It has become tradition for the Scrimshaw staff to select a student from the graduating class and feature their dedication to the university in a student profile in the yearbook. This year's student of the year is Jarrad Plante. Jarrad, the president of the Golden Key Honour Society has been a Resident Assistant, and has organized many programs across campus including the annual Residence Hall Softball season. He traveled to Alabama on his spring break to participate in the Habitat for Humanity program. He is a graduate of the class of 2004, Magna Cum Laude. Jarrad attended UMass rallies at the State House in Boston in 2002 and 2003, and was photographed in both the 2002 and 2003 Scrimshaw for doing so.



How did you first become involved on campus?

My first year here I took part in the freshman leadership symposium. That opened many doors of opportunity for me. I got to meet a lot of great people who would help me out for the next three years that I was here. [Director of Student Activities] Jamie Jacquart was one of the people who organized the symposium and he would be resource to me later in my UMD career.

Where did you go from there?

I met Samma Gamel, an English teacher who recommended me to work in the Writ-

Housing Crunch

With the opening of two new residence halls in 2003, UMass Dartmouth increased its resident capacity by more than 800 beds. Students who had endured the frustrations of overcrowded dorms in the past were relieved with the opening of Pine Dale and Oak Glen Halls in the hope that they would mark the end of scarce on-campus housing. It only got worse. In one of the biggest mistakes in the history of this university, the residence areas of campus were overbooked by more than 400 students. The office of admissions never communicated with the office of housing to determine the correct number of students to offer on-campus living and as a result the office of housing was given too many students and nowhere to place them. The only solution to this delicate problem was to place 180 residents at the Days Inn in New Bedford and force the remaining overbookees as third roommates into existing double rooms. In a year where the housing crunch was to finally be resolved, the original four residence halls were all booked to record capacity with 112 more students waiting to move into them. Students, parents and housing staff were all put under extreme pressure. The residential areas became a boiling pot for the first several months of the 2003-2004 academic year. There were too many people crammed into too small of an area. With the increase of residents, the older, worn-out buildings had a higher demand for maintenance, which the office of housing could not meet. Many students opted to leave the university as the living conditions were simply unacceptable. Just as quickly as students withdrew from the halls, new residents would move into their places from the Days Inn, leaving literally no room for relief. It would take an entire semester before all the students housed at the hotel in New Bedford would find homes on campus. After a semester of hotel life they felt exhausted. The office of housing was left with many unhappy customers, an extreme hotel bill and a further bedraggled reputation.

"There are just too many people on campus," says freshman John Tucker, "I'm late for class all the time because I can't find a place to park." This is an all too familiar frustration for many UMass Dartmouth commuter students. On-campus parking has been an increasing problem at UMass Dartmouth for the past five years. In 2004 the winter contributed to the problem as snowbanks occupied a large percentage of parking spots for most of the months of February and March. The UMD police were quick to ticket those who parked where the only available space could be found. The problem of overcrowding on campus is now finding its way into the classrooms.

For the past five years UMass Dartmouth's student population has increased by 5% yearly. The University is making several attempts to increase parking and classroom space on campus, but for the 2003-2004 academic year, students just had to learn to cope.

"Many times in my Jazz Appreciation class there aren't enough desks for all the students. We have to take them from other classrooms, then they do the same thing to ours. It's just not fair to us. We're paying for this." One College of Visual and Performing Arts student commented. In fact, classroom space is a campus wide problem. The main campus was built in 1962, designed by Paul Rudolph. His vision expressed a desire for small classrooms and intimate teaching environments between students and professors. In the 1960's the average class size at Southeastern Massachusetts University was under 30. Now, up to 60 people are being forced into the same rooms. These buildings were not designed to handle the volume of students that they see on a day to day basis. The last major classroom additions came in the 1980's with the addition of the Visual and Performing Arts building, also known as Group VI, and then none since the Dion Science and Engineering building was built later in the 1980's. The two buildings fall victim to the most overcrowded classrooms as there are no restrictions on the number of students that can fit in a room, opposed to Group II where the desks are permanent fixtures in the classroom.

