

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Introductory Statement

Herewith is presented a statement on the scope, purposes and character of the Occupational Classification of Railroad Positions and the Report Forms which are to be used by steam railroads in reporting service and compensation data to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the United States Railroad Labor Board.

Contents of the Report

This report includes the following main divisions:

Present Reporting Plan and Need for Revision

Prior to July 1st, 1915, the service and compensation of railroad employees were reported to the Interstate Commerce Commission under eighteen (18) occupational groupings. On July 1st, 1915, a revised classification, providing for the separation of occupations into sixtyeight (68) groups, was issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission, and this grouping is now in effect. The information both as to service and compensation reported annually by the carriers is consolidated and published in the annual report of the Commission, which is issued for the information of the public and provides a measure of comparison of wage and other data for the various classes of railroad occupations involved.

During the period of Federal control the United States Railroad Administration found it difficult in the adjustment of wage and other disputes to secure the type of statistical information as to service and compensation of railroad employees which it required. The Railroad Wage Commission in circulating questionnaires as a basis for the first award—General Order No. 27—used primarily the sixty-eight (68) groupings of occupations in effect at the time.

The Board of Railroad Wages and Working Conditions, appointed by the Railroad Administration, experienced the same difficulty that was encountered by the Railroad Wage Commission in using the data on wages compiled in accordance with the groupings prescribed by the Interstate Commerce Commission. Accordingly, in special cases, elaborate questionnaires were circulated to secure the desired information. Due to the difficulty experienced by it, the Railroad Administration submitted to the Interstate Commerce Commission for its approval a proposed classification of railroad occupations embodying one hundred and twenty-five (125) distinctive groupings of occupations and with it report forms for reporting both service and compensation according to these distinctive groups. These report forms provided not only for expanding the occupational groupings from 68 to 125, but also provided that employees' services should be separated as between overtime. straight time, special allowances, etc. It also provided that compensation should be similarly distributed.

Meanwhile, under the Transportation Act, 1920, the United States Railroad Labor Board was created. This Board inherited a great number of requests for the adjustment of disputes between employers and employees and such an adjustment was provided by the Board in Decision No. 2. In deciding the questions at issue, however, the Board was seriously handicapped because of the absence of wage data relating to homogeneous groups of occupations and classified according to the special working conditions found in railway operation. The absence of data was in part compensated for by the mass of information which was inherited from the Board of Railroad Wages and Working Conditions and without which it would have been difficult, if not impossible, properly to review the claims of the contending parties. Provisions for the current collection of similar data, however, had not been made and it seemed evident that steps would have to be taken by the United States Railroad Labor Board to secure such current and properly classified data if it were correctly to perform its functions according to the provisions of the law.

With this problem before the Board, inquiry was addressed to the Interstate Commerce Commission respecting its attitude on the reporting classification which had been submitted to it by the Railroad Administration for adoption. The Board learned that this classification had not been adopted but had been submitted by the Interstate Commerce Commission to representatives of the railroads and by them to individual railroads for their comment, and also to representatives of employees' organizations. Generally speaking, the comments and criticisms concerning it were favorable. In view of the fact that the classification had not been adopted, and that at the time it was submitted to the Commission the particular problems and purposes of the United States Railroad Labor Board were not known, it was thought desirable for the Board to request that the Commission defer its approval of the classification and Reporting Forms until the United States Railroad Labor Board had had time to study them in the light of its particular problems.

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Such a request was addressed by the United States Railroad Labor Board to the Interstate Commerce Commission and was favorably received, approval by the Commission being temporarily deferred. The Commission was also advised that the Board had begun, and was carrying through to completion, a comprehensive classification of railroad positions and the preparation of report forms with supporting instructions and regulations which would serve the needs of the Commission and the Board. Accordingly, a comprehensive study was made of present methods of grouping and classifying positions and of reporting information on wages and services of steam railroad employees. As a result of this study there has been developed a plan for grouping and reporting information concerning such employees as well as a complete Railroad Occupational Classification to be used in connection therewith.

Purpose of Occupational Classification of Railroad Positions

The purpose of the Occupational Classification of railroad positions is to furnish a basis for the collection of wage and other data on homogeneous classes of railroad positions, to establish as nearly as can be a uniform terminology to be used in describing similar occupations, and to describe classes of positions so that all railroads may have the same general understanding of the kinds of positions that are to be included in any class.

