# Residence Halls 



Ramsey Hall

Ramsey latl, named alter former English professon Dorothy Ramsey, is one of three $Y$. shaped buildings on North Campus. Ramsey Hall sits on the corner of Shapless and New Street: next to the Lawrence Center. It is the oldest residence hall and has 6 lloors. This residence hall houses approximately 400 students and is a co-ed building. It has pool tables, study lounges vending machines and a kitchen for its residents to use. Ramsey Hall is also home to a study center for students which is located in the basement

Tyson Hall
Trson thall is the second of the $Y^{\prime}$-shaped buildings and is named after Elizabeth S . Tyson. Ms. Tyson was the pioneer of West Chester University's Speech Clinic. Tyson Hall houses about 450 male and female students living on co-ed floors and wings. There are three wings comnected by a common loblyy where students can study or hang out with their fricuds. This hall has scren floors and has ping pong tables, pool tables and air hockey tables in the first flow lobby.


## Goshen Hall

Goshen Hall, named after form Psychology Chair and public educatic spectialist Amme M. Goshen, is the thiard shaped building and houses around 45 male and female students. As another $C$ ed residence hall, Goshen is comprised single sex and co-ed wings. This resident hall also has a common lobby for th students it honses and has varion recteational activities such as pool tabl and ping pong tables in its first floor lobby


Sanderson Hall
foderson Hall is named after WCU alumni uristian C. Sanderson. He was an artist, writer, ;torian and a teacher. Sanderson Hall is a mine nor co-ed residence hall. This residence hall uses around 350 students in its single sexed d co-ed wings. Located in the Residential ad in front of Sanderson are lighted vollerball d basketball couts.

hmidt Hall is mamed after Gertrusle K. Schmidt was the ander of the music program here at WCU. Schmidt Hall a " ${ }^{\prime \prime}$ " shaped co-ed residence hall and houses about 400 idents. Schmidt is located on the comer of Rosedale and ew Strects across from the Calvery Luthern Church.
