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## P R E F A C E.

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THIS book was prepared for the use of my second year classes in the Somerville English High School, and is published because of inquiries by many teachers concerning this line of work. It is not intended as an exhaustive study of Mediaeval History, but as a practical work for the class room. A copy should be placed in the hands of each pupil in order to accomplish the end designed.

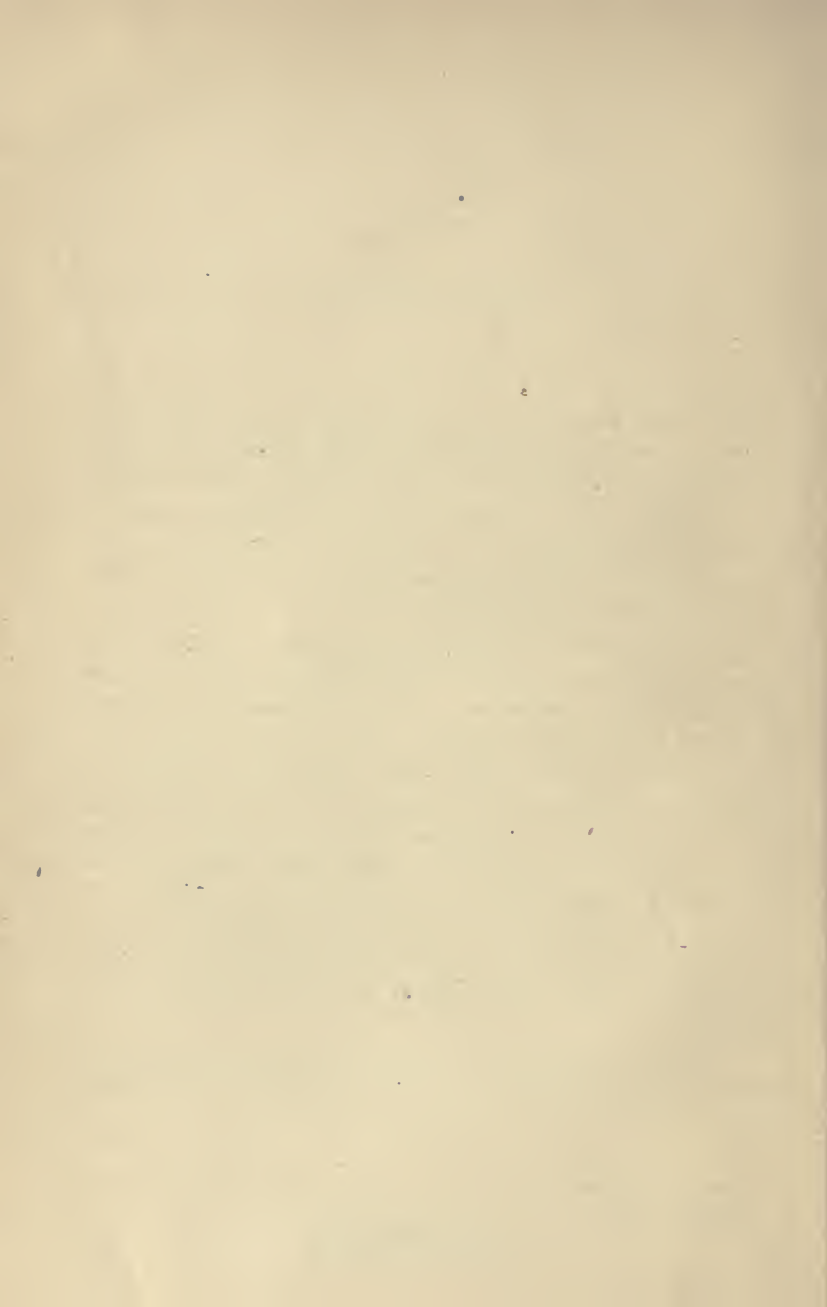

I have not touched upon theories or ecclesiastical questions more than is necessary for a good understanding of the period, preferring to leave such matters to the discretion of the teacher.
