Cure, who afterw<sup>ds</sup> (about May 7 K. GEORGE CURE, of the Inner Temple, gent., Francis Braxton, of London, Painter Stayner, & Jane his wife, Compls.

Whereas one Mark Lenne, of London, Paynterstayner, late dec<sup>d</sup>, being a bachelor,<sup>1</sup> marr<sup>d</sup> the afores<sup>d</sup> Compl<sup>t</sup>. Jane Cure, with the proviso that he should make her a good jointure. About a year after the s<sup>d</sup> Marke Lenne falling sick was reminded of his promise, & did make his will, and devised a third of his estate to his s<sup>d</sup> wife Jane, a third to his daughter Dorothy Lenne, & to any child his wife might go with at his decease, & the remaining third to his brother Humphrey Lenne, whom he made Ex<sup>or</sup>. The s<sup>d</sup> Marke Lenne died in S<sup>t</sup> Bride's, London, about Nov. 1637, his estate amounting in value to about £1,500, the s<sup>d</sup> Humphrey proving the will, & promising to account to the s<sup>d</sup> Jane for her third.

About two years since the afores<sup>d</sup> Francis Braxton marr<sup>d</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Jane Lenne, widow, & applied for a settlement of the matter. The s<sup>d</sup> Humphrey lent them £100, promising to make an accompt to them of the said third part, but now refuses to do so, & says that the estate was worth very little, & testator was much in debt at time of his decease.

Answer of Humphrey Lynne, 22 May, 1641. That the s<sup>d</sup> Marke at his marriage was to receive £200, of which not more than £50 was paid, & he does not believe the s<sup>d</sup> Marke made any promise as to a jointure. That in Dec<sup>r</sup> 1637, he died at his house in S<sup>t</sup> Bride's, & by his will gave one third of his estate to the said Jane, one third to his dau. 
