

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PREFACE.

THE Order of BARONETS was instituted by King James the First, in the year 1611. From that period to the present time upwards of 1550 creations have taken place, of which nearly 900 have become Extinct.

It was not until more than a century had elapsed that any work was printed which gave an account of the families of Baronets or exhibited the descent of these dignities: Collins made the first attempt in 1720, and was followed by Wotton, in 1727: in 1741, the latter individual, aided by Collins, published upon a more extended scale The English Baronetage, in 4 vols. 8vo., a work of high repute, evincing both labour and research, and which has not been superseded by the efforts of subsequent writers ;-many works have since appeared treating of the Existing Baronetage, but no attempt has been made to shew the origin, or trace the descent of the numerous Titles, which have become Extinct. It may perhaps appear singular, that Wotton left so useful a work unaccomplished, as he possessed the best materials which then existed and even now exist for such a purpose,—the collections made by Peter Le Neve, esq., Norroy; a man equally distinguished for his professional learning and zeal, for his antiquarian knowledge, and an indefatigable industry in the collection of a rich and valuable collection of Manuscripts. Many difficulties probably presented themselves, independently of the great sacrifice of time required for prosecuting enquiries into the pedigrees of families which had been some years extinct in the male line. The lapse of another century has not diminished those difficulties, although it has certainly rendered such a publication still more desirable.

The Editor of the present volume has found many obstacles to check him in his pursuit, which sometimes induced him to abandon all intention of publication: after the devotion of several years to the subject, he finds it impossible to produce so perfect a work as he could wish, although limited in his present object to a mere succession of Baronets, the time of Extinction, with the relationship of each Baronet to his predecessor, and their respective marriages and dates of death.

Impressed, however, with the utility of the Work, as a Book of reference to the Genealogist, the Antiquarian, and the Lawyer, and alone able to appreciate the value of the labour which he has bestowed upon it, or to estimate the hours through which he has toiled, and the numberless ponderous volumes which he has turned over, in acquiring the information which

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these pages embody, meagre as at first view it may appear, he has determined to submit it to a candid Public, with all its defects, rather than his manuscript should be lost, in the confidence that what it does contain will not be thought unworthy of preservation, and of laying the foundation for a more improved edition.

The Editor has only to add that, notwithstanding many difficulties encountered in the progress of the work, he has been in some degree compensated in having had resources open to him, (arising from peculiar circumstances,) which have added considerably to the value and character of the matter collected. In the compilation he has consequently spared neither time, nor reasonable expense: his researches have not been confined to the successive editions of the printed Baronetages, or the published obituaries of the Historical Register, the Gentleman's Magazine, &c., to County Historics, family Memoirs, and similar works; but he has consulted attentively large manuscript collections to which he has been favoured with access, and, whenever it was necessary for the clearing up any doubtful point, examined many original authorities.

The manuscript collections of Le Neve, before referred to, are now in the rich Library of the College of Arms, where the Editor, by the liberality of its members has had free access to them,—one amongst other obligations of which he has ever been sensible, and takes this opportunity of acknowledging with the most unfeigned gratitude.


