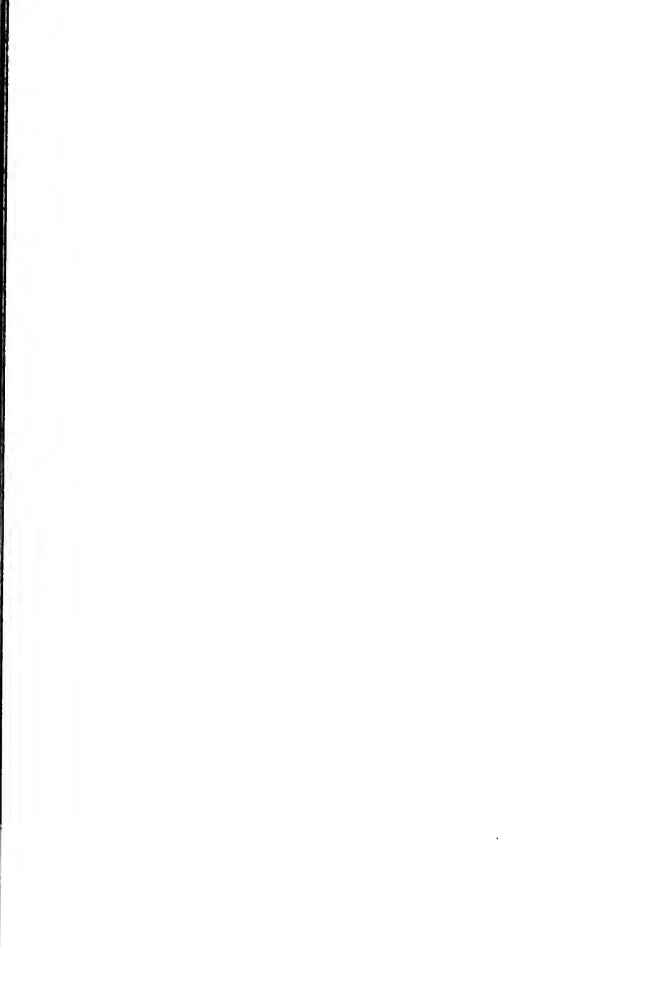

FIFTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“Follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts.”
1 Cor. 14 : 1.

Habit is a cable; we weave a thread of it every day, and at last we cannot bend it.

Never attempt duty but in God’s strength.

TWENTY-SECOND DAY.

Remember,

“Let every one of us please his neighbor for his good to edification.” Rom. 15 : 2.

Aim to foster a simple, self-denying life.

TWENTY-THIRD DAY.

Remember,

“Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” Matt. 6 : 21.

If thou seekest Jesus in all things, thou shalt find Jesus, but if thou seek thyself, thou shalt find thyself.

TWENTY-FOURTH DAY.

Remember,

“As thy days, so shall thy strength be.” Deut. 33 : 25.

God sends to His children daily strength with daily bread.

Remember,

Return in sweets to Heaven what goodness
lent,

Then bend beneath the chastening shower
content.

April.

FIRST DAY.

Remember,

“Speak ye the truth.” Zach. 8 : 16.

'T is not the great things that we do or say,
But idle words forgot as soon as spoken,
And little thoughtless deeds of every day
Are stumbling-blocks on which the weak
are broken.

SECOND DAY.

Remember,

“By humility and the fear of the Lord are riches,
and honor, and life.” Prov. 22 : 4.

Be humble, simple, upright, self-denying,
and affectionate to as many as possible.

THIRD DAY.

Remember,

“The righteous cry and the Lord heareth.” Ps.
34 : 17.

They who look to God in every need never
look in vain.

*FOURTH DAY.**Remember,*

“Be swift to hear, slow to speak.” James 1 : 19.

Be more in action than in conversation, for God hath given you two hands, but only one tongue.

*FIFTH DAY.**Remember,*

“Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness.” Matt. 6 : 33.

Avoid the beginnings of evil ; that is the way of escape.

*SIXTH DAY.**Remember,*

“Continue in prayer and watch in the same with thanksgiving.” Col. 4 : 2.

Let prayer be the key of the morning, and the bolt of the evening.

*SEVENTH DAY.**Remember,*

“Whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report, . . . think on these things.” Phil. 4 : 8.

NINTH DAY.

Meekness soothes irritating thoughts.
 Meekness makes us think well of others ;
 it hinders suspicions and insinuations and
 bitterness.

TENTH DAY.

Remember,

“Every one of us shall give account of himself
 to God.” Rom. 14 : 12.

Thy child, O God, thy child alone
 Forever may I be ;
 Thy child in innocence and truth,
 Thy child in purity.

ELEVENTH DAY.

Remember,

“God is a spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth.” John 4 : 24.

What are your prayers — the language of a full heart or of a full life ?

TWELFTH DAY.

