Hoffmann, a Frankfurt physician, wanted to buy a picture book for his son for Christmas in 1844. Not impressed by what the stores had to offer, he instead bought a notebook and wrote his own stories and pictures. While <i>Struwwelpeter</i> is somewhat notorious for its perceived brutal treatment of the erring children, it has been influential on many later children's books, most notably <i>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</i>.
