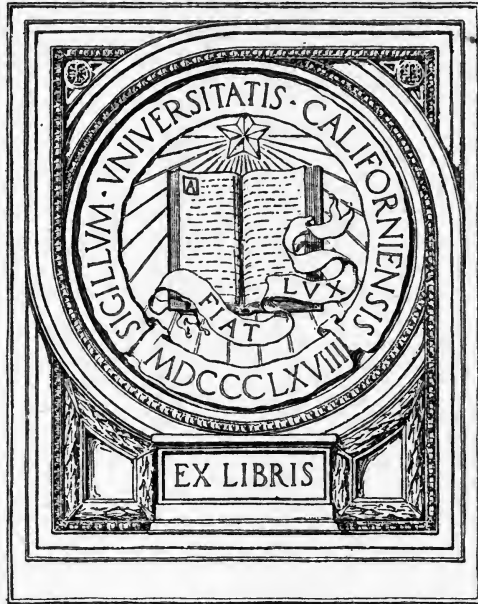
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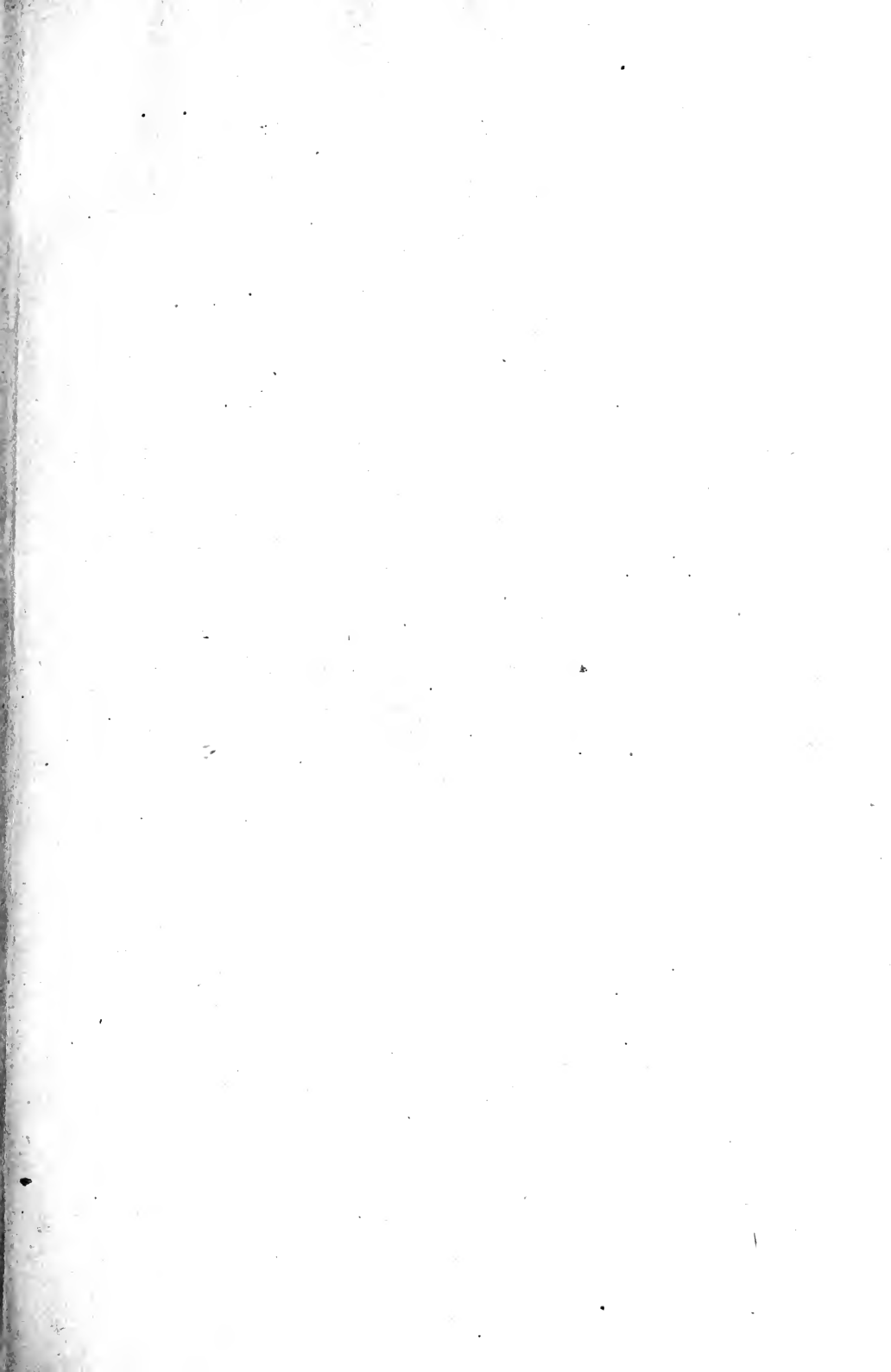

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Preface.

