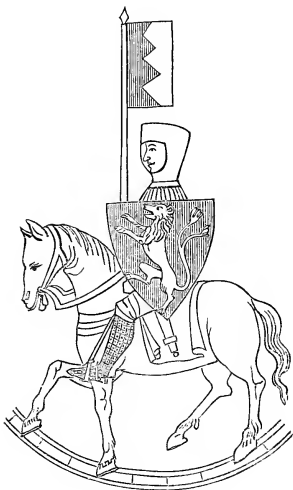

IT is a remarkable circumstance, that although volume after volume has been printed on HERALDRY, few attempts should have been made to publish the *contemporary* manuscripts on the subject which are extant; for they not only afford the most authentic notices of the Arms of persons who lived in former ages, but abound in valuable illustrations of the science, and present notices of our ancient families, of much interest to them. As has been pointed out in the Preface to the "Roll of Arms of the reign of Edward the Second," these Rolls are also of great utility for historical, biographical, and genealogical purposes.

Impressed with the value of such documents, the Editor hopes to publish a series of the most important. The four following are already completed :

The "ROLL OF ARMS OF THE REIGN OF HENRY THE THIRD," in this volume ;

The "SIEGE OF CARLAVEROCK," a contemporary French poem, with a translation, descriptive of that event, in the 28th of Edward the First, A.D. 1300, which contains the blazon of the arms of all the Knights in the English army on that occasion : 4to. 1828.

"A ROLL OF ARMS OF THE REIGN OF EDWARD THE SECOND," compiled between 1308 and 1314, printed from a contemporary copy in the British Museum : 8vo. 1828. and,

The "ROLL OF ARMS OF THE REIGN OF EDWARD THE THIRD," compiled between 1337 and 1350, in this volume.

It is the Editor's intention to form a series of any Rolls he may discover, from the earliest extant to the accession of Henry the Seventh, selecting such only as appear from internal evidence to have been compiled at the period to which they relate; and when the series is completed, an Essay on the subject, and a General Index to the whole, will be added. Each Roll will be paged and indexed separately, so as to admit of being introduced into its proper place, according to chronological order.

In this undertaking, the Editor has not the slightest view to profit, but he is of course anxious to be saved from pecuniary loss; and as the sale of works of this nature is extremely confined, thirty or thirty-five persons are required to give their permanent support to the plan, by subscribing a guinea for each publication, for which they will be entitled to one quarto copy, or to two octavo copies, at their option. Their names will be received by the Publisher of this volume.

The next Rolls intended to be printed, are one of the Reign of Edward the First, and the Roll of the Tournament at Dunstable, in the second year of the reign of Edward the Second, anno 1308.

Although the Editor has references to many Rolls of Arms, he entreats the favour of being informed of the existence of any in public libraries or private hands.

REMARKS

ON THE

ROLL OF ARMS

OF THE

REIGN OF EDWARD THE THIRD.

THE mistake made by the copyist of this Roll in 1562, in considering that it was then about four hundred years old, though it argues little for his judgment, is nevertheless proof that the original bore the mark of considerable antiquity, and justifies the belief that it was of at least half that age. This would render it contemporary with the period to which it is assigned, namely, between the years 1337 and 1351, the 11th and 25th of the reign of Edward the Third.

That it was compiled in or after 1337, is certain from the names and arms of Ufford Earl of Suffolk, Plantagenet Earl of Derby, and Montagu Earl of Salisbury, each of which dignities was created to those persons on the 13th of March 1337, although one or two persons

are mentioned who died as early as 1321 ; and that it was not written after 1350, appears from the name of "*Le Baron de Stafford*," who was created *Earl of Stafford* on the 5th of March 1351.

John de Fauconberg, and Walter his son, whose arms were differenced by a "Baston gobone," are both noticed ; but the said John de Fauconberg, as well as Robert Bouchier, whose name is the third on the Roll, died in 1349, whilst Adam de Welles, the last of that family who bore the baptismal name of Adam, died in 1345.

The name of the Earl of Derby likewise supports the idea that the Roll was compiled before 1345, as in that year he succeeded to the Earldom of Lancaster, and was always afterwards described by that title.

