




MONUMENT IN BARROW GURNEY CHURCH,




SUPPLEMENT

Monuments.

Chancel.—North side: Mosaic. To the Rev. E. Lilley, described at p. 24 of the History. South side: Inscription mentioned p. 23, but now given in full: “To the Glory of God Matilda Blanche Gibbs widow of William Gibbs of Tyntesfield in her latest hours provided glass for the adornment of the windows of this Sanctuary. A.D. 1887.”

Nave.—North wall above pulpit, three mural tablets.

1. In the vault beneath are deposited the remains of FRANCIS JAMES GORE, who unexpectedly departed this life on the evening of New Year's Day. 1823. at the early age of 17 years. Do not forget.

2. In the vault beneath are deposited the remains of RICHARD HUGH GORE Esq. who departed this life on the Sixth of Feby 1826 aged 23. This most amiable young man concealed a disease under which he labored, thro' fear of giving Pain to his Parents, till it became too powerful for human Aid, and he sunk under it, a Martyr to filial Affection. Greater Love hath no Man than this, that a Man lay down his Life for his Friends. John xv. 13.

3. Beneath the Altar are deposited the remains of Edward Gore Esq. of Barrow Court in the Co. of Somerset, youngest son of Edward & Arabella Gore. he married Barbara only daughter & sole heiress of Sir George Browne Bart. of Kiddington, Oxon, & relict of Sir Edward Mostyn Bart. of Trelacres. Flints. He was born Oct. 19. 1728, & he departed this life. March. 1801.

Between the windows on the site of the old pulpit is a tall white marble monument, capped with a large urn picked out with

gold, affixed to a larger background of grey marble; in the pediment is a heater shield between two branches of laurel, all tinctured, bearing the Arms of Gore & Tooker, quarterly, with the Smyth on an escutcheon of pretence (see p.p. 32, 12 n., 13 n. of the History)
 "Under the Altar are deposited The Remains of EDWARD GORE Esq., Son of Sir THOMAS GORE Knt. (By PHILIPPA, Sister and Coheir To Sir GILES TOOKER Baronet. Of Maddington in *Wiltshire*.) And second in Paternal Descent from Sir JOHN GORE, Knight, Of *Gilston*, in Hertfordshire, Who was Lord Mayor of *London* 1624. *Whitleigh* and *Aldrington* in *Wiltshire* were the Antient Seats of the GORES, From the fifth year of King EDWARD the Third. For many Centuries. From this stock sprung several flourishing Branches. Particularly the GORES of *Hertfordshire*; Who received the Honor of Knighthood For their distinguish'd Loyalty, And firm attachment to King CHARLES the First.

In a Grave adjoining is also interred His Wife ARABELLA (Sister & one of the Coheirs Of Sir JOHN SMYTH of LONG ASHTON. Baronet.) Who by maternal extraction Was lineally descended From MOWBRAY, First Duke of Norfolk And the Earls POULETT. & ASHBURNHAM Families.

EDWARD & ARABELLA GORE, Were both eminently conspicuous For their Piety, Benevolence & Charity, Resignation & Humility; And all those Christian Graces, Which eclipse the Lustre Even of an honourable Ancestry.

He died Sept^r. 18: A D: 1742 Æt. 70.

She . . . Oct^r. 27: . . . : 1748 Æt. 48.

They left Issue two sons. JOHN & EDWARD."

These were in the E. wall of the old church where the chancel arch now is, the vault being covered with tiles in front of chancel steps where the altar stood. This last monument is given in Collinson, II. 312.

Adjoining the North Porch are two mural tablets.

1. Sacred to the memory of RICHARD PICKFORD, Gent. late of the City of Bristol, who died May 27th, 1840, aged 82 years. Also of ANN his wife who died January 1st 1836, aged 70 years.

The Just ever in remembrance.

2. Sacred to the memory of ELIZABETH MARY HOGUE (relict of Arthur Hogue of Barrow House, Somerset, Esq.) She died March IV. MDCCCXXX., aged XL. years.

Carved on the splay of the window jamb by font :

To the Glory of God ✕ and in memory of Emily M. Wright who fell asleep. July 25th 1891.

Brass let into tiles on floor where it marked vault just inside the entrance through the old Tower Arch :

In this vault rest the remains of JOHN FOTHERGILL late of the City of Bristol. Merchant : who departed this life at the Parsonage House. Barrow Gurney. 9th March. 1846.

South Chapel.—South side. On the sides of the splays of the S.E. window containiag the Nativity of our Lord :

1. ✕ In Memory ✕ of Sarah wife of J. H. Blagrave Esq^{es} of Barrow Court, who died the 8th day of July. 1865.

