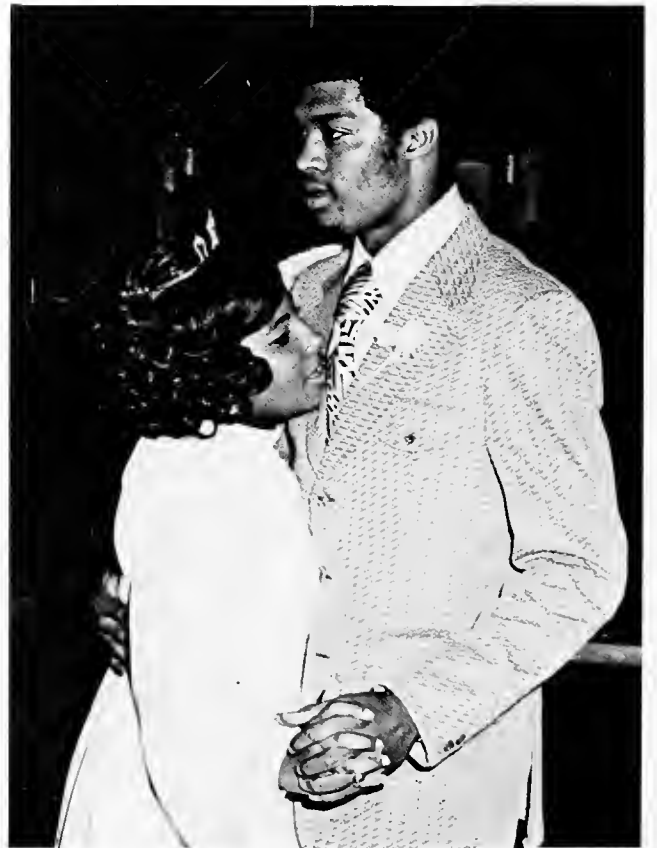
Bob is a social work and political science major and participated in the Washington, D.C. semester working in the political field.

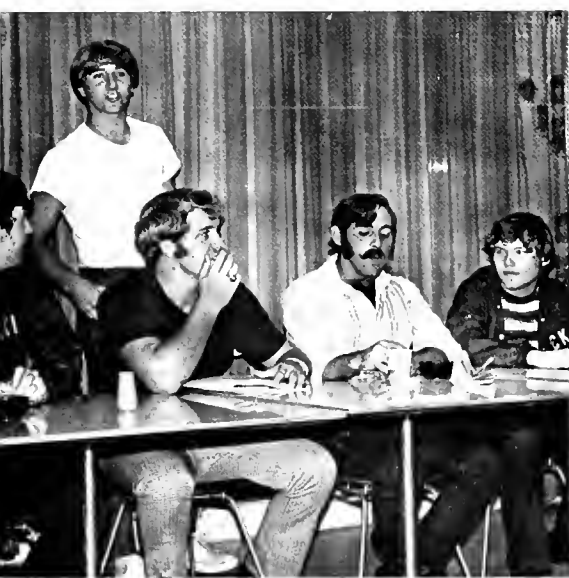
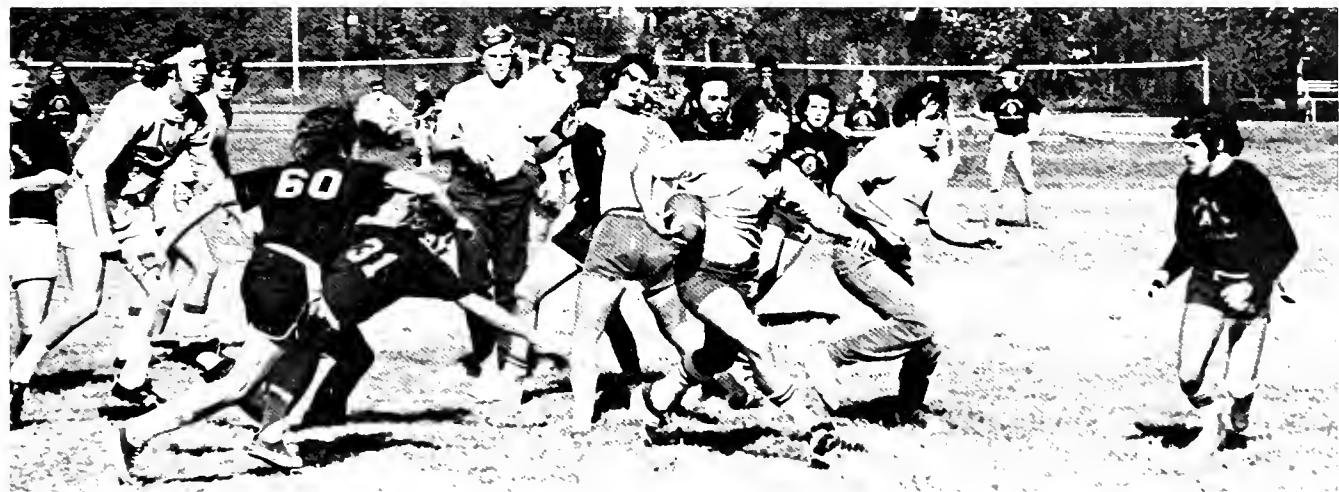
Circle K

