Mic regitur Bournus dum bixit charus amic' Punc diun' socius exlicolumq' comes Mors pretiosa deo sanctoru' masta malorum Transitus ad bitam que sine morte manet Obiit 18 die Maii, An Omi, 1581.

1581. M<sup>d</sup> that M<sup>r</sup> William Bourne thelder lyinge chested was buried under his grave stonne lying in the midest of the upper ende of Bobingworth Channell against the middest of the high glasse windowe thereof the xxx day of May. A<sup>r</sup> 1581. (Register.)

In hope of a joyfull resyrrection lies interred the body of robert bovene esqu who maried katherine  $Y^{\rm E}$  daughter of henry medeley esqu whom he had issue 5 sones & 6 dayghters; who after he had attained to  $Y^{\rm E}$  age of 78 yeares w^{\rm 11} alacritie of spirit syrrendred his soule into  $Y^{\rm E}$  hands of his redeemer the 10  $^{\rm TH}$  of May 1639.

CURE v. LENNE. BILL AND ANSWER. 17 MAY, 1641.

GEORGE CURE, of the Inner Temple, gent., Francis Braxton, of London, Painter Stayner, & Jane his wife, Complts.

Whereas one Mark Lenne, of London, Paynterstayner, late dee<sup>4</sup>, being a bachelor, 'mart<sup>4</sup> the afores<sup>4</sup> Complt. Jane Cure, with the proviso that he should make her a good jointure. About a year after the s<sup>4</sup> Marke Lenne falling sick was reminded of his promise, & did make his will, and devised a third of his estate to his s<sup>4</sup> wife Jane, a third to his daughter Dorothy Lenne, & to any child his wife might go with at his decease, & the remaining third to his brother Humphrey Lenne, whom he made Exör. The s<sup>4</sup> Marke Lenne died in S' Bride's, London, about Nov. 1637, his estate amounting in value to about £1,500, the s<sup>4</sup> Humphrey proving the will, & promising to account to the s<sup>4</sup> Jane for her third.

About two years since the afores Francis Braxton marr<sup>4</sup> the s<sup>4</sup> Jane Lenne, widow, & applied for a settlement of the matter.
