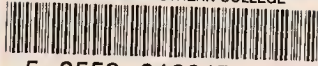

BIRMINGHAM — the city in Southern's backyard

— the city which has become one of the South's leading metropolitan areas. Its development took hard work and strong determination by those who saw a potential in the land. Not until the late 1800's did travelers learn the richness of coal and other minerals in the area. It was soon realized that the red rock was high grade iron ore. Thus, the development of a mining industry to support the making of steel was envisioned by those around.

The mining of natural resources in Jefferson County had begun, but development was limited by inadequate transportation. Without a means for transporting goods between other cities, industry was unable to flourish and take full advantage of the area's



abundant natural resources. It was not until after the Civil War that two major railroads were joined providing the transportation that paved the way for the rapid development of a new city.

An increase in mining attracted the attention of the Elyton Land Company. The company soon recognized the potential which the Birmingham area possessed. On December 19, 1871, with a population of 1,200, the city was officially incorporated. Shortly after the iron boom began, it was signaled that Birming-

ham was to be a city dependent on the steel industry. Within the city's first twenty years, the population increased to 26,000. In recognition of

this increase, the city was given the nickname "The Magic City."

This "Magic City" has grown from 1,200 to a thriving metropolis of nearly 500,000. Major industry remains dependent on the richness of the earth. However, the city has become a major center for financial, educational and medical institutions. A full range of recreational activities are now available to area residents and many places of historical interest may be visited.





