

Cushman's Brigade was organized at Ottwa, Ill., in the winter of 1861-'62-camping in the old Fair Grounds west of the city, and was composed of

Ten Companies of Infantry-the 53rd Ill, Vol. Capt. Wm. Fords Co. of Cavalry and Capt. Wm. Cogswell's Battery of Artillery.

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
Col. Daniel Fletcher Hitt Second Commander. Resigned January 2, 1863. Died, Ottawa, May 11, 1899. Cushman's Brigade lost its identity as an organization after we left Ottawa February 27, 1862—Cogswell's Battery being detached at Chicago—and Fords Cavalry at St. Louis. The Infantry, 53rd 111. Volunteers, remaining as the larger body.

But throughout the Civil War each of the original organizations took an intense interest in what the others did and in all the years since coming home we have held our annual reunions together as Cushman's Brigade.




Col. Seth C. Earl Third Commander. Killed in battle, leading his command, July 12, 1863, at Jackson, Miss.

It would be interesting to have a full history of all the commands composing the original Cushman's Brigade, but it is too large a task for the present. Suffice it to say that as true soldiers each arm of the organization

did its duty wherever it was placed by those in authority—and won for themselves honors of which every man may be proud. The 53rd is enrolled as one of the fighting 300 Regiments of the Civil War. Fords Cavalry was chosen as bodyguard to Gen. H. W. Halleck. Afterwards transferred to the 15th III. Cavalry, where it did splendid service. Cogswell's Battery answered all calls and never knew defeat.

It has been the aim and the desire of your officers to keep in touch with every Comrade of Cushman's Brigade, to keep alive the comradeship and to make stronger, if possible, the ties formed in the furnace of war Fifty years ago, and to have as many of you as possible come together each year to clasp hands, look into each other's eyes and to thank God for his goodness to us, the greatest of all Nations, the home of Freemen, we hope you have enjoyed as we have the love feasts year by year, and that you will come as long as you can get to them.

#### Narrative

Narrative-More than Fifty-four Years ago, some good Americans of the South, who thought that their rights were imperiled, made the great mistake of taking up arms and plunging our land into the Horrors of Civil War. Patriots everywhere sprang to the defense of our Flag, and for four terrible years, from the Ocean to the Father of Waters and beyond, through all the Southland and even into the Northland, fierce battle was raged, by day and by night the rich. red blood of our young men-even of our boys-moistened the hilltops, the mountain heights and the green valleys, while the damps and the dews of the swamps and the wildwood caught away their thousands as the slow years Mothers, wives, sisters and sweethearts toiled, suffered, and prayed passed. at home while their loved ones marched and fought and died, until Peace came. Then forgetting our differences, foe clasped hands with foe, enemies no longer, but AMERICANS all-we went back to civil life-one people, one land, one Flag-"THE STAR SPANGLED BANNER"-Emblem of Freedom the world over.

You of Cushman's Brigade were a part of that Grand Army. Where the fighting was fiercest, where the marches were longest, where the privations were severest, over the hills and down into the lowlends of the sunny, beautiful South, you were in the forefront, for thousands of weary miles you followed the banner of liberty until the day when Gen. Grant said: "Let us have Peace."

Today we meet to celebrate. THAT PEACE which for FIFTY YEARS has spread its wings above us and blessed us as no other nation has been blessed.

We may justly and modestly take pride in the fact that we in our young manhood had a part in making this the greatest, the freest, the best Nation this world has ever known.

The Fifty-third Regiment of Illinois volunteers was organized by Col. Cushman at Ottawa. Ill., in the winter of '61 and '62, and was mustered out at Louisville, Ky., July 22, 1865. From first to last it had five commanders, four of whose portraits we give you: unable to get a picture of the fifth Commander. We can only record that he. Col. Robt. H. McFadden, came to us with the consolidation of the gallant 41st Regt. Ill. Vol. He was mustered out July 22. 1865. Died Jan. 31. 1914.

Fords Cavalry was organized with the 53rd Regt., became escort to Mai.-Gen. Halleck-was transferred to 15th Ill. Cavalry, Co. L., later consolidated with the 10th Ill. Cavalry, and some of its members were not freed from service until Ian. 6, 1866, having seen almost five years of service. Capt. Ford was killed by his runaway team at Los Angeles. Calif., in 1887.

Cogwell's Battery, also organized with the 53rd Regt., and served throughout the war: its final discharge was at Springfield, Ill., August 14, 1865. Capt. Cogswell died at Ottawa Nov. 27, 1893.