In 2003 the university made the decision to build a new facility for the Charlton College of Business. Construction began in early 2004. The majority of space in this new facility is dedicated to administrative offices and conference space, including a new office for the Chancellor. There will also be classroom space to relieve some of the overcrowded classes which are offered in the Charlton College of Business.

UMass administration is interested in increasing classroom space in accordance with the vision to increase the student population in the future, but there are no plans to continue expansion beyond the new business building for 2005.

The Red Sox Riots

On the night of October 6, 2003, the Boston Red Sox defeated the Oakland Athletics in one of the most exciting playoff series in Major League Baseball history. Minutes after Derek Lowe completed the game with a strikeout of Oakland's Terrence Long, thousands of UMass Dartmouth residents flooded the residential quad and surrounding areas to express their excitement over their team's triumphant victory. An estimated 2,000 residents gathered. After a half an hour of celebration the situation turned violent. Bonfires broke out, light posts were knocked down, and fireworks shot through the night sky. Furniture could be seen being thrown off the third floor balconies of Roberts and Chestnut Halls to be used to fuel the bonfires. Fire alarms sounded throughout every residence building, forcing the remainder of the resident students to the chaotic environment outside. After 45 minutes of chaos, police officers from New Bedford, Westport and Fall River arrived on campus in an attempt to control the mob. Within an hour, armed police officers equipped in riot gear released canines into the crowd. As the dogs dispersed the crowd, smaller groups gathered on the other side of the residence halls and began to vandalize cars and tip over trash dumpsters. One large group of rioters gathered in front of the entrance to Maple Ridge Hall, blocking its entrance. The police then used their dogs to break up the smaller groups, arresting anyone who did not cooperate. After four hours, the authorities finally took control of the situation. The residential quad was left in shambles as fire fighters put out the remaining flames. Trash littered the area all the way to Ring Road. By the end of the evening 42 students had been arrested for crimes of resisting arrest, disorderly conduct, and public displays of nudity.

After a year of increasing anticipation, the new Cressy Field was unveiled in the Fall of 2003. For an entire year the old Cressy Field was left abandoned. It had previously been deemed unsafe for athletic use on the collegiate level. Through the hard work and dedication of the athletic department, a new state of the art field was constructed during the 2003 academic year. The football, soccer and lacrosse teams played their home games at nearby Bishop Stang High School in New Bedford for 2003, awaiting for their new come field in 2004. The football team recorded a perfect regular season in 2003 without playing one down on campus. The homecoming was long awaited. The new field has a synthetic grass playing surface much like many modern professional arenas. It's the same material used on Tropicana Field in Tampa Bay, Florida which is the home of the Major League Baseball club Tampa Bay Devil Rays. Student athletes are thrilled to be able to compete on a brand new professional quality field. The 1.4 million dollar facility will be the home of the Corsair football and soccer teams in the fall, and lacrosse teams in the spring for many years to come.

There were no outbursts to be had on this night. Rioting was the last thing on any ones mind. Our team had won the World Football Championship for the second time in three years. The Patriots had succeeded where the Red Sox failed us. They had created a dynasty in the football world. They overcame all the odds and win 15 consecutive games, completing their season with an undefeated record in Foxboro.

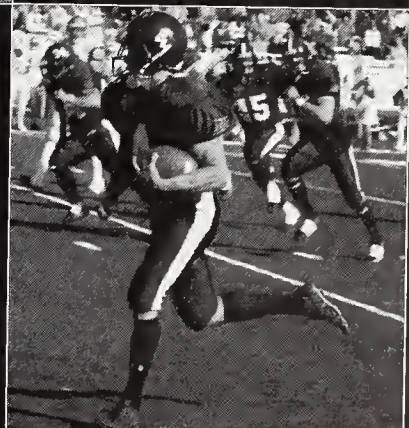

UMass Dartmouth defeats Worcester State, 21-7 in Northeast ECAC Championship Bowl Game

Shown Therioult rushed for 217 yards on 43 carries and a touchdown to lead UMass Dartmouth to a 21-7 victory over Worcester State College in the 2003 Northeast ECAC Championship game Saturday at Cressy Field.