The organization participates in the Daniel Boone parade and Roman Holidays. They are also active in intramurals.







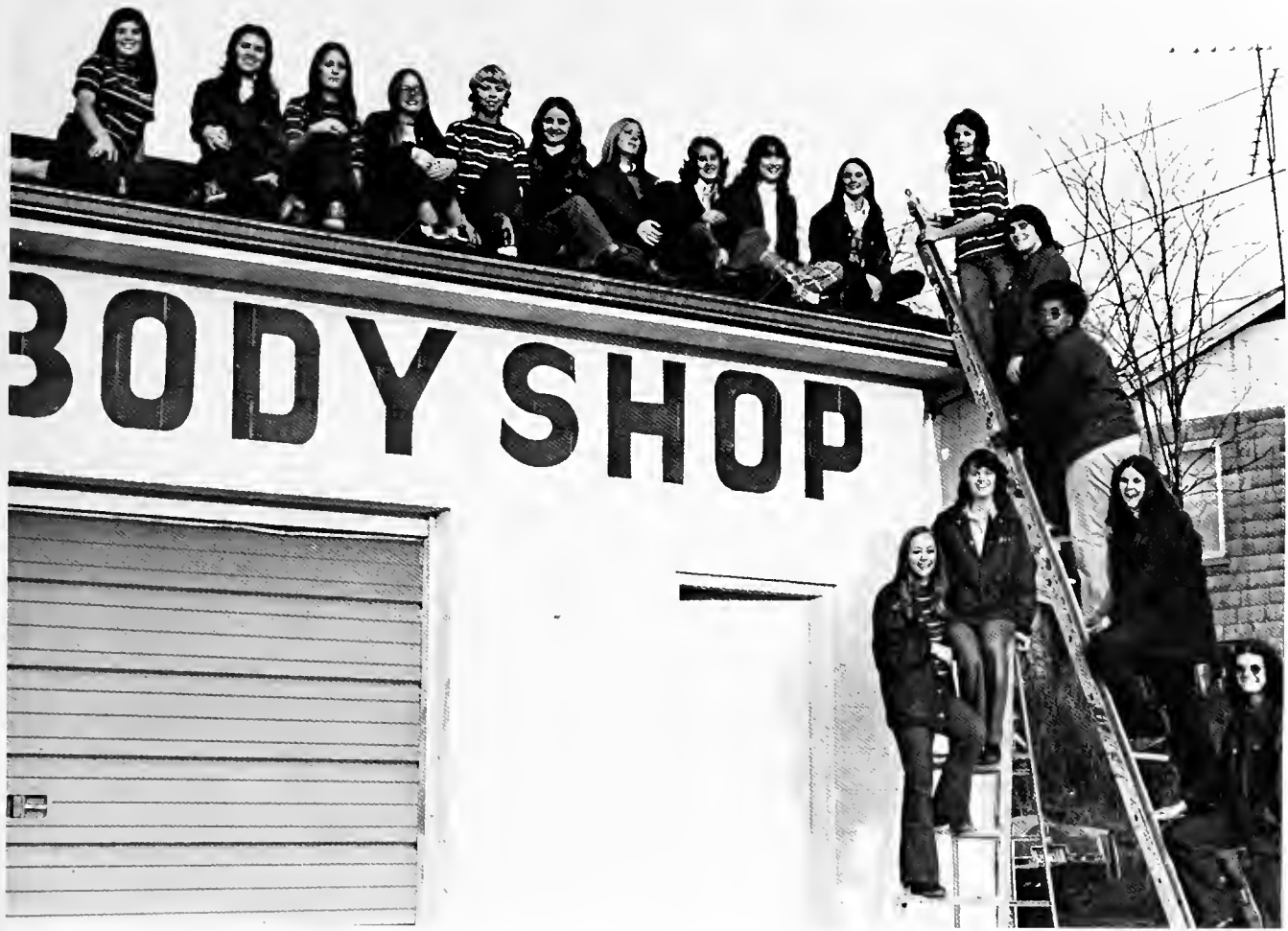

They participated in the March of Dimes collection, and are active in campus intramurals and Roman Holiday festivities.



