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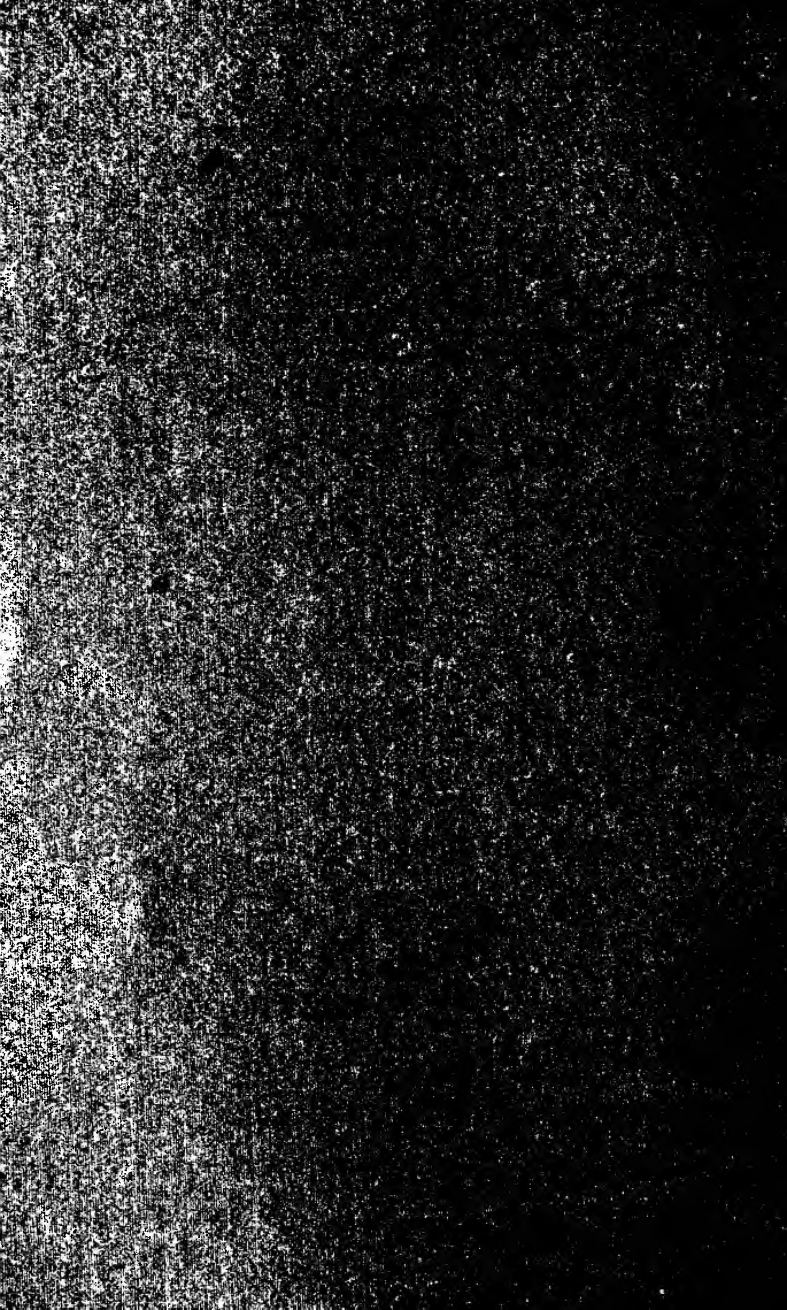

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P R E F A C E

The Board of Trustees of the New York Baptist Union for Ministerial Education at its annual meeting in May, 1909, authorized the undersigned committee to prepare and publish this fifth edition of the General Catalogue. Previous editions appeared in 1869, 1876, 1889 and 1900.

This issue, like the former one, includes the names of all officers of the New York Baptist Union for Ministerial Education and of all officers and members of the Board of Trustees. It also aims to furnish, with reference to all persons who have been members of the Faculty and Students of the Seminary, trustworthy information respecting the time and place of their birth, their collegiate and theological studies, their public services, and in cases that may require it, of their death.

The attempt has been made to give all honorary degrees above that of M. A. with the dates and sources, and a list of published works. When the college degree is not given it is assumed to be B. A.

The names of students are arranged in distinct groups under their respective classes as follows:

First—Full graduates of the regular and of the B. D. courses, in alphabetical order with the year of graduation.

Second—Special students who did not take a regular course of study or who did not remain until the course was completed, arranged in alphabetical order with a statement of the time spent by each in the Seminary.

Third—English course graduates. During the period from 1884 to 1892, covering nine years, an English course was provided for those men who did not study the Scriptures in the original. For these years the records of the full graduates are followed by the names of the men who completed the prescribed English course in alphabetical order with the year of graduation.

These in turn are followed by the special students as in other years.

The names of full graduates and of English course graduates with fellows and graduate students are all printed in **BLACK FACE CAPS**. The names of special students in **Black Face, upper and lower case**.

Fellows, graduate students and such graduates of other institutions as pursued further studies in this Seminary are placed at the head of the graduating class of the year of their residence.

Fellows and graduate students of this Seminary receive due credit at the appropriate place in their record, their name only being placed at the head of the graduating class of the year of their residence with citation of their record.

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A denomination, a state, or an occupation once used in a record continues in force until a new one is given. Unless otherwise indicated the persons named are pastors and members of Baptist churches, and the churches named are Baptist.

An asterisk (*) indicates a deceased officer or student. A dash and period following the year of entrance upon a service indicates that the person still continues in the work last mentioned. A semicolon at the end of a record indicates that further information is wanting. The date (1900) at the close of a record indicates that no facts have been learned since the last General Catalogue was issued.

