5. NUMERALS

5.1. Cardinals

The Khaling numeral system is a vigesimal one with the distinctive root -khäl '20'.

Listed below are those Khaling numbers which are known today. However, in actual use are only the first three. When used in counting an item-suffix -baa/pu is added. Beyond <u>sukpu</u> 'three' Nepali numbers are used and especially among young persons, Khaling numbers have been forgotten.