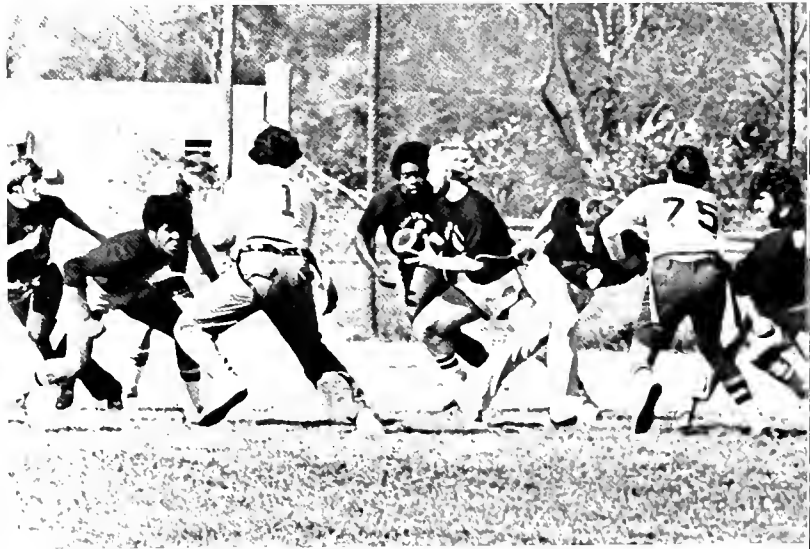

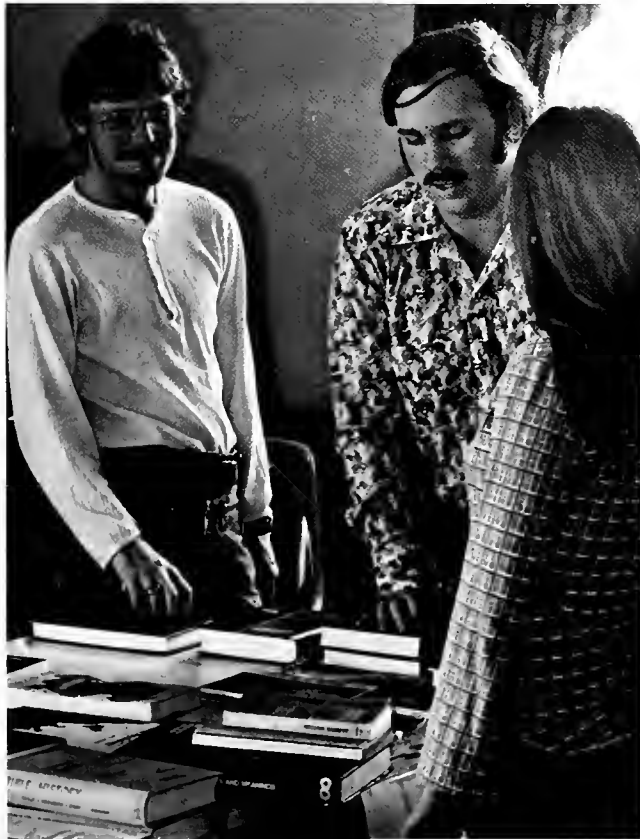

