The group annually publishes the Student Directory. Omicron Delta Kappa aspires to contribute to the high standards maintained by Birmingham-Southern College.






THE HILLTOP NEWS

AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY AND THETA CHI DELTA




PHI CHI THETA



This year Tom Gibbs is the president of the choir.




PANHELLENIC COUNCIL