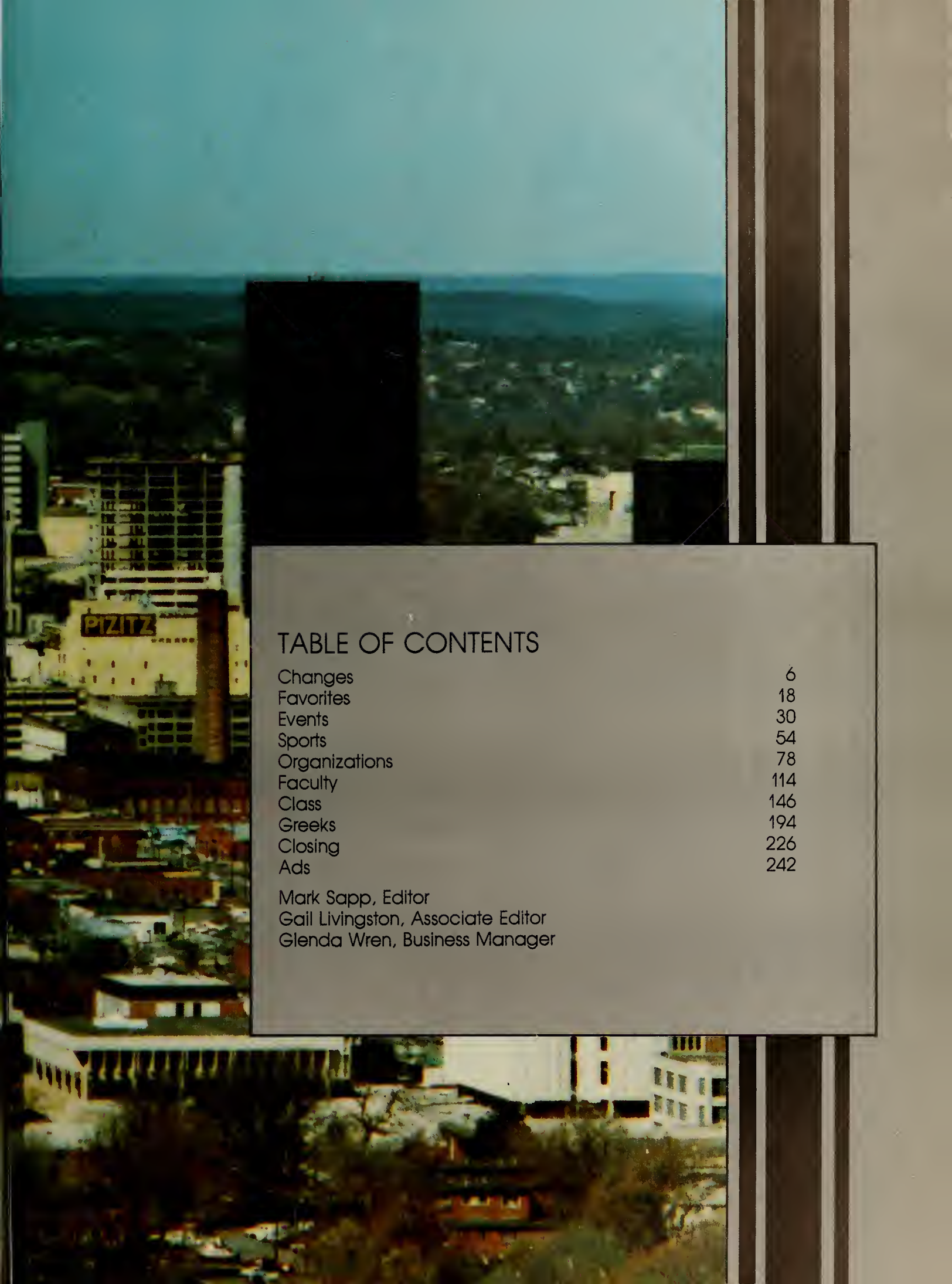

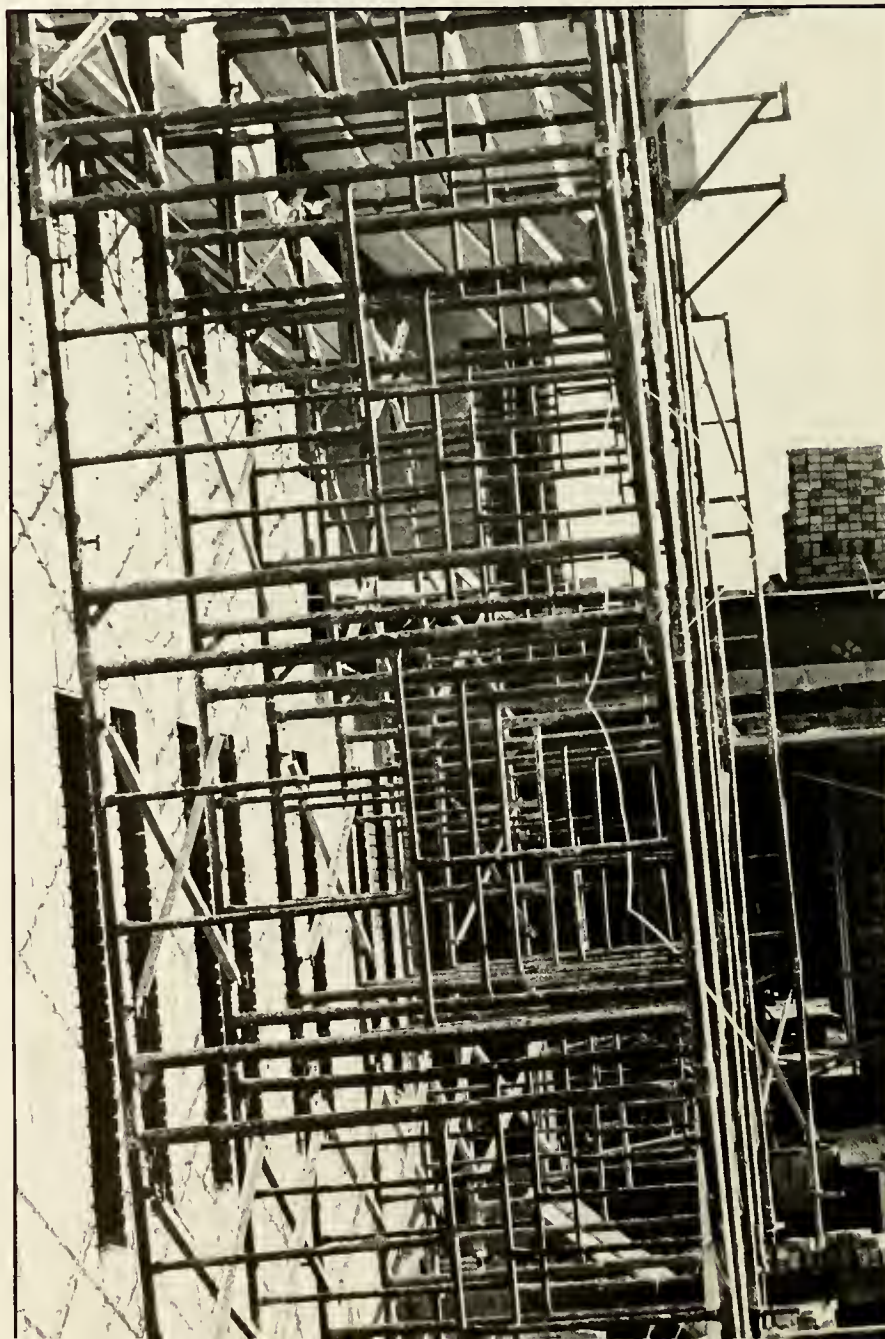

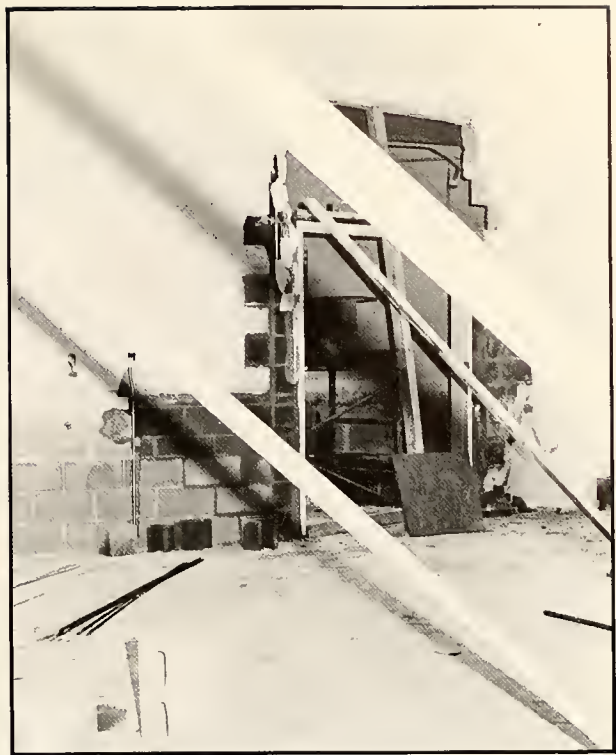

As each school year rolls around, it brings numerous changes for both students and faculty alike. All of these changes are not necessarily visible. Many such changes on campus occur within the lifestyles and relationships of the student body.