A statement concerning the purpose and history of the German Department of the Seminary as well as a record of its classes will be found immediately following the records of the classes of the English Department.

In the preparation of this Catalogue valuable assistance has been rendered by former students, by officers of other institutions of learning, by many pastors, church clerks and other officials. To all of these friends and helpers the Committee desire to express their thanks.

Notwithstanding all our efforts the Catalogue is still by no means complete and undoubtedly contains many errors. So far as possible in the case of the living the attempt has been made to secure the authority of each man for his own record. In some cases, however, it has not been possible to secure the addresses of men no longer in the pastorate.

Any communication with regard to the correction and the completion of defective records in this Catalogue will be welcomed. These communications or others with regard to future changes of location may be sent to any member of the Committee.

CHRONOLOGICAL NOTES

A Convention of the Baptist denomination of the State of New York "to consider the present aspect of the educational affairs of the denomination in the State and to take such action thereon as may be deemed wise and expedient," was held in Albany, October 9 and 10, 1849.

The committee of nine appointed by the Albany Convention met in Rochester in December, 1849.

The New York Baptist Union for Ministerial Education was organized by act of an educational convention of the Baptist denomination called by the committee of nine in Rochester, May 11, 1850.

The first meeting of the Board of Trustees for executive business was held in August, 1850, and it was resolved to open the Rochester Theological Seminary on the first Monday in November, 1850.

Articles of Incorporation were executed May 13, 1850, and acknowledged August 31, 1850.

The first annual meeting of the New York Baptist Union for Ministerial Education was held November 4, 1850.

The Rochester Theological Seminary was opened for instruction November 4, 1850.

From 1850 to 1860 the course of study in the Seminary extended over only two years. At the annual meeting of the Union July 10, 1860, the course was lengthened to three years and in consequence no class was graduated in 1862.

Until 1862 the anniversaries were held in connection with those of the University of Rochester, and came on the Thursday following the second Wednesday in July. Beginning with 1863 the anniversaries have been held in May, during the second or the third week of the month.

The year has generally opened the first week in September. Until 1860 the session was divided into three terms; since 1860 it has been divided into two terms, by a vacation of one week including the winter holidays, and a long summer vacation.

GERMAN DEPARTMENT

HISTORICAL NOTE.

The idea of providing a place where young men of German birth could obtain some training for the work of preaching the gospel to the Germans in our country, originated with the Rev. Zenas Freeman, the first corresponding secretary of the New York Baptist Union for Ministerial Education. In his travels among the Baptist Churches, Mr. Freeman learned of the first successful beginnings Baptists from Germany had made in such centers as Newark, N. J., Philadelphia, Pa., New York City and Buffalo, and concluded to encourage promising young men in these German churches to carry on this work still further. He invited them to come to Rochester. In the first published catalogue of the Seminary a special course of studies, embracing academical, collegiate and theological subjects, and extending over a period of four years, was announced as designed to meet the wants of such young men. The first German student came in 1851 and remained for two years. In 1852 several others followed, but only one of these succeeded in completing the entire course, graduating from the University of Rochester and the English Department of the Seminary. Inability to make sufficient practical use of the English language cut the course of the others short. For this reason also the increase in the number of German students was very slight, until the trustees of the New York Baptist Union, in 1858, appointed a native German teacher and thereby established what has since been called the German Department. Rev. Augustus Rauschenbusch, D.D., was the first teacher. He remained in this position for thirty-one years. With the success of the German Baptist churches in our country the demand for a larger number of pastors and missionaries increased. This necessitated the corresponding broadening out of the course of instruction and the appointment of additional teachers. In 1872, the Rev. Hermann M. Schaeffer, and in 1884, the Rev. Jacob S. Gubelmann, D.D., were added to the faculty, and when, in 1889, Professor Rauschenbusch resigned his position, the Rev. Albert J. Ramaker, and in 1890, the Rev. Lewis Kaiser, were elected. Professor Schaeffer died in 1897 and the Rev. Walter Rauschenbusch was appointed his successor, who, however, resigned his position in 1902 to take the chair of Church History in the English Department of the Seminary. Up to 1875 the course of instruction extended over three years,

but was then lengthened to four years; in 1883 another year was added and still another in 1888, making the present course in the German Department of six years duration, of which the last three years are devoted exclusively to theological instruction. For the instruction given in the first three years of the present curriculum there have been secured as teachers the Rev. Hermann von Berge, since 1907, and the Rev. Gustav A. Schneider, since 1908.

At the time when the German Department was established, it was the only Baptist institution of its kind in the world. In the earlier years, it, therefore, attracted young Germans from across the ocean, a goodly number of whom, after having completed the course of instruction here, went back to labor in the Fatherland, or to lands which had attracted German immigration. The number of such graduates, who are still in the active ministry in Germany, Russia, South Africa, Australia and Brazil, is nine. There have also gone out from the German Department fifteen young men who have become foreign missionaries, and at the present writing two others are under appointment to go the present year. The chief object of the German Department has, however, been to prepare young men for the work of preaching the Gospel to the Germans in our own country.

In recent years an increasing number of Slavs (Poles, Bohemians and Slovaks), Hungarians and Letts who, in addition to the knowledge of their own native language, understood German, have been admitted to the German Department with the understanding that they could there prepare themselves for missionary work among their own people, either in our country or in Europe. This arrangement, unsought and but little encouraged by the Seminary, has been successful beyond expectation. Thus far nineteen of these non-German students have received or are at present receiving instruction for a longer or shorter length of time. Of this number fourteen are still in preparation while five are doing successful work in the Master's cause in this country. In the near future five others will be ready for active work in those new missions. Should these new missionary interests grow in the future as they have done in the past, the question of establishing separate departments of instruction will come up for answer.