The Occupational Classification is in no way and under no circumstances to be interpreted by the Board, by the Interstate Commerce Commission, by the railroads or by other interested parties, as setting up jurisdictional lines for occupations, or as limiting the kinds of work which employees may perform or the duties which they may assume. In preparing the Occupational Classification, the Board has not aimed to standardize for the railroads the occupational duties assigned to, or the kinds of work performed by their employees, and nothing in the classification nor in the report forms is to be construed in this light. Its purpose is solely so to group positions that the wage and other data reported to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the United States Railroad Labor Board may be used for administrative and public purposes. It specifically provides against grouping together occupations of widely different duties and responsibilities, as well as rates of compensation. By adhering to the classification and the groupings provided for in the Reporting Forms, wage data will be more than indiscriminate totals and the averages computed therefrom will be valuable for administrative and public purposes.

Reference to the Occupational Classification in making the reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission and the United States Railroad Labor Board will facilitate the placement of positions and uniform segregation of wage and other employment data. The value of uniformity and definiteness in classification is particularly clear in the analysis of data on railroad positions which are well defined. In obtaining data on wages and other employment conditions for such positions as those in the Train and Engine Service, where the terminology and language used are fairly uniform on the different railroads, definite and comparable information can be furnished by the railroads and with the least possible danger of misunderstanding.

With respect to other services it is difficult, under present conditions, for the Board to make clear the exact information desired and for the carriers to furnish classified data suitable for analysis. Positions such as those in the Clerical and Office Administrative Service are good examples. There is no classification or uniform language at present in use as to clerical positions and there is little or no distinction between positions of varying importance and responsibility. It is therefore difficult to obtain comparable wage data and other information necessary to the Board in rendering decisions or in interpreting and applying such decisions by the interested parties. This condition has confronted adjustment bodies and also the carriers. For want of a better alternative it has been necessary to treat such unclassified positions without distinction as to existing differences.

The submission of wage statistics and other information for homogeneous groups of positions will give the Interstate Commerce Commission and the United States Railroad Labor Board uniform, definite and usable data. The use of standard nomenclature based on duties will also enable the Board to make comparisons with similar occupations outside of the railroad service and to detect inequalities between positions on the railroads and in outside organizations.

With the establishment and use of the Occupational Classification by the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Board, as well as by the railroads, a foundation will be laid for securing comparable information. This will obviate the necessity of special explanations and correspondence concerning the precise nature of the data which are required and furnished and will materially reduce the number of special inquiries and studies on wages and working conditions which may be required in carrying out the purposes of the Transportation Act.

The annual reports of the Commission and the Board which are made to the public, are studied from various angles. In order that these reports may fully serve the purposes intended, the statistical information which is incorporated should be precise and capable of clear and definite interpretation. All this rests fundamentally on the presence and use of comparative statistical material.

In order to simplify the Reporting Divisions and at the same time to secure reports suitable to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the Board, the distinctive classes in the Occupational Classification have been re-grouped into 148 Reporting Divisions. The Reporting Divisions have been arranged according to established broad departmental lines and data relating to them, based as they are upon a comprehensive grouping of positions, will meet the general requirements of both the Commission and the Board, thereby reducing the amount of labor necessary in preparing any special reports which either body may deem necessary. The distinctive classes of positions falling under the different Reporting Divisions are listed in the Detail under the Reporting Divisions (Pages 21 to 50 inclusive). To minimize the possibility of misinterpretation and to facilitate the use of the descriptions of duties and basic groupings of positions in the Occupational Classification, the distinctive class names, with references to Occupational Classification symbols and page numbers, are given for all the classes in the Reporting Divisions.

Description of the Occupational Classification

The basis and general plan of the Occupational Classification conform to the recognized lines and the best practice which have been followed by industrial and governmental organizations in the development of employment classifications for their services, the entire plan being based upon the principle that duties and responsibilities must control in any orderly arrangement and classification of positions.

The Occupational Classification may be described as a functional grouping of positions, the aim being to set up unit classes which group together positions of essentially similar nature having due regard to the duties and responsibilities which they require or imply.

All railroad positions are separated into main divisions which, for convenience, are called SERVICES. These are the broadest divisions of positions and are determined irrespective of departmental lines. Such a grouping of services admits of a bird's eye view of the entire range of railroad positions.

