Her inspiration for the play came from her father, a steelworker, who moved to Birmingham in 1974 and worked at a small local mill. As early as five years old, she became familiar with the mill environment. "It's the most killing work you can do when trying to deal with relationships or raise a family." Nemeth internalized all of these feelings and emotions into "Millfire," a story about redemption and forgiveness. When a fatal mill explosion takes the lives of some workers, the main character, one of the widows, has to learn to give it up in

order to heal and carry on with her life. The "giving it up" that Ne meth refers to is the process of letting go of the rage, the memories, and the emotions associated with the tragedy.
Nemeth came to Bir-mingham-Southern during rehearsal to visit with the cast in order to give them a more indepth understanding of her work.

Copy was written by Matt Henderson and Carlton Chamblin unless otherwise noted.

Staff Photographers used T-Max 400 speed film for all black and white photographs. These were developed in the Publication Board darkroom. Color photographs were sent off to different developers for processing. Student Portraits in the People section of the book were taken by Belmont Studios. All remaining photographs were taken by BSC students, the Office of Public Information, and BSC Theater.
