Vowels

The contrast between /e/ and /ɛ/ is phonemic: cf. /kelel/ 'one'; /kɛlɛl/ 'war'. Nasalization is notated by vowel + nasal consonant: dan /dã/. The apostrophe is used to mark vowel elision.

TONE

High and low; the contrast is phonemic: cf. sá 'snake'; sa 'die, death'.

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
