

By a vote of the town passed March 27th, 1837, the interest of the town's portion of the Surplus Revenue was appropriated for the support of the Schools; three Installments of which have been received, amounting to 19,230 34; the interest accruing from the time when paid, to Jan'y 1st, 1838, amounting to \$681 58 has been accordingly paid to the Trustees.

TOWN DEBT.

Exclusive of the sum of 10,300 dollars, which is holden in Town Notes by the Trustees of the Schools and Overseers of the Poor, the Town Debt is now reduced to 30,000 dollars.

The account against the Commonwealth for the support of State Paupers the past year is \$2951 01, and several small accounts against towns remain to be collected. The claims against the overseers department, (including money borrowed of the Town Treasurer,) amount to about \$4300 00.

The increased number of persons requiring assistance and the advance prices of the principal articles of sustenance have increased the expenses of the Overseers department, so that there is a deficiency of about \$1000.

Medford Street, and two streets leading from that to Bunker-Hill street, have been graded during the past year under the supervision of Mr. Gideon Foster, the care and labor of which he voluntarily took upon himself in addition to his other duties.
