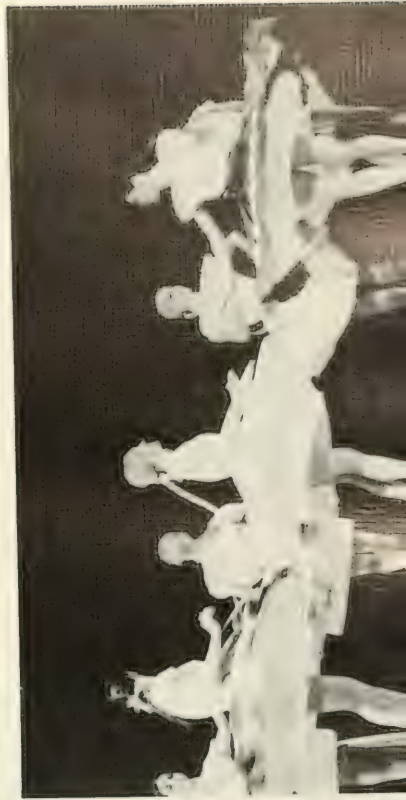
Hanneford Circus

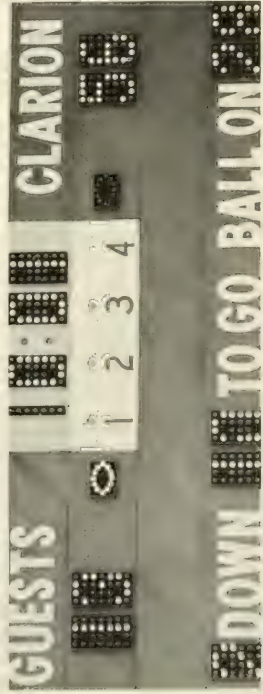
Football '73

Losses to the two conference finalists coupled with a pair of narrow defeats spelled a 5-4 season for the CSC Golden Eagles.

Although some may think that by being 5-4, Clarion must have been a mediocre team, they were by means just that:

To begin with, there was tight end, Ton West, who led the Pa. Conference in receiving with 40 catches, for 523 yards. Then, there as Harford Junior College transfer, John Harlacher, at quarterback. The junior signal caller hit on 82 out of 164 passes, for 1125 yards and 10 touchdowns.

To give Clarion a well-rounded team, we had offensive players Jim Fulton, who led all runners with a 760 yard season, and Steve Nolan with 559 yards. Scott Peters ran for 527 yards. Dan Jefferies and Dan Rhodanz paced the defensive team line.





