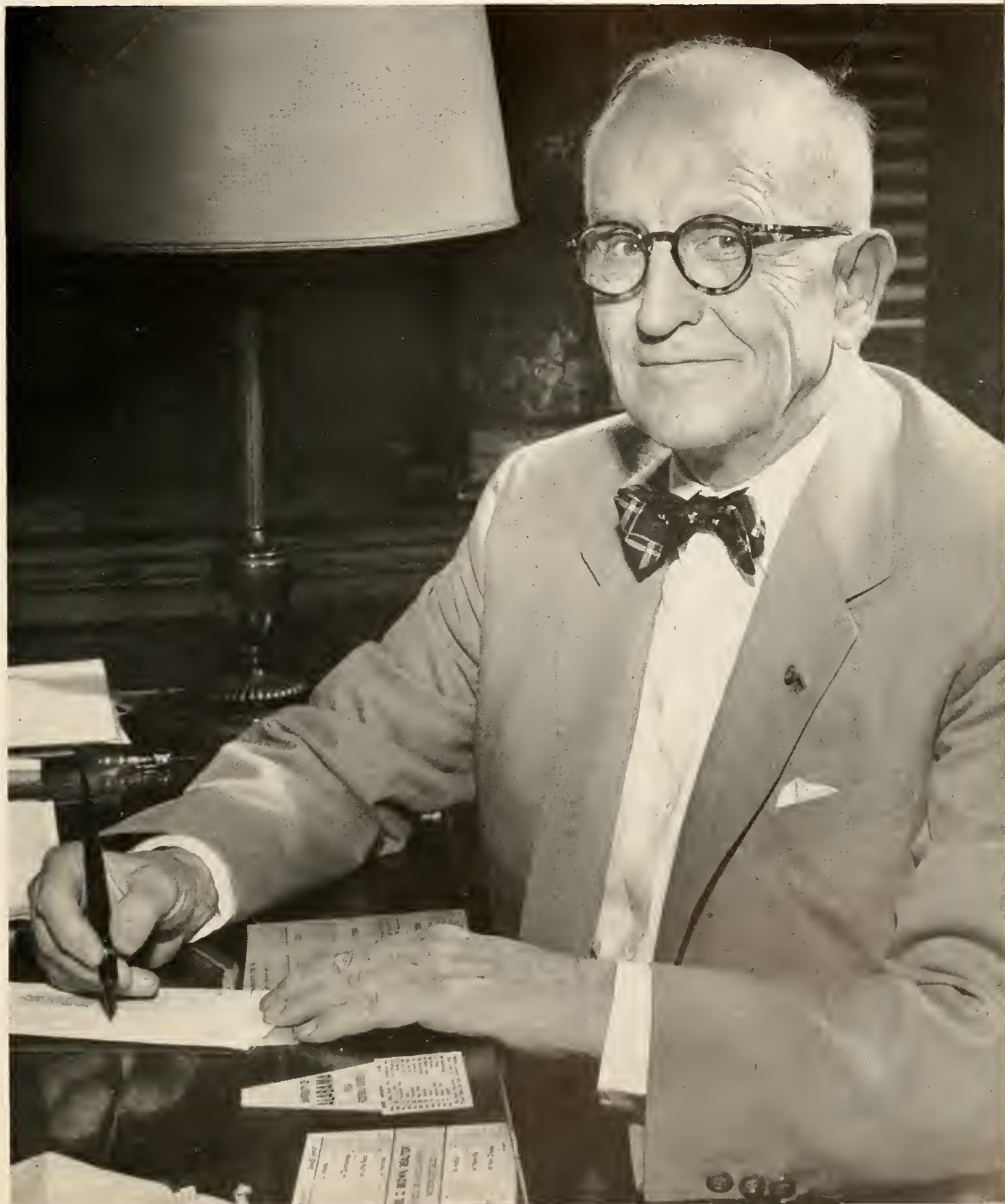


THE PRESIDENT