The services are sub-divided into GROUPS of related positions covering work which is generally performed in the same profession, vocation or trade, or in a particular kind of railroad work.

Wherever there are wide and clearly discernible differences in the importance, difficulty and responsibility of the work performed, the groups are further sub-divided into GRADES which consist of one or more DISTINCTIVE CLASSES of positions. These classes are the smallest units provided for in the classification and are made up of positions carrying essentially similar duties and responsibilities. Each class is given a distinct title and described so far as is necessary to indicate the kinds of positions which fall under such distinctive class.

Under each of the respective services, groups, and grades there is set out general descriptive statements of the duties and responsibilities of the services and groups and of the distinctive classes of positions. These descriptions are set out solely as distinguishing particular kinds of work, so as to provide for essentially homogeneous classes of occupations.

The various positions found in the steam railroad service are grouped in the Occupational Classification under seventeen (17) major Services; these Services having been set up according to the general railroad functions as well as the special and peculiar requirements in railroad organizations. The Services are sub-divided into 119 Groups. Within the Groups are the separate grades and distinctive class titles, each of which has a description of duties generally performed and illustrative examples.

Outside of the Executive, Official and Staff Assistant Service, which is ungraded and unclassified and in which examples of positions are shown separately under appropriate groups but not distinguished as to importance and responsibilities of work performed, there are 500 distinctive classes which are distributed under the other sixteen (16) Services as follows:

The Occupational Classification with the alphabetical finding list should be used as a basis in distributing occupations in the reports which are to be made to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the United States Railroad Labor Board. This does not mean that the railroads are required in making up the regular reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the United States Railroad Labor Board to observe all of the separate class distinctions provided for in the classification, but they are required to follow the definitions and make the distinctions which apply to the divisions of occupations upon which they report. It is hoped, however, that the classification in its detailed form will prove of such value to the railroads in viewing their employment problems as a whole that they will, of their own free will, install it as a basis for employment administration, and reap the advantages which would accrue therefrom.

To the Carriers Concerned:

The accompanying rules governing the Classification of Steam Railway Employees and Reports of their Service and Compensation provide for more detailed reports to the Commission relative to railway Employees than have hitherto been required. The resulting statistics are intended to meet the needs of both the United States Railroad Labor Board and the Interstate Commerce Commission. The classification of employees was worked out by the Labor Board. The information required concerning each class or so-called Reporting Division is largely in accord with the recommendation of the Director General of Railroads, with some modifications as the result of conferences and hearings held jointly by the Labor Board and the Commission, at which representatives of labor organizations and carriers were present. ~

It is requested that a duplicate copy of each monthly wage report made to the Commission be sent to the United States Railroad Labor Board, Kesner Building, Chicago, III.

INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION

Order

At a General Session of the Interstate Commerce Commission, held at its office in Washington, D. C., on the 18th day of April, A. D. 1921.

The subject of statistics of service and compensation of steam railway employees being under consideration, the following order was entered:

It is ordered,

1. That the order of June 17, 1915, prescribing certain "Rules Governing the Classification of Steam Railway Employees and their Compensation," and also an order of July 13, 1917, supplementary to the said order, be and they are hereby annulled as of July 1, 1921.

2. That the annexed "Rules Governing the Classification of Steam Railway Employees and Reports of Their Service and Compensation" be approved to take effect on July 1, 1921, and that all carriers by steam railway within the scope of Section 20 of the Interstate Commerce Act be governed by the said rules in the preparation and submission of their annual and other periodical reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission in accordance with forms adopted for such returns, and also with respect to any other matters covered by these rules.

3. That all carriers of Class I included under this order shall, beginning with a report for the month of July, 1921, render monthly reports of employees, service, and compensation in accordance with forms outlined in connection with the rules specified in Article 2 above. Such reports shall be made under oath and forwarded to the Bureau of Statistics, Interstate Commerce Commission, Washington, D. C., not later than the 30th day following the close of the month to which they relate. Carriers of Classes II and III and lessor companies shall include a statement of employees, service, and compensation in their annual reports in accordance with the simplified form given in Part II of the annexed Rules.

INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION

Rules Governing the Classification of Steam Railway Employees and Reports of their Service and Compensation

1. DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEES—The word *employees*, as used herein, is intended to include every person in the service of the reporting carrier subject to its continuing authority to supervise and direct the manner of rendition of his service. Persons engaged to render only specifically defined service and not subject to the continuing authority of the carrier to supervise and control their acts, such as customhouse brokers, lawyers retained only for specific cases and not under general or continuing retainer, etc., are not employees in the meaning of the term used herein.

