- Ruby Jones Hallwas buils in 1899 and served ats W'ess Chester Srate Normal Shool's model sehool for local children. Throughour the years the building has always obtained a "home-like atmosphere" which dlows it to rank as one of the student's lavorite buildings. It was named after the first Af-rican-American member who taughe at the university from $1961-1972$.


Francis Harvey Green Library was built in the 1960's. It contains thousands of volumes, microfilms and fiche, and plenty of tables and carrels for srudying and socializing. It also houses one of the coziest mecting places on campus in the Special Collections Room.

A part-time home to many of the students who attend this insritution, Sykes Student Union offers so many programs under it's roof. Most of the studene organizations offices are located here along with the fitness center, game room, the bookstore, rheater, and food court. Programs are always occurring in the meeting rooms and ballrooms which include speakers and concers.

## The Foundation



APhillips Memorial, erected in 1925, is where Green Gables, President Philip's home, once stood. The building was dedicated to Dt. George Morris Philips, who was the Principal of West Chester State Notmal School for 40 years. There are many legends surrounding this building. From the whispering arches to the ghost of Philips memorial this building is a popular attraction in W'est Chester.

4The Old Library was built in 1902 and was the University's first library until 1966. It now houses the Anthropology, Sociology, and Graduate Studies offices. It is also a popular place in the nice weathet to sit and read ot chat on the steps.

Living in the dorms would be step one, and hiving off-campus would be step three. Living in the apartments at South Campus is a moxture between living in the dorms and liveng off-campus.

Life in the apartments is similar to life in the dorms. The South Campus Apartment Assistant (A.A - not to be mistaken for Alcoholies Anony' mous) is simalar to the North Campus Resident Assistant (R.A.). A tomventence store located at the South Campus Apartment Complex also ineludes a computer lab, a front lesk, and everyone's mailboxes (as in the dorms). Dr. Campolo is the Founder and Peesident of the Evangelical Association for the Promotion of Education, an organization involved in educational, medical, and eooromic programs in Thard Worle countries and at-risk roung people in urban America. Dr. Campolo is often juoted by President Clinton for his work with the youth of he work. Tony Campolo recieved his undergraduate legree from Eastern College and Ph.D. degree from Temsle. He spoke on the topic, "Is Jesus a Republican or Democrat." on Wednesday, September ird.


A David Horowitz is the President of the Center for the Study of Popular Culture. Secking to "stimulate" the minds of his audience, Horowitz, f960s left wing radical turned conservaive speaker and author, spoke on Wednesday October 22nd on such controversial topies as racism, affirmative action and he black community. Horowitz, president of the Los Angeles rased Center for the Study of Popular Culture, co-cditor of the orok "The Race Card" and author of "The Radical Son", his rutubingraphy, voiced his rught wing views to an anxious rowd.

He believes that the key to treat societal problems is to treat these proble before the fact.

- Sharon Robinson, daughter of Jackie and Rachel Robinson, is Director of Educational Programming for Major League Baseball. Her discussion on Wednesclay, October 1st, centered on her new book, Stealing Home, which describes her life living with the legend who broke the color barrier in major seague baseball fifty years ago. Robinson described her famuly as a civil rights family, not as a baseball family, as most would probably assume. Robinson took many years to finish her book, and in the process realized the courage it took her tather to break the color barrier of not only baseball, but of the counery.


4 Elizabeth Holtzman is an attomey with the New York City firm of Herrick, Feinstein. Holtzman began her distinguished career in public service when she won a seat in the U.S. House of Representarives in 1972. This four term congresswoman served on the House Judiciary Committee and won national attention for her role in the Wratergate hearings about the Nixon pardon. She spoke about her book, "Whoo Said It W'ould Be Easy?: One Woman's Life in the Political Arena" on W'ednesday, October 29th. Her book concentrates on a life of commirment to issues and leadership on multiple positions of power and responsibility.

Philip Randolph Institute and Bayard Rustin successor as head of the historical organization, spoke together in tribute to the historical working relationship between Marton Luter King, Jr. and Bayard Rustm during the civil rights era. These two men spoke on the topic: Bayard Rustin and Aartin Luther King, Jr:: Collaborative Leadership Development in the Cival Rights Novement on Tuesday, January 20th.


4 Alexis Atoore is a member of the Editoral Board of the Philadelphia Inquirer. She joned the boasd as a writer and columnist upon her return to Washington, D.C. where she served as national correspondent. Noure visted WCU on February fth to discuss the memoir of Ruth W'right Hayre, the firse fulltime African American teacher in the Phatadelpthia puthic school system, the first African-American senior high school principal, and the first woman president of the Philadelphia Board of Education, her co-author of the book titled "Tell Them We Are Rising. " This is the story of the family and traditions that inspired that phenomenal gift, which took 116 boys and girls through six years of public school life on the wings of one woman's determination to make a difference in their lives.

