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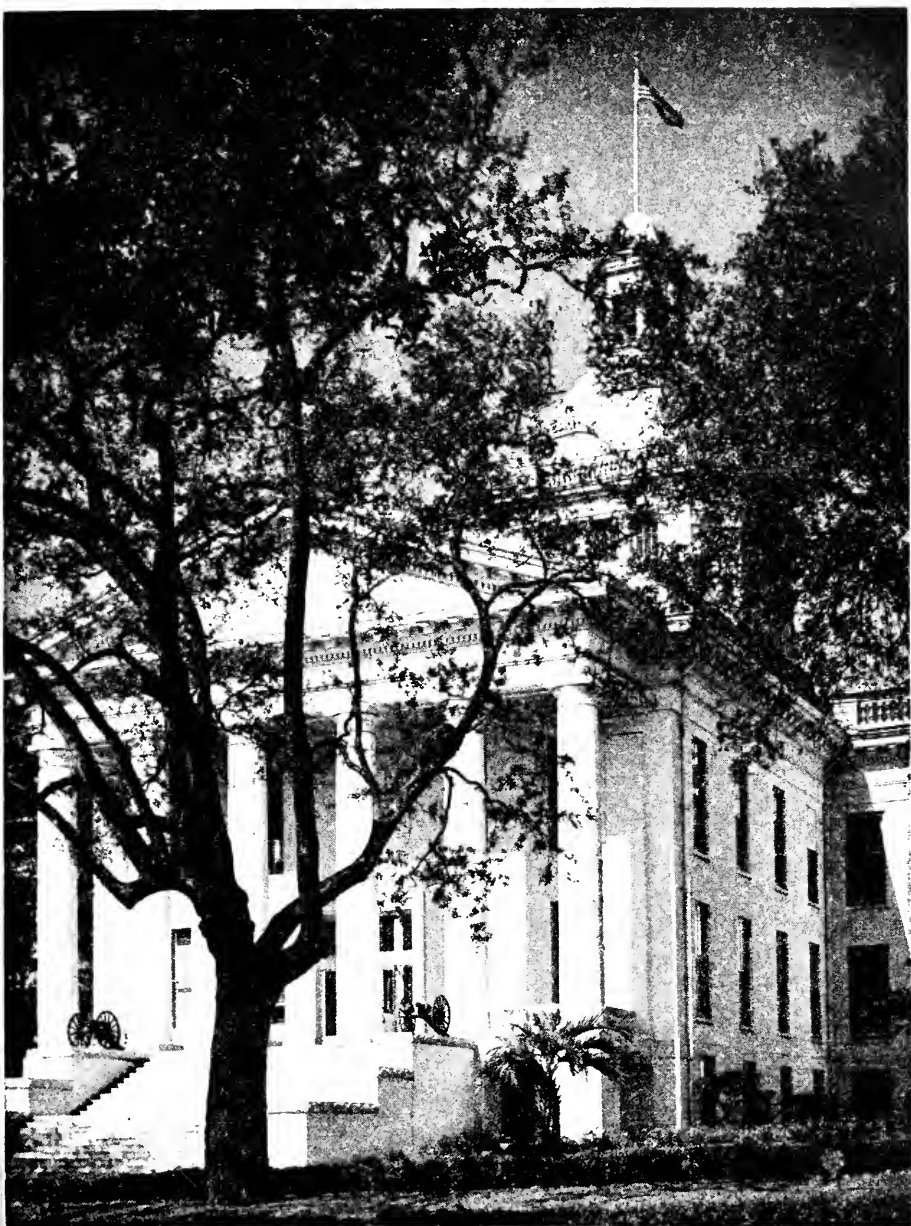

In compliance with the requirements of law I have the honor to transmit herewith the biennial report for the office of Secretary of State for the calendar years 1953-1954. Since the report is for a two year period, it is necessarily a little larger than an annual report would be. The volume of work handled by this office is steadily increasing. For example for the year 1949 the collections were \$699,069.60 while the collections for 1954 were \$1,209,286.07.

### ELECTIONS DIVISION

This division of the office has the administration of the Primary, special and general election laws. Beginning with the preparation of various and sundry blanks and form to be sent out to the counties for the Supervisors of Registration, then the qualification of candidates in the primaries, the handling of all reports from such candidates, supplying numerous form required by the new election laws, certifying results of the first and second primaries, preparation of forms of ballots, certifying nominees, handling all the general election procedures, canvassing returns, qualifying those elected to office and finally preparing commissions for them. These are a few high spots that keep this division busy through a two year cycle.

In 1951 the Legislature re-codified the entire election laws. This codification included primaries, general and special elections covering all the mechanics of administration. This alone would have added materially to the work of this division, but the Legislature of 1951 also enacted a new law referred to as Senate Bill No. 8 which dealt with campaign contributions and campaign expenditures of candidates for office. This

new law was so different from anything heretofore on the statute books, and its requirements were so rigid the Secretary of State foresaw the probabilities of a chaotic condition unless information was thoroughly disseminated. So, by use of bulletins and holding meetings in various parts of the state which were well publicized, information on the new requirements was given to the public, especially candidates. The new law (Senate Bill No. 8) was on the whole obeyed by the candidates and its administration on the state and county level was handled without confusion. The law proved generally to be satisfactory to the public in the 1952 and in the 1954 primaries and elections and the candidates apparently made an honest and sincere effort to comply with its provisions. Additional personnel is needed in this department.