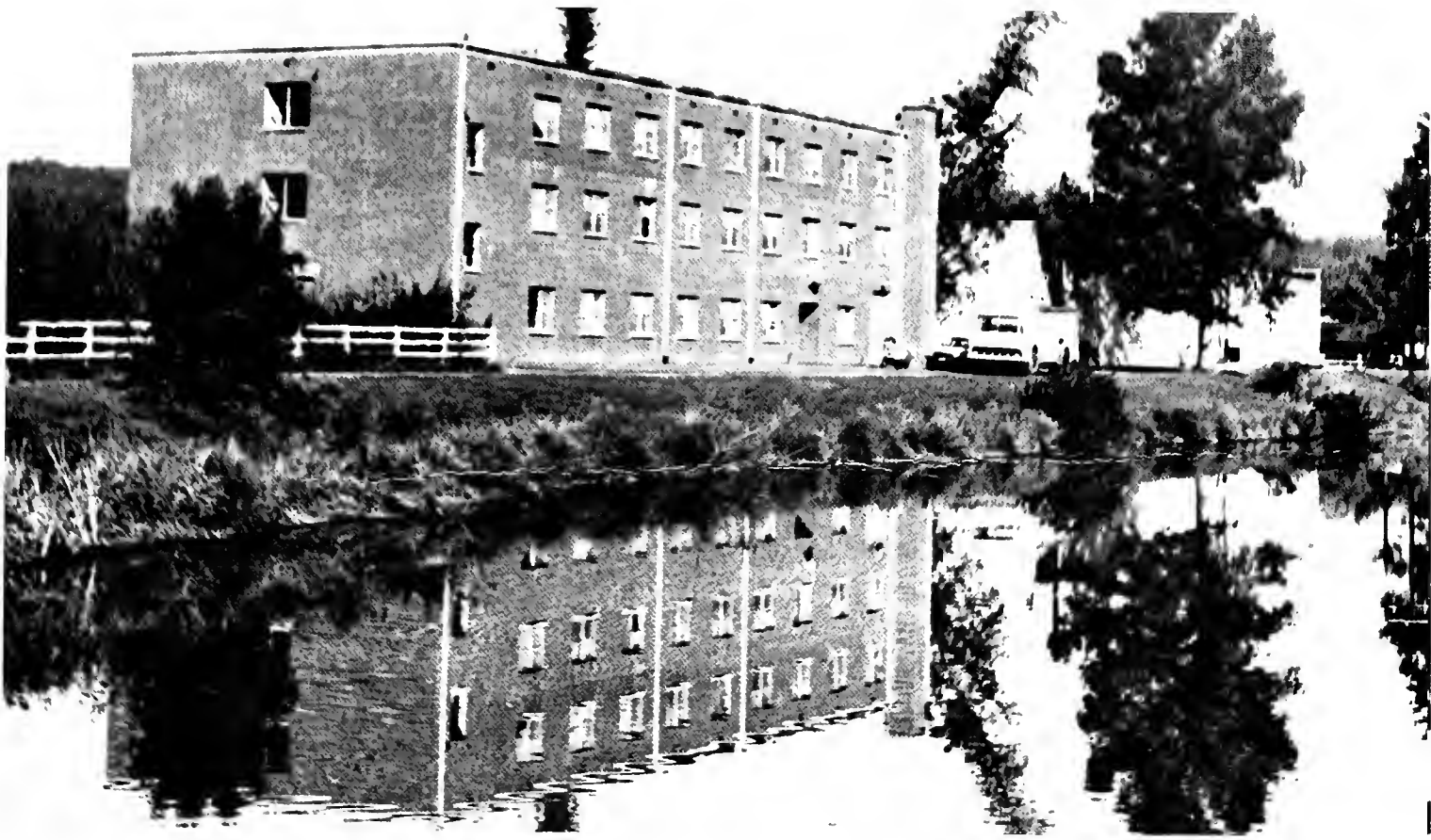

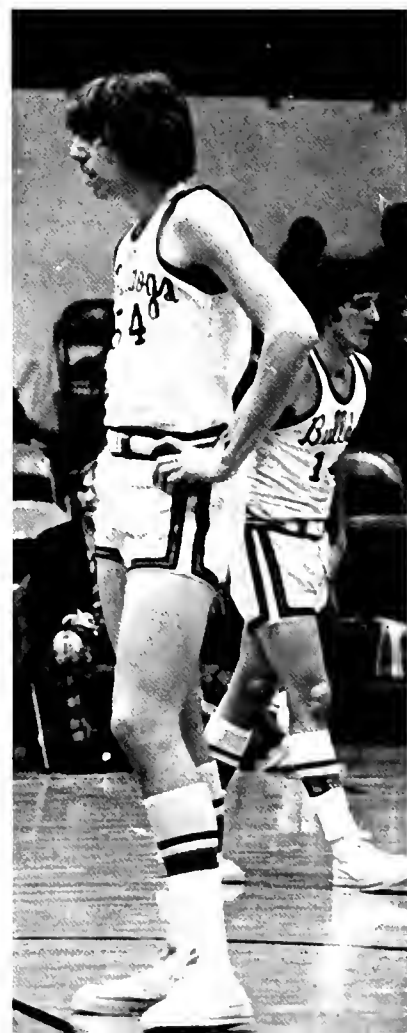