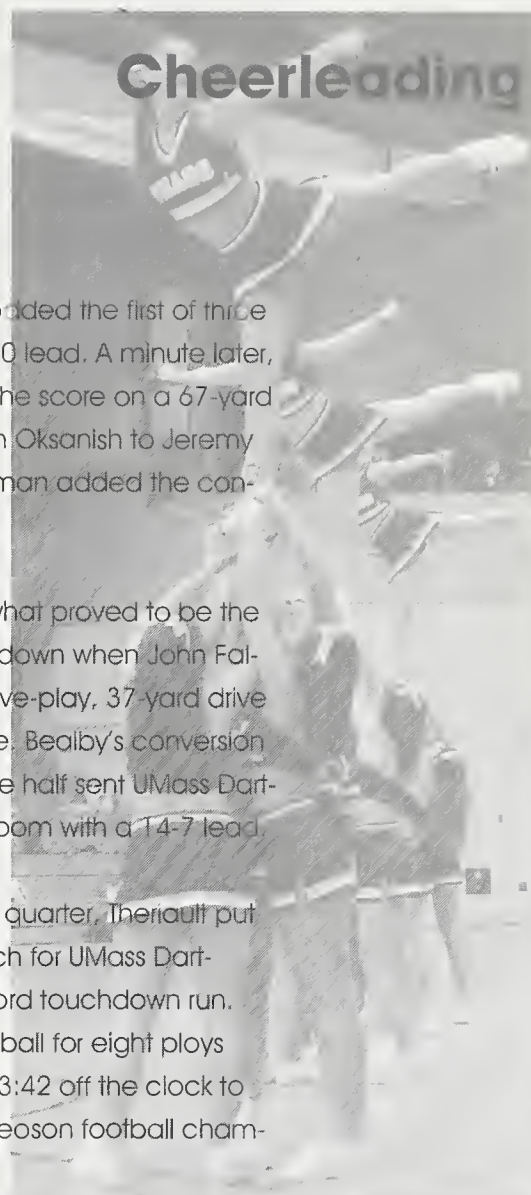
The career leading rusher of UMass Dartmouth, Therioult earned game Most Valuable Player honors after leading the Corsairs to their ninth victory of the season against two losses. Worcester State College finished with a record of 8-3.

UMass Dartmouth jumped out to a 7-0 lead when Derek Bealby intercepted a Ceon Oksonish pass and returned it 29 yards for a

touchdown. Bealby added the first of three conversions for the 7-0 lead. A minute later, Worcester State tied the score on a 67-yard touchdown pass from Oksanish to Jeremy Goucher. Tom Crossman added the conversion for a 7-7 tie.

The Corsairs scored what proved to be the game-winning touchdown when John Falcone capped off a five-play, 37-yard drive with a nine-yard score. Bealby's conversion with 1:44 to play in the half sent UMass Dartmouth to the locker room with a 14-7 lead.

After a scoreless third quarter, Therioult put the game out of reach for UMass Dartmouth with a three-yard touchdown run. The Corsairs held the ball for eight plays and 66 yards, taking 3:42 off the clock to clinch their first post-season football championship.

The Women's Swimming and Diving teams completed the 2003-2004 with an 11-4 dual meet record and a team high second place finish at the Division II/III New England Swimming and Diving Intercollegiate Championships. The meet saw eight school records fall, the most in any single meet. Senior Amy Stucchi led the way setting school records in three events. Stucchi finished first in the 200 YD Individual Medley (2:14.80) and the 200 YD Butterfly (2:12.06) and finished second in the 400 YD Individual Medley with a time of (4:45.55). Stucchi became the first female athlete to qualify and participate in the ECAC Open Swimming and Diving Championships held at the University of Pittsburgh where she broke the school record she had previously set with a time of 4:45. Stucchi then teamed up with sophomore Seanna McRae, freshman Cassie Bryant, and freshman Meaghan Coache to shatter the 400 YD Medley Relay school record with a time of 4:11.59. Freshman Cassie Bryant led the way in the Breaststroke events, setting two school records with times of 33.16 in the 50 YD Breaststroke and 1:11.55 for the 100 YD Breaststroke. Bryant also teamed up with McRae, Coache, and sophomore Caitlin Magura to become the New England Champions in the 200 YD Medley Relay with a school record time of 1:55:80. Sophomore Meaghan Coache set a new school record in the 100 YD

Butterfly with a time of 1:00.81. Seniors Tora Conley and Andrea Desjardins finished their four-year careers with lifetime bests in the distance events. Conley finished 6th in the 500 YD Freestyle (5:29.92), 5th in the 1000 YD Freestyle (11:28.63), and 4th in the 1650 YD Freestyle (19:01.02). While Desjardins placed 7th in the 500 YD Freestyle (5:36.06), 7th in the 1000 YD Freestyle (11:31.11), and 7th in the 1650 YD Freestyle (19:15.24).

