






## INTRODUCTION

This is the day of child-saving race cultivation, and health talks. The Pennsylvania State Commissioner recently said in one of his reports: "No person or nation can live on itself. The highest degree of physical health comes only with a healthy brain. When one begins to live on one's self, death follows."

The same eternal law holds good in the spiritual world. The brain cannot attain to the highest degree of efficiency and of power without a healthy heart.

A healthy head, a healthy heart, and a healthy soul, each beating in harmony with the other, is absolutely necessary to a wholly healthy man, woman, or child. For just as the whole body is sick and weakly when any one of its members is injured or diseased, so the whole man is sick when any part, head, heart, or soul, is in any way affected or incapacitated.

To be a well-balanced, healthy, and robust human being, then, we must not only eat and

sleep regularly and temperately, for the good of the physical body; we must read and study and work rationally for the proper development of the brain. We must also see to it that we get wholesome and nourishing food regularly for the growth and development of the soul's spiritual self.

This brings the only kind of thinking, at all worth our while. This is "thinking right" for time and for eternity. This is the only kind of thinking which is "right thinking"—"the thinking right" which is "living right." Thinking from a purely intellectual point of view is a one-sided thinking. It is a matter of the head only. It is not instinct with the life of the whole of one's being. It is, therefore, far from the wholesome process of "thinking right." For "thinking right" can only be accomplished when head, heart, and soul are involved, each in its due order, in bringing thought to fruition. Then, when thus brought forth, heart and soul, as well as mind, give it their quota of life. The feelings as well as cold intellect enter into it, and "living right" of necessity follows.

Now all the political grafters and bad people were coming near Jesus to listen to him. And both the Pharisees and the scribes complained, saying: "This man welcomes bad people, and eats with them."

So Jesus spoke to them this parable, saying: "What man of you, who has a hundred sheep, and has lost one of them, doesn't leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness, and go after the lost one till he finds it? And when he has found it, he puts it on his shoulders, rejoicing, and when he comes home, he calls his friends, and his neighbors together, saying to them: Rejoice with me, because I have found my sheep which was lost.

"I say to you, that in the same way, there will be joy in heaven over one bad person who changes his mind, more than over ninety-nine

good people such as have no need of a change of mind.

“Or what woman who has ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doesn’t light a lamp, and sweep the house, and search carefully till she finds it. And when she has found it she calls her women friends and neighbors together, saying: Rejoice with me because I have found the piece which I had lost. In the same way, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one bad person who changes his mind.”

And he said: “A certain man had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father: Father, give me the share of the property which is coming to me.

“So he divided the estate for them.

“And not many days after, the younger son gathered everything together, and went abroad to a distant land, and there squandered his property by a ruinous style of living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine spread through that land, and he began to be in want. And he went and engaged himself to one of the citizens of that land; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. And he longed to feed himself with the bean pods on which the swine were feeding. And no one gave to him.

“But he came to himself, and said: How many of my father’s hired men have more bread than they need, and I am here starving to death! I

will rise and go to my father, and will say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in your sight, and I am no longer fit to be called your son. Make me as one of your hired men.

“So he rose and went to his father.

“But while he was still a great way off, his father saw him, and it touched his heart, and he ran, and fell on his neck, and gave him a hearty kiss.

“And the son said to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in your sight, and am no more worthy to be called your son.

“But the father said to his slaves: Be quick. Bring out a robe—the best you can find—and put it on him; and give him a ring for his finger, and shoes for his feet; and bring the young bull that has been fattening, and kill it, and let us eat and be merry. Because this son of mine was dead and is alive again. He was lost, and is found.

“So they began to be merry.

“But his older son was in the field; and as he came nearer and nearer the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the slaves, and asked what these things meant. And he said to him: Your brother has come, and your father has killed the young bull that has been fattening, because he has received him back safe and sound.

“But he was angry, and would not go in. So his father came out and begged him. But he answered and said to his father: Listen! These

you would have known my Father, also. Hereafter you will learn to know him, in fact, you have seen him."

Philip said to him: "Lord, show us the Father, and we are satisfied."