2. Also of their eldest son John Anthony aged 5 years & a daughter Henrietta aged 2 years. R.I.P.

Above in the tracery is the glass coat of arms of the Blagraves (see p. 4 n. of History), and their motto: "Pro marte et arte."

Between this last window and the next is a large marble monument erected by Sir Thomas Gore to the memory of his father, William Gore, the first of the Gore owners of Barrow Court: as Collinson does not give it, it has been thought well to prefix it as an Illustration to this Supplement; but its position between the two windows has rendered it difficult to get a good copy, although with the help of the text it can be deciphered. The whole monument

has been carefully tinctured and picked out with gold; on a shield set back between the jagged edges of the pediment are the Gore Arms as before, surmounted by the Crest, ‘On a mount (really vert) an heraldic tiger rampant argent murally gorged gules; below the pediment on a frieze is the very indistinct chronogram—

Below a shield bears the Arms of Gore, impaling Azure, two bars between three pheons or . Smith . supported on each side with

two cornucopias filled with fruit, slung hammock-like from ribbons. William Gore married Jane Smith (see p. 11 of History).

The middle window contains in its upper tracery the glass-shield of the Gibbs' coat (see p. 14 n. of History) and the motto, 'Eu Dios mi amparo.' The window represents the visit of the Magi to the Manger of Bethlehem. Against the side is carved :

' + To the glory of God and in loving and reverent memory of his father and mother William Gibbs and Matilda Blanche Gibbs of Tyntesfield.'

The W. window has for its subjects, 'The finding in the Temple,' 'The flight into Egypt' and the 'Home at Nazareth.' In the heading of the tracery is the glass shield of the Crawley-Boevey; this is a dimidiated coat bearing Crawley and in chief Boevey (see p. 117, Wraxall History); also the motto, 'Esse quam videri.' On the splay is carved : 'These windows were erected by their son Henry Martin Gibbs of Barrow Court in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine' (see p. 28 of History).

Close by the remains of the old roodloft (?) doorway is a mural monument which Collinson, II. 313, gives in full, and says was placed against the E. wall. It is Jacobinical in character and has been painted up: at the top is the date, 1658, and the Arms of Bampfylde, impaling Sydenham (see p. 28, 29 n. of History). 'M.S. — Gemmulam viator quam hic subitus capsulatum — cernis, CATHERINA BAMPFYLDIA est, ex — honestissima Sydenhamorum familia — oriunda, nupta non data JOSEPHO — BAMPFYLD, sacratissimae Caroli — Britannici Majestati A Chiliarchis; — Femina, Deo suo charissima; bonis omnibus — desideratissima; utqui pietatis omnis — Religionisque Maximum, si non Exemplar — Unicum, Quæ post Plurimas Temporum — Fortunarumque vicissitudines, post — maximas morborum ægritudinumque Procellas.

— Post Labores masculine exantlatos, — Omnes et singulos, hic tandem in Dño — Placide obdormit. Obiit Augusti XII. — M.D.C.L.VII. — M..M.P.F. — I.D.F.V.'

Underneath this is a white marble tablet affixed to a grey back, recording: ‘Near this Place lyes Interred — The Body of M^{rs}. ANN WINTER — Widow & Relict of JOHN WINTER. — Late of ye City of Bath Doctor of Physick, — Who after a tryal of near twenty Years — Severe illness, which she bore with — Uncommon Patience & Resignation, — Departed this Life ye 28th Day of June — A.D. 1753 Aged 58. — This Monument was erected by — Her truly afflicted — Son & Daughter — In pious Remembrance of the — Best of Mothers.’

At the west end on the S. side of the entrance door from the Court are two mural tablets. (1) The base part is a white marble inscription plate resting on a highly-veined greyish marble back, whilst on the top is a halved sarcophagus, having on its side the shield of Winter tinctured (described on p. 29 n. of the History); but the second quarter is there given as it ought to be, the chevron of Arthur being omitted in the original. Above again are loops of drapery; both of these are affixed to a black marble pyramidal backing. The inscription runs: ‘Sacred to the Memory — of WILLIAM GORE — Youngest Son of WILLIAM GORE *Esq:* — He was Loyal to his KING — Unshaken in his Principles — And a Friend to his COUNTRY. — In private Life — Affable & Amiable — of distinguished Hospitality. — Liberal to the Poor — Benevolent to all. — Having no Issue; the Ancient Family Estates descend — to JOHN GORE of Bourton *Esq:* — He departed this Life with great Resignation — the 25th day of Jan^y. 1769. aged 68. — This Monument was erected by EDWARD GORE — of Kiddington in the County of Oxon. *Esq:* — to perpetuate the Memory of a most Affectionate Relation — and by his Will

a generous BENEFACTOR.' Beneath is a shield tinctured bearing the Arms of Gore, impaling May (see p. 13 and n. of History). It is conjectured that as the Winter shield seems out of place here, and not suitable for the Winter Monument, that John Gore caused it to be made, and that it represents the daughter of that monument, and the family of the first wife of John, who is only known by her Christian name of Temperance.