The idea of investigating the language in the Middle English poem *Cursor Mundi* was suggested to me by a remark of the late Professor BJÖRKMAN in one of his lectures dealing with this poem. He pointed out that this old and extensive literary product would be worth investigating, as there had been no comprehensive study of this work of late. In order to obtain definite ideas as to the original forms in the language of the anonymous author it was necessary to begin by a systematic study of the rimes, and especially the rime-vowels, from a phonological point of view and by getting as complete a collection as possible of the rime-material. The whole material is, for practical reasons, arranged in small groups according to the origin of the different rime-words, so as to enable the reader to survey the extensive collection. The arrangement is almost tabular, the rime-words being given alphabetically in each paragraph, thus facilitating the search for any special word.

I should like to state as a general principle that special investigations, limited as far as possible in their sphere and offering exhaustive materials, must precede works dealing with general subjects. In the latter class of works the literary documents are usually treated in a very summary manner and sometimes the investigator gives a wrong rendering of some passage owing to the absence of a specific investigation of the text in question. Such mistakes have been very frequent in the treatment of the language of *Cursor Mundi* and have been pointed out in the present work as often as I have detected them. In several cases they have contributed to produce incorrect results. Frequently, however, such works dealing with general questions are quite indispensable even for a study with a very limited scope, as they may illustrate a question in a more com-

prehensive manner and, by comparison and combination, quite unexpected results may be attained, which would not have obtained a proper elucidation by internal inquiry alone.

To Docent ARVID GABRIELSON, my present teacher in English philology, I beg to take this opportunity of proffering my sincerest thanks for the kindly encouragement he has given me during the course of my English studies.

I am indebted above all to my former teacher, Professor ERIK BJÖRKMAN, whose tragic and untimely death a few days ago is still poignantly regretted by us all. His sympathetic kindness and keen interest in my English studies was of great assistance to me in carrying out my work. It is with a feeling of profound sadness that I realize the impossibility of tendering him, my real teacher, these thanks. As a scholar, teacher and man he has left a deep impression upon me and will for ever remain a brilliant example. The stimulus that emanated from his bright and many-sided personality, which was characterized above all by sound common sense, was invaluable. His memory will for ever remain a precious possession to his friends and pupils.

For assistance in the revision of the English in my treatise I am indebted to Mr HENRY ALEXANDER, lector in English at this University. Finally my thanks are due to all those friends of mine who have helped me in revising the proof-sheets of this thesis.

Introduction.

The Cursor Mundi is the oldest and most voluminous literary monument of Northern England. It was composed just before 1300 in a dialect which, according to MURRAY (see MURRAY, The Dialect of the southern counties of Scotland p. 30), was that of a district not far from Durham. Dr. HUPE (see EETS 101, p. 186), on the other hand, suggests the north of Lincolnshire. Any idea of a Lincolnshire dialect must, however, be dismissed, because the rimes of the North Lincolnshire writer Roberd Mannyng of Brunne do not agree at all with the rimes of the Cursor Mundi, which must represent a pure Northern dialect. The rimes of our poem often correspond with those of early Scottish writers, and the vocabulary has much in common with Scottish. Several words are recorded only in our poem and Scottish authors; see CURT BARTH: Der Wortschatz des Cursor Mundi, p. 19, where he says: «Wir dürfen daraus schliessen (from these words peculiar to Scottish), dass das Original des Cursor Mundi in nächster Nähe von Schottland, also etwa im Norden der Grafschaft Durham entstanden sein muss» and p. 50: «Murray ist durchaus im Rechte, wenn er den Cursor Mundi in Durham entstanden sein lässt. Wörter wie *siquar*, *ithen*, *sank* etc., denen wir sonst nur in den schottischen Denkmälern begegnen, weisen deutlich auf den äussersten Norden Englands hin.» In the course of the present investigation I have found further correspondences with Scottish (such as *lame* sb.², *eri* adj. etc.) and I should like to assume, like KALUZA, that the original was written in Scotland, if it were not for a passage (ll. 232—236) that seems to speak against this: «þis ilk bok it es translate In to Inglis tong to rede For the loue of Inglis lede, *Inglis lede of Ingland*», e. g.

this book is translated for the English in England»; see BARTH p. 10. But since Barth wants to place the poem as near as possible to the Scottish border, why not in the county of Northumberland, which lies between Scotland and Durham? In order to settle the question as to the original home of the poem it would be necessary to investigate the rimes of the earliest Scottish writers and compare these with the results derived from an examination of the rimes in *Cursor Mundi*.

The present rime-investigation comprises ll. 1—24968, as, in the opinion of Dr. HUPE Introduction V. 219, the poem probably ends there. The following rime-lists are based on MSS. CEF, critically compared with each other, and are founded on the text-variants best suiting the rimes; they claim to offer a complete rime-material. In some cases the text has been compared with its sources (The Vulgate, etc.), and this has sometimes made it possible to ascertain the original form used by the author when it has been corrupted by later scribes. I have only occasionally discussed some interesting scribal errors in the MSS. and especially in MS. C, as these questions do not really come within the scope of this investigation. The forms and spellings given are chiefly those of MS. C, and MSS. CE from line 18989. Peculiarities and mistakes in MS. C are specially pointed out and the more correct forms given in addition or substituted. In a few cases textual emendations had to be made.