- Dickie Noles is known for his pitching performance in game four of the 1980 World Series. But one pitch wa the game made him infamous. It was high and inside; its purpose was to brush back Kansas City's George Brett. Some chaim the puth was a turnong point in the series. It motivated the Philles to win their only W'orld Series tutle. Now some 17 years later, his new pitch is thrown to brush back young people from using drugs and akohol. Noles began dronking heavily as a teenager. A brilliant baseball career was shortened because of the devastating effects of his aleohol abuse. In 1990 his dedicates to educating thousands of children, teachers and parents on the dangers of substance abuse began. Dickie Noles presented a program on his life story and it's meaning to today's youth on Apral Gth.



Donna Red ${ }^{W}$ ing foned the Human Rights Commission as its national field director in 1996 to build the movement from the grassroots up. Red W'ing presented a speech entitled "Postards From the Front: An Overview of Gay and Leshian Activism Around the Country" on March 2th. - A severe fire erupted at diproximately 7 a m . on Sunday, August 10 , at 600 Walnut, a house rented by several West Chester Unversity. The fire was caused by a lygheweight electrical extension cord plugged into an air conditioner in the room of WeU student Tim Foster.
- Cable has finally come to the dorms. The system meludes all of the most popular channels offered on most standard cable systems. It also requires a cable box, supplied by Popvision, that comes with a remote control.
- Stone arch brings the past into the present. The ewenty foot stone structure symbolizes W' (U's heritage and is a testimony to the thousands of students who have passed through its doors over the past 125 years.

- The West Chester University steam distribution system is being renovated to improve service and conserve energy.
- W'est Chester University has an unusually high enrollment, with about 100 more students than last year.
- The West Chester commonity foned together to hold an auction to benefit Tom Hutchins and his fiancee Jennifer Mulavney.
- WWCU senior Kelly Rech is currently living her decam of being a professional dancer; she is in her second season as a dancer for the 76 'ers baskerball team.
- A crowd of nearly 10,000 people turned out to enjoy the offerings of local restaurants ated caterers, breweries and wineries at the 18 th amnual Chester County Restaurant Festival in downtown W'est Chester
- Two female students were assaulted in two separate incidents, one at an off-campus party and the other in Miner Alley.
- The Unversity changed its student purging policy, sending letters to 1.103 students informing them that they are no longer a student a West Chester University. This happened when students didn't pay their bills in time or have their financhal ard approved.
- IVCU was reviewed in the October issue of Philadelphia magazine, and the outcome of the review was not at all flattering. They related the GPA's of students to their blood alcohol level, classified students as apathetic and dressing in bascball caps and midriff-blaring tops.
- Approximately 10 W'est Chester Borough police officers, accompanied by two undercover agents from the Liquor Control Enforcement Board, stopped a keg party on 610 N. High Street. They handed the residents a search warrant, and cited some 60 under age drinkers for various alcohol-related charges, arresting four people.
- The Share-a-Bike program allows students, faculty and staff to ride a bike to their destination, and put at back in the bike rack for the next person. The bikes were donated to the school, bought at garage sales or were abandoned bikes that were left on the racks.
- Students celebrated "Natonal Coming Out Day" when two student arganzations - Lesban, Gay and Bisexual Services and the Safe Space Alliance informed the student body ،bout issues surrounding the gay community. "National Coming Out Day" is the day designated for lesbian, gay and bisexual people to reveal to their families, friends and co-workers their sexual orientation.
- Esteemed professor and educator Dr. Shirley Ann W'alters passed away from cancer.
- The lrving H. Cohen Memortal Recital was held in Swope Hall, sponsored by Sara H. Cohen. Paul Kirender, baritone; Rebecca Abram Kreider, soprano; and Richard Veleta, piano, were featured in the recital.
- Mark Lukanski lost all his belongings in a tragic fire at 529 S. Matlack.
- Sykes Student Union Building underwent repars again; construction crews replaced the square tablets of stone which line the outside walkways of Sykes.
- Cafe Chicane, a restaurant more likely to be found in downtown Philadelphia, arrived on High Street.
- Student Government Association President Peter Kulp was elected to a State Board position; he is vice-chairperson of the state's Board of Student Government Presidents.
- Despite the number of parties that have been busted by the $\mathbb{W}^{\prime}$ est Chester Police and the LCE, 25 E . Bernard Street held its third annual Oktoberfest with over 150 people in attendance.
- W'CU celebrated "Alcohol Awareness W'eek"; this year's purpose was not to preach against the act of consurnng alcohol, but instead to make students more aware of how their decisions affect lives.
- The Community Service student organization of W'est Chester University donated books to over OOO children in the Chester County Area on National Make a Difference Day.
- W'CUR, after 25 years of waiting, finally received an FM1 construction permit from theFCC authorizing permission to build, secure and operate an FM station for one year
- The 20th annual Brian's Run, the main race which consisted of 10 kilometers, took place. The day also offered a two-mile walk, a one mile open fun run, a two mile open fun run, and a one mile children's fun run.