However, many of the changes at Southern during the 1980-81 school year have been structural ones. The Edward L. Norton Center and the additions to the Hill Music Building are two of the new looks on campus. Renovations have been made in the dorms along with improvements and construction on the Striplin Field. As well as improving the looks of the school, these structural changes will aid in bringing new events and activities to the Hilltop.







A YEAR FOR CHANGING

As the structural changes on campus are visible, there are changes within the lives of the students which are not apparent to the human eye. Specifically, the freshman year is a time when new students undergo changes in lifestyle and relationships. For many freshmen, college means being away from home for the first time. Leaving a familiar environment and close friends can cause anyone to become homesick.

Along with those who are homesick, there are many students who simply do not like their living conditions. With small rooms furnished for two, sharing one of these rooms in itself is a very big change for some. While the dorms may not be like home, this adjustment is soon overshadowed by the daily shift from home cooking to cafeteria food.

As the freshmen experience these changes, he or she is never alone. The minute he arrives on campus, he begins to make new friends. The pledge class, dorm, classroom, library or cafeteria are among the places where those who are sharing these common experiences come to know one another.

It is throughout the entire year that the freshman is faced with one surprise after another. Not many of these students were used to paying high prices for books or staying up late at night studying; and who was that person who said Dr. Randall's courses were crip.

At the beginning of the year things seemed rough and sometimes unfair. However, as time passed, the new surroundings and friends blended with the campus activities to provide a new world of excitement.



Going from home cooked food to cafeteria meals is one of the most dramatic changes any student encounters. Generally, this change is most noticeable to the freshmen; however, each fall the upper level students must once again make the adjustment to the school food.

Though Shamrock, Southern's food service, is not the worst, one cannot help but tire of the same ol' meats and vegetables. In search of more satisfying food, Southern students have selected certain Birmingham restaurants as favorites. One such establishment is the Smokehouse. A local truckstop slightly over a mile from campus, the Smokehouse serves an array of fresh meats and vegetables at a reasonable price.

At a little higher price and a unique atmosphere of the 20's, Spats has become a favorite with many Southern students. On the other hand, there are those times when students simply prefer a hamburger from one of the fast food chains. While the Smokehouse, Spats, and McDonalds are all very different, each establishment offers Southern students a change from the routine of cafeteria eating.







As students arrive on campus each fall they see old friends and make new ones. Many of these friendships begin in the dormitories. Birmingham-Southern has six such dorms, three for both girls and guys. As school progresses, these buildings soon become a home away from home.

Students soon become accustomed to the dorm room and decorate these rooms to fit personal taste. While all rooms appear different, they can generally be placed into one of three categories: 1) a color coordinated room, 2) a room with simple decorations or 3) one that decorates with time.

The color coordinated room is one with matching bedspreads and curtains. The place is always clean with never a messy closet or dust on the dresser; hardly liveable for some. Most of the other dorm rooms are arranged to show the taste of two separate students. To decorate a room the simple way is to let each roommate do what he or she wants without trying to match each other. The final type of room is created through time. The room never appears to be clean for items such as coke cans and paper gradually accumulate. Following the law of gravitation, these items have simply fallen where they please.



GREEK?

One of the most significant changes a student undergoes begins when he or she decides to join a Greek society. Southern offers its students 12 of these societies; 7 sororities and 5 fraternities. Joining one of these groups means pledging your loyalty to that group. Along with the hard work and fun times, being a member of the Greek system can mean making life long friendships.





As students have noticed structural changes on campus and changes within themselves, they may not realize the turnovers in the faculty and administration. New department chairmen are Dr. Thomas Gibbs of Fine Arts, Dr. Dorothy Ward of the Humanities, and Dr. Marjorie Gunter of Business. Aside from these chairmen, Southern has hired several new faculty members. As an example, the English department has hired three new professors to teach in the areas of American, British, and Renaissance literature. Southern's increase in faculty is a strong step toward furthering the school's high academic standards.







With the school year coming to a close, seniors are faced with decisions concerning their future. Whether to enter the working world or continue studies in graduate and professional programs is just one of these decisions. Students wait anxiously for letters of acceptance to schools of dentistry and medicine as well as masters degree programs. The office of Career Development and the Counselling Center are just two places one can go in times like these. With a little hard work, students can hope to use their skills and talents they have developed while attending Birmingham-Southern College to find their place in today's society.

The 1980-81 BSC Basketball began and ended its season on very auspicious notes. An opening season loss to Allen University added to an ending season loss to Alabama State in the NAIA District 27 Tournament. However, in between were plenty of high notes to keep third year Panther head coach Greg Walcavich happy and content.