Underneath is the second, of white marble, inscribed with very large letters: 'Here Lyeth the — Body of Elizabeth — Wife of EDWARD GORE *Esq.*: Ob. — Dec^r. 6th. 1718.' She was the wife of Edward, second son of the second William Gore, who G.E.C. says was buried February 14th, 1727, so he survived her nine, not three years as on p. 13 of History.

Over the door is the monument to Doctor James described on pp. 10 and 29 of the History, and given in full by Collinson II. 312-13. On the top is a hollowed round with ornamented border, in which is carved the arms, Esquire's helmet, wreath and crest of the Barrow James', all tinctured; the Crest is 'a demi-bull rampant (sans tail) couped sable, really 'or' encircled round base with a wreath of laurel proper.' The shields above the figures represent his marriage with Blanche Gunter, the gauntlets of which are 'sinister'; whilst Collinson describes the James' arms as bearing 'crosses botony,'—they are really 'crosslets,' and the 'below' in the 10 n. should read 'between': under the figures are two panels, one filled with the inscription and the other blank, as Blanche's was never added; his contains the following: 'Here Lyeth y^e body of Francis James; D^r of — Lawe, one of y^e Maisters of y^e Highe Court — of Chancery, judge of y^e Court of Audience of y^e L'd Archb. of Cant and Channclor of y^e — Diocess of Ba: and Wells: whoe livinge was — worthely beloved of all honest men, and — Dead hartely of them deplored. He died — 26 March 1616 in

whose remembrance — Blanche James, his beloved wife did — erect this monument.

To the N. of the doorway are three mural white marble tablets.

1. Sacred — to the memory of — JOHN SIGISMOND GORE. — Ensign of the 57th Regiment of Foot — who departed this life — the 1st of July 1825 — at Sydney New South Wales. Aged 21. (See p. 29 of History.)

2. Sacred to the memory of — the Rev^d. CHARLES GORE of Barrow Court — in the County of Somerset — who departed this Life — on the 21st of April. A.D. 1841. — in the 77th year of his age. — Also to the memory of — HARRIETT his wife — who breathed her last — on the 17th of July. A.D. 1840 — in the 66th year of her age. — Their virtues endeared them to all — who knew them — and their example will ever be cherished — with the tenderest affection — by their now only surviving sons — Montague Gore Esq^{re} of Barrow Court — and the Rev^d. George Gore — of Newton St Loe near Bath — who have erected this monument — in pious gratitude — to the best of parents. — Dated. A.D. 1842.

3. Sacred to the memory of — the Rev^d. WILLIAM CHARLES GORE, second son — of the Rev^d. CHARLES GORE, of Barrow Court, — and HARRIETT his wife. — He was for many years minister of Barrow, — and discharged the duties of his sacred calling — with a zeal and self denial — which were truly exemplary, — and which with his other Christian virtues — gained him the undying esteem and affection — of his Parishioners. — He now rests from his labours, — having departed this life in the 41st year of his age — on the 17th of February. A.D. 1842. — in the island of S^t. Christopher's whither he had gone — for the recovery of his health. — The Lord's will be done. Amen

Knt. hee died September ye 17th 1675 — Here Sleepeth in Jesus in hope of a blessed Awaking — (opposite here another shield as before bearing Gore impaling Tooker.) Sr Thomas Gore Kn^t who died October ye 2nd 1675 — Here Lyeth the body of Ruth the wife — of William Gore Esqr. daughter & Heiress — of John Tibbott sonne of Magdalen and Benjamin — Tibbott departed this life the 11th of December. 1689.— Jane Gore Daughter of Thomas Smith — of London Esq. Relict of Wm. Gore Esqr — (opposite to this is a shield bearing Gore & Smith as on the first one) ye Elder, Mother of Sr Thomas Gore Knight — And Grand Mother of ye Present. Wm. Thomas Southworth's stone: round the margin, at top, 'Hic' to 'Southworth,' right hand side 'Armiger' to 'gra,' the rest defaced; and there is room for more between the 'iorum' and the 'octor pa' at the bottom; left side 'cis' to 'memoria,' this is continued inside the margin at the top, 'custos' to 'depu' — 'tatus' to 'qui' — obiit to 'Septembris' — 'anno' to '1625.' — 'ætatis' to '61.' (See pp. 29, 30 of History.)

