly inapplicable. Multifernam was founded by the Delamars, a name which does not occur in the Annals de Monte Fernandi; and these Annals make frequent mention of families whom we cannot trace in the neighbourhood of Multifernam. These obvious objections to the common title, and the frequent mention of the family of Dexter, induced Ware, and Usher, and Molyneux, to suspect that these Annals were compiled in the Dominican Friary of Strade, in Mayo. This supposition would do away altogether with the common title, and is inconsistent with the evidence contained in the Annals that they were the work of a Franciscan. By the change of only two letters in the title all difficulties may be overcome. That part of Drogheda which lies on the north side of the Boyne, in the Barony of Ferrard, was called De Ponte Ferrardi, to distinguish it from the villa De Ponte on the south side of the river.—D'Alton, vol. i. p. 146. On this, the north side of the Boyne, was situated the Franciscan Friary of Drogheda, and it may be assumed that this friary was called de Ponte Ferrardi, as long as the distinction between the two sides of the river was continued; and that this name became obsolete when both boroughs were consolidated. If these Annals were compiled in Drogheda, the frequent and familiar mention of the Dexters, the Lords of Stackallan (D'Alton, vol. i. p. 90), and the builders of Castle Dexter, and the namers of Carrig Dexter, is easily accounted for; and as the Dexters of Meath were most probably connected with the Dexters or the Jordans of Connaught, the notices of Connaught affairs may be traced to the same origin. Although, for convenient reference, these Annals may still be quoted as the Annals of Multifernan, by which name they have been called by Ussher, Ware, Nicolson, and Smith, we think that their proper title is “Annales de Ponte Ferrardi,” and that the Franciscan Friary of Drogheda is entitled to the honour of their compilation.

Page 67, line 8.

Walterus de Redesford.—This Walter de Ridlesford, called, in the conquest of Ireland, p. 86, “Barun noble guerrer,” had the following grant from Strongbow:—

Iotas 10 carucatas terre habebit pro feodo unius militis sibi et heredibus de Rege Anglie et heredibus tenendas in feodo et hereditate per liberum servicium 3 militum Dublinie faciendum, viz., pro feodo 5 militum de Brien longinquiori Dublin servicium 2 militum et pro 10 carucatis propinquioribus Dublin servicium 1 militis, et cum hoc dictus comes dedit ei ex parte Regis domum et messuagium Cristini Ostmannici extra portam et murum Dublin per concessionem Cristini predicti, hospitis sui. Testibus Ranulpho constabulario et aliis. Gilbertus scripsit.”—*Rot. Pat. Litt. Antiq.* 52.

As this grant is mentioned in Pope Gregory's bull, it must have been made before 1234.

Page 67, line 16.

Aquagium.—In the Charter Book of the Corporation of Dublin are many very early and very curious entries respecting the city waterpipe. Thomas Fitzgerald endeavoured to cut the pipes of the conduits, whereby the citizens of Dublin should be destitute of fresh water.—Stanyhurst, p. 296, in Holinshed.

Page 68, line 23.

Heres domini Roberti Bagod.—This assignment must have been made shortly after the death of the elder Sir Robert Bagod, Chief Justice of the King's Bench, which is placed by Pembridge, in his Annals, in this year, 1298.

Page 69, line 29.

Tenementum suum de Rath.—Nicholas de Hynteberg sold to Sir Robert Bagod the manor de le Rath, “ quod est extra Dublin prope ecclesiam Omnim Sanctorum cum aqueductu de le Doder.”—*Litt. Antiq.* 41.

Page 71, line 19.

Ricardo Anglicus.—Amongst the names of the Jurors on an Inquisition taken at Castlekevin, in the time of Lord Edward (1270), are the following: “ Thomas, Prior Sancti Salvatoris Glendelache, A? Prior magne ecclesie de Glendelache, Donolm Prior de

de Rupe juxta Glendelache, Dominus *Willielmus Anglicus, Gilbertus de Beaufo, Ricardus Lailes*, and others."—*Alan's Reg.*, College Copy, 364.

Page 72, line 11.

Waleranus de Wellesley.—In Lynch's Feudal Dignities, p. 69, reference is made to this charter, as existing in the office of the Town Clerk, where it is not now to be found. Crevaghe, or Crewath, is now Cruagh. In the charter of Hen. III., deafforesting the lands of the Archbishop, Crevache is called the land of Richard de Sancto Michaele, from whose family Wellesley had acquired it.

It may, perhaps, be thought allowable in the Editor to insert here an agreement made before Waleran de Wellesley and other itinerant Justices, relative to the parish of Trim. It is taken from Alan's Registry, College copy, p. 18.

Page 72, line 18.

De Wykynglo.—These two Wicklow Charters are interesting, as they shew the state of that town in the middle of the 13th century, and preserve the names of a parson of the parish, of a chaplain to the castle, and of a provost of the town.

Page 74, line 3.

Galfridus de Appilby.—Agatha, widow of Geoffry de Appulbi, was alive on the Sunday before All Saints, in the 11th of Ed. II.—Rot. Pat. 11 Ed. II. 38. Two of the witnesses to this charter also witnessed No. lxxix., which was confirmed in the Papal Bull of 1276.

Page 75, line 14.

Thoma de Kenefeg.—Rot. Pat. 11 Ed. II. 112, and elsewhere; the initial of Cradoc's Christian name is omitted in MS.

Page 75, line 16.

Apud Balyeros.—From the following charter it appears that this Balyeros or Balynegros was in Moytastha, the barony of Moyashel and Magheradernon in Westmeath, where the Petyts had large possessions from the grant of Hugh de Lacy,

“ E Chastel Brec, solum l'escrit,
A barun Willame de Petit,
Marcherueran altresi
E la terre de Rathkenni.”—*Conq. of Ireland*, p. 149.

Magheradernon is strangely disguised in Marcherueran. Herberto de la Marte is an error of the writer of the MS. for H. de la Marre.

Ada de Ledewiche.—In the reign of Ed. I. Adam de Ledewich granted the church of Lekkyn to the priory of Tristernagh.—*Mon. Hib.* p. 729.

In villa de Main.—“ Robert Gernon of Mayn, in Louth, one of the English Marchers, was bound in his recognizance in the sum of £40, not to take coyn or livery, in the 16th of Hen. VIII., 1524.”—*State Papers*, vol. ii. p. 109, part iii.

Iggelbrith.—Ingelbrie appears as the name of a witness to a charter witnessed also by Gilbert de Lynet and printed *ante*, p. 120, from Alan’s Registry, College copy, p. 10.

Ricardus Corner.—Richard de la Corner was Bishop of Meath from 1230 to 1250.

Page 78.

LXXXIX.—This relaxation by Archbishop Talbot was written on the first blank leaf of the Registry.

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
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
