PHARMACY HALL ADDITION GROUNDBREAKING

September 19, 2008



On Friday, September 19, 2008, Dean Eddington invited students, faculty, and staff to the official roundbreaking for the Pharmacy Hall Addition of the School of Pharmacy. After fighting year after year for money to fund the addition to our school, the legislation finally passed and the school received 62 million in state funds. To celebrate, Maryland governor Martin O'Malley was invited to speak at he ceremony. Pharmacy Hall Addition will allow our school to expand its enrollments, addressing the shortage of pharmacists in the workforce. The building will house larger lecture halls, expanded experiential learning facilities, research laboratories, and state of the art technologies. It is scheduled to be complete in the fall of 2010.

A conversation with Dr. T:

What do you think your impact on the students and the School of Pharmacy has been?

ve been a one trick pony. My career was and continues to be ocused on the causes and treatments for addiction and trying to lefine practice roles for pharmacists in this disease space. I have vitnessed a growing level of interest in this area among students n terms of wanting to acquire both knowledge and practice kills as well as being sensitive to the personal tragedy and tigmatizing aspects of the condition. So maybe my career has wakened students to the need for these services and the practice opportunities that await them in this field.





Is there anything you would like to communicate to the students?

My belief is that God guides our work and we should give ourselves over to His calling. It may be presumptuous of me to assume that we can know His calling, but I can urge students to pursue and accept only those positions that they will perform with great enthusiasm and passion.

Remain professionally connected. While every student eagerly looks forward to graduation day, it is a poignant moment to cross the stage and realize that the years spent in the caldron of education forge ties that last a lifetime. An active professional life keeps those associations fresh and vibrant.

Also, give time to family and charitable service. As the old saying goes, there is none who, in his or her last days will say, "Gee - I should have spent more time at the office."

What have you enjoyed about your time here?

Without question the most enjoyable part of my career and my time at the school has been the joy ind privilege of interacting with students, especially those who participated in the SCODAE program. This connection was very strong, the commitment was (and still is) very deep. When 1 considered changing jobs 1 knew that I would miss that aspect of teaching, as indeed 1 have.

What are your current plans for the future?

Although I continue to be fully employed in my new position in industry I remain very active in he program for impaired pharmacists (Pharmacists Education and Advocacy Council PEAC) and foresee spending more time enjoying my family and sailing.

Class of 2011

The Shady Grove student population is growing thanks to the additional forty first year students that attended the Shady Grove campus this fall. It was an exciting change to have more of a representation of the School of Pharmacy in Rockville, MD. The Shady Grove campus now has an equal mixture of first and second year student pharmacists. A typical week for Shady Grove students requires students to be on campus an average of two to four days a week. All of the lectures are available asynchronously through mediasite. Contrary to the belief that distance learning would make the students strangers to each other, the class of 2011 is a close-knit group of people. While students are not required to be on campus every day, many students still come to study in groups. While being pioneers of the distance learning program, the students have developed a sense of camaraderie and lasting friendships. While the exam schedule and course load kept second year students busy, they still managed to have some fun. The first major social event with second and first year students was a Washington Nationals game in D.C.

The fall of 2008 also marked the opening of the new practice lab at the Shady Grove campus. Before the construction of the new lab, Shady Grove students had all labs on the Baltimore campus. The new lab is a spacious area with 2,000 square feet. The practice lab consists of a simulated pharmacy and counseling suite. The model pharmacy has 14 order entry terminals for students to practice entering prescriptions and screening for drug interactions. The large counseling area provides a space for the students to develop their counseling and medication therapy management skills with mock patients.




