I not be glad no more!"







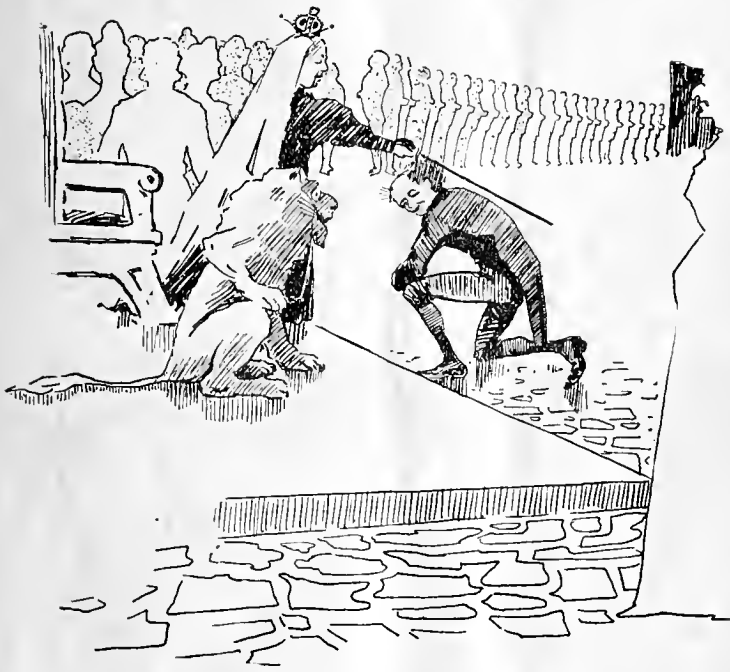
Den Wilfrid—not bad fellow, him—