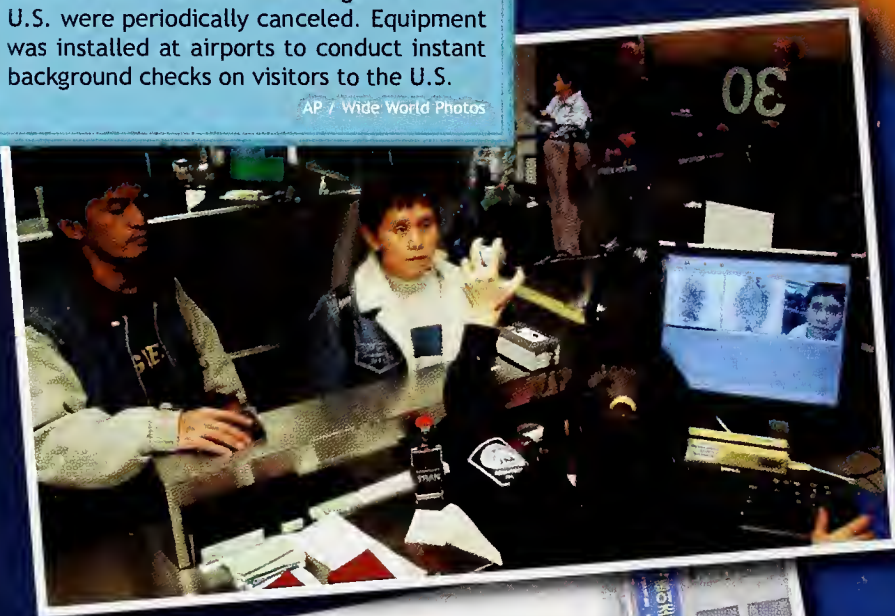

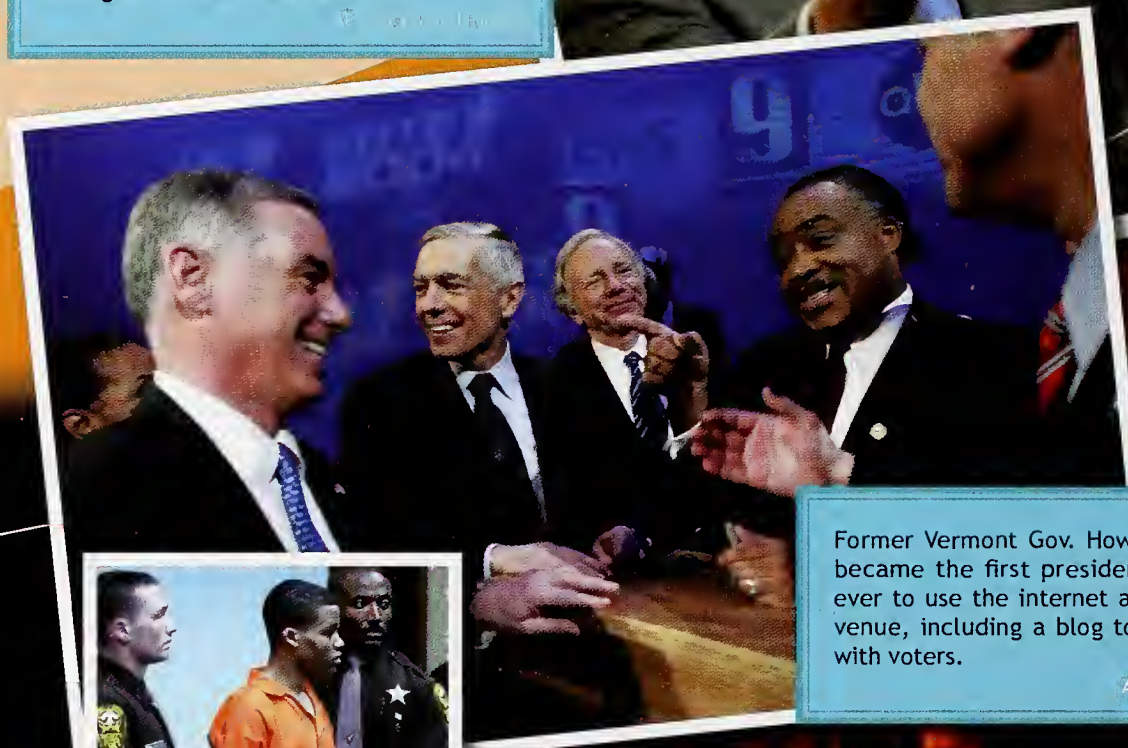

More than 20 people died, at least 1,100 people lost their homes and thousands were evacuated as California wildfires roared from the Simi Valley south to San Diego in the fall. Schools closed and airports were shut down.