The most remarkable entry is, however, that of the Earl of Gloucester. Gilbert, the last Clare Earl of Gloucester, died without issue in 1313 ; and on the 23rd of April 1337, Hugh de Audley, who married Margaret, sister and co-heiress of the said Earl, was created Earl of Gloucester, but dying without issue male in 1347, the title became extinct. In the Roll, the arms of Clare are assigned to "*Le Conte de Gloucester*," and

though three Audleys are mentioned, one of whom is called "Hugh d'Audeley le Rich," and another "Hugh d'Audeley le Cousin," that title is not attributed to either of them. Whether this circumstance is to be accounted for by supposing that the Earl of Gloucester alluded to, was Hugh de Audley, and that he bore the arms of the former possessors of the dignity, the said arms being also those of his wife; or, whether the Roll was compiled after the death of the said Hugh de Audley in 1347, and there consequently not being any Earl of Gloucester, the arms were inserted as the arms of the Earldom,* cannot, perhaps, be determined; but if the opinion that the Roll was written before 1345 be correct, it must be concluded that the said Hugh de Audley was referred to as Earl of Gloucester, and that the arms attributed to him were those of the Earldom instead of his own personal coat.

The "Counte de Stracherne" was either Malise, seventh Earl of Strathern in Scotland,

who was living in 1334, the exact time of whose death is uncertain, or, which is more probable, William de Warren, Earl of Surrey, who was created Earl of Strathern about March 1334, in consequence of the forfeiture of Earl Malise,* and died in 1347 without issue; another proof that the Roll was not written after that year, and that arms were considered to be attached to Earldoms.

It might be supposed from there being nearly six hundred names in this Roll, that other evidence exists by which its date might be proved; but from the frequent omission of baptismal names, and even where they do occur, from the similarity of the same in one family, reliance cannot be placed on any other names, as indicative of the time of its composition, than those which have been cited.

Unlike most other Rolls of Arms that are preserved, this has been arranged in the form of an Ordinary, which has superseded the necessity of adding one; but as many charges occur elsewhere than under the divisions appropriated to them, and as numerous bearings are not so classed, an Index is given to all the charges.

The copy from which these sheets are printed, is preserved in the College of Arms, in a thin folio MS. containing thirteen pages, and having many of the coats tricked in the margin, but it is probable that these did not occur in the original. No other alteration has been made in printing it, than to put the contractions at length.

The original, it is said, was in the year 1562 in the possession of Hugh Fitz Williams, of Spradborough, Esq.; and was copied by Hugh Cotgrave, then Rouge Croix Pursuivant of Arms, and afterwards Richmond Herald, who states that some parts were almost, and that others were wholly illegible. The former, apparently, are those few doubtful names and words which are pointed out in the notes, and the latter are sufficiently obvious from the omissions; but these are sometimes supplied, within brackets, from other authorities.

Notwithstanding these circumstances, there is such indisputable internal evidence of the authenticity of the Roll, that it has ample claims to be deemed a valuable addition to our heraldic knowledge; and forms the best source of information for the arms of persons in the Reign of Edward the Third ever pub-

lished, even if there be any superior to it in manuscript.

To his friend, Charles George Young, Esq. York Herald, the Editor and the Public are chiefly indebted for having this Roll, as well as that of the reign of Henry the Third, brought to their notice.

REMARKS
ON THE
ROLL OF ARMS
OF THE
REIGN OF HENRY THE THIRD.

THE most material point with respect to this Roll is its authenticity, by which expression is meant, that it was compiled at the time to which it appears to relate; for if that be established, its value, as the earliest blazon of Arms hitherto discovered, is indisputable.

As it is not known whether the Original Roll is now in existence, the attestation of the copyist in the year 1586, and the internal evidence which it contains, are the only criteria by which a judgment can be formed on the subject: each of these points require, therefore, to be carefully examined.