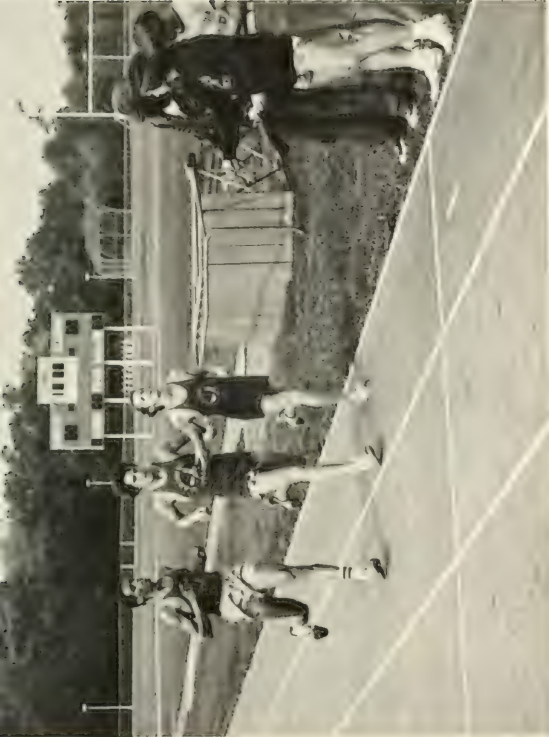

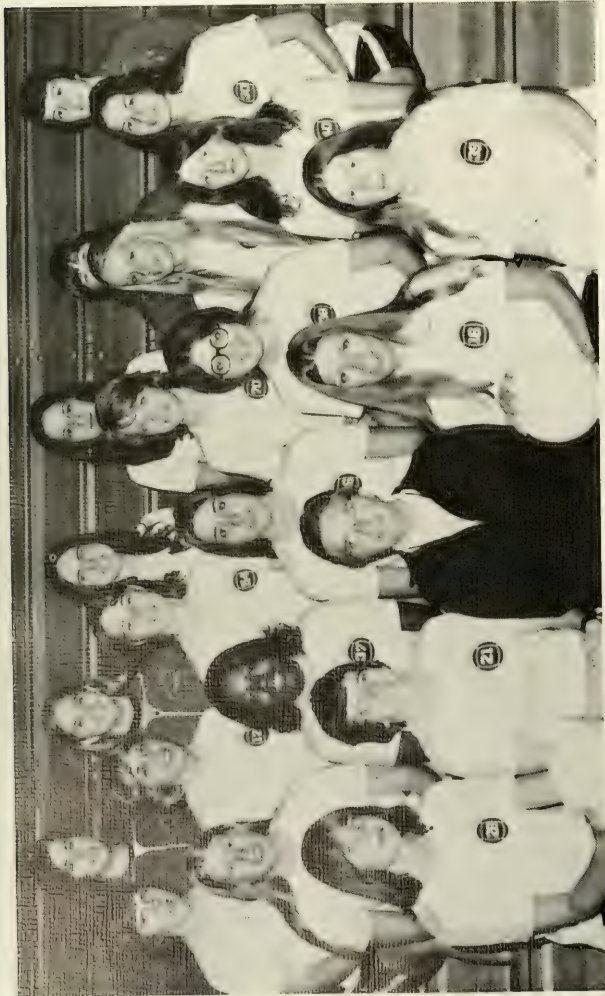
The '73 edition of the CSC Cross Country Team checked in with the finest showing ever by a Clarion State harrier team. On the season, the Englishman posted a 6-3 record. To go with this, the Eagle runner placed second in the District 18 meet and sixth in the Conference run.

Both of these finishes were higher places than any other Cross Country team in Clarion's history had ever taken.