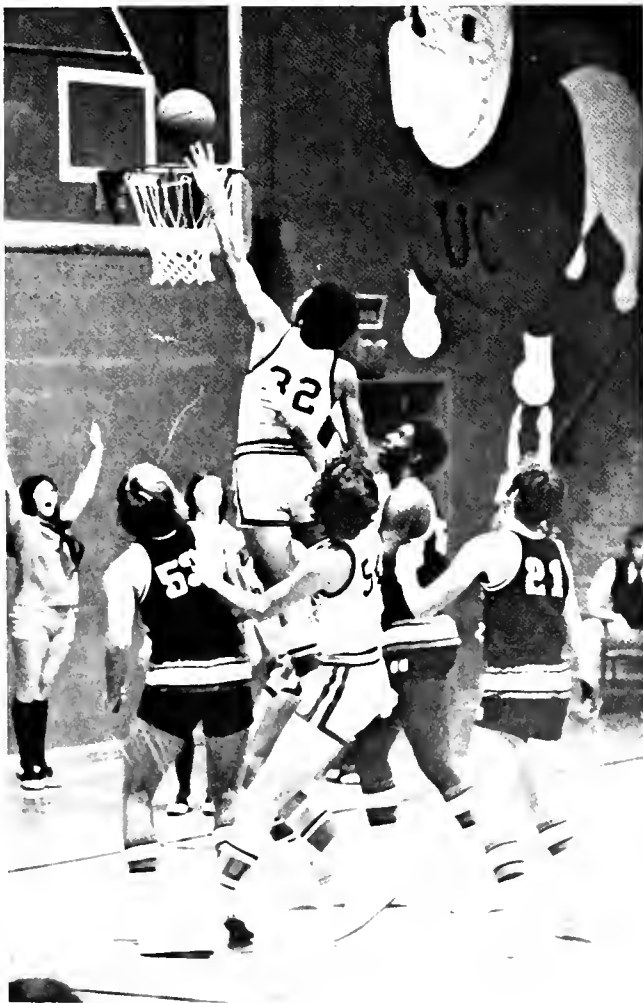

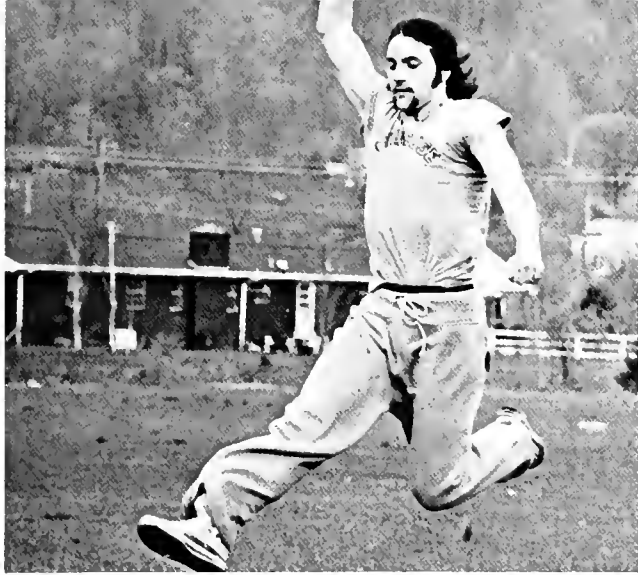
