

*Message of the President***HERBERT D. ALLMAN**

TO THE

THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL MEETING

OF

THE NATIONAL FARM SCHOOL

OCTOBER 7, 1928

Every Presidential campaign is an important educational period in national issues. The paramount subject in the minds of the American people today is agriculture. Newspapers throughout the country are discussing the farm situation. Both major political parties promise relief. In his acceptance speech Herbert Hoover said, "Farming presents not one, but many problems." In this he is right, for there are economic conditions which may take years to adjust. Better living and working conditions on the farm, efficiency in production, and marketing of farm products are not all the factors involved.

The modernization, rehabilitation and repopulation of farming communities may be a difficult task, yet successfully accomplished will prove as essential as our present Federal Reserve System which regulates and controls the flow of capital.

If, as is stated, the American farmer is compelled to sell his major crops below cost of production, it must adversely effect the manufacturer and merchant. Any depression in agriculture is felt by the business man, because of shrinkage in the farmer's purchasing power. Therefore, if the proposed plans for placing the farmer's business on an economic equality with industry can be carried out, independent of bounty or Federal assistance, then this important industry will show a healthy betterment.

Those not directly interested in agriculture, do not perhaps understand the farm situation. They do not fully appreciate modern farm life and what it means for the development of our best citizenship, otherwise there would be more institutions like The National Farm School endeavoring to encourage young men to take up farming.

In its early history this great Republic was mainly developed because of the easy opportunity for farm ownership. Then land was plentiful and free to young men with energy and agricultural training, but that opportunity does not exist today, notwithstanding we have thousands of acres of good farm land lying idle in every State.

It has been said not 5 per cent. of agricultural college graduates engage in farming, no doubt due to the fact that they have not the ownership opportunity necessary to encourage them in this vocation, and are possibly influenced against it by the existing unfavorable attitude of the public.

This attitude arises not because of any decline in the development of agriculture, but from the fact that farmers have not been able to make the big profits which other industries, having the advantage of mass production and other quick turnover facilities, have made. Technically and mechanically, agriculture has made progress equal to that of any other industry, but the public possessed with the idea that large earnings are essential to modern business success, and observing that agriculture has not held its own in that direction, have been led to believe there is something fundamentally wrong. Farming when understood and scientifically handled, will not only bring fair returns, but is conducive to a happy, healthy and independent existence.

It is a moot question whether the attempt to have the government guarantee farming profits has a tendency to discredit the business standing of the industry. Will not the situation successfully solve itself when the attitude of the people changes, confidence is restored and agriculturists scientifically trained, approach the problem along efficient business lines?

The National Farm School is unique—it goes further than agricultural colleges, by giving its students an all-round agricultural training, not only in classroom theory, but actual farm practice on our fields of over a thousand acres.

We hope the day is not far distant when the creation of a Revolving Fund, so often stressed by Mr. Abraham Erlanger and our Board of Trustees, will enable us to help worthy graduates purchase their own land. This coupled with the training received at our School should place our graduates among the successful farmers of the future.

Independent of improvements under government supervision, the possibilities of successful farming are becoming better. The development of farm machinery and its application, advanced

scientific methods of increasing farm efficiency, increment of acre value on all good land, the automobile, telephone and radio now within the reach of farmers, are all factors tending towards this betterment.

Agriculture must expand to meet the growing need for larger production, to feed and clothe a steadily increasing population. This expansion need not be in the direction of greater acreage, but rather in better farms, better cultivated fields and a better agricultural community. In this work The National Farm School is eminently qualified to assist in no small degree.

Our School impresses upon the youth of the land that farming is not to be considered an occupation of secondary importance. The farm offers splendid opportunity for the man fitted by temperament and education for that kind of life. It is a great laboratory for the development of leadership and independent thought—its potentialities are unlimited. A school such as ours, setting before it a definite goal, that of preparing city boys for agricultural life, has earned a place in the economic and educational schemes of this great country.