The Roll appears, from the hand-writing, to have been transcribed by the celebrated Glover, Somerset Herald from 1571, until his death in

April 1588, whose professional reputation is well known. He states that the original was an "Old Roll of Arms, made and written in the reign or time of Henry the Third;" that it was on parchment; and that, in the year 1586, it was in the possession of Mr. Harvey of Leicestershire. From this information it may be inferred, that Glover did not judge of the period at which the Roll was compiled from its contents alone, but that the document itself was written at the period which he assigns to it. If this be the case, the transcript from which these sheets are printed, may be considered the connecting link between them and the original compilation, and the circumstance of the copy having been made by so able a person, gives to it as much authority as can belong to any document not the original. The transcript is in the College of Arms, bound up with other Heraldic MSS. in a volume marked L 14, entitled "*Miscellanea Curiosa*," which was presented to that corporation by Sir William Dugdale, Garter, in 1676.

The more important criterion of the authenticity of the Roll is, however, its internal evidence; and the result of a careful examination is, not only that it was compiled in the reign of Henry the Third, but that it was written

between the 25th and 30th years of that monarch's reign, A. D. 1240—1245. So much depends on this fact, that the grounds on which the conclusion is formed will be stated.

The arms assigned to the Earl of Leicester prove him to have been a Montfort, the last of which family, who enjoyed that earldom, was slain at Evesham in 1265.

The Conte de l'Ile was either Baldwin de Rivers, Earl of Devon, who was created Earl of the Isle of Wight in the 25th of Henry the Third, 1240-1, and died in 1245, or Baldwin, his son and successor, the last of the name who bore those titles, who died in 1262, but most probably the former.

The last Earl of Albemarle who bore the coat therein assigned to that person, died in 1259; and the last Earl Ferrers in 1265.

The family of Marshal, Earls Marshal and Earls of Pembroke, became extinct on the death of Anselm, sixth Earl, in 1245. The arms attributed to them, were afterwards assumed by Hugh Bigot, Earl of Norfolk, his mother having been Maud, the sister and coheir of the said Anselm, Earl Marshal, in whose right he succeeded to the office of Marshal, but in this Roll, the Earl of Norfolk is said to have borne the coat of Bigot, "Or, a cross gules." The

last Earl of Arundel of the D'Albini family, whose arms were "Gules a lion rampant or," died in 1243; and it has been satisfactorily shown,* that that title was not attributed to Fitz Alan, who assumed the same arms, until the 20th year of the reign of Edward the First.

Hubert de Burgh, Earl of Kent, who was the only Earl of that county that ever bore "Mascally vaire et gules," died in the 27th of Henry the Third, 1242-3.

The Newburghs, Earls of Warwick, who bore the coat therein assigned to that dignity, became extinct in the 26th of Henry the Third, 1241-2; and Sir John de Plessis, the next Earl, who bore that title as early as August 1247, is mentioned among the Barons.

These facts are strong evidence that the Roll was not compiled after August 1247; and there is not a single statement which may not be reconciled with that opinion.

As the name of Roger de Mortimer occurs, who is said to have succeeded his brother Ralph in August 1246, and as the said Ralph de Mortimer is not noticed, it may be concluded that the Roll was not compiled long before that time.

That it was written after 1243, also appears from Maurice de Berkeley being named in it as bearing the arms of his family without any distinction, his father Thomas de Berkeley having died in that year.

A comparison of the names in the Roll, with the writs of summons to perform military service about the middle of the reign of Henry the Third, corroborates the date assigned to its compilation.

The date of the Roll having thus been fixed as nearly as presumptive evidence can be expected to do, it would be superfluous to multiply proofs: one or two instances, however, will be cited to show its accuracy.

Simon de Montfort, Earl of Leicester, is said to have borne "Gules, a lion rampant argent, the tail forchee;" but his banner is stated in the Roll to have been very different, namely, "Party indented argent and gules." That he bore such a banner was probable, from the charge on it being described in some early Rolls of Arms in the College of Arms and British Museum as "Le vielle escu de Leicester;" but which appears from other authorities to have been the banner of the Honour of Hinckley, in Leicestershire, by the tenure of which the Earls of that county were Stewards of

England;* and the statement of his using that banner is confirmed by a contemporary portrait of the Earl, in the window of the church of Notre Dame de Chartres, engraved in Willemin's "Monumens Français Inédits."†

There are, however, three Earls noticed in the Roll, on whom some remarks are necessary.

