The consonant phonemes of SDA are: $p, t, c, k, k w, b, d, j, g, s$, $s_{1}, z, z, m, n n, n, 11,1, r r, x, w, y . / t /$ and /d/are fronted; /s/ and /z/ are retroflexed. In loans from Spanish the following additional consonants are found: $g w, f, x$. The vowel phonemes are: $i, d, u, e, 0$, $\varepsilon$, a. / $\mathbb{E}$ / is an unrounded mid-open front vowel. There are simple and complex syllable nuclei; the complex nuclei subdivide into laryngealized (aa), interrupted (a), and aspirated (ah) nuclei. Syllables are either stressed or unstressed. There are three tonemes: rising, falling, and low. In unstressed syllables there is neutralization of the rising and falling tones to a phonetic high pitch. Tone is not written in this paper. However, where two morphemes are distinguished only by their inherent toneme, one of them is marked by a diacritic accent.
