

EDITORIAL NOTE.

The book of Shelley's poems, containing a number of autographic copies (with others in the script of Mrs. Shelley), and from which the accompanying facsimiles were made, has recently been given to Harvard College library by Mr. Edward A. Silsbee, who procured the memorial some years ago from a lady in Florence, who had been of Shelley's acquaintance. The book is a thin quarto, bound in parchment. The earlier leaves have been cut out. The following is a collation of what is remaining:—

Page 47. The Sensitive Plant, marked as "published." In Shelley's handwriting. Occasionally corrected in ink and lead pencil. Stanza marked 17 of third part erased. Ends on p. 60. "Pisa, March, 1820."

Page 61. A Vision of the Sea. "Published." In Mrs. Shelley's handwriting. Ends on p. 68. At end in Shelley's script, "Pisa, April, 1820."

Page 69. To Night. In Mrs. Shelley's hand. Ends on p. 70.

Page 71. An Anacreontic. In Shelley's hand. "Florence, January, 1820."

Pages 72-75, missing.

Page 76. An Exhortation. "Published." In Shelley's hand. Corrected. Ends on p. 77. "Pisa, April, 1820."

Page 78. Ode to Heaven. In Shelley's hand. Corrected. Ends on p. 80. "Florence, December, 1819."

Page 81. Song. In Mrs. Shelley's hand. Ends on p. 83. Dated by Shelley, "Pisa, May, 1820."

Page 84. A Dream. In Mrs. Shelley's hand. Ends on p. 86.

Page 87. Ode to Liberty. In Shelley's hand. Erased.

Pages 88, 89, missing.

Page 90. The Indian Serenade. In Shelley's

Page 91. Song. In Shelley's hand. Ends at top of p. 92.

Page 92. To William ——. In Shelley's hand. Ends at top of p. 93.

Pages 94-97, missing; 98, 99, blank.

Page 100. To a Skylark. In Shelley's hand. Ends on p. 105. Facsimile given herewith. It will be observed that the manuscript has some variations from the usual printed copies of the poem, as in the second stanza, "unbodied joy" for "embodied joy."

Pages 106-109, torn out, except a small part of each.

Page 109 (duplicate). Hymn to Mercury. Translated from the Greek of Homer. In Mrs. Shelley's hand. Ends on p. 145. Some of the pages not numbered.

Pape 145 (duplicate). To the Lord Chancellor. In Shelley's hand. Many corrections and erasures. Ends on p. 148.

Page 149. England. In Shelley's hand. Ends at top of p. 150.

Page 150. Song ("Good night"). In Shelley's hand.

Page 151. Sonnet ("Ye hasten to the dead!"). In a hand different from the others.

Page 152. Sonnet. To the Republic of Benevento. In Shelley's hand.

Page 153. Ballad ("Young Parson Richards"). In Mrs. Shelley's hand, with corrections by Shelley. Ends on p. 158.

Page 159. Contents, which end on the inside of the opposite cover.

This index shows the following poems on leaves which have disappeared from the book: "Maddalo and Julian, 1."; "The masque of anarchy, 30"; "To S.....th and C......gh, 38"; "E....d, 39"; "An ode, 40"; "Translation from Moschus, 42"; "A Fragment, 43"; "Lines written at Naples, 72"; "Sonnet, 75"; (The contents of pp. 88-90 are not given); "To —, a sonnet, 106"; "Men of England, a song"; "To —, 109"; page 145 is indexed "To L...d E...n."





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