"Le Conte de Huntindon, pale d'or, et de goules ung bende noir."

"Le Conte de Chester, d'azur, a trois garbes d'or," and

“ Le Conte de Mandevile, quarte le de or et de gules.”

At the time of the Conquest, Waltheof was Earl of Huntingdon; and after his death, in 1073, Simon de St. Liz, who married Maud, his eldest daughter and coheirress, is said to have borne that title until about 1100, when he died. David, brother of Alexander, King of Scotland, having married the said Maud, widow of Earl Simon, was allowed the dignity by Henry the First, and succeeded to the throne of Scotland in 1124. From that time the Earldom was possessed either by the family of St. Liz, as heirs of Simon, the second Earl, or by some member of the royal family of Scotland, as heir of David, King of Scotland, the third Earl, until the death of John le Scot, Earl of Huntingdon and Chester, s. p. in 1237; and the next Earl on record is William Baron Clinton, who was created Earl of Huntingdon in 1337. According to some authorities, the arms of St. Liz were “Per pale indented argent and gules,”* and, to others, “Argent two bars gules frette or;”† whereas all the royal family of Scotland who possessed the dignity, are stated to have borne, “Or a lion rampant gules,” except-

ing David, brother of William the Lion, King of Scotland, and John le Scot, son of the said Earl David, the two last Earls of Huntingdon at the time this Roll was compiled, whose arms were "Or three piles gules."

The arms attributed to the Earls of Huntingdon in this Roll, "Paly or and gules a bend sable," differ materially from both those coats, but they are assigned to the title in several Rolls of Arms and Ordinaries in the College of Arms and British Museum;* whilst Nisbet, in his "System of Heraldry,"† on what seems good authority, says, that Simon de St. Liz, the second Earl, bore Paly of six, or and gules, a bordure argent.

It is therefore difficult to determine which of the Earls of Huntingdon was alluded to in this Roll, but it is most probable that one of the St. Lizs was meant, of whose arms it may be deemed the best evidence, unless any of their seals be extant.

The Earldom of Chester became extinct on the death of the before-mentioned John le Scot, and was not again granted until 1253, when Edmond Plantagenet, younger son of King Henry the Third, was created to that dignity. The arms attributed to John le Scot have been just alluded to, but those assigned to the Earl of Chester in the Roll, "Azure, three garbs or," were the arms of Randolf, surnamed Blondeville, the preceding Earl, who died in the 17th of Henry III. 1231; so that in speaking of the Earl of Chester, the Compiler may either have meant that person, or have attributed the coat to John le Scot, not as his personal bearing, but as the arms of the Earldom of Chester, though both he and Ralph Blondeville were then deceased. In the Roll of Arms of the reign of Edward the Second, among the "Nons e les armes *abatues* de Grande Seignors," is "Le Conte de Cestre," to whom "de azure a iij garbes de or"* are attributed.

By "Le Conte Mandevile," who bore "quarterly de or et de goules," must be meant one of the Earls of Essex, a title which became extinct about 1227, but was assumed by, and apparently allowed to, Humphrey de Bohun, Earl of

Clare and Gloucester, and mother of Gilbert, then a minor, was present ; and though he wore his own arms, " Or an eagle displayed vert" on his surcoat and shield, his banner was that of the Earldom of Clare, " Or three chevronels gules."*

The seal of Humphrey de Bohun, Earl of Hereford and Essex, to the letter from the Barons to Pope Boniface VIII. in February 1301, has on the one side his effigy, vested in, and holding his shield charged with, the arms of Bohun, and inscribed with his name and the titles of " Earl of Hereford and Constable of England ;" and on the other side, a large shield of Bohun, between two smaller ones, each containing the coat of Mandevile, and inscribed " S. Humphridi de Bohun Comitibus Herefordie et Essexie."