The rimes of the *Cursor Mundi* have been dealt with before by Dr. HUPE, but his examination of them dates from 1889 and scarcely satisfies the demands of modern scholarship. I do not enter here upon any criticism of his inquiry, as this would be too extensive a task. Apart from this there exist only two small investigations dealing with the language of *Cursor Mundi*: CURT BARTH, *Der Wortschatz des Cursor Mundi* and WILLY HÖRNING, *Die Schreibung der Hs. E des Cursor Mundi*.

The etymologies given within square brackets generally originate from NED, except for the letters S—Z, for which the *Century Dictionary* has been chiefly consulted. In a few cases I have ventured to propose new etymologies, which are collected and discussed in a special Etymological Section at the end of the book.

When the rimes enable us to draw any conclusions as to the pronunciation of a vowel these conclusions are placed, for practical reasons, immediately below the rime-group concerned; only in a few cases have the results been summarized. In many cases it has been expressly pointed out that the rimes can very well be explained in more than one way.

All the rimes that are probably incorrect are printed in small type as Notes. On account of the comparatively small number of incorrect rimes, we must state that the author of *Cursor Mundi* was a fairly good rimer. It is noteworthy that in some cases, e. g. *dēl* sb. and *dēl* v., *rēd* = 'read, tell' and *rēd* = 'advice' he makes strikingly regular distinctions. Sometimes, especially in the cases of words containing some variety of *o*-sound, emergency rimes occur, owing to the scarcity of quite suitable and correct rime-words in his native dialect.

The arrangement adopted, which is designed to avoid the necessity of giving each rime more than once and to afford a comprehensive view of the words riming with the different vowels, is also intended to make up for the absence of a rime-index.

All the rimes show *fledd* with a short *e*. NED supposes that *fledd* may be of Scandinavian origin, from such a form as MSw *flydde*, although *flydde* is not recorded before 1350. Against such a supposition we have the fact that *fledd* occurs all over England even at an early date; why should it be just an old Swedish form that had this influence when the other old Scandinavian languages show other forms? As to SWEET's suggestion that there had been an identification with the verb *flede* = 'to flow, flood', I agree with NED in dismissing it as impossible because of the difference in sense. The most probable explanation seems to me that, when *fle* was inflected as a weak verb, there was an analogy from all the numerous preterites and past participles with short *e* + *dd(e)* — there was scarcely any pret. and p. p. weak form with *ē* + *d(e)*.

Judging by these numerous rimes there seems to be a long \bar{a} in *siguar* s. As a possible OE ground-form I assume a form **siþhw(e)arf*; for the further discussion of this form see the Etym. But it seems to me that the rimes in § 131 prove a short *a* at least in the case of *hald* inf., and probably in *tald* pt., p. p. as well. With regard to *hald* inf. it is proved to have a short *a* in such a careful rimer as Richard Rolle, who also wrote in a northern dialect, and in Roberd of Brunne as well. The quantity of the *a* in the other words is more doubtful.

This short *e* has been found as early as in Robert Mannyng in the first half of the fourteenth century (cfr. OSKAR BOERNER, *Festschrift für Morsbach*, p. 317). He says: »So sehe ich in unserm Reim das erste Beispiel für das gekürzte *ded*.» But the above examples are earlier, since *Cursor Mundi* was composed before 1300.

Conclusion: *drede* in all its significations has mostly \bar{e} . The same applies to *wede* = 'clothes'. *Red* = 'counsel', 'help' and as a verb = 'advise', 'save', on the other hand, must have had open \bar{e} , to judge by the great number of rimes with \bar{e} . The infinitive *shede* with \bar{e} , judging from the rime in § 173, cannot be explained from the inflected forms of the present tense *scēadas* with *i*-mutation, because OE $\bar{a}^1 + d$ is always represented by \bar{e} in this dialect, cfr. § 167. It should be noted, too, that Orm. has *shædenn* and not *shedenn* like *ledenn*. NED is right, therefore, in assuming this explanation of the open vowel. The ground-form is an OE form with a falling diphthong instead of an original rising diphthong. With regard to the p. p. *shede*, this form originates from an OE form *scēaden*, also with a falling diphthong. NED puts a sign of interrogation after this p. p., but no doubt it existed, as this rime seems to show. Moreover, it

should have been the p. p. corresponding to the present tense *scēadan*, since the verb was a reduplicated one.

As to the etymology of the verb *hon* = 'delay' found only in the north, I should be inclined to derive it from the interjection *ho* = 'stop', from which a verb *ho* has been formed and is recorded in ME in the sense of 'cease, stop'. From this comes a sb. *ho* = 'cessation', occurring in such a phrase as *withouten*

ho. To *ho* inf. the infinitive ending *-n* has been added and taken as part of the stem, as was sometimes the case in the north; cfr. *ron* inf. and *ro*, *mistrun* inf. and *mistru*. It is true that resemblances in meaning and construction are found between *ho* and *hon*, but the vowel in *ho* is proved by rimes, e. g. in Chaucer, to be open, although a rime apparently containing close \bar{o} does occur (see NED s. v. *ho*), and the above rimes all prove a close \bar{o} . One might perhaps imagine that $h\bar{o}$ < OFr *ho* was ousted in the north by $h\bar{o}$ < OSc *hó*, *hóa*.

