



The 1966 football season was one of many ups and few downs. West Chester finished the season with a 7-3 record. Other highlights of the season were the Rams' winning the Eastern Division of the PSCAC and then losing the championship in the thrilling last 74 seconds of the game with Clarion; WCSC's being on television for the first time at the Tangerine Bowl; seven players from West Chester being picked for the Eastern States Athletic Conference All-East Weekly Teams; eleven men being chosen for the first All-League (PSCAC) teams and eleven more for the second teams; Brian Mulhern's election to the Little All-American Team; and West Chester's being ranked twelfth in the nation among small colleges in offense and fifth in defense. 



SYNCHRONIZED SWIMMING








"Egypt" is one of the many themes which acts as a base for routines.










