



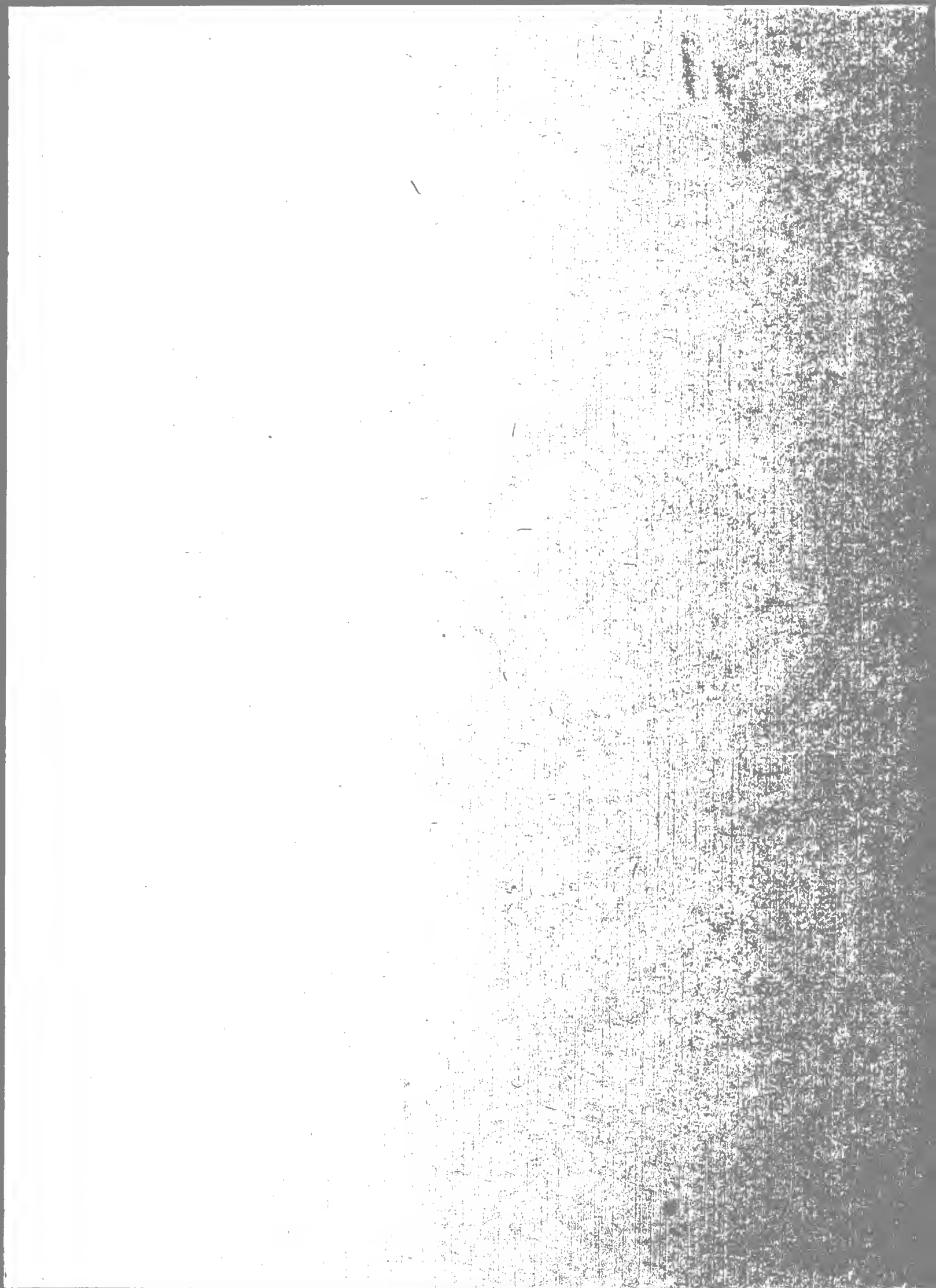