2. COUNTING EMPLOYEES—Since the number of employees fluctuates, carriers are required to classify and count all of their employees at twelve different times each year, with additional counts in certain occupations as provided for in Part II hereof.

3. JOINT EMPLOYEES—Each person jointly employed, shall, if carried on the payrolls of the several joint employers, be counted by each employer and represented in its return of number of employees by a fraction based on the number of employers reporting him; if a person, for example, is reportable by three employers, each should include him in its number of employees as one-third of an employee. When the entire compensation of a joint employee is shown on the payroll of a single joint employer and is paid to the employee by that employer such employee should, for the purpose of returns, be treated as if employed solely by such employer.

4. TIME ON DUTY—The actual number of hours on duty, or held for duty, is to be ascertained and recorded for every class of employees required to be on duty at regular times. For enginemen and trainmen, the actual number of miles run is to be recorded as well as the number of hours on duty.

Whenever an employee works at more than one occupation, or in more than one class of service, both the number of hours worked and the compensation paid, subject to the modifications indicated in connection with Form B, should be separated and reported under the

proper Reporting Divisions. For example, if an employee is paid a day's wage for a smaller number of hours than constitutes a day's work, the number of hours paid for as well as the actual number of hours the employee is on duty should be ascertained and recorded. Time allowed for meals, part holidays, holidays, absences on leave, vacations, etc., should be excluded from time actually worked, unless such time is paid for, in which case, it should be appropriately reported. These requirements apply to enginemen and trainmen paid on the basis of trips or of miles run, and to employees paid at piece rates, as well as to employees paid on hourly, daily, weekly, monthly, or other time bases. For general officers, division officers, traveling agents and solicitors, and other classes of employees, whose duties are of such a nature that it is impracticable to record accurately the number of hours during which they are on duty, the return should show the number of days on duty, as well as the number of days paid for. Employees whose time on duty and time paid for are measured in days are indicated on Form A by the letter (D), following the title of the Reporting Division. Total overtime hours paid for should be reported separately between pro rata and punitive rates paid therefor, except in Train and Engine Service.

5. COMPENSATION—The compensation of employees as defined in these rules is to be stated in such manner and detail as the forms adopted for periodical returns require.

PART II

1. There are presented in Part II outlines of two forms for the report of information to the Interstate Commerce Commission on railway employees, their service, and compensation, designated as FORM A, which relates to employees other than train and engine service employees, and FORM B, which relates to train and engine service employees. These forms are followed by instructions, or explanatory references, with some illustrative examples, in order that the intent of the forms may be correctly understood.

2. With general reference to the statement of the compensation of employees in Forms A and B, it should be understood that the total compensation received by the employees in each Reporting Division, as well as the amount of work they perform, should be shown properly distributed under the prescribed column heads as indicated by the forms. It should be noted, that if the work of an employee varies during a report period, his time and compensation should be apportioned accordingly.

Illustrations: (a) In the course of a month, an employee works as a Machinist, and as such earns \$65.00, and he works also as a Gang Foreman and earns \$35.00. The pay received by him in the occupation of Machinist with corresponding time should be included in returns for Division 77, "Machinists," and his other pay and time as indicated should be included in returns for Division 67, "Gang Foremen and Gang Leaders." (b) When an employee works at two or more of the occupations of engineer, fireman, conductor, and brakeman his time and compensation should be assigned in accordance with the facts. For example, in a certain period an employee earns as a Through Freight Engineer \$30.00, as a Local or Way Freight Engineer \$26.00, as a Yard Engineer \$15.00, and as a Local or Way Freight Fireman \$16.00. The time and the compensation of this employee should be correspondingly distributed among Reporting Divisions 142, 143, 144 and 147 as they are respectively applicable, without regard to the predominance of the time worked or the amount earned by him in one occupation.

3. As elsewhere indicated, the statement of the number of employees in the service of a company with respect to Reporting Division depends upon the allocation of the individual employees as of the day of count.