Jesus said to him: "Have I been so long with you, and yet you have not recognized me, Philip? He who has seen me has seen the Father! How do you say: Show us the Father? Do you not believe I am in the Father, and the Father in me? The words I am speaking to you, I am not speaking from myself, but the Father dwelling in me is doing his deeds. Believe that I am in the Father, and the Father in me; or else believe me on account of the deeds themselves. Most truly I tell you: He who believes in me will also do the deeds which I do. And greater deeds than these will he do; because I am going to the Father. And whatever you shall ask in my name that will I do; that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you shall ask anything in my name I will do it.

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments, and I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper to be with you forever—the Spirit of Truth, which the world cannot receive because it doesn't see it, nor recognize it. But you recognize it; because it remains with you and will be in you.

"I will not leave you orphans. I am coming to you. Yet a little while and the world will see

me no more. But you will see me; because I live, and you shall live. On that day you will recognize that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you.

“He who has my commandments, and keeps them, is the one who loves me. And he who loves me, will be loved by my Father, and I will love him, and will make myself known to him.

“These things have I spoken to you while still present with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, which the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of everything I have said to you.

“Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives, do I give to you.

“Don’t let your heart be troubled, nor let it be cowardly.

“You heard me say to you: I am going away, and I am coming to you. If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father: because the Father is greater than I.

Now faith is confidence in things hoped for, a conviction with reference to things not seen. For in it our fathers had noble testimony borne to them.

By faith we understand that the worlds were created and still exist at the command of God, so that what we see has not been made out of visible things.

By faith Abel offered to God a more accept-

able sacrifice than Cain, and through it he was informed that he was righteous, God testifying concerning his gifts. And through it, though dead, he still speaks.

By faith Enoch was taken from earth so that he might not see death, and was not found, because God had taken him. For, before God had taken him, he was given to understand that he pleased God. But without faith it is impossible to please him. For he who comes to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him.

By faith Noah, divinely instructed about things not yet seen, showing reverence for God, prepared an ark to the saving of his family. Through this he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

By faith Abraham, when he was called, obeyed; when he was called, that is, to go out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going.

By faith Abraham, when he was put to the test, offered up Isaac. Yes, he who had gladly received the promises, was on the point of offering up his only begotten son; that is, he to whom it was said: In Isaac shall a seed be called for you. For he considered that God is able to raise up, even from the dead; and, figuratively speaking, he did receive him from the dead.

By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau even with reference to things to come.

By faith Jacob, when he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, as he leaned on the top of his staff.

By faith Joseph, when he was approaching his end, made mention of the departure of the children of Israel; and gave directions about his bones.

By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months by his parents, because they saw he was a beautiful child; and they were not afraid of the king's decree.

By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; choosing rather to be abused with the people of God, than to enjoy the short-lived pleasures of sin; considering the reproach of the Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt. For he looked away to the recompense of reward.

By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king. For he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

By faith he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of the blood, that the destroyer of the first born might not touch them.

By faith they passed through the Red Sea as by dry land. But when the Egyptians tried to do this, they were swallowed up.

By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they had been surrounded for seven days.

By faith Rahab the harlot was not slain with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies with peace.

And what more shall I say? For the time will fail me, if I tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah; about David and Samuel, and the prophets; who through faith conquered kingdoms, brought about righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, controlled the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, from weakness were made strong, became valiant in war, put armies of foreigners to flight. Women received their dead back to life. And others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Others were cruelly mocked and beaten, yes, more, they were put in chains and imprisoned.

They were stoned, they were sawn to pieces, were tempted, were put to the sword. They went about in sheepskins, in goatskins. They were destitute, afflicted, ill-treated.

Of them the world was not worthy.

They wandered in deserts and mountains, and hid in caves and holes in the ground.

And though all these had noble testimony borne to them through their faith, they did not receive the promise, since God had provided some better things for us, that they, apart from us, should not be made perfect.

### WHEN YOU ARE ALL OUT OF SORTS

For this reason, then, let us, also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin which entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race which is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the prince and perfecter of the faith, who, for the joy which was set before him, endured the cross, despised shame, and has taken his seat on the right hand of the throne of God. For, if you would not become weary and faint-hearted, consider him who endured such hostility of bad people against himself.