Somewhat similar was the seal of Guy de Beauchamp, then Earl of Warwick, which is attached to that letter ; for on the one side is his effigy habited in, and holding a shield of, the arms of Beauchamp, and on the other is a large shield with the coat of Newburgh, from which family he inherited the dignity, and who, like the Mandeviles in the case of Essex, and

Clare in that of Clare, were the first of the name who possessed the Earldom of Warwick after the Conquest.

It is probable, also, that the extraordinary charge on the seal of John de Hastings to the Barons letter to the Pontiff, in 1301, as well as that on the seal of his brother, Edmund de Hastings,* arose from some local dignities, or possessions, either in this country or in France, though neither the nature nor the names of them are known.

These facts, and others might be stated in corroboration, admit of the conclusion, that the arms of Earldoms and important Lordships were, in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries, considered to have been local, and were borne in some way with the personal coat of those who may have succeeded to, or obtained grants of them; and even so late as the reign of Henry the Sixth, Richard Duke of York bore the arms of Ulster on one of his seals, in allusion to his possessing that Earldom:† hence, when the names of Earls occur in early

Rolls of Arms, that of the Earl who lived the latest may be assumed to be the date of the compilation.

Sufficient has, perhaps, been adduced, both to prove the authenticity of this Roll, and to remove any objections to which the apparent anomalies in it, with respect to the Earls of Chester, Huntingdon, and Mandevile, might give rise.

Considerable doubt has been entertained as to the period when Heraldry was introduced; and it has been conjectured, that if the science was known, it was not generally adopted, in this country, until the reign of Richard the First.* Arms, it is true, occur on the tomb of Geoffrey de Mandevile, Earl of Essex, who died in 1148, but this monument may not have been erected until some years after his death. Leaving, however, the question of the time of the invention of Heraldry, this Roll establishes that it was reduced to a science as early as the year 1240; and as materials by which to judge of the changes which have taken place between a period so near to its origin and the present, and as the earliest compilation on the

subject yet discovered, the Roll is of much interest.

Its greatest value is, however, in presenting contemporary evidence of the arms borne by the Barons and Knights of the reign of Henry the Third, and thus forming a source of information which may be relied upon, since in every instance in which the bearings here assigned to those personages have been compared with their seals, the statements have proved correct; and one example of the manner in which this Roll and the "Siege of Carlaverock" which was written about sixty years afterwards, agree with each other, is deserving of attention, as it tends to evince the correctness of both.

Gilbert de Segrave is said in this Roll to have borne "Noir trois gerbes d'argent." He died in 1254, leaving issue Nicholas Baron Segrave, who died in 1295, and left, among other children, two sons, John his successor, and Nicholas, both of whom were at Carlaverock in June 1300. Speaking of Nicholas, the poetical historian of that siege, says,

*"Vaillant pere ot ki getta puer
Les garbes et le lyon prist."**

"He had a valiant father, who cast out the garbs and assumed the lion," and the arms of

John de Segrave are accordingly blazoned, "Sable, a lion rampant argent, crowned or;" and those of Nicholas, his younger brother, were the same, differenced by a label.

For having his attention called to this Roll, as well as for the transcript of it, the Editor is indebted to his friend, Charles George Young, Esq. York Herald, whose valuable assistance he has had to acknowledge with gratitude, in each of his publications. No alteration has been made, excepting by printing the abbreviations in the copy in the College of Arms at length.

To Mr. Willement, the author of "Regal Heraldry," he owes the illustration of the effigy of Simon de Montfort, Earl of Leicester, and the account of some arms in Westminster Abbey, which, being contemporary with this Roll, and from the accounts of them previously printed being very imperfect, he has inserted among the notes at the end.