4. The Reporting Divisions shown in Forms A and B following will also be used in connection with the annual report of steam roads of Classes II and III and lessor companies, but only the information indicated by the following column headings will be required for each Reporting Division:

- 1. Name of Reporting Division.
- 2. Number of employees in service at middle of the months of January, April, July, and October, (and average of preceding).
- 3. Hours of service:

Straight time Overtime Total

4. Days of service: Straight time Overtime Total

5. Compensation: Straight time Overtime Total

Form A, pages 16-19.

Explanatory Instructions Pertaining to Form A

Column 1. The Reporting Divisions named in Column 1 of Form A are to accord with the definitions of the Divisions given in the Classification and Index of Steam Railroad Occupations of the United States Railroad Labor Board.

Column 2. The 15th day of a month is to be taken as the middle of the month, except when it falls on a Sunday or a holiday, in which case the count should be made as of the last preceding business day. The count should not be restricted to employees actually on duty as of the day of the count, but should cover all employees, including employees under pay on vacation, or sick leave. Employees who are not subject to call for duty, such as employees not under pay, absent on definite leave or under suspension, and pensioners not bound to render service, should be excluded. Employees whose duties are such as to make them includible in two or more Reporting Divisions should be reported in that Division indicated by the greater part of their duties during the period covered by a report.

Column 3. To arrive at the number of full-time positions reportable for a Division, divide the hours (or days) required in column 4 by the number of hours (or days) that constitutes the straight-time assignment for the month for which report is made. In the computation of averages of this sort for inclusion in reports, fractions of less than onehalf are, in general, to be disregarded, and fractions of one-half or more reckoned as one.

Illustrations: (a) With respect to Division No. 77, "Machinists," if in a particular shop or department the assignment of machinists for a given month is 26 days of eight hours, or a total of 208 hours, and the total number of straight-time hours actually worked by all the machinists is 5,230, this total number of hours should be divided by the number representing the assignment, for the month (208 hours), to obtain the number of full-time positions, which in this instance would be 25, as the fraction of less than one-half in the quotient would be dropped. (b) If in the case of Division No. 124, "Crossing and Bridge Flagmen and Gatemen," the total number of days for which the men of this Division were paid on a 31-day assignment was 296, the number of full-time positions reportable would be 10, since the quotient of 296 divided by 31 is 9 and a fraction greater than one-half.

Column 4. There should be stated for each of the Reporting Divisions the total number of straight-time hours actually worked by the employees whose service is includible in the particular Division.

Column 5. Enter the total number of overtime hours paid for at pro rata rates.

Column 6. Enter the total number of overtime hours paid for at punitive rates.

Column 7. Enter the totals of time paid for and not worked, such as payment for part holidays, holidays, absence on definite leave, vacations, miscellaneous time paid for and not worked; such as pay for attending court, suspensions, sickness, time allowed for meals, and other time that can properly be considered constructive, such as allowance to complete a minimum day when less than a minimum day is worked.

Illustrations: (a) Certain employees are required to work only four hours on Saturday but are allowed eight hours pay. Enter four hours in Column 4 and 4 hours in Column 7. (b) Certain shop employees work 7 hours on Saturday and are allowed eight hours pay. Enter 7 hours in Column 4 and 1 hour in Column 7.

Column 8. Enter the total of Columns 4 to 7.

Column 9. Enter the compensation for the time shown in Column 4.
Column 10. Enter the compensation for the time shown in Column 5.
Column 11. Enter the compensation for the time shown in Column 6.
Column 12. Enter the compensation for the time shown in Column 7.
Column 13. Enter the total of Columns 9 to 12.

SUPPLEMENT TO FORM A-PIECE WORK

For each Reporting Division in which employees on a piece work basis are represented, the number of employees on such piece work basis, together with their hours of work and compensation, should be shown in a footnote or if necessary on a supplementary sheet in the following form:

Explanatory Instructions Pertaining to Form B

Column 1. The Reporting Divisions named in Column 1 of Form B are to accord with the definitions of the Divisions given in the Classification and Index of Steam Railroad Occupations of the United States Railroad Labor Board.

Column 2. Enter the total number of employees in service or available for service as of the middle of the month. Employees whose duties are such as to make them includible in two or more Reporting Divisions should be included in that Division indicated by the greater part of their time during the month.

The count should not be restricted to employees actually on duty as of the day of the count, but should cover all employees, including employees under pay on vacations or sick leave, as well as "extra" men in train and engine service, who are subject to call for duty. Employees who are not subject to call for duty, such as employees not under pay, absent on definite leave or under suspension, and pensioners not bound to render service, should be excluded.