Despite an unusually slow start of 2-3 in the first 5 games, the Panthers

were able to hit the magic 20 win plateau for the fifth consecutive season. The turnaround was the first of 2 regular season wins over NAIA National Runner-up Alabama State. That 80-79 victory before a packed house at Fair Park was just one win in the Panther 22-8 season. Going into the SSC Tournament the Panthers were seated second based on a regular season conference record of 12-2. Just ahead was K.O. Willis' number one 13-1 UAH which had beaten BSC in two very close regular season meetings. The Panthers rolled through the first two rounds with wins over Belhaven and William Carey setting up a rematch with UAH. James Henderson's game high 32 points and a productive five minute overtime period sparked the Panthers to an 81-79 victory and the Conference Championship. Three nights later, unfortunately, BSC's season came to an abrupt end as they bowed out of the District Tournament with a 68-62 loss to Alabama State.

James Henderson led the squad in scoring for the season with a 17.2 average. The senior from Yulee, Florida also eclipsed the 1000 point mark during the regular season. Another senior, Jay Higg, also broke the 1000 point barrier with his 6 points in a nonconference affair with Troy State. The Panthers will lose three other seniors including the ball handling wizard Jobe Belser, the tallest Panther ever Brent Nielsen and everybody's favorite hustler Terry Posey. However, those that do return to the hilltop next year truly have something to look forward to as the team moves into its lavish new home, The Bill Battle Coliseum.