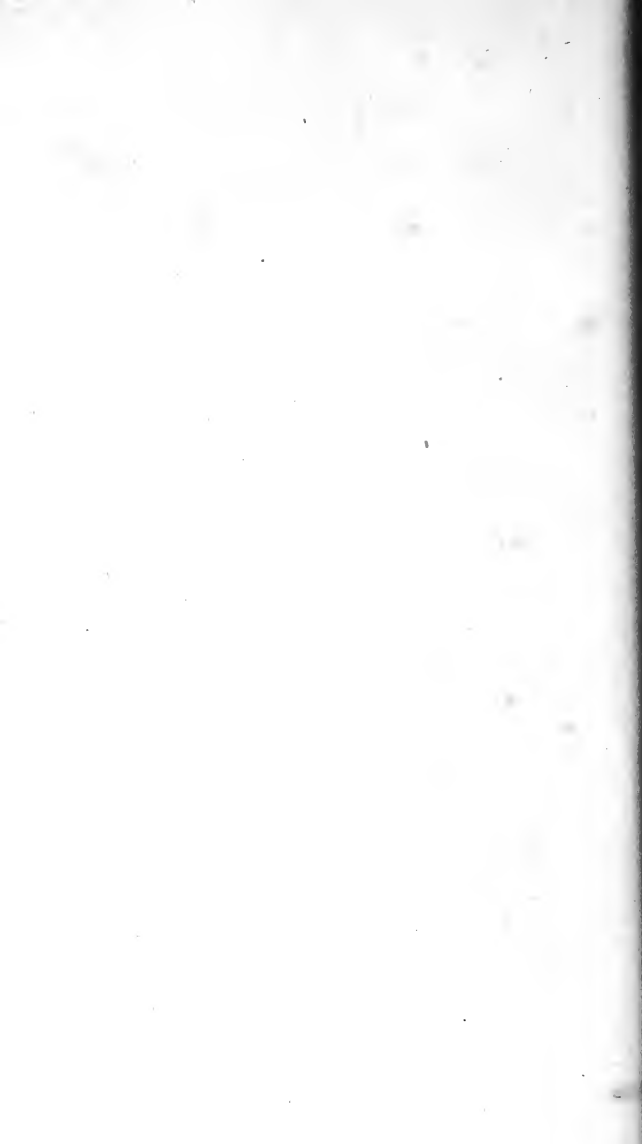

It may be desirable to notice such terms of blazon in the preceding ROLL OF ARMS as are obscure, not so much with the view of explaining, for in one or two instances this is not in the Editor's power, as to collect them.

- 10 BREYS. Barnacles for a horse's nose.—*Cotgrave*.
- 5, 7 BURELE. Appears to be used almost synonymously with Barry; but as the latter term frequently occurs, it would seem to be distinct from it. Probably Burele meant a shield divided by horizontal lines, without regard to their number, and was consequently formed of much narrower divisions than Barry.
- 16, 18 DE L'UN E L'AUTRE. Counterchanged.
- 10 DANCETTE. Now called a Fess dancette. In early Heraldry, the fess and dancette were distinct ordinaries.*
- 8 EMBELIEF. The coat of Greiley, in which this term occurs, was gules, three bends *enhanced* or. As "Embelief" is not to be found in any Glossary or Dictionary, it was perhaps an error of the transcriber for "en le chief."

The same practice still prevails in French Heraldry, and it may be doubted whether it is not more simple than, and consequently preferable to, our own system. The word *Pellets* appears to have been subsequently used in the same manner.
- 11 TREGOZ, ARMS OF. As there blazoned, the arms of Tregoz are not intelligible, the chief and the lion being both gules. It was probably the error either of the compiler or copyist, in describing the lion as *gules*, instead of *or*.