Column 3. Enter the number of employees ascertained in the following manner:

Employees should be counted four times each month, i. e., on the 7th, 15th, 22nd, and 28th, except when these dates fall on Sundays or holidays, in which case the count should be made as of the last preceding business day.

Employees should be credited to the service in which they are engaged on the particular dates the counts are made. Employees on assigned runs, whose lay-over days fall on these dates, should be included, but "extra" men not working on these dates should be excluded. It should be noted that the counts provided for in column 3 are made on a different basis from the count provided for in column 2. In column 3 employees are to be credited to the Services in which they are engaged on the days of the counts and not according to those in which their preponderant duties fall as provided for in column 2.

Column 4. Enter the number of straight-time hours actually worked.

Column 5. Enter the total straight-time hours paid for covering Divisions Nos. 131, 132, 135, 136, 139, 140, 141, 144, 145 and 148 only.

Column 6. Enter the number of hours of overtime paid for.

Column 7. Enter the number of constructive hours allowed which does not represent actual train service and for which mileage is not allowed, such as pay under "Held away from home terminal" rule, called and not used, run around, deadheading, attending court, suspensions, investigations, claim and safety meetings.

Column 8. Enter the total of amounts shown in columns 5, 6 and 7, for passenger and yard service employees, and the total of amounts shown in columns 4, 6 and 7, for freight service employees.

Column 9. Enter the straight-time compensation for the time shown in column 4.

Column 10. Enter the straight-time compensation for the time shown in column 5.

Column 11. Enter the overtime compensation for the time shown in column 6.

Column 12. Enter the compensation for the time shown in column 7.

Column 13. Enter the sum of the amounts shown in columns 10, 11, and 12 for passenger and yard service employees, and the sum of the amounts shown in columns 9, 11, and 12 for freight service employees.

Column 14. Enter the total compensation paid. The amounts to be shown in this column include those given in column 13, as well as the compensation for time not worked due to additional hours necessary to equalize the miles paid for. The sum of the amounts in this column must agree with the total pay roll.

Column 15. Enter the number of miles run in performing actual train service.

Column 16. Enter the number of miles paid for but not run in connection with actual train service.

Column 17. Include in this column the number of trips made for which not less than a minimum day is paid.

EXAMPLES BASED ON EXISTING WORKING CONDITIONS ILLUSTRATING ENTRIES TO BE MADE

(a) A freight engineer makes a run of 125 miles in 8 hours. (Time from reporting for duty until released at end of run.) Enter eight hours in column 4 and 125 miles in column 15.

(b) A passenger conductor makes a run of 200 miles in nine hours. (Time from reporting for duty until released at end of run.) Enter nine hours in column 4, 10 hours in column 5 and 200 miles in column 15.

(c) A passenger engineer makes a run of 120 miles in 4 hours. (Time from reporting for duty until released at end of run.) Enter four hours in column 4, six hours in column 5 and 120 miles in column 15.

(d) A freight conductor makes a run of 60 miles in four hours. (Time from reporting for duty until released at end of run.) Enter four hours in column 4, 60 miles in column 15, and 40 miles in column 16.

(e) A passenger conductor makes a straight-away run of 100 miles in five hours (time from reporting for duty until released at end of run), for which a minimum day is paid. Enter five hours in column 4, seven hours and thirty minutes in column 5, 100 miles in column 15, and 50 miles in column 16.

(f) A passenger conductor makes a short turn-around run which is paid for under the 8-within 10-hour rule, making a total of 140 miles, and was actually on duty from 6:00 A. M. to 3:00 P. M., again going on duty at 5:00 P. M. and worked continuously until 6:00 P. M., when he was finally released. Enter eight hours in column 4, eight hours in column 5, and three hours in column 6. 140 miles should be entered in column 15, and 10 miles in column 16.

(g) A passenger engineer makes a short turn-around run which is paid for under the 8-within 10-hour rule, making a total of 80 miles, and was actually on duty from 6:00 A. M. to 1:00 P. M., again going on duty at 5:00 P. M. and working continuously until 7:00 P. M., when he was finally released. Enter seven hours in column 4, eight hours in column 5, three hours in column 6, 80 miles in column 15 and 20 miles in column 16.