The National Farm School conforms to the best educational practice. It aims to develop not only ability in agriculture, but also sound character, good citizenship and breadth of view. Teaching the boy how to farm intelligently gives him a better understanding of its real economies—of the laws of supply and demand—of the principals of co-operative marketing, farm credits, etc. The infusion of city-bred boys to the farm is of distinct value to the farming communities, just as city life has been benefited by the infusion of the country-bred youth. City life has taught the boy many things which can be applied towards the progress of farming.

The importance of our institution was stressed by Mr. Aaron Sapiro, the well-known agricultural organizer. He sees in The National Farm School the nucleus of forces that are needed to place agriculture on the economic plane to which it belongs as the fundamental industry of the United States. Mr. Sapiro was our speaker at the Founder's Day Exercises last June, and graciously offers to give us a series of Lectures on Farm Economy. This should prove of inestimable value to our students.

Friends and supporters have rallied to our cause as never before. A notable gift is that made by our friend Mr. J. Bunford Samuel, of a valuable piece of property at Sea Girt, N. J. Mr. Abraham Erlanger, our friend and patron, has again contributed

liberally of his means, and we are further indebted for his wise counsel and advice in our many problems. Other bequests have come to us during the year from friends and Federations throughout the country. We plead for liberal consideration from new Federations now incorporating.

Our enrollment today is the largest in the School's history. Applicants for admission were in larger numbers and better qualified than ever before. It is regrettable that we can admit but a limited number on account of insufficient funds. Temperament playing an important part in the success or failure of the farmer, applicants must prove a love of the soil and a sincere desire to follow agriculture as a vocation, otherwise we discourage their admittance.


As we are responsible for the education, physical and moral well-being of our students 24 hours a day, the year round, the smooth running of the School speaks well for the character of our students and the one hundred per cent. attention of our Faculty.

The remarkable progress we show is due in part to the personal interest of our active Board of Trustees, as well as to the experience and qualifications brought to the work by our able Dean, Mr. C. L. Goodling. His years of experience and great success in farm management, his understanding of the science of raising crops and cattle, and improvements introduced in the methods of instruction and revised curriculum, all help to turn out better trained students and increased yields of crops.


Through the generosity of friends, we have secured some pure-bred imported stock—a nucleus for starting herds of Jerseys and Guernseys. These in addition to our Holstein and grade cows give students a broader training in handling different breeds.

The uniformed School band of thirty pieces, funds for which were donated by Mr. Charles Kline, of Allentown, Messrs. Hirsch and Weintraub and other Trustees, has won enthusiastic response from the student body. This band, under the leadership of Philadelphia's outstanding bandmaster, Lieut. Jos. Frankel, who volunteered his services without expense to the School, has made such remarkable progress after only four months' training, that it has already accepted invitations to play at various public functions.

The spiritual advance and ethical culture of our students have our careful consideration, as the foundations of all true

education. This work is augmented through the help of the Women's Committee, under the leadership of Mrs. Jos. Krauskopf, greatly assisted by Rabbi Julian B. Feibelman, who has volunteered his services as School Chaplain.

The new athletic field recently dedicated and presented to the School by our Alumni Association is a practical gift. Formal Entrance Gates, the gift of our Treasurer, Mr. I. H. Silverman, are now being erected where the State Highway crosses our road.

The most urgent need of the School today is a Mechanics Building where students can be taught shop and farm mechanics. Other needed improvements are a power plant, good roads and an adequate Administration Building, held in abeyance because of lack of funds. We hope some kind friends may find it possible to make one or more of these an actuality.

Gatherings of important agricultural, educational and civic organizations have been held on our grounds—mutually beneficial to students and visiting groups. Recreational facilities and athletic events have been many and successful. The football team distinguished itself by an almost 100 per cent. victory, adding new honors to the School colors.

Our beautiful library, the memorial to our Founder, continues to grow in usefulness for reference and recreational reading for students, as well as for friends and neighbors.

The National Farm School, non-sectarian in scope—founded and carried on by Jewish idealism and financial support has been called "A great Jewish tribute to an American ideal." In thus helping to create an interest in the development and stabilization of agriculture, the Jew is making a real contribution to America.