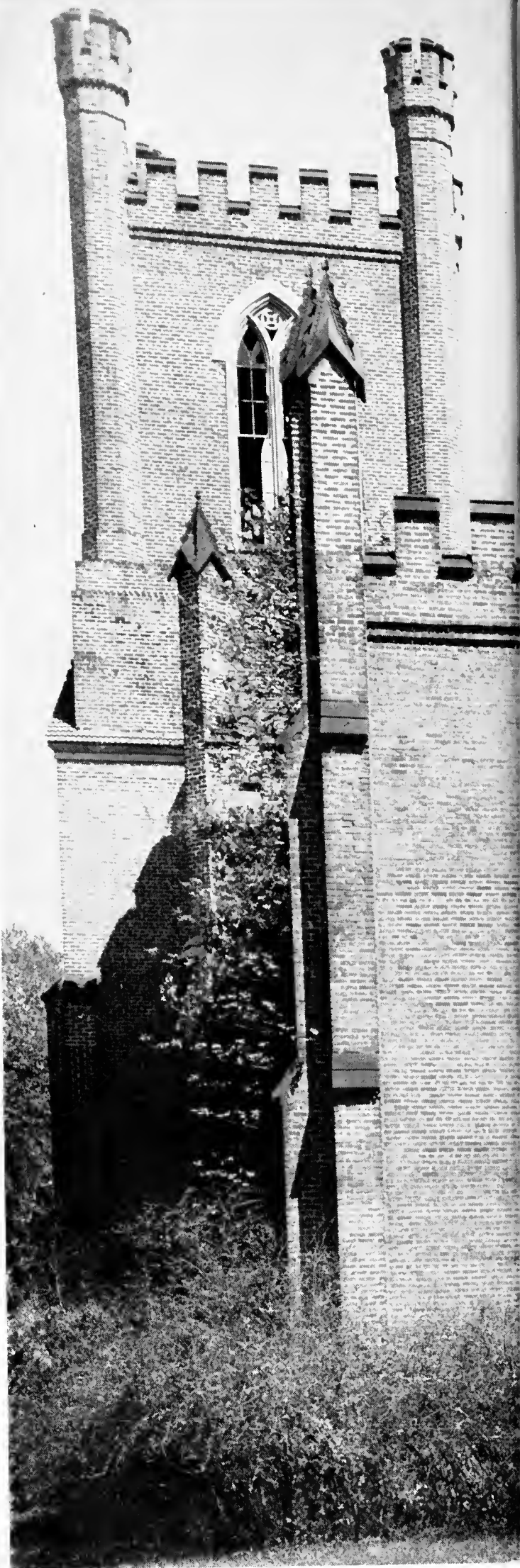
*"Thy walls have fallen,