(h) A freight conductor goes on "Held away from home terminal" time at 6:00 A. M., is called and reports for duty at 8:00 A. M., runs 80 miles and is released at 4:30 P. M.; rule of schedule provides that overtime of 30 minutes shall be counted as one hour, less than 30 minutes not counted. Enter eight hours in column 4, one hour in column 6, two hours in column 7, 80 miles in column 15 and 20 miles in column 16.

(i) A freight engineer is called and upon reporting at the enginehouse is notified that he is not wanted. Rule of schedule provides an allowance of three hours when called and not used. Enter three hours in column 7. Should schedule provide for allowance of 50 miles, enter four hours in column 7, which is the equivalent of 50 miles on speed basis of $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles per hour.

(j) A freight conductor deadheaded 100 miles, consuming three hours, on a passenger train for which, under the deadhead rule of schedule, he was paid 50 miles at freight rate, 50 miles being the equivalent of four hours at the freight speed basis of 12½ miles per hour. Enter four hours in column 7. No entry to be made in the mileage columns 15 and 16.

(k) A freight engineer deadheads from a terminal to an intermediate point on a passenger train, a distance of 50 miles, in two hours, and immediately goes in freight service and runs 50 miles in five hours to another terminal, or to the terminal from which the deadhead service was commenced. The schedule rule provides that deadhead trips made in connection with actual service trips be paid for as a part thereof. The man was paid 100 miles for the entire service. Enter five hours in column 4, four hours in column 7, this being the equivalent of 50 miles at freight speed basis of $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles per hour, 50 miles in column 15 and nothing in column 16.

(1) For allowances in connection with "run arounds," "attending court," "suspensions," "investigations," and 'Claim and Safety meetings," where the remuneration is based upon time actually lost, the time lost should be converted into its equivalent in hours and entered in column 7. Where the remuneration is based upon a flat rate per day the hours constituting the minimum day of the employee when in regular train service should be considered the hours paid for per day and the total number of days allowed should be multiplied by the number of hours and the product entered in column 7.

(m) A freight fireman reported for duty at "A" at 6:30 A. M., switched until 8:00 A. M., for which two hours was paid, and ran to "B," an intermediate point 25 miles from "A," arriving at "B" at 10:00 A. M., where he consumed 25 minutes coaling engine and 15 minutes turning engine, after which he was released at 10:40 A. M. Left "B" at 3:00 P. M., on return trip to "A," arriving at main track switch connection at "A" at 5:40 P. M. Delayed getting in yard and released at "A" at 6:20 P. M. Schedule provides that overtime limit be extended by switching at initial terminal, that one hour be paid for coaling engine and one hour for turning engine with deduction of actual time consumed in such work in the computation of overtime and also provides that final terminal delay should be paid after delay of 30 minutes from time train reached main track switch connection; the . road overtime ending at that point. This man was paid two hours for switching at "A;" 100 miles for the round trip, "A" to "B" and return; 1 hour for coaling engine, 1 hour for turning engine, 1 hour road over-• time and 1 hour final terminal delay. Enter in column 4 three hours and forty minutes; in column 6 one hour; in column 7 five hours; in column 15 fifty miles, and in column 16 fifty miles.

(n) A yard conductor reports for duty at 8:00 A. M., and is released at 2:00 P. M. He was paid for eight hours. Enter six hours in column 4 and eight hours in column 5.

(o) A yard engineer reports for duty at 8:00 A. M., switches in the yard until 12:00 noon; goes out on the main line to assist train over a hill; returns to yard and resumes switching service at 2:00 P.M., switching until 4:00 P. M., when finally released for the day. Schedule provides that work performed outside of yard limits shall be paid for in addition to yard pay, with no deduction therefrom for time consumed in such work outside of yard limits. This man was paid eight hours for service performed in yard work and two hours for work performed outside of yard limits. Enter in column 4 six hours; in column 5 eight hours, and in column 7 two hours. Nothing should be entered in columns 15 and 16.

(p) A through freight engineer makes a run of 100 miles, for which he is paid 135 miles because of mountainous country. One hundred miles should be reported in column 15 and 35 miles in column 16. Month of......192..

The above classes include positions in which the preponderant duties of incumbents, which may involve supervision of assistants, draftsmen. rodmen, chainmen or others, and which require training and ability in an engineering profession, are to execute definite instructions in minor engineering work in field or office, involving the use of surveying and drafting instruments and including such work as preparation of preliminary details and designs from sketches, the computation and compilation of engineering data, the inspection of details of construction of engineering projects, the making of routine tests of materials, devices, equipment and processes; and the making of surveys, or to have charge of a small drafting squad or of a field survey party assigned to specific engineering work; and to perform related work.