The lines of the Inscription and Epitaph of Mrs. Thomazin

The fragment near the Altar (mentioned on p. 29 of the History) reads thus: round the margin 'Here lyeth the body,' right side 'of Fran . . . , and on the left ' . . . ed . ie . ' [? departed the] in the middle, 'twentieth . . day' — of . July . Anō Dni — 1020 [? 1629.]

On Exterior of Church.—On S.W. side, over the spot where the entrance door from Court to Aisle, with its outside open iron gate, used to be, are the Arms of James with a defaced crest, carved in stone. (See p. 11 B.G.S. and p. 10 n. of History.)

Above this is the stone shield of Collinson's Clarke, query Norton, of which he says there were two; the second now lying in fragments in the churchyard. (See page 9 and n. of History.)

On W. end of the Chapel, in the arcading, is on the N. side a stone shield bearing the Arms of Gibbs quarterly with (Argent) a chevron between three owls (Azure) Hucks, and on the S. side Gibbs impaling Otter. (See p. 14 n. of History.)

Adjoining, where now the present Tower stands, but was removed and re-interred with the consent of the father in the new graveyard close to its gate, the body, and this inscription: ‘In Memory of Elizabeth Mary Bourder — the beloved daughter of — George and Mary Ann Vowles of this Parish — who departed this life Feb. 26th 1870 aged 28 years. — — I breathe no weak upbraiding — For death I know is nigh — I feel my strength is fading — And peacefully would die.’

In wall behind where the last was, is inserted a Memorial Stone found during rebuilding of N.E. boundary wall. 1817. — P. * V. — 1827. — Ann Vowles — aged 70 years.

Jane Yeates wife of George Yeates died Sept. 17th 1874 aged 57 years.

In Affectionate Remembrance of — ELIZABETH BATT — The Beloved Wife of RICHARD BATT — who departed this life May 15th 1874. — Aged 75 years. — — Father in thy gracious keeping — Leave we now thy servant sleeping. On reverse side: In Loving Memory of — RICHARD BATT — who died April 22nd 1884 — aged 85 years. — — With long life will I satisfy thee and — shew thee my salvation. — Ps. xci., v. 16.

ADDENDA ET CORRIGENDA.

History i.—‘Elwell brook.’ In the old Waterworks’ Act of Parliament this brook is called ‘Elwall,’ and it is stated that a stream from Dundry flowed past the Manor House and joined the Elwall by the disused compensation reservoir.

History, p. 2, n. 16—Lovel arms should read, ‘Or crusily crosslets a lion rampant azure.’

N. 17—Somerset, ‘Archæological’ should be ‘Record’ Society.

History, p. 3—During the time of the lordship of the Ap. Adams and Thomas, third Lord Berkeley, the Bavents owned a good deal of the land in Barrow (see Roberts’ share in the Lay Subsidies on p. ii.) Collinson II., p. 121, says: ‘Sir James Perceval was trustee of the family estates in Brockley, Backwell and Barrow for the use of Richard Harvey.’ This is proved by the Somerset Visitation, p. 47, where ‘John Scovile 1420 married Joan d & coh. of Rob. Bavent by whome ye land in Barrowe did descend,’ his daughter ‘Elizab. the 3^d part of whose land did descend to Nicho.

Harvey,' her husband. Sir John Berkeley alienated the Manor to the Comptons, who were of Backwell, and as their lands adjoined those of the Bavents in that Parish, they no doubt acquired them and so consolidated the Manor.

Last line—for ‘1626’ read ‘1636.’

History, p. 4, n. 25—The Arms of Blagrave are: ‘Or on a bend sable three leg harnesses argent.’ Called ‘shambroughs’ by Papworth.

History, p. 5, line 3—After ‘issue,’ insert ‘by second marriage.’

History, p. 6, line 7—‘Richard de Acton:’ his will, dated 1388, and proved at Lambeth (*Somerset and Dorset N. and Q.*, viii. 261) contains also a money bequest of XI^s to the Prioress and Convent of Barwe.

Line 19—‘John Blanket,’ in the *Little Red Book of Bristol*, I. 114, the marginal reference to which is, ‘Composio cuiusdam cantarie Johannis Blanket in ecclesia de Barowe:’ it is described as, ‘Foundation of a chantry in Bearwe (Barrow Gurney) priory, co. Somerset, by John Blanket and Cristina his wife, for the welfare *inter alios* of the mayor and commonality of Bristol. The chantry priest is to take an oath yearly before the mayor for the performance of his duties. The goods, chattels and tenements of the priory in Bristol are to be distrained if the terms of the foundation are not carried out. Dated 4 September 45 Edw. III. (1371).’