#### CORPORATION DIVISION

For several years the number of new corporations formed in Florida has been far above the average of other states with comparable population. Though Florida now ranks twentieth in population in the list of states, we rank sixth in the number of new corporations filed with this office month by month and year by year. This is all the more significant in that it is not a sporadic or temporary situation but one that has been continuous now for five or six years. While this adds to the volume of work required in the office, it also increases the amount of revenue collected both for services rendered by the office and for charter tax and corporation capital stock tax. In 1949 the capital stock tax collected was \$443,503.86 while in 1954 the capital stock tax collected was \$686,548.05. Charter tax increased during the same period from \$157,000.00 plus to \$297,452.70.

In this division a very large volume of inquiry mail is received. Carrying out the policy and custom of the office of rendering prompt service becomes more and more a burden on the corporation division. Our corporation laws on the whole are satisfactory.

#### RECORDS DIVISION

The original function of the office of Secretary of State and still one of great importance is the filing of the many official documents and records required to be kept and

recorded by the office of Secretary of State. These are too numerous to attempt cataloging. It varies from proclamations by the Governor, court orders and commissions signed by him, to the recording of voluminous agreements of railroads for leasing railroad equipment. This function is perhaps mentioned less than any other function of the office but its importance was recognized by the framers of the Constitution.

#### CUSTODIAN OF THE GREAT SEAL

Any Secretary of State who seriously analyzes the duties and responsibilities of the office appreciates and realizes that he has no more responsible duty than that placed upon him as the Constitutional Custodian of the Great Seal. The Great Seal is the symbol of the sovereignty of the State and is the one device with authenticates official documents of the highest import. That documents should bear the authentication and receive the imprint of The Great Seal may seem casual and routine, but a situation might arise at any time where the use of the Great Seal would be of the greatest significance and the highest importance. Its integrity must be forever maintained.

#### LAWS DIVISION

The Secretary of State is custodian of all acts of the Legislature. The increased volume of matters considered by the Legislature and the laws enacted by that body is adding continuously to the volume of work in this division. The desire of the public for immediate information and copies of the laws newly enacted imposes quite a tax on the clerical force of the office. Here again may be mentioned the importance of guarding and safe keeping the original authenticated acts of the Legislature. Those are kept in safe vaults and are never permitted to be taken from the office.

#### MAINTENANCE DIVISION

Maintenance of the capital and grounds also is growing in the demands arising under such duty. Not only does the capital have additional wings built every few years, but the business carried on in the Capitol offices must keep up with the pace of modern business. The facilities required to meet the demands and tempo of modern business and modern

living means the constant addition of equipment and the servicing of such.

The 1951 Legislature added another building to be maintained by the Secretary of State. This was known as the Tallahassee Administration Building and has since been designated the W. V. Knott Building. The maintaining of this building involves the same type of duty as maintenance of the capitol and grounds.

### MISCELLANEOUS

A number of duties imposed upon the Secretary of State by various and sundry statutes would probably not fall accurately under any one of the above mentioned divisions. However, many statutory duties involving such as trade marks, limited partnerships, licensing of labor business agents, etc., add to the variety and interest.

The duty was imposed upon the Secretary of State by the Legislature a few years ago of determining what was "the prevailing wage" in a community, when certain disputes arose.

The law requires every contract for the erection of a public building to contain a clause that the contractor will pay the prevailing wage in that community. In case of a dispute as to what is the prevailing wage the law requires the dispute certified to the Secretary of State and he is required to investigate and make a finding with reference to the matter.

The 1953 Legislature amended the act but required the investigation to be made in the field but did not make any appropriation for such. During the past year there have been a number of situations requiring a prevailing wage determination. The Secretary of State should be relieved of this duty or a small appropriation made to cover contingencies which might or might not arise.

### EX OFFICIO DUTIES

The Secretary of State is named by the Constitution as a member of the Board of Commissioners of State Institutions, the State Board of Education and the State Board of Pardons. By statute he is a member of the State Board of Conservation, the Executive Board of the State Safety Department (Highway Patrol), Trustees of Teachers Retirement System, State Board of Vocational Education, State

Textbook Purchasing Board, State Advertising Commission, State Budget Commission, Civilian Defense Council, the State Purchasing Council and chairman of the State Canvassing Board.

Being a member of the Board of Commissioners of State Institutions in itself takes up a great deal of time of the Secretary of State. The Board finds it necessary and expedient to have a committee of three members on each of the several state institutions. The Secretary of State is chairman of the committee on the Florida State Hospital for the mentally ill our largest state institution where there are presently some seven thousand patients.

The Legislature of 1953 appropriated for a 37 million dollar program and placed the responsibility of carrying it out on the Board of Commissioners of State Institutions. The Governor was too ill to serve. As vice-chairman the Secretary of State had the duty of taking the lead in this large and important task.

#### CONCLUSION —

While the duties of the Secretary of State are steadily increasing, I am pleased to state the satisfaction of handling this important office is one I have greatly appreciated. I am very grateful to the people of Florida for having returned me repeatedly to this office without opposition. I shall continue to do my best to render prompt, efficient and courteous service in the office and to maintain the high tone and quality of official service to which the people of this state are entitled. For myself and entire personnel of the office we express appreciation to your Excellency for the splendid cooperation we have had from the Governor's office and to the Legislature for its understanding helpfulness, and also we wish to express our gratitude for the many commendations letters and messages received from all over the state concerning the operation of this office.