In the G reading: »*Bot i, caitef, nu all bischorn*» we only need to correct the spelling *bischorn* into *bi-scorn*, which is the spelling in C. In the G text *nu all bischorn* represents a relative clause with the pronoun omitted, as was very often the case. The verb *biscorn* is recorded in ME in C. M. l. 16611 and Chaucer, Pers. T. 204.

Summary. The rimes with *beforn* adv. [OE *beforan*] in §§ 385, 386 prove a short *o* even in the words containing OE *ó + rn*, or else they would be incorrect rimes $\bar{q} : \bar{o}$, or $\bar{\delta} : \bar{o}$. The rime with *bestorn* p. p. in § 387, if correct, would also speak in favour of \bar{o} .

As to the etymology of *wei* SKEAT assumes a borrowing from OSc *vegr* = 'way', but I think that this derivation is impossible, as the OSc combination *-eg* is represented in ME by- *ai* (see § 430), and all the above rimes point to *ēi*.

I, 2: «Quotations 1513, a 1650 appear to have the specific meaning 'to writhe in death-throes' and may perhaps be viewed as showing a Scotch form of *throē* v. 2», q. v. = 'suffer throes, agonize', just the sense suitable to this context). Our *throu* would then be the first example of *throē* v. = 'agonize'. The verb, whose infinitive was *trau* in the north, passed into class VI of the strong verbs and so obtained a preterite form *throu*, containing *ou*. The Glossary erroneously renders *throu* with 'threw', but that would give no sense at all.

§ 467. The rime *clous* s. pl. [OE *clōzas*] 17590: *Iuus* [OFr *Giu*] is to be interpreted as a rime *iū: iu*. This rime is therefore very instructive and worthy of attention, as it proves that OE *ō* had passed into an *i*-sound even before 1300. LUICK in his *Studien* p. 127 speaks about this Northumbrian modification of OE *ō*: «Die Veränderung dieses Lautes tritt uns aber schon in Reimen des 14. Jahrhunderts entgegen, muss also um diese Zeit schon deutlich ins Ohr gefallen und schon vor 1300 eingetreten sein» and a few lines below «die northumbrische Modification des *ō* muss vor 1300 liegen, wenigstens in seinen Anfängen». LUICK does not, however, give any real proof of his statement about the modified sound. That *ō*, at any rate, was already modified into an *i*-sound is shown by the above rime, which cannot possibly be accounted for in any other way.

Etymological Section.

air s.

air s. occurs only once, in line 8971, riming with *fair* adj. The complete line is as follows: «*And hamward sco tok hir air*». The Glossary renders this word *air* correctly with 'way'. The word is, however, not given in NED in this sense. *air* is an OFr loan-word, coming from OFr *eire*, or in a contracted form *erre*, which meant 'journey, way'. The phrase in question «*sco tok hir air*» had its exact equivalent in the following OFr expression found in Wace «*leur erre ont vers France priz*», where *erre* means «way»; see GODEFROY s. v. *erre* = 'voyage, route, chemin'. NED mentions this word in the form *eyre* q. v. only with the sense of 'itineration, circuit' as a term of jurisprudence, but not in the above general sense of 'journey, route, way'.

befst pt., p. p.

befst occurs as pt. in ll. 14730, 24871 riming with (*bi*)*left* pt., 24840 riming with *wefst* pt. and as p. p. in l. 2264 riming with *left* pt.; see § 54. Acc. to NED the verb is found only in pt. and p. p. NED assumes as possible a derivation from OE **behaftian* with loss of *-h-*, but that would have given a ME form *bafst(en)* with *a* and not *e*. As *befst* occurs mostly as a preterite without any corresponding infinitive, one is inclined to interpret it as a specific preterite formation and thus to connect it with such irregular preterite forms as OE *hēht*, *leolc* etc., i. e. reduplicated preterites. In OE and just in

ONorth. a form (*hondum*) *beóftun* actually existed; see BOSWORTH-TOLLER Suppl. I s. v. *beaftan*. *beóftun* is glossed with 'lamentabantur' i. e. 'beat with the hands as an expression of grief'. The word here in C. M. means exactly 'beat'. I look upon this ONorth *beoft* as a reduplicated preterite from the OE infinitive *beatan*, accordingly a pret. form parallel to OE *brot*. *beoft* pt. was developed from a Teutonic ground-form **bebaut*, reduplicated pret. of the inf. **bautan* —, formed in the same way as, e. g., in Gothic *staitaut* pt. to *stautan* inf. This irregular pret. *beoft* > *befi* is found in OE as well as in ME times only in the North, and this supports the above suggestion, since such irregular reduplicated preterites were peculiar to the Anglian and especially the Northumbrian dialects; see SIEVERS § 394, I, Note 2. Being apprehended as a weak preterite form, the pret. *befi* was transferred to the p. p. by analogy.

