what crease-resistant fun!





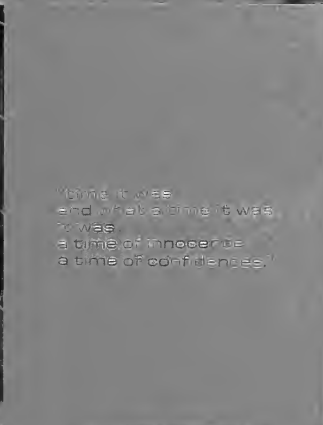
