



Moliere's Imaginary Invalid, the first show of the year, incorporated the theatre's new trend of combining dance and movement with acting. The production was an overwhelming success as the individual performances collectively made the show worthy of the community-wide praise it received, indicating that the forthcoming plays would follow along the same lines of high achievement.

Minelli's appearance on campus, with her director Alan J. Pakula, as publicity for her movie The Sterile Cuckoo attracted many curious students who were interested in hearing her viewpoints and feelings on the alienated college person-the basic theme of the film. Her intimate reflections and discussion occurred simultaneously with The Imaginary Invalid to place a garland of excitement around an otherwise routine week of the fall term.



Freshman Class Elections dragged on through the month of October, longer than the usual expectations of the candidates' constituents. Questions of legalities arose among the members of the Student Association Elections Committee through various student complaints and as a result, the outcome as to whom would emerge the Presidential and Vice-Presidential victors was delayed while thorough investigation of the issues was pursued. The arguments were placed before the student Court of General Sessions and upon appeal of the decision there and of the ethical involvements on the part of the defendent's counsellors, the case was carried to the higher Superior Court of Appeals where Chief Justice Gail Robinson and student Justices Stuart Kaufer and Luiz Simmons compiled their information to proceed with their first hearing of the term, their first matter of imposing jurisdiction since the Student Court System's initiation of last spring.

Fall Sports aroused more than the normal interest at A.U. this year. The good weather lured fans to the Baseball Diamond, the Rugby Field, the Cross Country Trails, the Soccer Field, Women's Varsity events, and Intramurals. Baseball yielded exciting moments to those who wandered to the games; the team's record of 6 wins and 8 losses seems erroneous when considering the improving performance of the team. Rugby was again the focus of much student interest; the addition of this sport to our campus last spring has made a great contribution to the athletics of A.U. The team was successful in winning its second straight championship, being undefeated in league play for the fall season. Cross Country also evoked much enthusiasm and AU hosted major meets in D.C. Soccer fans responded to the unique feeling of rooting for an AU team with numerous victories. Intramurals displayed the usual vigor that typifies them-the Knee-Football and Football seasons added to an extensive and eventful fall sports program.






# Play for more than you can afford to lose,

























## Organizations Rushed to Finish a Short Semester

WAMU, the student operated station at AU, had a year of expansion and development. In order to bring local colleges together, the Washington Intercollegiate Network was devised, sending WAMU programming to Trinity College and George Washington University, as well as receiving programs from GW. The station's broadcasting hours were expanded to nearly 24 hours a day, and news coverage of campus and world news was increased. For the November 15th Moratorium, WAMU was the anchor station of a college network of over 100 stations.

WAMU is financed by the Student Association and advertising sold by staff members. The staff is made up completely of students, whose duties range from news coverage to disk jockey and sales

The Eagle

Five or six years after an editor of The Eagle decided to "go twice a week," the paper returned to weekly publication. Along with another apparently backward step, the cut-back allowed a consolidation of effort to produce tighter editions. As student attention turned to academic governance and issues, the paper began its first regular coverage of the University Senate. In recognition of its less immediate role as a weekly, the Eagle, under the direction of Steve Behrens, adopted a pictoral front page with large-type blurbs on stories inside. Ray Avrutis modeled BVD's, Stu Kaufer and Alex Ajay needled the police education program, and professors pursued a lonely haggle over mission statements in the pages of the Eagle.

Pressure to get the news fell on two hard-working news editors, Scott Custin in the fall, and Ginnie Rhodes in the spring. Organization suffered without a managing editor in the fall, but senior Jim Lawrence returned to his old job his last semester at AU. Marty Bronstein, Fredda Zuckerman, Rose Stoll and Mike Rierstein formed the most effective and amenable ad staff in Eagle history. These and numerous other individuals made their committment, some almost unlimited,

to produce a better paper.




















## To Be or Not to Be:

## Outstanding Senior Athletes

Rich Tomford





Due to the outstanding achievement and high standards set by two of AU's senior athletes, the TALON, in conjunction with the Athletic Department, has decided to award this perennial honor to two deserving men.

Rich Tomford, from North Merrick, New York, has an amazing 48-3-1 record through four years of wrestling. As a freshman he was a runner-up in the D.C. Amateur Athletic Union meet at 145 lbs. In Tomford's sophomore year, still at 145 lbs., he was a runner-up in the Mason Dixon Conference. Last year he was the Mason Dixon Con-ference Champ at 152 lbs.

This year, as captain of the wrestling team, he led the team to its first winning season in history and the team looked for a fine performance from Rich in the M.A.C.

Championships.

Gordon Stiles, hailing from the District, was elected to the All Middle Atlantic Conference, in the foreward position, several times this year. He's only the seventh A.U. basketball player to score over 1,000 points. Stiles scored 1,012 points in his 63 game career. Over these four years he had an average of 16.1 points and 15.6 rebounds a game. He was AU's leading scorer, and the sixth leading rebounder in the Nation this year. His extraordinary ability was highlighted in the game against Georgetown in which he had 28 rebounds and in the LaSalle game in which he scored 31 points.







## SELECTED FACULTY

Dr. Donald Derby, Secretary of the University, joined the AU faculty in 1947 as an Assistant Professor of History. During his long service here (1947-1969), he served as Assistant to the President, Provost of the University, Dean of Administration, University Dean, and as Vice President: Dean of Faculties. He was named University Secretary in 1968.

In this position, he served as Secretary of the University (Faculty) Senate and as AU's Faculty—Personnel Records Officer. His status placed him in the University

Cabinet.

Dr. Derby was born in New York City on May 14, 1908. He received his B.A. from Bowdoin College in Maine in 1931, and earned both his Master's and his Ph.D. at Harvard University. He was a mem-

ber of Phi Beta Kappa.

From 1942-46 he rose to the rank of Captain with the Army Security Agency, receiving a War Department Staff Citation for "exceptional resourcefulness and organizational ability." Upon his discharge from military service in 1946, he joined the National Archives in Washington as a re-

searcher and writer.

On July 10, 1969 Donald Derby died while vacationing with his family in Massachusetts. The following day President George Williams eulogized Dr. Derby in his message which stated, "Dr. Derby served the University loyally and well as a faculty member and administrator since 1947. His death is a profound personal loss to us all as well as a great loss to the University and to the academic world at large . . . All who have been priviliged to work closely with him will miss his friendship, his deep commitment to this University, and his warm relationship with colleagues and students.'

It is in respect to his memory that we dedicate and establish this new section in the 1970 TALON honoring those previous and present members of the AU Faculty who exemplify the high achievements and characteristics of Dr. Derby.



After receiving school-wide nominations, a special screening committee of administrators and students discussed the 45 nominees and 10 were chosen to appear as SELECTED FACULTY for 1970. These people are being honored for their distinguished role in the university community and are recognized on the basis of their perception, enthusiasm, and most important, their continued interest in their work and students and in campus affairs.