blēs s.

blēs s. occurs riming with *rēs* (see 274) and with *vintrēs* (see § 275). As I have stated in § 274 I assume as the origin of the open *ē* or rather half-open *ɛ̄* (compare MORSEB. § III) an OE *e* which has been lengthened in an open syllable. NED gives an entirely wrong explanation of *bles* by deriving it from OE *blæse*, which would be represented, however, in ME by a form with *a* and not *e*. The ME form would then have been *blāse*, and this was the usual form, especially in the south. EDD, on the other hand, considers an OE form **blæse* < **blaisjōn* (see § 43 in the Phonology) as its source. But in that case I am unable to connect the stem **blais-* with any words in the cognate languages. Assuming that the above rimes are correct, then in order to satisfy the conditions present, we must postulate an OE **blese* s. with short *e* in open syllable. This OE **blese* originated from WGerm. **blasiȝ*, accordingly an *i*-stem with the same root **blas-* as is found in OE *blæse* < *blasjōn*. **blasiȝ* has many representatives in other Germanic languages, such as MLG *bles*, Du. *bles*, Sw. *bläs*, all meaning 'a white spot on the forehead of a horse or cow'. Originally it meant 'some-

thing white, shining'. The stem **blas-* is found in MHG in the meaning of 'torch' and in OHG in compounds such as *blas-ros*, in MHG *blasen-hengst*. All these words are clearly connected with each other, and perhaps the English *blaze* = 'flame' and *blaze* = 'white spot' are one and the same native word, though the latter does not seem to be recorded till the 17th century.

bulk v.

bulk inf. is recorded only once riming with *skulk* inf. 18511. It seems to mean 'beat' in the phrase concerned «*Apon þair breistes can (F gon) þai bulk*». NED says about this word: «origin unknown. ?To beat». EDD gives two verbs *bulk*, one with the sense of = 'to butt, push with the horns', the other = 'throb, palpitate'. These two verbs are probably connected with this ME verb *bulk* = 'beat' and are originally from the same OE verb **bulcian* because of the resemblances both in form and signification. A word very similar in form and with the same meaning 'butt' is NE (dial.) *bult* corresponding with the Sw. *bulta*; cfr. TAMM, Etym. Svensk Ordbok, where a connection with such words as *buller* = 'noise', *bullra* = 'make a noise' is stated as possible. It is, indeed, very tempting to assume such a relation when one compares such words clearly cognate with each other as Sw. *dunka* = 'beat', ME *dunch* = strike, OSc *dynkr* 'stroke' and 'noise', originating from **dun-k-*; cfr OSc *dynr* = 'noise', OE *dynian* = 'make a noise', and with *t* OE *dynt* = 'stroke, blow', OSc *dyntr* = 'noise, din'.

drill v.

drill v. is found riming with *spill* inf. 23716 and: *will, fulfill, ill, till* 16390. Consequently it contains short *i*. NED says of this verb: »origin unknown» The meaning of the verb in C. M., is stated by NED to be 'delay, put off'. The English dialect verb *droll* rendered in EDD by 'delay, procrastinate', seems to be connected with this verb *drill*, at least as far as the meaning is concerned.

In the cognate continental languages we find e. g. OFris. *drölen* = linger, Du. *druile* = linger. We find more resemblances in the Scandinavian languages, e. g. OSc *drolla* = be slow, *drollsamr* = slow, Norw. Dial. *drül*, *drýl* q. v. in TORP, Nynorsk Etym. Ordbok. Further connections in Swedish dialects are seen in RIETZ s. v. *drula* = 'linger, delay'. The verb *drylt* in a Swed. dialect meaning 'to be slow in action' is another example. All these words point to a common Germ. root **drül(l)*- and from that a PrimOE formation **drulljan* may have been developed and been represented in OE by **dryllan*, which I assume as the possible OE ground-form for ME *drill* = 'delay'.

siquar s.

siquar sb. = 'time, moment' occurs frequently in rimes; see § 127. NED gives no information about its origin but offers an interesting parallel form from The Scotch Legendary Saints *sythware* and a form without *-w-* *sithar*. As the spelling *qu* represents OE *hw* we may combine these two different forms into a form *siphwar*, and by adding a final *-f* an OE ground-form **siphw(e)arf* may be constructed and analysed as consisting of the two existing OE nouns *siph* = 'going, journey', and *hw(e)arf* = 'turn', related to the verb *hwearfian* = 'turn, move'. The formation **siphw(e)arf* would in that case have the sense 'turn in going'; compare Swed. *gångvarv*. As a matter of fact, there existed in OE such compounds with *siph* + an ablaut-grade of a verb implying same sort of action. There are e. g. OE *siphfer* = 'way, journey' and *siphfæt* = 'journey', which also has a meaning very relevant in this connection, 'course of time'; see BOSWORTH-TOLLER s. v. *siphfæt*. In Swedish there are a great many corresponding words and compounds implying 'course of time'; I need only mention *tidevarv* = 'age', and *varv*, *veva*, *vända* = 'turn' in such phrases as *i den vevan*, *i den vändan* = 'at that turn', 'at that juncture', *tre varv om midjan* = 'three times about the waist'. In English too, *turn* may contain an idea of time. As to the dropping of the final *-f* in OE **siph-*