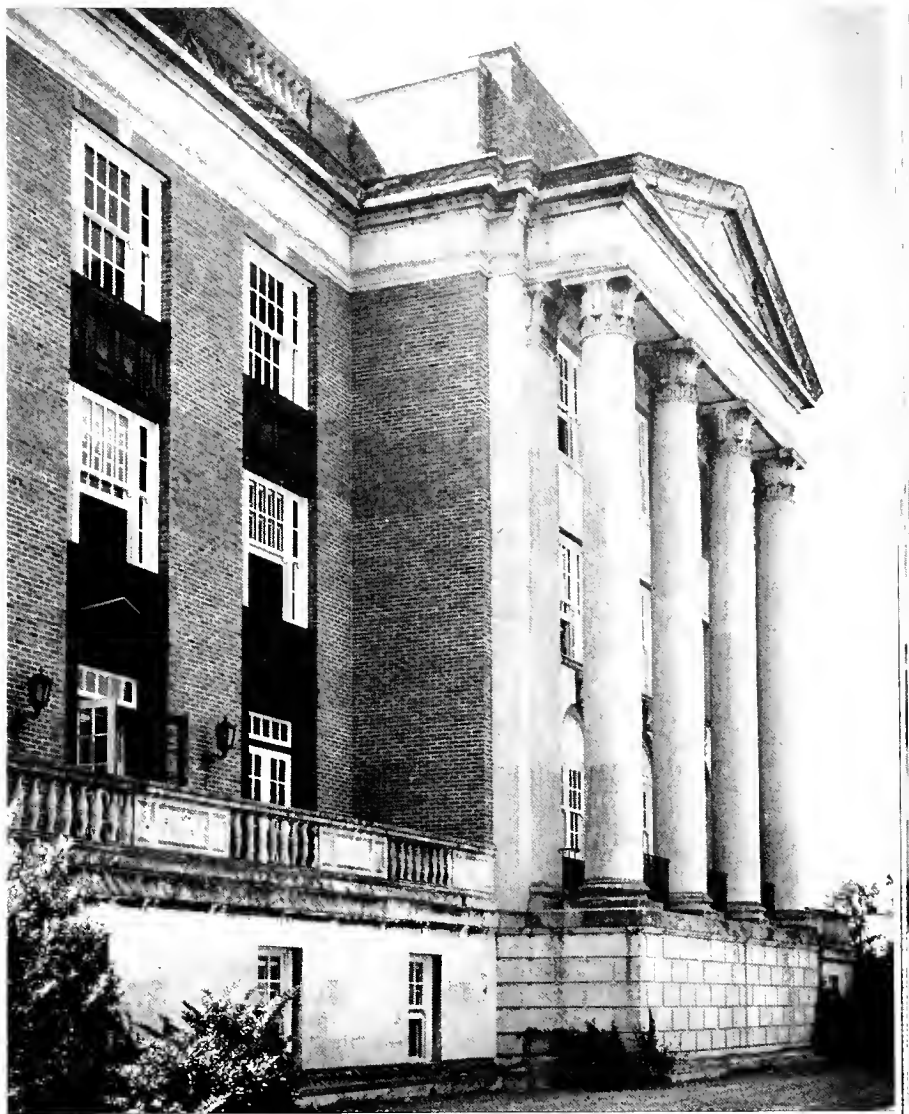

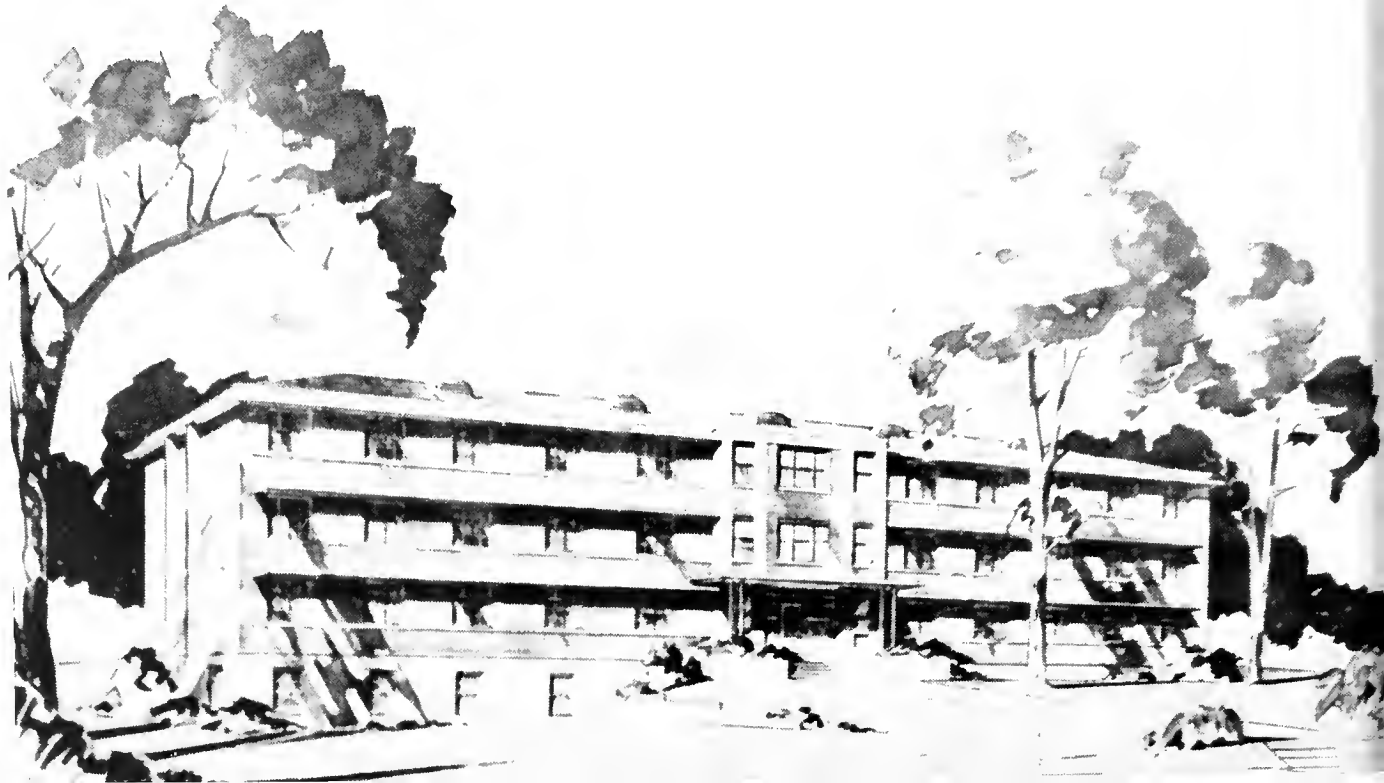