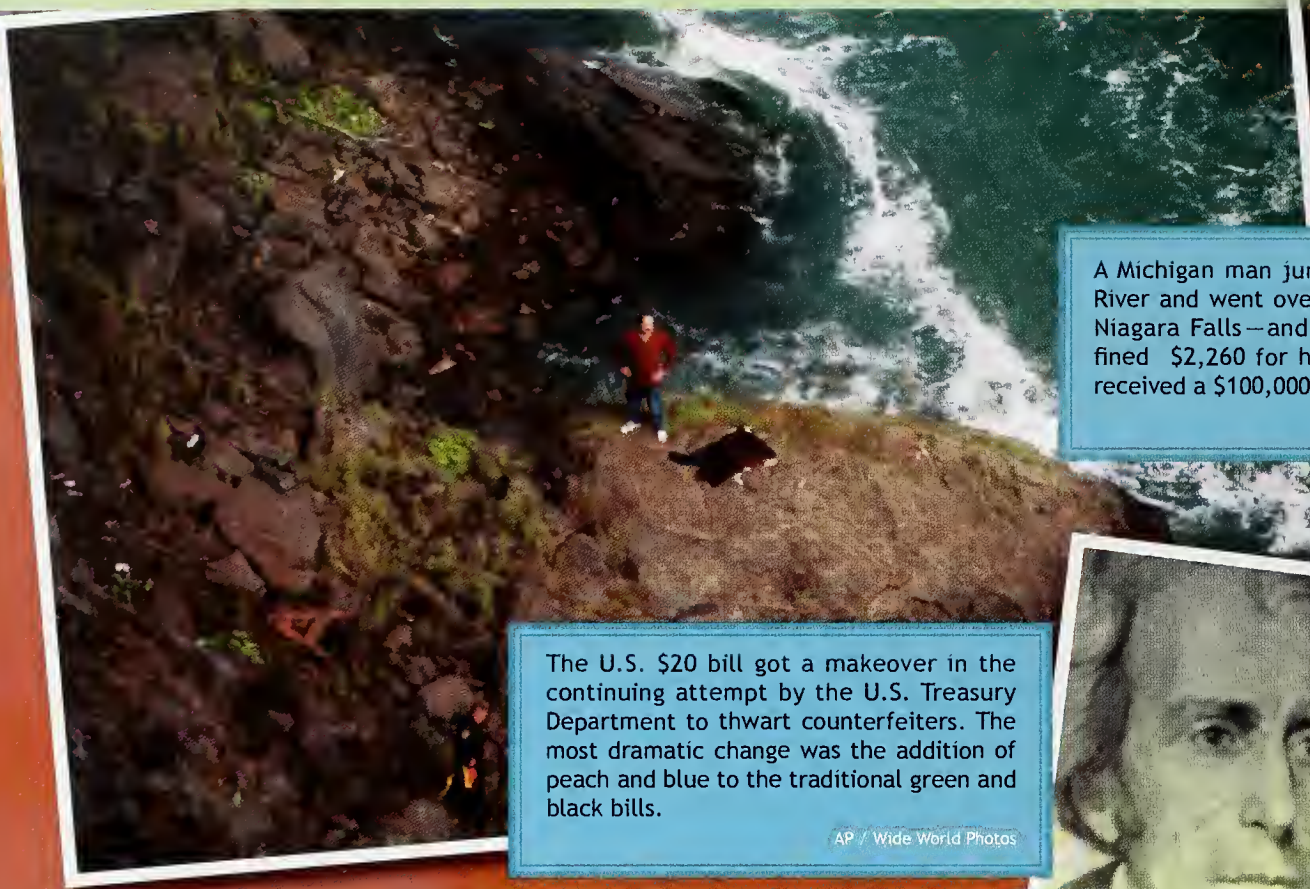
Signs of the Times

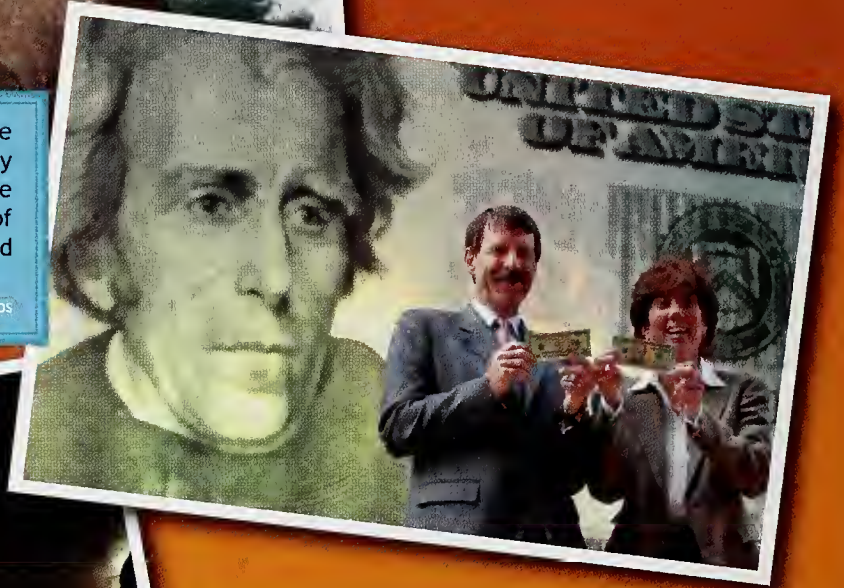

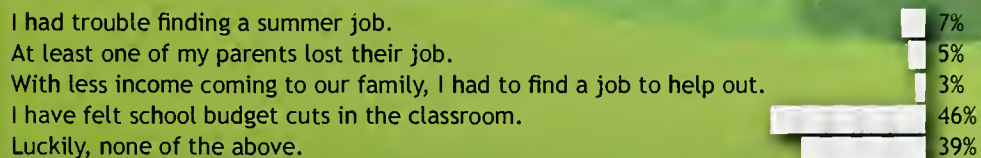

