ART AND MUSIC

Courses offered in the teacher education program at Charlotte College may be taken for undergraduate credit and may also be applied toward a teaching certificate or certificate re-





fers work leading to the A.B. and B.S. degrees in mathematics, with a view to training future mathematicians for government and industry, and for further study in graduate schools. Persons are also trained to be teachers of mathematics at all levels.

In addition to the work offered for a major in mathematics, the department offers courses needed by students studying engineering, the sciences, business, and social sciences. Special courses have been added to the curriculum to serve the needs of such students. In particular, majors in economics and business administration, sociology, and psychology are now required to take six semester hours of probability and statistics, in addition to the six semester hours of mathematics required of all students.

In the six semester hours of mathematics required of all students for graduation, the department seeks to provide all of the students at Charlotte College with genuine mathematical experiences, without which no education can be complete in the present age.