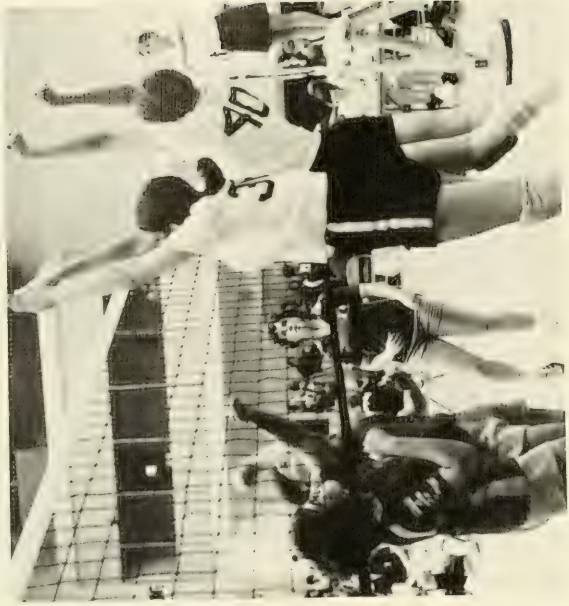

Martin turned in his best showing of the season as he took second in the prestigious District meet by posting a time of 25:08. Brown placed fifth in the districts while Burk came in tenth. 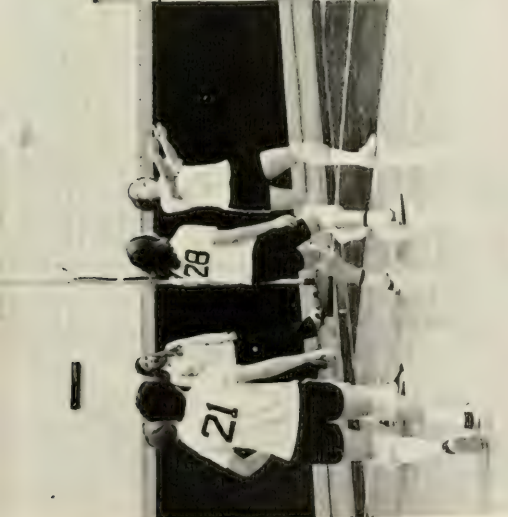
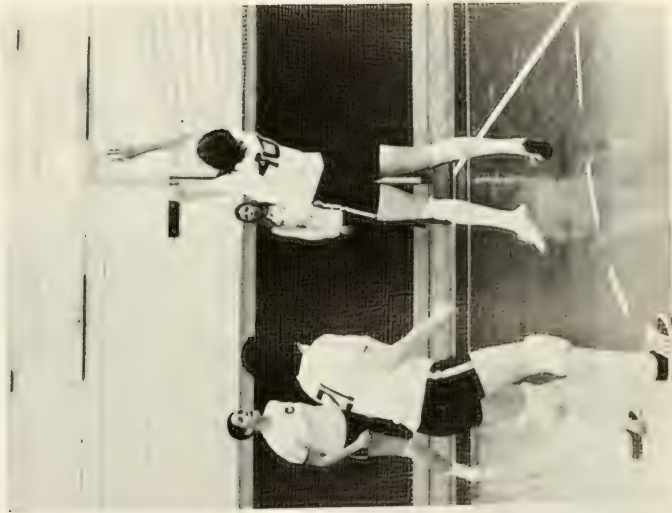
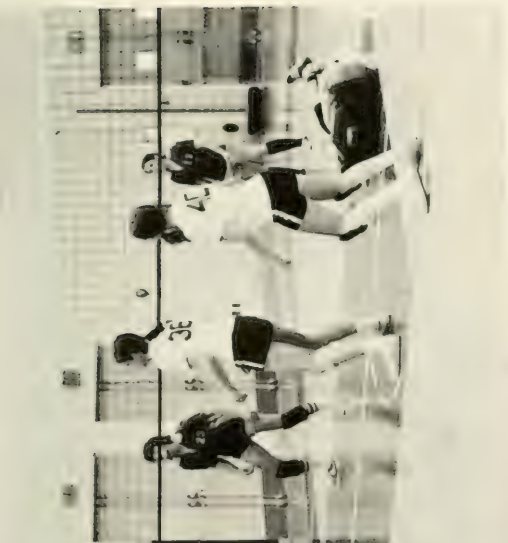
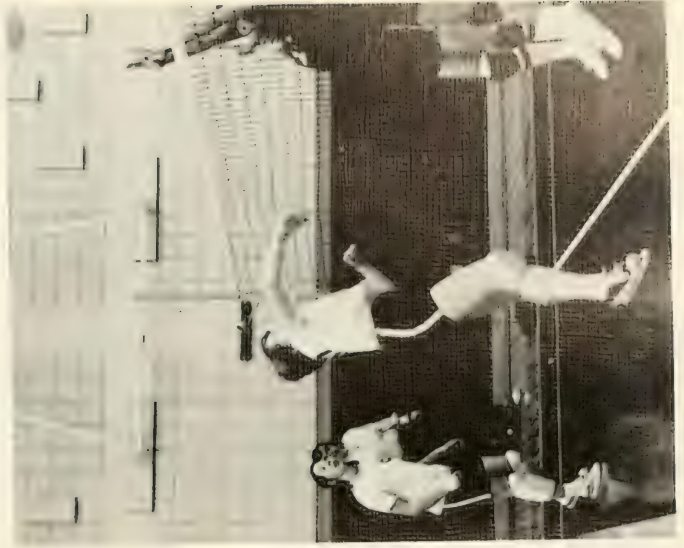


The Clarion State Womens Intercollegiate Athletic Association got the '73-'74 season off to a fine start as the Women's Volleyball team posted an outstanding 15-1 record.

By winning this season, the women spikers now have had winning seasons in all of their six year history. As a matter of fact, the gals, coached by Fran Shope, now have an overall mark of 39-15; winning percentage of 72.2%!

Before CSC took on Indiana, they were almost bumped off by the Slippery Rock gals. Their chalked up victory was a close 15-12 and 18-16.

