DR. J. LEM STOKES, II
Dr. J. Lem Stokes, II, is the main speaker for the week born in Sangdo, Korea, the Dr. and Mrs. M. B. Stokes, the matriarch of the Methodist Church early schooling was given by his mother, who had been a Carolina school teacher. Stokes was graduated from Seoul Foreign School, Seoul, Korea, in 1926. He received a B. S. Degree from Asbury College in 1930, his B. D. Degree from Duke University in 1932, and his Ph. D. Degree from Yale University in 1936.

Dr. Stokes was admitted to the Western North Carolina Conference in 1931 and received his pastorate at Randleman, North Carolina, in 1931. In 1940 he was appointed in Franklin and was in 1944, to Elkin. In the fall of 1945 he was transferred to the South Carolina Conference and appointed to St. John's Methodist Church, the university church of Rock Hill, South Carolina. This church he went on September 1, 1950, in the position of pastor of Religion in High School in the Division of Education, Nashville, Tennessee. He assumed his present post as president of Pfeiffer College in July, 1953.

As a pastor, Dr. Stokes was active in community affairs. In the war he served as home chairman and chapter chair of the Red Cross unit at Pine Bluff. He is past president of the Hill Rotary Club and of the Hill Kiwanis Club. In Rock Hill he served on the Board of Directors of the Y. M. C. A., the Red Cross, and the Salvation Army. The Western North Carolina Conference, he served as vice president of the Board of Missions (Church Extension) and in the South Carolina Conference he served as secretary. He had