We hope to merit your continued approval and support, in the further upbuilding and expansion of this School, making it possible to accept a large proportion of applicants, thus giving them the opportunity to obtain this means of an independent career on the soil.

Included in this summary of the past year, we gratefully tender an expression of appreciation and thanks to the men and women of our Board, its various committees, our worthy Faculty, loyal office staff and to all who have helped to make possible this year's remarkable record of accomplishment and progress.

TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL GRADUATION**March 18, 1928**

The Twenty-eighth Annual Graduation Exercises of The National Farm School were held on Sunday afternoon March 18, 1928, in Lasker Hall, on the School campus. Thirty-five students from various parts of the United States received the School's diploma for completion of the three-year course in practical and scientific agriculture.

Mr. Harry B. Hirsh, Chairman of the Board, presided. The Graduation Address was made by Dr. Louis Wolsey, of Philadelphia. Joseph F. Lynch delivered the Salutatory Address. The Valedictory was offered by Benjamin Goradetzky. One of the features of the Exercises was the Presentation of the Hoe by Meyer F. Hurwitz to the President of the new Senior Class. Dean C. L. Goodling presented the graduates to President Herbert D. Allman, who then awarded the diplomas and prizes. The Meyer Rothstein Prize for the highest scholarship was won by Benjamin Goradetzky; the Massinger Veterinary Prize by Morris Namen. The following graduates received prizes for excellence in departmental work: Frederick Blumer, Jos. I. Brown and Bernard Rosenman for General Agriculture; Joseph F. Lynch for Farm Mechanics; Wm. Fox for Horticulture; Martin Greenberg for Poultrying; Benj. F. Graffman for Landscaping; Harlan T. Huff for Dairying; Harry M. Harris for Floriculture.





**FOUNDER'S DAY AND THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL TREE
CONSECRATION EXERCISES****Sunday, June 3, 1928**

Hundreds of friends of The National Farm School assembled on the School campus to participate in the Founder's Day Exercises, on Sunday, June 3, 1928, which were made the more inspiring by their setting in a beautiful, natural outdoor auditorium, shaded by stately trees. The ceremonies marked the thirty-first anniversary of the founding of the School.

Mr. Aaron Sapiro, internationally prominent lawyer and organizer of agricultural interests, was the principal speaker. He described the School as "The greatest single contribution to American agriculture today." Mr. Sapiro said he came to pay a tribute to the founder of the School, the late Rev. Dr. Joseph Krauskopf, of Philadelphia. "I was amazed when I learned that there is such an institution as The National Farm School," Mr. Sapiro declared, "and I was further amazed when I learned that because of insufficient support, the School has not been able to take all the students that have applied for admittance. People of all creeds have a real opportunity to support a project that can contribute more to American agriculture today, than any single thing in the history of the country. The financial support should be ten times as great as received at the present time. The founding of this School, by a great Jewish leader, who opened its doors to all classes and creeds, has made this School the outstanding success that it is."

"Agriculture is the fundamental industry of the United States today," he said a little later in his address. "There cannot be any one thing wrong in agriculture that does not affect our whole fabric of life. Rural life in the United States is far different from city life, and we must understand it, to be successful. Farmers must learn more than mere production, if agriculture is to keep its place in American life. What happened in recent years is that big business of the whole world came upon group production all of a sudden, except the farming industry. The farmers of America have not as yet discovered group farming, and in bringing out this discovery is where The National Farm School can play a part. This School, more than any other in America today, should be teaching group farming,

so that when graduates leave here they cannot only produce and market properly, but they can go around from one farm to another and be able to organize the farmers in co-operative agriculture. This School is one in the United States where there is a real place to do an unusual service in agriculture, a school where a boy should be able to produce crops and, greater than that, put business into agriculture. The farmers of America can cure their own ills by building up a proper economic system. The day is coming when the farmer will not be thought of as the desperate citizen of the United States, but as the real peace-loving, prosperous and thrifty citizen of the country."