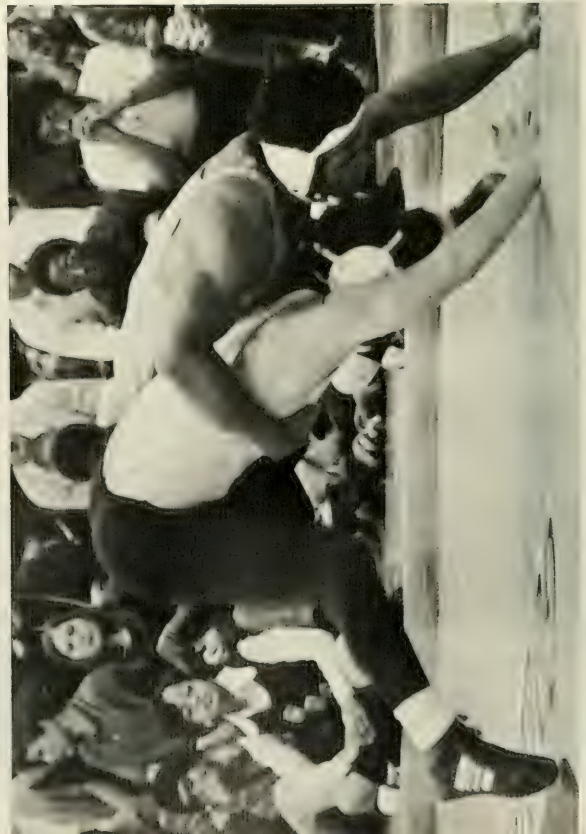

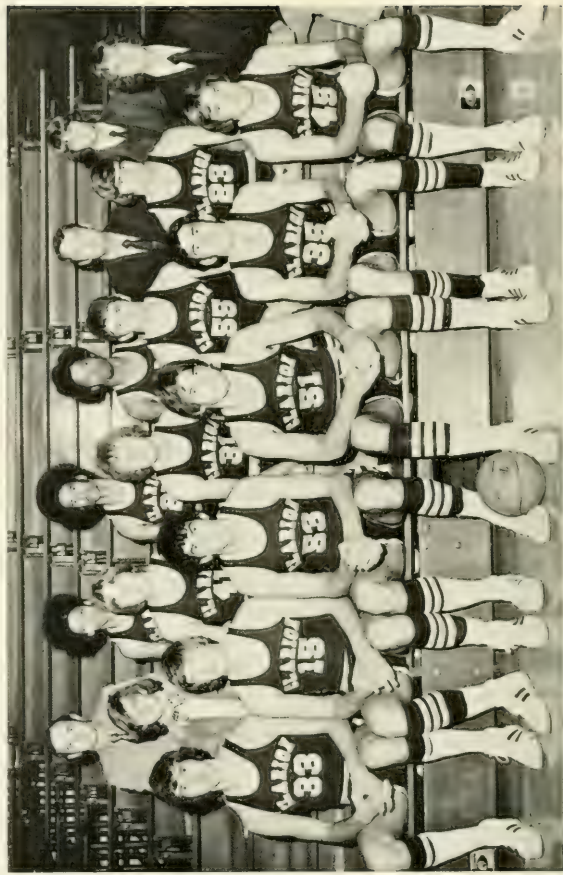
Basketball 1973-74

With the loss of three starters due to graduation, and with only three lettermen returning, the pre-season outlook for CSC basketball was bleak.

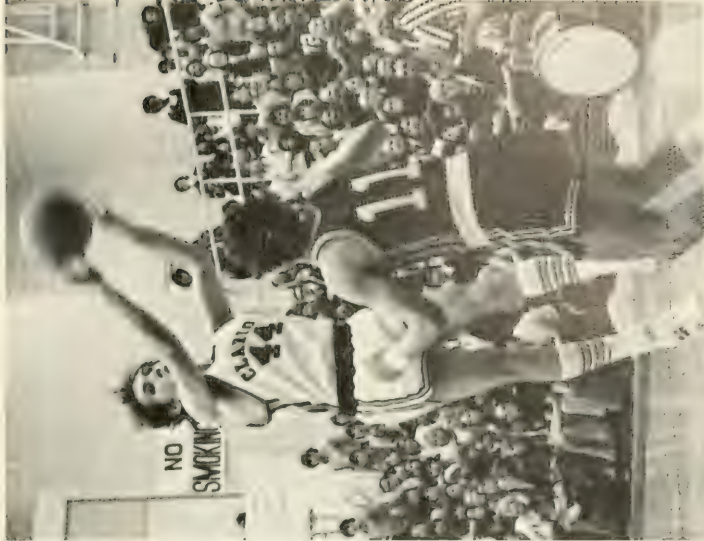
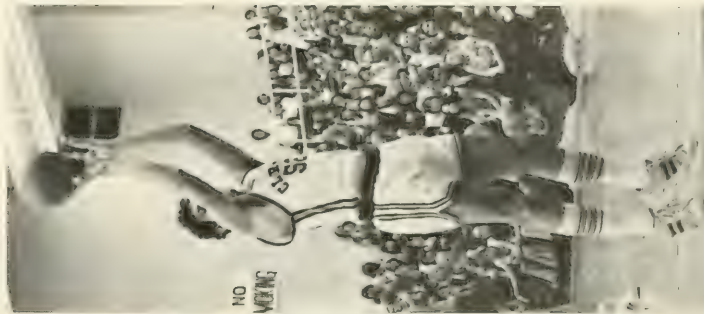

