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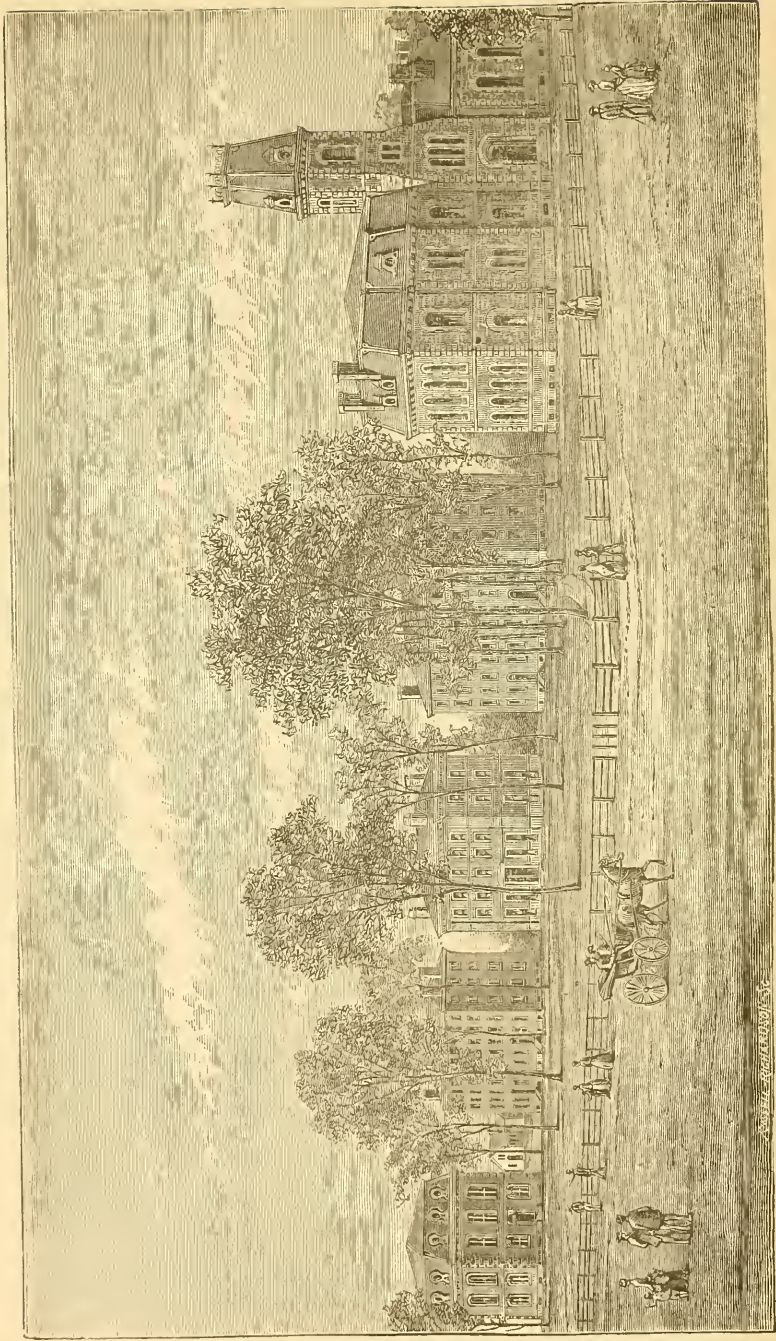

Name of the Institution changed to WATERVILLE COLLEGE by Act of Legislature, February 5, 1821.