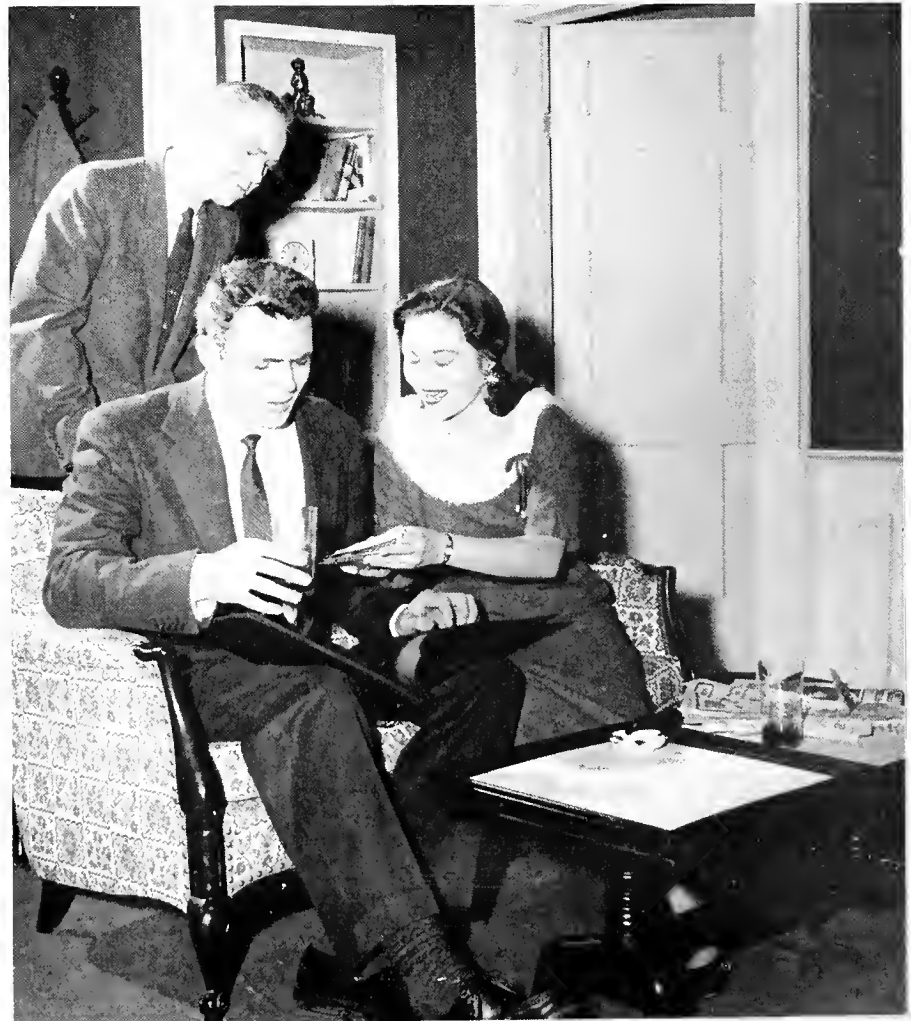