Your resistance has not yet come to the spilling of blood, in your struggle against sin. And you have forgotten the encouragement which comes to you as to sons.

My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord,

Nor faint when you are tried by him.  
For whom the Lord loves he disciplines,  
And chastises every son whom he acknowledges.

It is for discipline you endure. It is as with sons God is dealing with you. For who is the son whom his father does not discipline. But if you have had no discipline of which all have had a share, then you are bastards, and not sons.

And further, we used to have our natural fathers to discipline us, and we respected them. Shall we not much rather submit to the Father of spirits and live? For they disciplined us for a few days as they thought best. But he does it for our good, so that we may partake of his holiness. Now, at the time, no discipline seems to be pleasant, but painful. But afterward it yields peaceable fruit of goodness for those who have been trained by it.

For this reason, strengthen the weakened hands, and the palsied knees, and make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be made worse, but may rather be cured.

Strive earnestly to be at peace with every one, and to attain to that holiness, without which no one will see the Lord; taking care that no one is falling away from the favor of God; that no root of bitterness is springing up, and troubling you, and by it many are being defiled; that there be no fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one mess of food sold his own birthright. For you know that even when he afterward desired to obtain the blessing, he was rejected. For he found no way to change his father's mind, though he begged earnestly for the blessing with tears.

See that you do not refuse to listen to him who speaks. For, if they did not escape when they refused to listen to him who warned them on earth, much less shall we escape, if we turn

away from him who warns us from heaven. His voice, at that time, shook the earth. But now he has promised, saying: Yet again will I once for all cause not only the earth to tremble, but also heaven. And this expression: Yet again once for all, has reference to the removing of what can be shaken, as of what has been made, that what can not be shaken may remain. For this reason, since we are receiving a rule which can not be shaken, let us be thankful, and so offer services pleasing to God with reverence and awe. For our God is a consuming fire.

earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. .

### WHEN YOU HAVE SINNED

Jesus addressed this parable to some who believed in their own goodness, and treated every one else with scorn.

“Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a political grafter. The Pharisee stood, and prayed to himself in this way: O God, I thank you I’m not just like the rest of men; thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this political grafter. I fast twice a week. I give a tenth of all I get.

“But the political grafter, standing at a distance, would not raise so much as his eyes to heaven, but kept striking his breast, saying: God, be merciful to me the sinner!

“I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled. But he who humbles himself will be exalted.”

As Jesus was coming near Jericho a certain blind man was sitting beside the road begging. So hearing a crowd going by he inquired what this meant. And they told him, Jesus the Nazarene was going by. So he cried out, saying: “Jesus, son of David, take pity on me!”

But those who were going before sternly told him to be quiet. But he called out the louder a great deal: "Son of David, take pity on me!"

Then Jesus stood, and directed him to be brought to him. And when he had come near, he asked him: "What do you want me to do for you?"

He said: "Lord, I want to recover my sight."

So Jesus said to him: "Recover your sight. Your faith has cured you."

And instantly he recovered his sight, and followed him, glorifying God. And when all the people saw it they gave praise to God.

As Jesus was passing by, he saw a man blind from his birth.

And his disciples asked him, saying: "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

Jesus answered: "Neither did this man sin, nor his parents; but this happened that God's deeds might be made known in him. We must do the deeds of him who sent me, while it is day. The night is coming, when no one can work. So long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

When he had spoken this way he spat on the ground, made clay of the spittle, anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay, and said to him: "Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash." Siloam means Sent.

So he went away, and washed, and came, seeing.

Then the neighbors, and those who had formerly known him by sight as a beggar, said: "Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?"

Some said: "This is the man."

Others said: "No, but he is like him."

The man himself said: "I am the man."

So they said to him: "How, then, were your eyes opened?"

He answered: "The man called Jesus made clay, and anointed my eyes, and said to me: Go to Siloam, and wash. So I went away and washed, and regained my sight."

They said to him: "Where is he?"

He said: "I don't know."

They took the man who had been blind to the Pharisees.

Now the day Jesus made the clay, and opened his eyes was the Sabbath.

So again the Pharisees also asked him how he had regained his sight.

And he said to them: "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and I see."

So some of the Pharisees said: "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the Sabbath."