hw(e)arf this phenomenon has taken place in unstressed positions, and a parallel case is observed in the frequently unstressed OE auxiliary *þ(e)arf* > ME *þar*, present form of OE **þurfan*; see NED s. v. *tharf*. A similar simplifying of a consonant group is seen in the case of another auxiliary OE *d(e)arr* > ME *darr* > *dar* (in an unstressed position); see § 118. With regard to the consonant group — *þhw* — such an accumulation of three consonants being of course very troublesome to pronounce, some modification of it had to take place and the most natural result would be the dropping of the medial consonant, which, indeed, occurred in the dialect found in The Scotch Legendary Saints, where OE **sīþhwarf* became *sithwar*, as is seen in the above example. In the dialect of Cursor Mundi the first consonant, *th*, seems to have dropped and the form *sihwar*, which always appears in C. M. as *siquar*, is developed.

skurn v.

skurn appears as a verb = 'flinch, hesitate', riming with *mun* inf. 23337, 24423 and *turn* s. 19445 and as a sb. [formed from the verb] = 'hesitation', riming with *burn* s. 8963; see further §§ 420, 421. NED only says about these words: «obscure origin; perh. cognate with ON *skirra-sk*. Cf. *scunner* v.» but entirely omits to mention its southern representative *skurn* = 'avoid, shun'; see NED *shurn*, where the following statement occurs: «Altered form of *scurn* v.» Owing to the existence of the southern *sh* any idea of directly connecting *skurn* with a Scandinavian form with *sk* is probably to be dismissed. It is very tempting to connect this word with *scunner* = 'flinch', but there is no southern variant of the latter with *sh*. Modern forms of *scunner* in Scottish dialects still contain *sk*, and in the southern counties of Scotland forms with *sk*- instead of *sh*- are not at all rare; for examples see J. MURRAY: The Dialect of the Southern Counties of Scotland, p. 122. The suffix in *scunner* is, according to NED, apparently the frequentative suffix *-er*, and the dictionary suggests a connection with *shun* < OE *scunian*. The ME *skurn* would then be represented in OE by the form

**scunrian*, a frequentative verb. By metathesis of *nr* an OE form **skurnian* may have been developed. With this metathesis of *nr* compare the metathesis of *ns* in OE *clænsian*, by metathesis *clænsian*; see BÜLBR. § 523.

sogh s.

sogh s. occurs riming with *slogh* pt. 2501, where it has the meaning 'muddy place, slough'. Apart from this it also means 'ditch, drain', and NED compares it with a word *zoeg* = 'small ditch in a meadow' in Antwerp. dial., but its origin is stated by the dictionary to be obscure. By the side of *sogh* NED records such forms as *swowze*, *swough* which are noteworthy, as they show that a *w* has been dropped before *o*. MAŘIK, p. 15, indeed, places this word *sogh* under the heading Cons. + *w* + OE *ō*3 and with regard to the loss of *w* (p. 84) he states: «Der früheste Schwund eines *w* vor ME *ō* ist um 1300 verzeichnet.» As the Cursor Mundi is supposed to have been composed just before 1300 it is possible that a loss of *w* had taken place in the dialect of the author. In that case we should obtain a possible OE ground-form **swō*3, **swō*h. I think I have succeeded in finding cognates to OE **swō*3 in the Scandinavian languages, e. g. Jutlandish *svau* = 'quagmire' and Sw. dial. *svag* = 'depression in a field, swampy place'; see further TORP Nynorsk Ordbok s. v. *svaga* and RIETZ s. v. *svag*. The meanings of all these words correspond very well with that of English *sogh*. The Antwerp. dial. *zoeg*, given by NED, seems to contain *ō*, but the dictionary has rendered it inadequately. According to CORNELISSEN-VERVLiet the form is really *zōeg*, which implies a short vowel, and Flem. *oë* represents WGerm. *ū*. A WGerm. form **sug-* may very well have been developed from an older form **swug-*, as *w* before *u* was dropped in Teutonic. The *ō* of the English form represents the lengthened ablaut-grade of the *a* that occurs in the Scandinavian forms.

steck v.

steck inf., only recorded in MSS. EFG I. 22202, riming with *breck* inf.; see § 183. No dictionary, as far as I have seen, mentions this verb *steck*, which in this passage seems to have the meaning 'run away, take to flight'. A verb with precisely this meaning 'take to flight' is found in OIcel. in the form *stökkva*; see CLEASBY and FRITZNER. For the loss of *v* compare such OwSc words as *slökkva*, and *gørva*, but ME *steck* may equally well be derived from the present tense sing. OIcel. *stekkr*. In the first period of the Scandinavian loanwords, however, *stökkva* appeared in a form with *-nk-*, and generally the Scand. loan-words have retained these older unassimilated forms; see BJÖRKMAN Prov. p. 6 foot-note 1. Yet in a few cases forms with *kk* < *nk*, thus representing a younger layer of loans from OScand, appear, as is shown in BJÖRKMAN Loanwords p. 169 and BJÖRKMAN Prov. p. 6 foot-note 1. A derivation of ME *steck* from OwSc seems therefore possible.