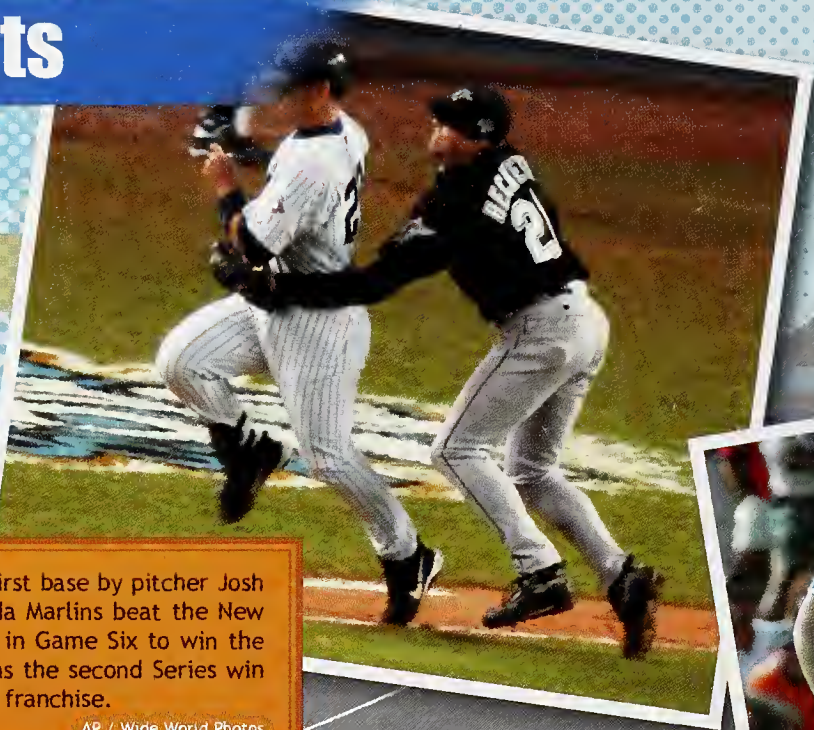


Has the weak U.S. economy affected you in one or more of the following ways?

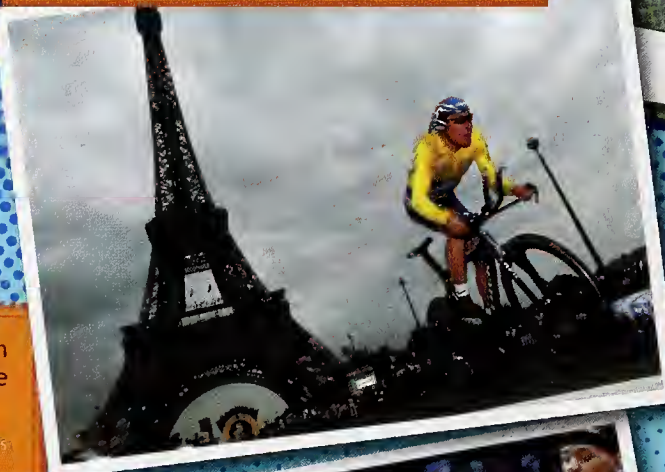

