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PREFATORY NOTE

The Third General Catalogue has been prepared mainly on the same plan as the editions of 1882 and 1887. It was intended that a catalogue should be issued every five years, but this has not been practicable. The present edition owes its existence to the suggestion of Hon. Richard Cutts Shannon, LL.D., class of 1862, who has generously assumed the entire cost of publication.

The earliest catalogue of graduates bears the date of 1825 and is printed in Latin. Other issues followed at irregular intervals, becoming triennials in 1851, and ceasing in 1878.

The first catalogue of officers and students was printed in October, 1824, by William Hastings, at Waterville. It is an octavo pamphlet of eight pages with an enrolment of fifty-two students and ten in the theological school. The Faculty included the President, the Professor of Theology, a Professor of Languages, who was also Lecturer in Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, and two recent graduates as Tutors.

An examination of the file of catalogues shows that many students received instruction here for several years but for various reasons did not graduate. A list of these is presented, compiled from the annual catalogues. As no previous attempt has been made to record the history of these non-graduates, the facts obtained have necessarily been brief, often only the name and residence. The large number of these students shows that the college has contributed to the education of many more than its regular graduates. The names of those who left college to enter the army in war times, are here recorded.

The Editor is grateful for the aid rendered by many individuals in the gathering of statistics, and especially to Mr. Walter L. Hubbard, '96, to Mr. Frank W. Alden, '98, and to the records kept by the several college Fraternities.