stīme s.

stīme sb. occurs riming with *time* sb. 19651, 22514, and is thus proved by these two rimes to contain a long *i*. The Century Dict. supposes *stīme* s. to be a variant of *steem*, *stem* (see Cent. Dict. *steam*) or perhaps a variant of *shim* < OE *scīma*. The Glossary translates it with 'ray of light', but as it is only used here in such negative senses as «*he ne moht se a stīme*», I prefer the rendering 'glimpse' or 'bit, particle', cfr. EDD s. v. *stīme* I. sb. Although it seems very tempting to connect *stīme* with such a word as Sw. (*till*)*stymmelse*, it is hardly probable, as Sw. *stymmelse* seems to be connected with Sw. *stomme* = 'figure, shape' and in that case there is no connection in meaning apparent. The other meanings of *stīme* recorded in EDD should be noted, e. g. 'to open the eyes partially, peer' and the adj. *stīmey* = 'dim-sighted'. In Swed. the sb. 'glimpse' is rendered by *skymt*, also meaning 'faint light', and the verb by

skymta, and they are related to the adj. *skum* = half bright and the sb. *skymning* = 'dawn, half-light'. The chief sense of the root **skum-* seems to be 'limitation of light'. This notion of 'limiting, checking' in a general sense is found associated with another root in Germ. languages **stam*, **stum*, represented by the verbs *stämma* in Scand., *stemmen* = check in G., *stumm* in G., q. v. in KLUGE, *stumm sein*, originally = 'to have a stoppage in one's speech' and *stum* in the lengthened ablaut-grade, **stūm-* found in G. *ungestüm* adj. originally = 'not to be checked'; see KLUGE. Just as **stum* has got its specified meaning of 'stopping in speech', **stūm-* may have obtained the sense of limitation in another specific direction = 'diminishing the power of vision', as seen in Engl. Dial. *stime* = 'peer with the eyes', and the adj. *stimey* = 'dim-sighted'. If this hypothesis is right, we may have had in OE a form **stȳm* < **stūmi-*. *stime* = glimpse would then originally mean 'the dim view one gets of an object'.

sualm s.

sualm s. occurs only in MSS. C and G, riming with *palm* 20758. *suelm*, a probable ablaut-form of this s. *sualm*, is recorded in The alliterative Romance of Alexander 750 and in Early English Alliterative Poems III, 3 with the sense of 'heat, glow'; see *swelm* sb. in STRATMANN-BRADLEY. In the passage in C. M. it seems to imply some kind of illness. The Glossary translates it with 'sickness'. MLG. has *swalm* = 'qualm' and ODan. *svalm* = 'smoke', but in ODan. it also has the meaning 'attack of illness'. In Dan. and Scanian dialects (see FEILBERG and RIETZ) *svalm* means 'suffocating heat in a room', 'warm steam', 'lukewarm wind'. *sualm* is further probably connected with G. *schwül* q. v. in KLUGE = 'sultry', OE *swelan*, *swælan* = 'burn' and OE *swōl* s. = 'feverish heat'. For further connections see TORP Nynorsk Et. Wb. s. v. *svæla*. An idea of 'heat, especially in motion', seems to be common to all these probably related words. Especially the OE *swōl* = 'feverish heat' leads one to think that 'fever' might be the most probable signi-

fication of this ME *sualm*, as it seems, to judge by the context »*Ga to þaa men þat lijs in sualm and þai sal both hef hel and witt*» to imply some sort of illness. The meaning 'fever' would, I think, suit very well here, as in the last part of the text given above *witt* s. is mentioned, and, as is well-known, in the case of a feverish disease even the 'wits' are sometimes temporarily lost.

utenem adj.

utenem adj. riming with *strēm* 4827 and *utenemes* : *strēmes* 1315 (see § 209) are by these rimes certainly proved to contain *ē*. They mean 'exceptional' and the original sense is seen by a parallel word *utnume(n)*, also meaning 'exceptional, exquisite'. A meaning 'taken out' or 'worth being taken out' seems to be the original one. *utenem* cannot represent the lengthened ablaut-grade of OE *nīman* = 'take'. A WGerm **nāmi-* would give OE *nēm-* and ME *nēm* with close *ē*. We may, however, find the origin of this *-nēm* in OSc *-nēmr*. *-nēmr* was a very common form, from which adjectives could be composed usually by adding an adverb, e. g. *auð-nēmr*, *sótt-nēmr*, *tór-nēmr*, *ú-nēmr*, *upp-nēmr*. Some of these compounds, indeed, had a passive sense, i. e. denoting that something could be taken e. g. *upp-nēmr* = 'seizable', *auð-nēmr* = 'easily learned', *sótt-nēmr* = 'apt to be taken ill'; see CLEASBY.

