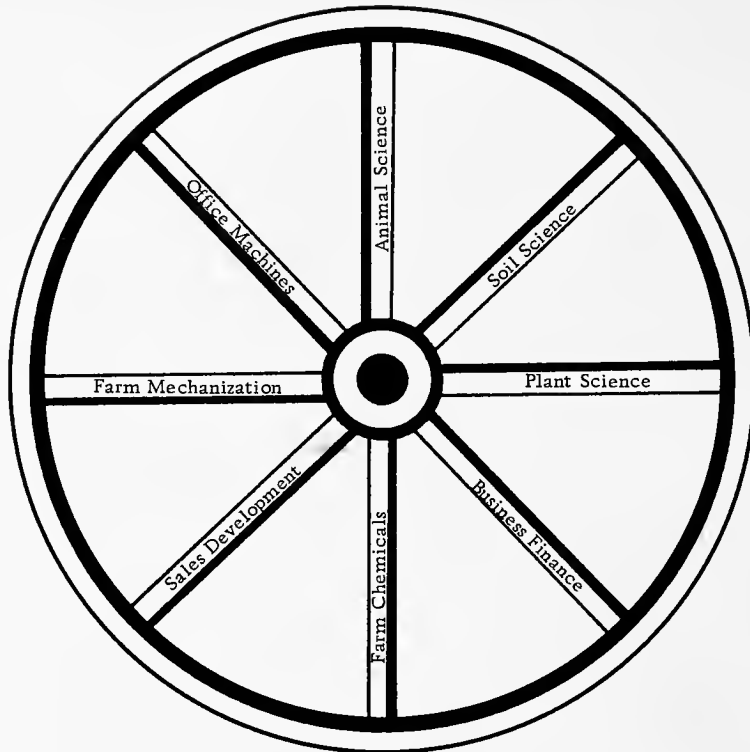
The Learning Lab helps to provide students the opportunity of a more comprehensive instructional program to fit individual needs. In the Lab students are able to study individually at both remedial and supplementary levels. The instructional procedure is further oriented to meet individual needs by allowing students to establish study schedules that are convenient for them during the hours the Lab is open.

Basically, four groups of students study in the Lab: (1) Those preparing to enter a technical institute or college, (2) those currently enrolled in a curriculum who need and desire study at levels or in areas not covered in the classroom, (3) those who desire general interest study and (4) those preparing to take the high school equivalency test.

Agricultural Technology Education consists of instruction that increases the competence of technicians engaged in the non-farming agricultural occupations. Emphasis is placed on the development of specific knowledge, understanding, concepts, attitudes, and skill essential for the technician in a non-farming agricultural occupation, or in the management role in the farm operations.

The curriculum is based upon a careful analysis of the educational needs of students who expect to be employed in agriculture or non-farming agricultural businesses, and the needs of these type of industries. Subjects in the curriculum are intended to train the student for employment in a variety of job opportunities in agricultural business, rather than for one specialized job classification.

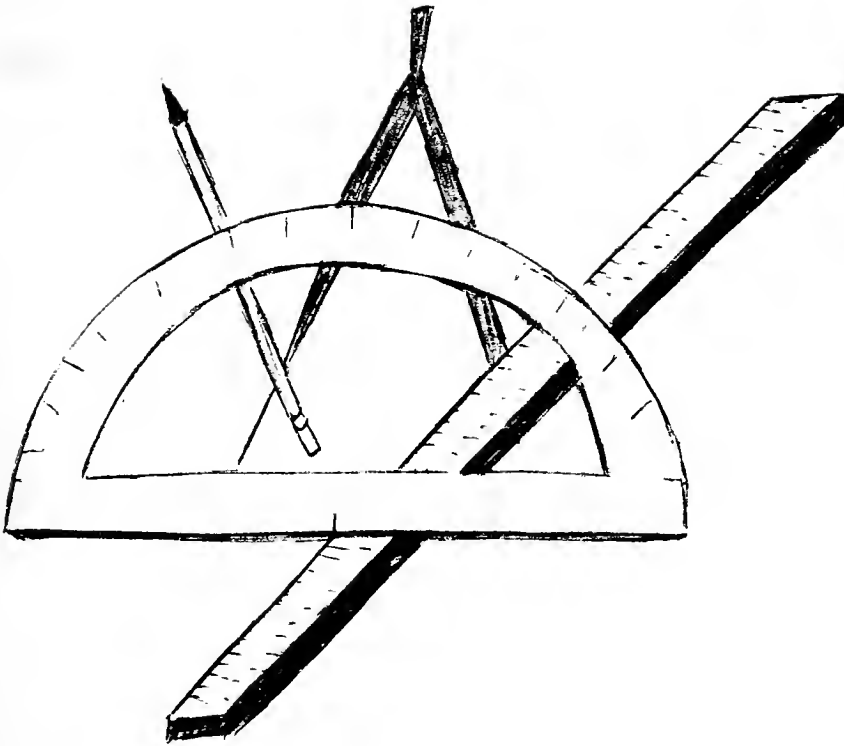

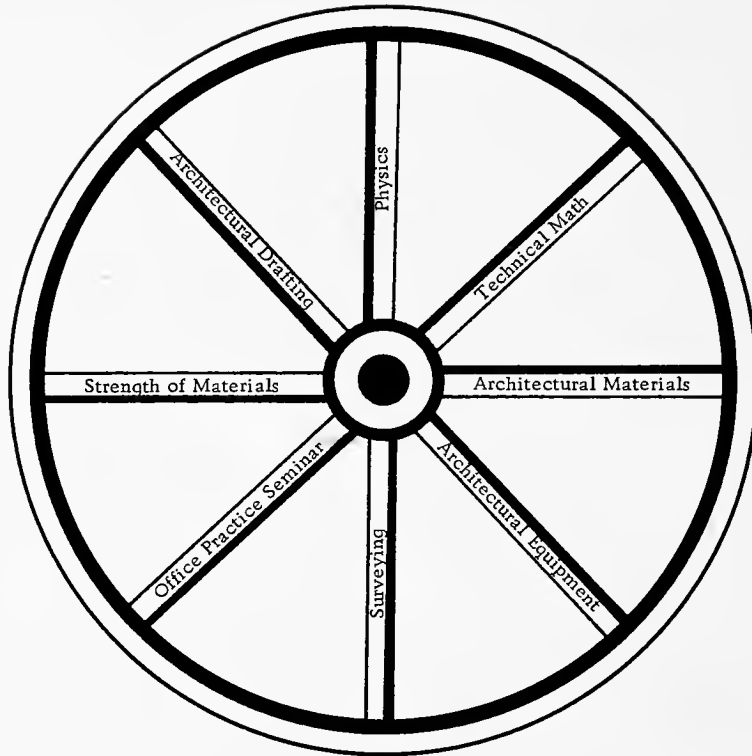

The architectural draftsman must be able to prepare clear, complete, and accurate drawings and plans for schools, residences, hospitals, shopping centers, churches, etc. Some of the detailed work involved in this profession includes the ability to establish dimensions of parts, materials to be used, the relation of one part to another, and the relation of the various parts to the whole structure.

In order to carry out these duties, the architectural draftsman must possess skill in the use of drafting tools, making statistical charts, and making finished designs from sketches. In addition, he must have an over-all knowledge of various machines, engineering practices, mathematics, building materials, and the ability to communicate effectively with others.