Line 25—Robert Cheddre’s will was proved 1384.

History, p. 9, line 11—‘Drew’s Arms:’ this is the only place in Collinson, and on his authority alone, that this coat is attributed to him; it is really the coat of Wickham, and is here marshalled with Choke, whilst in Long Ashton Church, p. 300, it is impaled with the latter; perhaps Drew was an ‘alias,’ there being several Wickhams, both Mayors and Sheriffs of Bristol at that time.

History, p. 10, line 13—Elizabeth James' monument in S. Mark's, Bristol, has a diminutive kneeling effigy high up on the wall of the S. aisle chapel, surmounted by a small shield bearing 'chequy sable & or a fess gules:' this would be one of the Winter coats; it is dated 1599.

Note 44—Gunter arms should read 'three sinister gauntlets.'

Note 45—read 'between' for 'below.'

History, p. 11, line 6—read '1636' instead of '1626.'

Line 5 from bottom—read 'fourth' instead of 'second.'

,, 3 ,,—read 'Cambell' instead of 'Campbell.'

,, 2 ,,—read 'Tidworth, Wilts,' instead of 'Tidworth, Hants.'

History, p. 12, line 12—for '1665' read '1675.'

,, , line 13—Dame Philippa married secondly Mr. Joseph Knight of Bristol and Congresbury, Som.; the fourth daughter, Philippa, line 21, married Mr. Joseph Earle.

Note 54—The tinctures of this coat should be in brackets, as they are not blazoned on the coffin.

History, p. 13, line 6—Mary May was the relict of William Allen when she married William Gore.

Line 3 from bottom—'he married 1795' should be '1798 at S. George's, Hanover Square,' &c. Last line—the date '1842' should be '1841.'

History, p. 14, line 6—the number '(4)' in brackets should be '(5),' the next '(5)' should be '(4),' '27' should be '17.' Line 7—'1823' should be '1825.'

History, p. 17, line 12—for 'Bodham' read 'Boddam.' Line 20—William Hasell was Chamberlain of Bristol 1670.

History, p. 19, line 3 from bottom—'Mrs. Mary Tooker,' see note 51 on p. 12: above the inscription on the W. wall of the Vicarage is a mantled Lozenge shield bearing two

bars; this, most probably intended to be painted, would represent her Arms, 'Sable two bars argent, in chief three plates.' Hungerford.

History, p. 21, n. 82-4—The Lyons coat should read 'Argent a chevron? sable, between three lions dormant—may be couchant as tails are erect—the two in chief respecting gules.'

History, p. 23, line 16—for 'piscina' read 'credence niche.'

History, p. 24, line 12 from bottom—for 'Filton' read 'Fitton.'

History, p. 26, line 6 from bottom—'Weekes' an error for 'Weekes.'

History, p. 27, line 18—between 'by' and 'sculptured' insert 'modern.'

History, p. 28, line 23—for 'Esq.' read 'Knt.'

History, p. 29, line 3—for '1823' read '1825,' and line 5—for '1841' read '1842.' N. 28—the 'chevron' of Arthur has been forgotten on the shield, so the quartering reads as Granville.

History, p. 30, line 6—for 'faith' read 'earth.'

History, p. 31, line 15—'Matildy.' The following extract, though perhaps a little early in date, taken from the *Glos. Arch. Transactions*, Vol. XI., p. 331, from a paper by Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B., entitled, 'Domestic Outrage in Gloucester,' might help to identify who this Matilda was. 'In 1221 Matilde de Acton was accused of murdering her husband, Richard Butler de Acton, or of conniving at the same, and was sentenced to be imprisoned for life in a Convent of the Black Nuns or Benedictines unless she could be admitted to Sempringham in Lincolnshire, founded by Gilbert de Gaunt in 1139; her father's name was Elias de Coleweye.'

History, p. 32, line 14—for 'a Crucifix' read 'the Crucifixion.'

History, p. 34, line 5—for 'we' read 'two.'

The following extract taken from *Som. & Dor. N. & Q.*, III, 265—‘The fox and Goose Inn was Burnt Down, August 13. 1800 by the servant adden fewel to the furnis.’ [This is a well known Inn on the main road from Bristol to Bridgwater]—is interesting, and tends to prove the date of the present building.

Departed — Life Isaac ogborn — 6 — Nouembe ye 11 : 1756 Ann — Smyth was bured— — Aprill ye 14 : 1757 ?Mar [really Mos-es] — Wallis was Burid— — William Uowles Died — No-