But others said: "How can a man who is bad give such signs?"

There was a division among them.

So they again said to the blind man: "What

do you say about him, seeing he opened your eyes?"

He said: "He is a prophet."

The Jews, however, did not believe about him, that he had been blind, and had recovered his sight, till they had called the parents of him who had recovered his sight, and asked them, saying: "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How, then, does he now see?"

His parents answered, and said: "We know this is our son, and that he was born blind. But by what means he now sees, we do not know; or who opened his eyes, we do not know. Ask him. He is of age. He shall speak for himself."

His parents said this, because they were afraid of the Jews. For the Jews had already agreed, that if any one should acknowledge Jesus as the Christ, he should be excommunicated. That is why his parents said: "He is of age. Ask him."

So, a second time, they called the man who had been blind, and said to him: "Give God the honor. We know this is a bad man."

So he answered: "If he is a bad man, I don't know. One thing I do know, that I was blind, and now I see."

So they said to him: "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"

He answered them: "I just now told you, and you didn't listen. Why do you want to hear it again? You also don't want to become his disciples, do you?"

Then they reviled him, and said: "You are that man's disciple. But we are Moses' disciples. We know God has spoken to Moses. But as for this fellow we don't know where he comes from."

The man answered, and said to them: "Well, that is strange, indeed, that you don't know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. We know God does not listen to bad people. But if any one is a worshipper of God, and does his will, to him he listens. Since the world began it has not been heard that any one has opened the eyes of one born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."

They answered, and said to him: "You were born totally depraved, and do you teach us?"

They excommunicated him.

Jesus heard that they had excommunicated him; so finding him, he said: "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"

He answered, and said: "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?"

Jesus said to him: "You have both seen him, and it is the man who is talking with you."

He said: "I believe, sir." And he did him homage.

Then Jesus said: "For judgment did I come into this world, that those who do not see, may see. And that those who see, may become blind."

Then some of the Pharisees who were with

him heard these words, and said to him: "We also are not blind, are we?"

Jesus said to them: "If you were blind, you would have no sin. But, as it is, you say: 'We see.' So your sin remains."

Luke 18:9-14, and 18:35-43, and John 9.

My brothers, don't many of you become teachers, knowing that we will receive heavier judgment. For we make many mistakes, all of us.

If any one does not offend in word, he is a perfect man, able to bridle his whole body also.

Now when we put the horses' bits into their mouths that they may obey us, we turn about their whole body also.

Look also at the ships. Large as they are, and driven by rough winds, they are controlled by a very small rudder, and steered in whatever direction the man at the helm may determine.

In the same way, also, the tongue is a little member, and boasts great things. See how great a wood a little fire sets ablaze! And the tongue is a fire. Among the members of our body it proves itself a very world of mischief. It contaminates the whole body, and sets the machinery of life afire, and is set on fire by hell. For

every kind of beasts and birds, of creeping things, and things in the sea, is tamed, and has been tamed by mankind; but the tongue can no one tame. It is an uncontrollable evil. It is full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father; and with it we curse men, who are made according to the likeness of God. Out of the same mouth come blessing and cursing.

My brother, these things ought not to be thus. The wisdom which is from above is first pure, then peaceable, forbearing, persuasive, full of compassion and good deeds, impartial, sincere. And the seed, of which goodness is the fruit, is sown in peace by those who make peace.

James 3.

I beg you, then, I the prisoner of the Lord, to walk worthily of the call with which you were called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with each other in Love, earnestly striving to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

To each one of us has grace been given in proportion to the extent of the free gift of the Christ.

Be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who, in accordance with God, has been created in goodness and holiness of the truth.

Relieving the necessities of Christians; practicing hospitality.

Bless those who persecute you.

Bless and don't curse.

Rejoice with those who rejoice.

Don't become wise in your own conceits.

Render to no one evil for evil.

Care for what is noble in the sight of all men.

If it be possible, so far as you are concerned,

Live in peace with all men.

Don't avenge yourselves, dearly beloved ones,

But give place to wrath. For it is written;

Vengeance is mine, I will repay,

Says the Lord.

But if your enemy is hungry, feed him.

If he is thirsty, give him a drink.