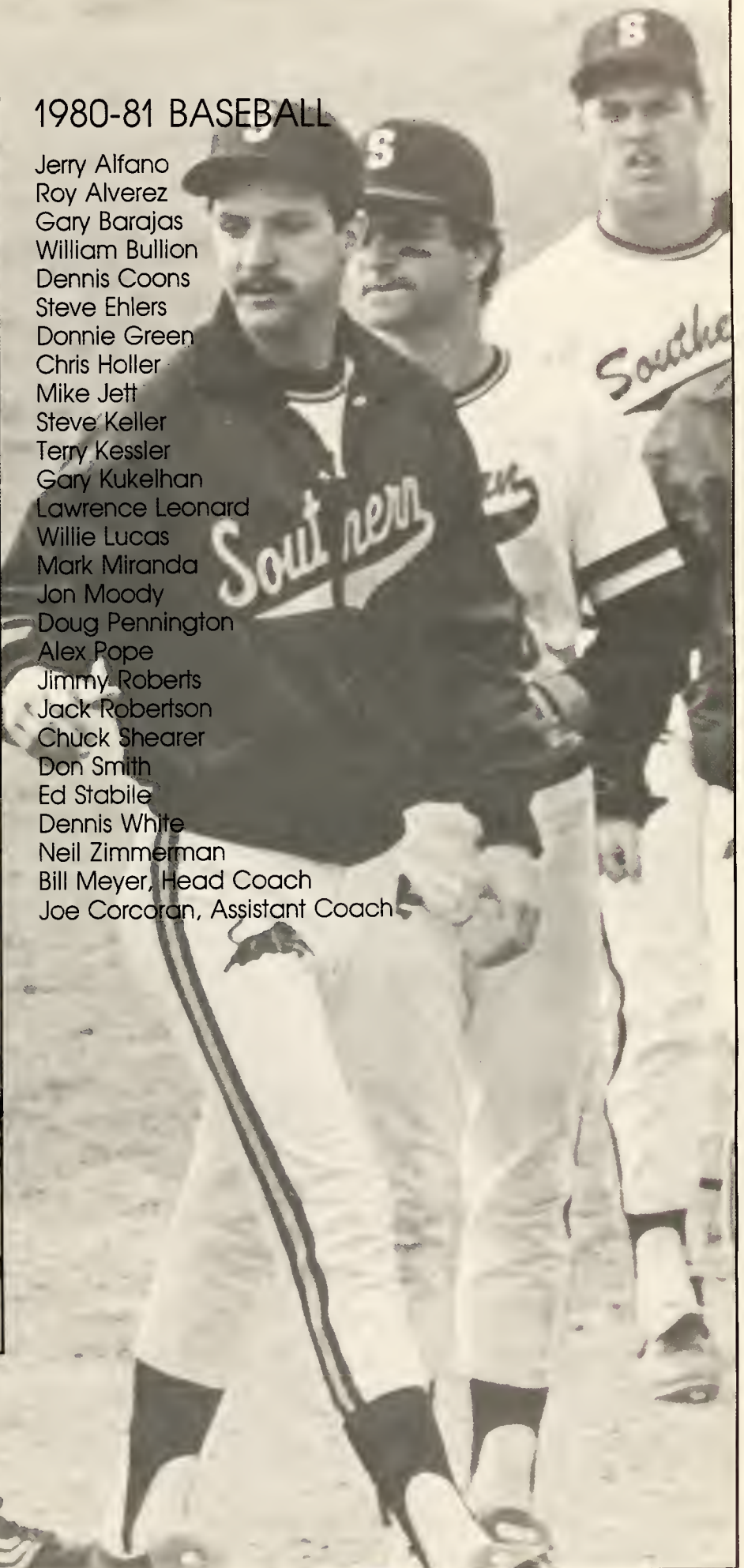

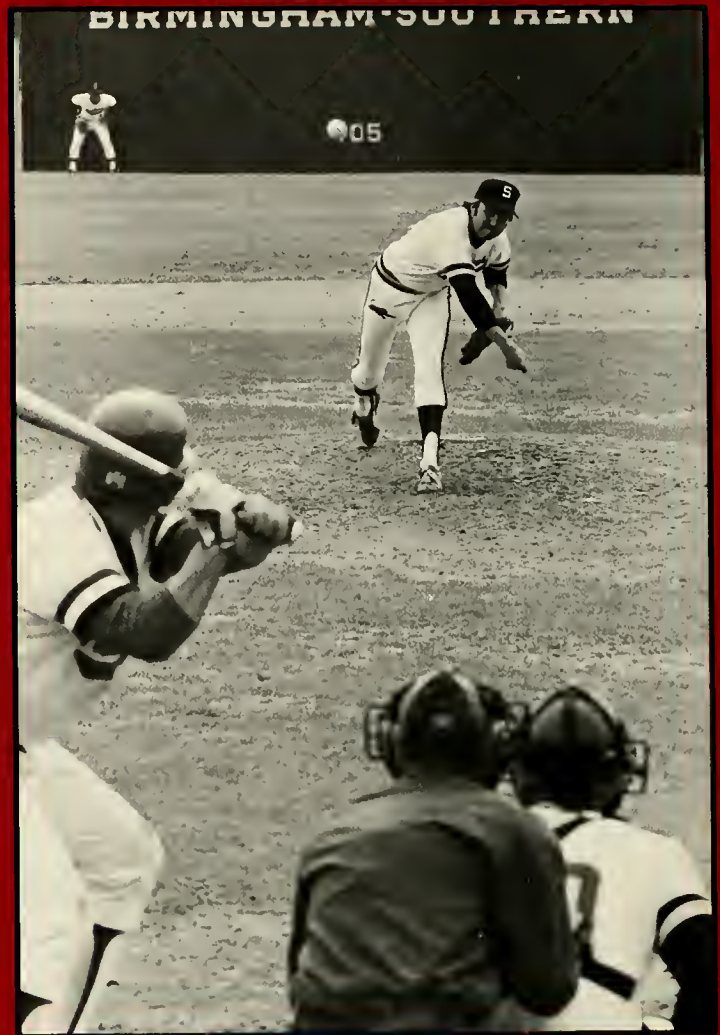
The 1981 BSC baseball season was loaded with improvements both on and off the field. The new Striplin Field was named in honor of the generous donor, Larry Striplin. Returning players from the 1980 squad were greeted with a reworked infield, outfield, a grandstand, press box and a lighting system which brought night baseball to the Hilltop for the first time.

To keep pace, head coach Bill Meyer made some improvements of his own that added to a returning group of 11 players, who had won 50 games in 1980.