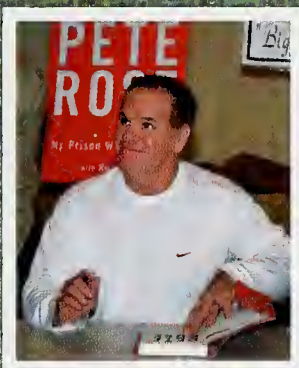

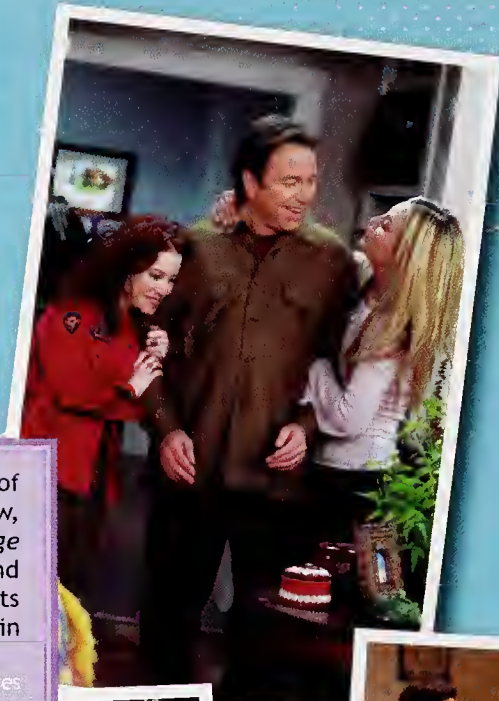

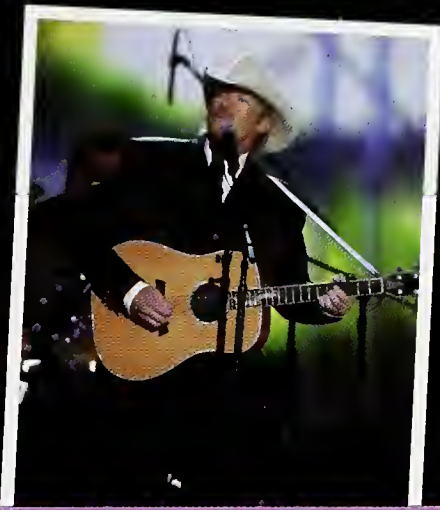
