



HOW TO ORDER. Early Orders. We respectfully request our customers to send in their orders as early as convenient after receipt of catalogue. We ship all orders within 24 hours from receipt (except perishable Roots, Bulbs and Plants, which will follow when weather will permit), but, during the busy season, this entails a tremendous effort on the part of our staff. Your early order will, therefore, be appreciated.

ORDER SHEETS. Use the order sheets to be found at back of catalogue. Please fill in all particulars carefully and distinctly, and keep a copy of your order.

PRICES AND TERMS. The prices quoted are those ruling at this date, and are subject to fluctuations without notice. Our terms of payment are net cash. We do not send goods C.O.D.

HOW TO SEND MONEY. Remit by Registered Letter, Postal Note, Post Office Order, Express Order or Bank Draft, and small sums in stamps.

SAFE ARRIVAL OF ALL PACKAGES. If seeds, bulbs, etc., are not received in a reasonable time, send exact copy of order, mentioning date sent, stating amount of remittance, kind of remittance (cash or money order), and we will investigate immediately.

GOODS TEMPORARILY OUT OF STOCK.
