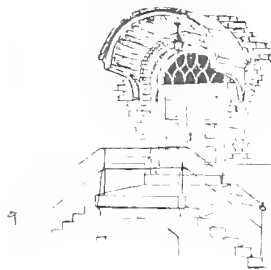
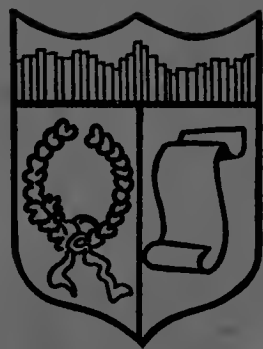

## *Dedication*

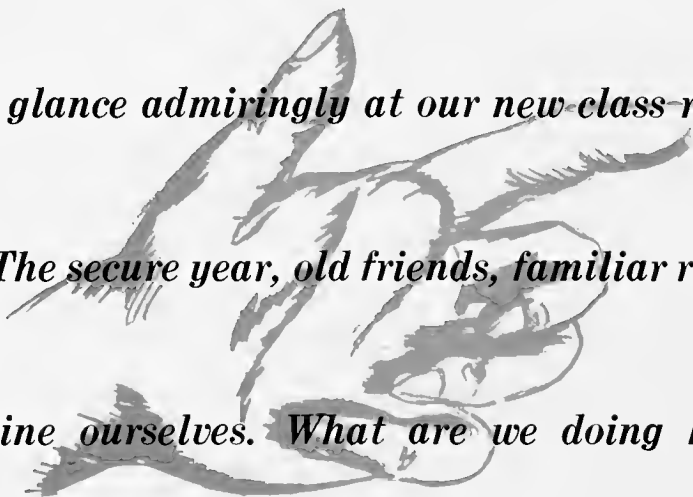

finds it continuing.

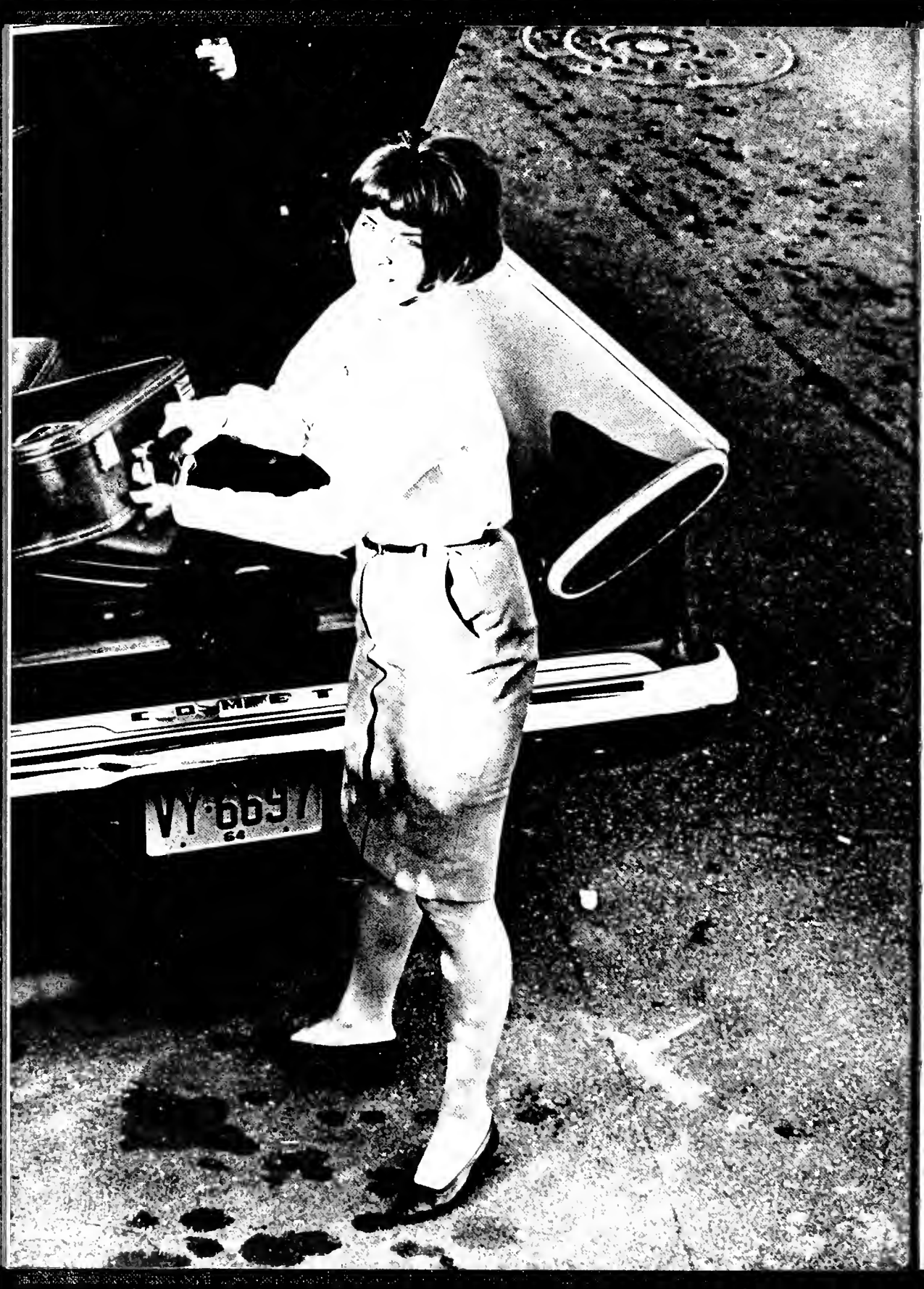