Remember,

“An idle soul shall suffer hunger.” Prov. 19 : 15.

The idle are
Like ships that sailed for sunny isles
But never came to shore.

THIRTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“We know that all things work together for good to them that love God.” Rom. 8 : 28.

Keep an innocent heart and you need never fear trouble.

FOURTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“Ask counsel of God.” Judges 18 : 5.

Be brave, my child !
 He whom thou servest, slights
 Not even His weakest one.

FIFTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much.” Luke 16 : 10.

Faithfulness in little things fits one for heroism when the great trials come.

SIXTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“As much as lieth in you live peaceably with all.” Rom. 12 : 18.

He that will live in peace and rest
 Must see, and hear, and say the best.

SEVENTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“By love serve one another.” Gal. 5 : 13.

Do the work that 's nearest ;
 Though it 's dull at whiles ;
 Helping when we meet them,
 Lame dogs over stiles.

EIGHTEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“Ask, and it shall be given you.” Matt. 7 : 7.

Christ, in His heaven, will hear your prayer.

NINETEENTH DAY.

Remember,

“After this manner therefore pray ye : Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.”
Matt. 6 : 9, 13.

When tempted, look to Jesus for strength to resist. He is willing and able to help you.

TWENTIETH DAY.

Remember,

“Praise ye the Lord, for it is good to sing praises unto our God.” Ps. 147 : 1.

Father, Thy name be praised, Thy kingdom
given,

Thy will be done on earth as 't is in heaven ;
Keep us in life ; forgive our sins ; deliver
Us now and ever. Amen.

“Jesus said : Suffer the little children, to come unto me, and forbid them not.” Mark 10 : 14.

Was there ever kindest shepherd
Half so gentle, half so sweet,
As the Saviour who would have us

*TWENTY-SECOND DAY.**Remember,*

“Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth.” Eph. 4 : 29.

*TWENTY-THIRD DAY.**Remember,*

“God giveth us richly all things to enjoy.”

Always be ready to share in all blameless mirth, indulgent to all save sin.

TWENTY-FOURTH DAY.

Remember,

“Thou, therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.” 2 Tim. 2 : 1.

To be thoroughly attractive you must be simple, honest, straightforward, unpretending, gentle, and kindly.

TWENTY-FIFTH DAY.

Remember,

“Give ear to my words, O Lord ; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto Thee, and will look up.” Ps. 5 : 1, 3.

The best prayer at the beginning of the day is that we may not lose its moments.

TWENTY-SIXTH DAY.

Remember,

“He that is slow to wrath is of great understanding.” Prov. 14 : 29.

When angry, count ten before you speak : if very angry, a hundred.

TWENTY-SEVENTH DAY.

Remember,

“Keep thy tongue from evil and thy lips from speaking guile. Ps. 34 : 13.

“God hath raised up a horn of salvation for us.”

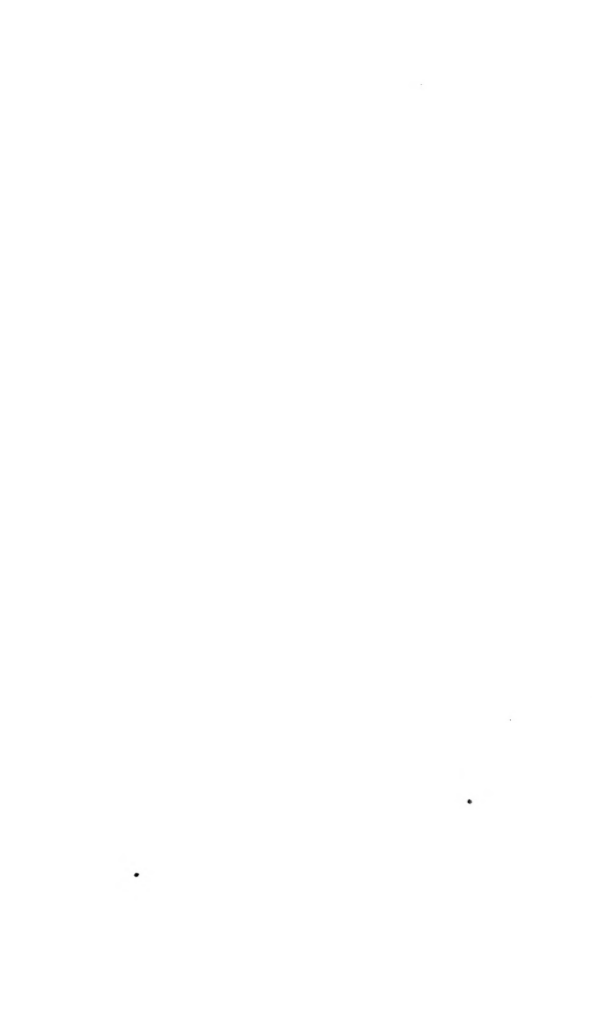