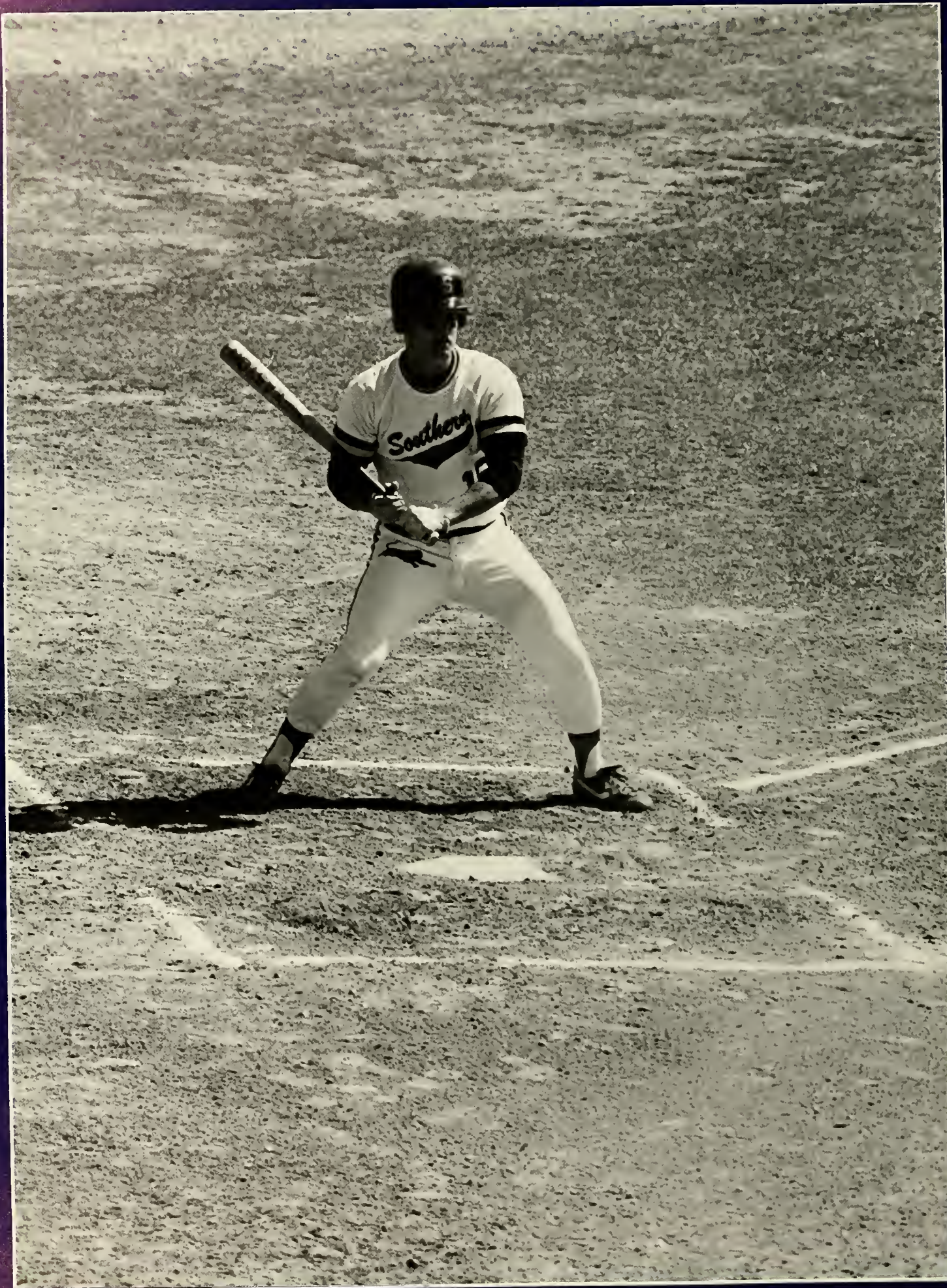

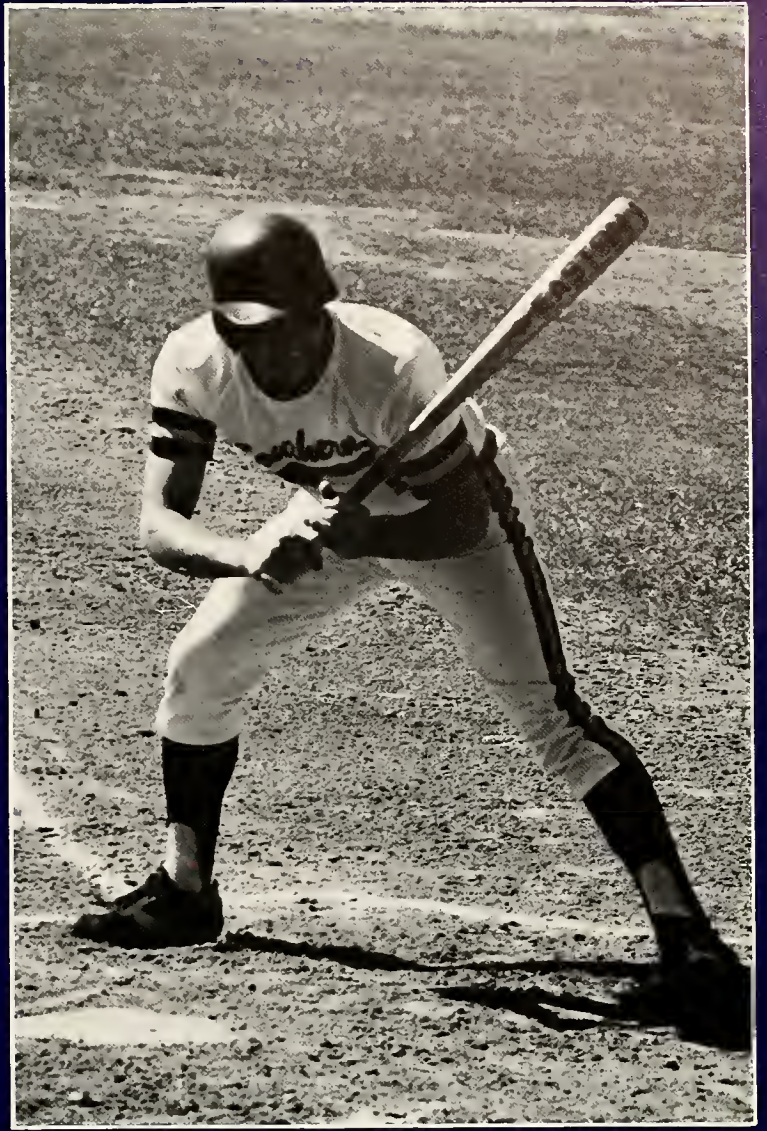
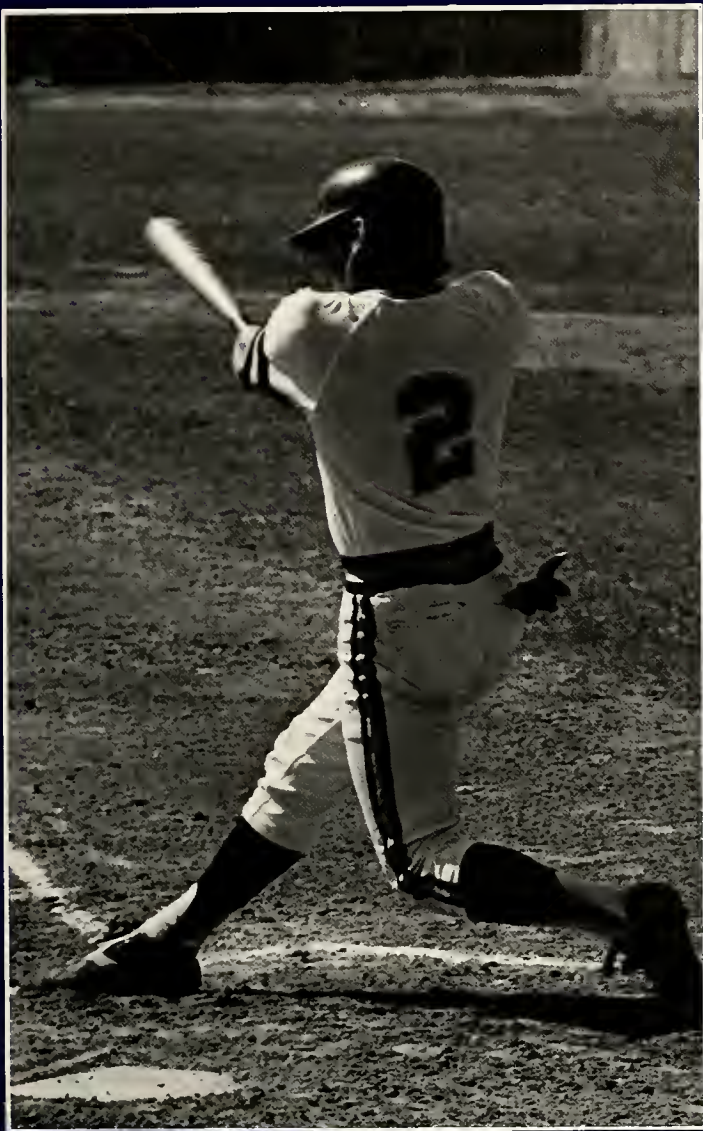
In the Conference Tournament played at Striplin field, the Panthers were seeded first and drew William Carey in the first round. Ed Stabile's RBI single in the bottom of the 9th gave the Panthers a 4-3 win. The following day Chris Holler's four hits gave the conference's new number one, West Florida, their first round match loss. The championship game pitted the tough Montevallo Falcons against BSC in a game that took 10 innings to decide. The Panthers won the game 6-3 and took their first conference title from last year's champs.