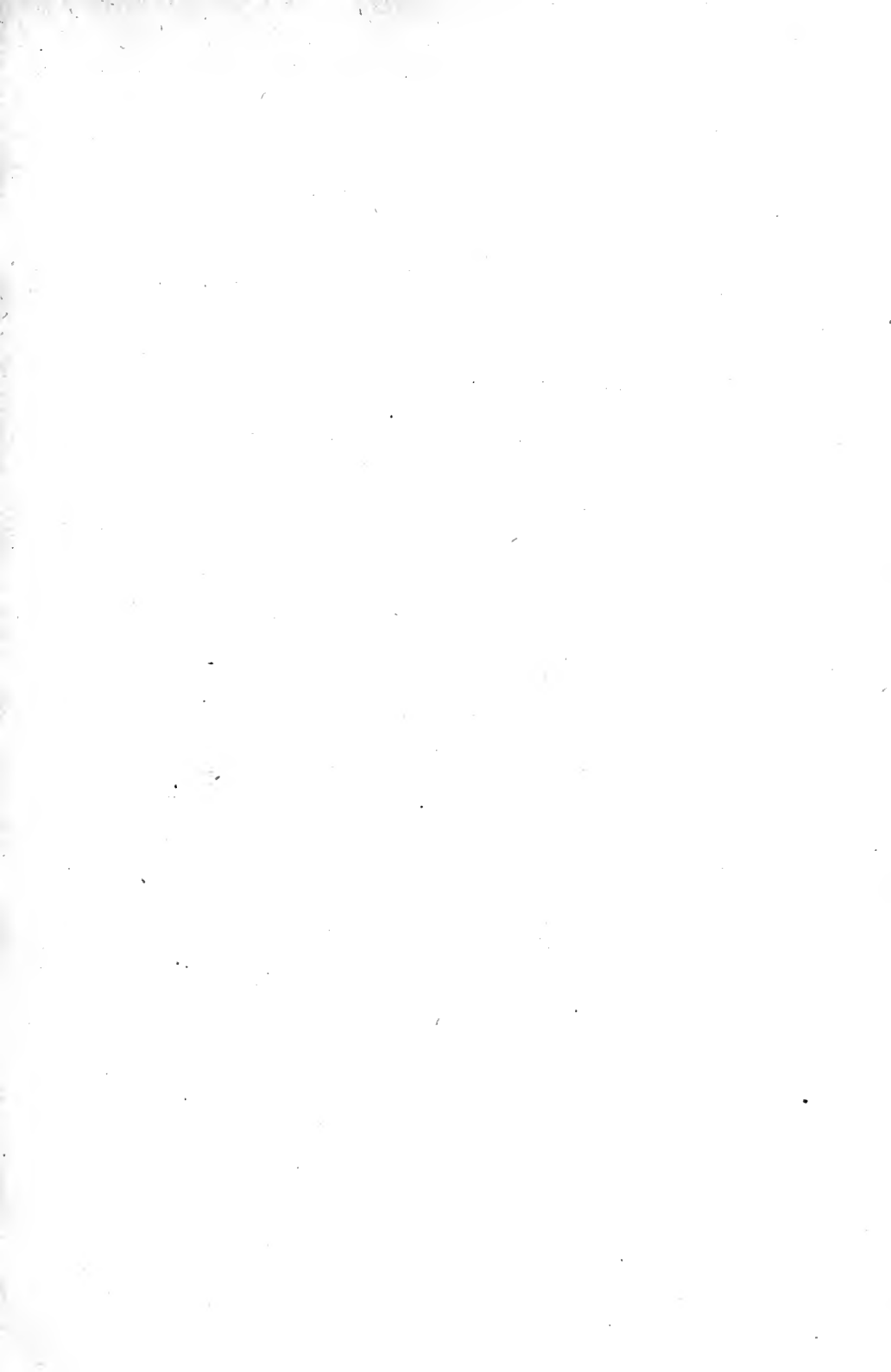
wer(e) s.

wer(e) sb. = 'doubt' is proved by a great many rimes to contain a close *ē*; see § 255. *wer(e)* has nothing to do with OSc *vari* = 'caution' or OE *wær* = 'aware' nor with the OE verb *werian*, as CURTIS in *Anglia* XVII p. 13 thinks possible. I connect this *wēr(e)* with an unrecorded OE **wēr-* < **wēr-* < **wōri-*. The stem *wōri-* is represented in Scand. by *ør* = 'giddy, confounded'; see FALK u. TORP Et. Wb. s. v. *ør*. In OE there

existed a closely related form in the verb *wōrian* = 'wander about', which was also used in a figurative sense = 'vacillare, dubitare, anxiare', and these last significations correspond exactly with the meanings of the ME *wēr(e)* = 'doubt, fear'. In Roberd of Brunne's Chronicle 2126 *wēr* occurs with the meaning of 'confusion', and this resembles very closely the sense of the Scand. word given above.