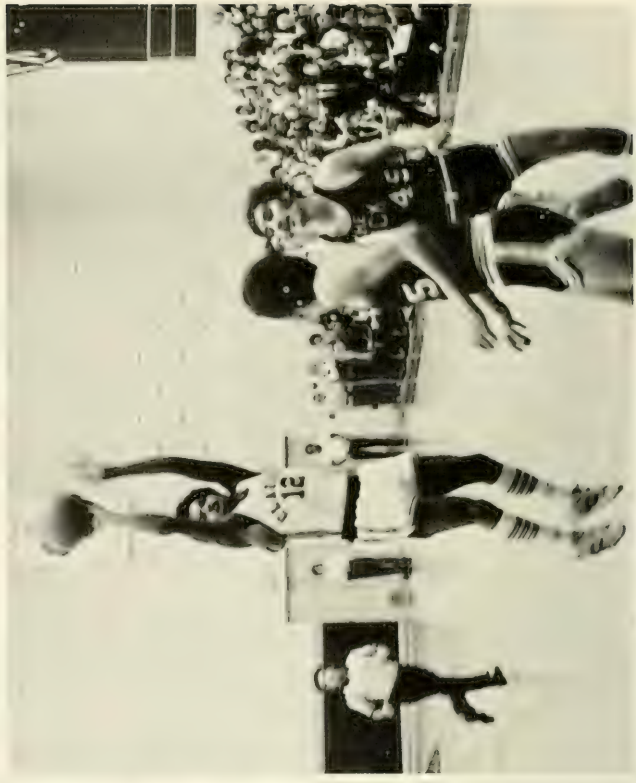

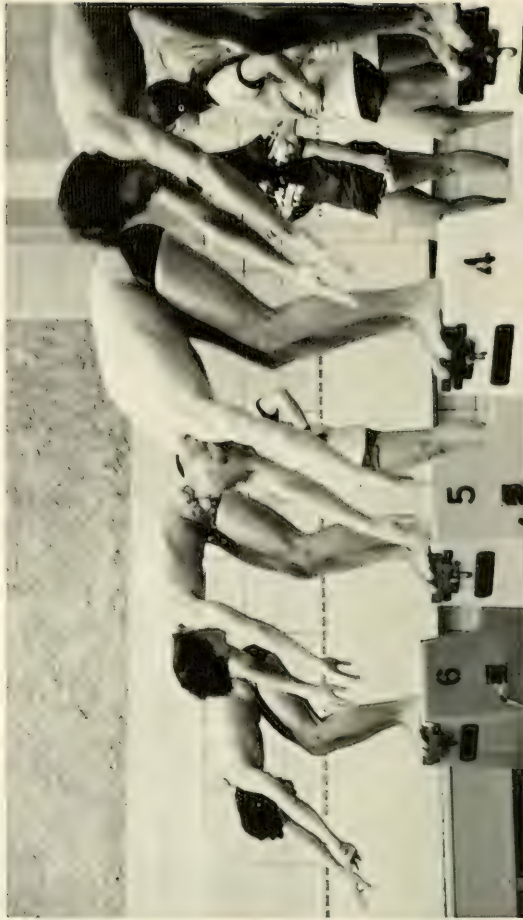


Mens Swimming
