Maybrat has five vocalic phonemes, $/ i, e, a, o, u /$. In word-final position [j] and [w] occur as allophones of $/ \mathrm{i} /$ and $/ \mathrm{u} /$ respectively. There are eleven consonantal phonemes: $/ \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{t}, \mathrm{k}, \mathrm{m}, \mathrm{n}, \mathrm{f}, \mathrm{s}, \mathrm{x}, \mathrm{r}, \mathrm{w}$, $y /$. Sequences of consonants are invariably broken up by an epenthetic [ə]. Monomorphemic words mostly consist of one or two syllable. Stress usually falls on the first syllable of a word, unless this syllable contains [ə].

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