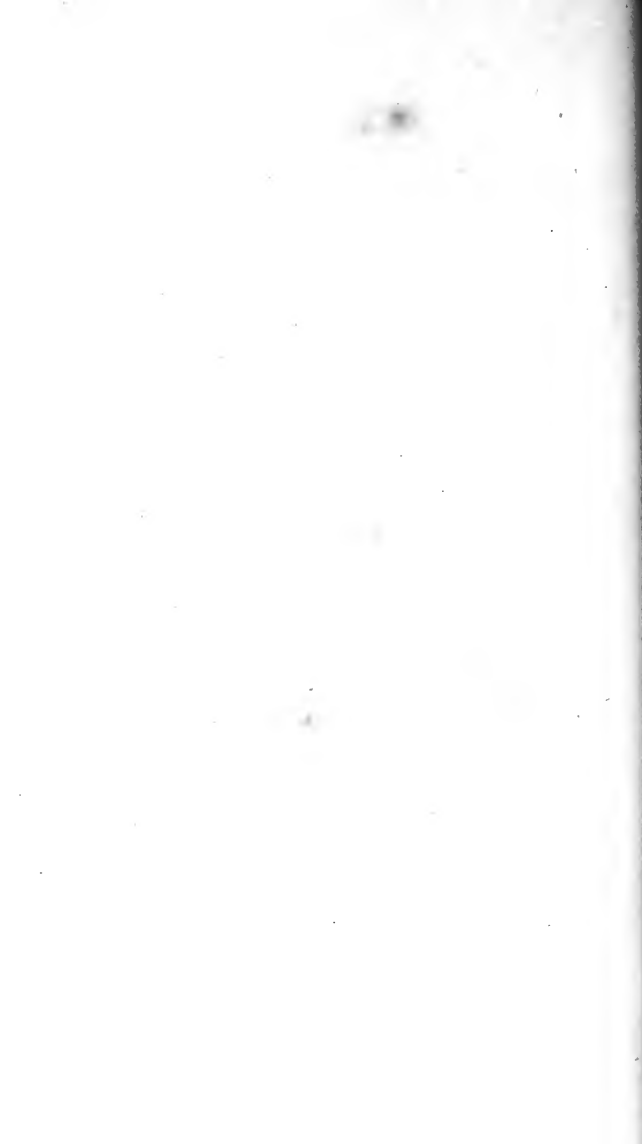

17. FRET AND FRETTEY. The coat of Audley is blazoned as "une frette," in p. 17, whilst those of many other persons are described Argent, Azure, &c. "fret de gules." Notwithstanding that a *fret* and *fretty* are distinct bearings, it may be safely

concluded that the individuals there mentioned bore what is now termed *fretty*; for though Hugh d'Audley's coat is called "une frette," the seals of the Audleys of the period were *fretty*—See *Ancient Charters* in the British Museum, marked 45 E 36, 45 E 38, &c. In the Roll of the reign of Edward II. three Audleys occur, each of whom is said to have borne "frette."

33. **PIECES.** Pics, *i. e.* Pickaxes.

13. **RASES.** Erased.

RECERCELE, or **CERCELÉE**, is now used to describe a cross which is curved at the points like a ram's horn, and this was probably then the meaning of the word when applied to crosses. But when it was applied to **Bordures**, it seems to have meant engrailed. See **Bordures** *recersele* in the Index to the Charges.

12. **ROUKE.** A Chess-rook.

SCROPE, arms of. The Arms of the family of Scrope were Azure a bend Or; but in this Roll, as well as that in the reign of Edward the Second, the only person of the name of Scrope mentioned is said to have had the bend charged with a Lion rampant purpure, the cause of which addition is thus explained by the Prior of Gisborough, in his deposition in the memorable contest between Richard Lord Scrope, of Bolton, and

Sir Robert Grosvenor, in 1385, for the right to the arms, Azure a bend Or. The Prior said, that "the arms of Scrope were in his church in a glass window, Azure a bend Or with a little Lioncel purple in the caunton of the shield 'paramont' on the bend, the which Lioncel was given to one of the Scopres by the Earl of Lincoln for the term of the life of the said Scrope." One part of this statement does not, however, agree with finding the Lion borne on a bend by Sir Henry le Scrope, temp. Edw. II. and by Sir William le Scrope, temp. Edw. III.

19. TREMOILS. This word does not occur in any glossary, nor has the name of *Elmindbright*, in whose coat it occurs, been met with in any other instance. The copyist of the Roll in 1562 explains *tremoiles* by "men's hearts," but it might have been a mistake for *trefoils* which the colour *vert* also renders probable.
20. PELLETS. When not accompanied by the name of the colour, pellets seem to have meant plates, as in the arms of Camois. In the arms of Huntingfield, p. 28, they are called "pellots *d'argent*."