Illustrative Examples of Positions and Duties:

Engineering Computer:

Under supervision, compiling estimates and quantities on an engineering work, compiling inventory and unit prices.

Engineering Draftsman:

Doing structural, electrical, or mechanical drafting work, under supervision; making preliminary designs for structures; drafting in connection with the designing and detailing of plans.

Instrumentman:

In charge of small survey party, with such office duties as plotting of notes, assisting in the preparation of field plans and simple drafting.

Junior Engineer (Civil):

Inspecting division construction, taking charge of field party on surveys, preparing plans and estimates; making inspections and reports on 'designated engineering work, and directing field party on surveys, construction or repair work.

Junior Engineer (Electrical):

Under supervision, making preliminary electrical equipment designs; estimating and calculating in connection with designs of same, assisting in writing specifications for equipment.

Junior Engineer (Mechanical):

Under supervision, conducting tests and investigations of materials and apparatus for use on locomotives, cars, or maintenance-of-way, in shops and other railroad plants, compiling cost data in connection with valuation work, making preliminary engineering estimates, assisting in preliminary design and detail of locomotives, cars and other mechanical equipment; checking engineering calculations.

Leading Draftsman:

Directing drafting and designing work of office squad.

Description of Classes:

The above classes include positions in which the preponderant duties of incumbents are, under specific direction, to assume responsibility for the conduct of engineering work in a minor sub-division of a department or an engineering project; to take immediate charge of important field surveys; to lay out and develop work from specifications or to supervise the work of a drafting, designing or computing force; or to make engineering inspections, estimates and reports on railroad constructions, maintenance and repair work, or on the valuation of same; to investigate, collect and compile data for specific items of engineering problems; and to perform independently other important engineering work.

Illustrative Examples of Positions and Duties:

Assistant Engineer (Accountant):

- Making examinations into distribution of costs on engineering projects, making important engineering accounting investigations and reports.
- Supervision of checking of contract vouchers, charge of engineering accounts and special investigations and reports on same.

Assistant Engineer (Civil):

- Inspecting steel bridges for Bridge and Building Engineer and taking charge of assigned bridge construction work.
- Preparing detailed estimates, bills of material and specifications, and making inspections and reports on construction projects.
- Immediate supervision of construction of bridges, buildings or other construction work, seeing that material is received as per contract and that work is done according to plans and specifications.

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Assistant Engineer (Electrical):

Assistant in charge of electrical sub-division, charge of electrical construction and maintenance work, illumination tests, etc.; testing of motors, wiring and other electrical apparatus on road regardless of location or kind.

Detail engineering, drafting and other work, such as drawing up of estimates, etc.; assigned to general and special electrical engineering work, such as testing electrical equipment and inspecting and reporting on the condition of same.

Assistant Engineer (Signal):

Supervising preparation of plans for mechanical, electromechanical, electro-pneumatic, and electric interlocking plants, alternating and direct current, automatic block signaling, highway crossing protection.

Assistant Engineer (Mechanical):

- Under direction, writing specifications and preparing plans and designs of locomotives, cars and other mechanical equipment.
- In charge of dynamometer car, making indicator and tests of locomotives, also making tests of stationary boilers and engines and special mechanical tests.

Assistant Engineer (Valuation):

- Compiling Federal and State valuations and making valuations of facilities as basis of operating contracts; supervising work . of assistants.
- Making field investigations, estimating value of real estate, preparing appraisal maps.

Chief Draftsman:

- General supervision over preparation of maps, plans, designs and maintenance of way construction work, keeping record of physical changes in property of the railroad.
- Supervision of checking in connection with estimates and preparation of designs and specifications for all classes of equipment.

Designer and Detailer:

Designer and Draftsman, designing and direction of detailing of large and difficult work, including steel, concrete and timber bridges and structures.

Division Engineer (Not M. of W.):

In responsible charge of division improvement and construction work, reporting to Division Engineer or Special Assistant Engineer, supervising preparation of plans and estimates and determination of quantities in construction work on which payments are made to contractors.

Note: See note which follows the definition of Engineer Group for the classification of engineering positions in the higher grades and on the classification of sub-professional engineering positions.

LAWYER GROUP