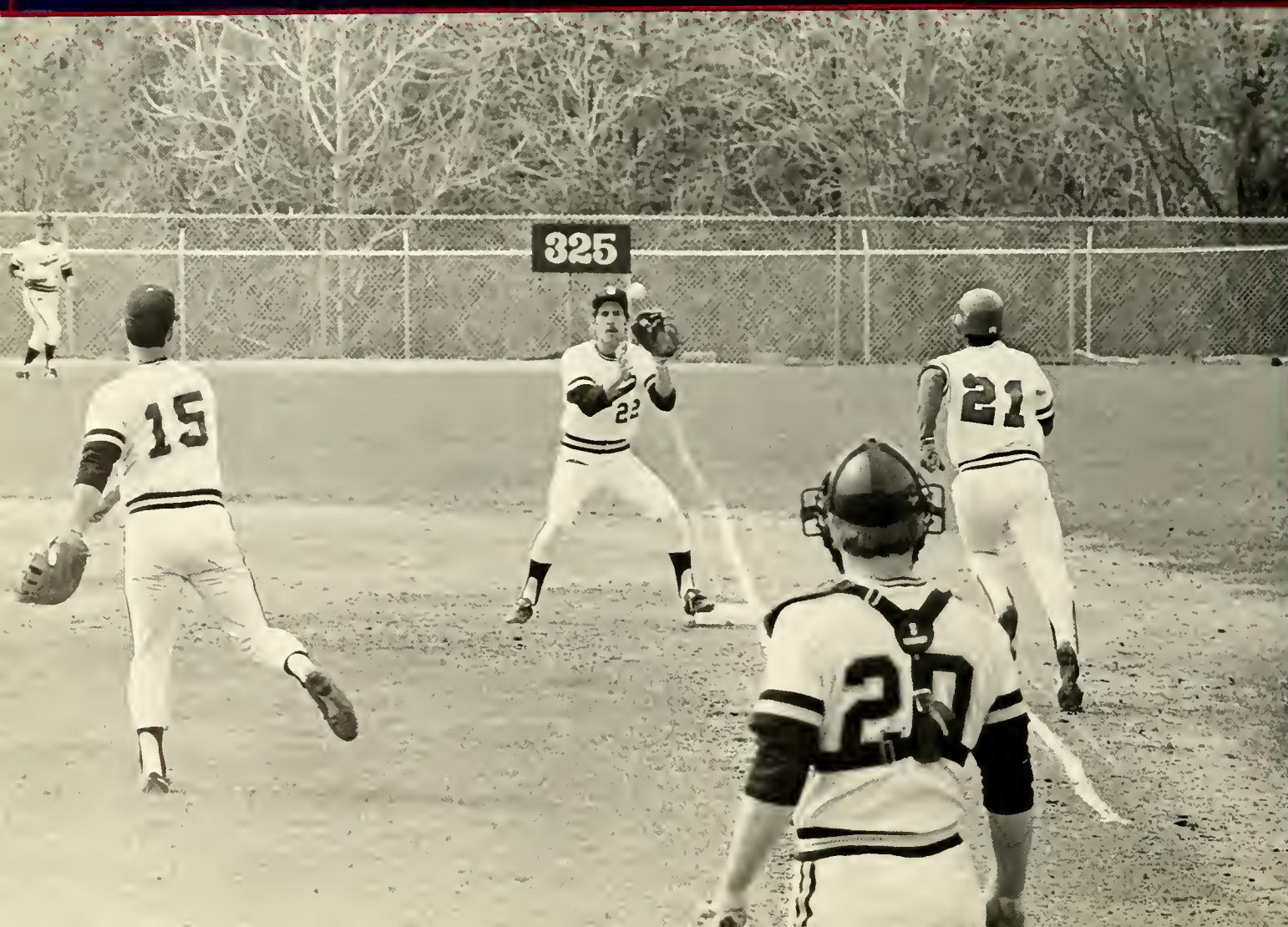
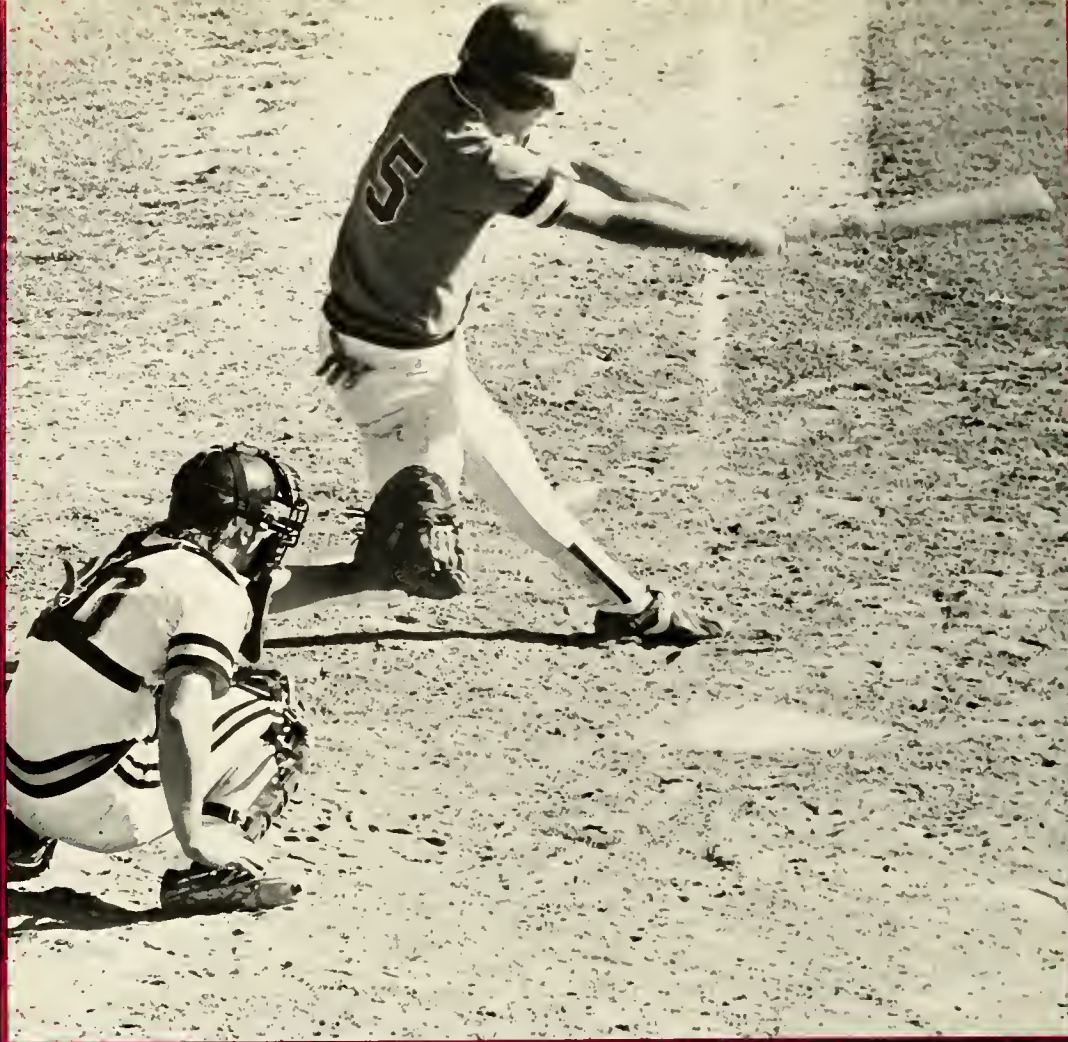