Mr. Herbert D. Allman, President of the School, in welcoming the visitors and guests, stated that Founder's Day is set aside to honor the memory of the revered Founder, Dr. Joseph Krauskopf. "This great School is the result of his practical ideal—the outgrowth of his vision which saw the future needs of the Nation," said President Allman. "Our fundamental aim is to train city boys in agriculture, scientifically and practically, to the end, that they may become successful farmers. We consider this a constructive contribution to the economic farm conditions of today. Improving conditions in agriculture were indicated this spring by an unusually large application and student enrollment. Allowing our heart and not the head to guide us, we admitted a score more students than capacity, yet we have a large waiting list of eager lads who cannot be accepted. We are equipped to double the present enrollment of 185 students had we a larger maintenance fund, and earnestly ask this additional support from you and the generous public. Our unique School is the only one of its kind, and we feel, with President Coolidge, Herbert Hoover, Senator Capper and others, that we are helping present and future prosperity, agriculturally."

An oil painting of the late Max Schoenfeld, donor of the three Flora Schoenfeld Farms, and one of the earliest benefactors of the School, was presented by his daughter and son-in-law, Jane and Arthur K. Kuhn, of New York; Mr. Kuhn making the presentation address. The portrait was accepted on behalf of the School by Mr. Harry B. Hirsh, Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Another feature of exercises was the consecration of Memorial and Festive Trees, in the names of friends of the School. (List is published on p. 16 of this book.) A group of fifty trees, the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Gabriel Blum, of Philadelphia, was dedicated to the memory of the late Rodman Wanamaker. Rev. Dr. Wm. H. Fineshriber, of Philadelphia, delivered the Tree Consecration Address.

THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL MEETING AND HARVEST FESTIVAL

Sunday, October 7, 1928

The Harvest Festival and Thirty-first Annual Meeting of The National Farm School was held in the Louchheim Auditorium on the School Campus on Sunday, October 7, 1928. The Hall was decorated to simulate an outdoor auditorium, a large rock garden and a display of farm products having been arranged by the students in landscape and horticulture.

Mr. Joseph H. Hagedorn, Vice-President of the School, presided. He introduced the speaker of the day, Mr. Samuel Price Wetherill, Jr., President of the Regional Planning Commission. "Relating Agriculture to Public Progress," was the subject of Mr. Wetherill's address.

"If we do not conserve the organic condition of our soil, America will some day be an impoverished nation," said Mr. Wetherill. He outlined the advantages of regional planning in conjunction with agricultural districts. "In order to have agriculture function properly in the future, some time must be spent by business men, and by the farmers, too, in planning for the future by conserving the soil of this great country. Artificial remedies are not permanent. We must look ahead and plan to feed a greater population twenty-five years from now, especially in the regions adjacent to large cities."

The President of the School, Mr. Herbert D. Allman, presented his Annual Message, reprinted in full on pp. 5-9 of this book. Dean C. L. Goodling, made a report of the general operation of the institution for the year, and awarded prizes to the students contributed by generous funds. (See list of prize donors pp. 28 and 29 of this book.)

The following Officers were elected: Harry B. Hirsh, Chairman of the Board; Herbert D. Allman, President; Joseph H. Hagedorn, Vice-President; members of the Board of Trustees, whose terms expire, were re-elected for three years: Mrs. Gabriel Blum, Abraham Erlanger, Horace T. Fleisher, Roy A. Heymann, Chas. Kline, Leon Rosenbaum, Philip Sterling, Wm. S. Wasserman.

Following the Exercises, a Concert by the School Band, under the leadership of Lieut. Jos. Frankel, was given on the Campus.



REPORT OF THE DEAN**C. L. Goodling****To the Thirty-first Annual Meeting, October 7, 1928**

At the last Annual Meeting, reports of changes to be made in the curriculum were submitted. These have been instituted, the results already being evident in the improved functioning of the School. The system whereby classroom work and farm work have been divided into set periods, has made for better scholastic standing, as well as for more efficient practical work in the field operations, besides allowing more time for other endeavors. While several minor changes have been made during the year, the general system remains the same as was outlined a year ago.

The student personnel totals 176 happy lads. During the period from March 30th to October 1st, or since the present Freshmen Class was entered, we have lost but 6 per cent. This is in comparison to over 12 per cent. lost during the same period in 1927. In general, the spirit among the student body is excellent.

The School was fortunate in having donated, band instruments and uniforms. The band instruments were the gift of Mr. Charles Kline and several other members of the Board, and the uniforms were donated by Hirsch, Weintraub & Company. The organization of this new band has done much to create a good spirit among the students, as well as advertising the School. I want to pay tribute to one of the most able band leaders in America, Lieut. Joseph Frankel, who gratuitously gives his services teaching and directing, and in a short time developed a student band superior to those of other institutions organized for a longer period of time.

During the past year, we have revised the Student Senate which is now functioning in a superior and workable manner.

There have been several minor changes in our Faculty. Mr. Samuel B. Samuels has replaced Mr. J. L. Campbell. We are studying the qualifications of applicants to take the place of Mr. Wing, dairyman, and Mr. Dikeman, farm foreman, resigned.

We have added several men to our force—Mr. H. B. Fleming now in charge of student welfare work; Mr. Fred Cook as herdsman, in addition to several farm foremen, thus greatly strengthening our teaching staff.

There have been changes made in the operation of the farms; old and useless equipment sold; improved new equipment added; better horses have been purchased, so that the present farm equipment is up to date and modern in every respect. In general, the farm crops have been very much better than in the previous year. The production was considerably increased, harvesting 3,000 bushels of wheat; 300 tons of hay and 25 acres of potatoes, in addition to a large corn crop now maturing.

Horticultural Department

The Horticultural Department has exceeded our expectations in production. The amount of vegetables grown was twice as large as that of last year, and the prices received considerably higher. This department has prospects for still further development in the next few years, owing to the fine growth of trees and betterment in soil conditions now taking place.

Dairy Department

There probably has been more attention paid to dairying than to any other department because of the fact that dairying is one of our main enterprises. During the year we have added six very fine bred Guernseys, as well as six high-bred Jerseys imported from the Island of Jersey, including a fine Jersey bull. This purchase was made possible by the donations of Mr. William Anderson, Philadelphia; Mr. Dutton, of the Meridale Farms at Meredith, New York, and Mr. Thomas Cooper, of Coopersburg. We now have a nucleus of Guernsey and Jersey herds, equalled by no other institution in this section of the country.

The Dairy Department has done well during the year in that the production has continued to increase, without raising the cost of operation.

Poultry

Considerable change has been made in the Poultry Department. The old flock has been disposed of and replaced by pedigreed stock, purchased from flocks which are high-producing. By practicing more sanitary methods in handling chicks, this department has 1,500 white leghorn pullets in healthy condition which should show a big production during the coming winter. We are hoping for great things from this department.

Landscape

The Landscape Department speaks for itself all around you, as does the campus and our nursery, the latter having recently

been inspected and creditably passed by the Government, free from all diseases.

Floriculture

The greenhouses and campus flowers show an unusually fine yield and improvement. During the past year most of the Memorial Trees lost by removal or some other cause, have been replaced by new ones properly marked. There still remain a few which will be replaeed within a short period.

Financial

Please bear in mind that The National Farm Sehool is primarily an educational institution, not for the purpose of making money. However, I cannot refrain from calling your attention to the reduced cost of maintenance per boy by 17 cents per day, yet increasing the quality of the food served, credit for this being mainly due to our Mr. Samuel B. Samuels.

We have also, increased as previously implied, the sales of our surplus products, thus bringing us a larger income.

The Board of Trustees have expressed their appreciation of all these betterments, much credit for this being due to the hearty co-operation of our Faculty staff. If you, our friends and patrons, will continue and increase where possible, your appreciated support, I sincerely hope our present deficit may be reduced, to the end, that we may accept more of the worthy applicants whom we are yearly compelled to turn away.




